22 name or form of business or activity without proper licensure. The respondent
23 has signed and returned the proposed consent order offered by the Complaint
24 Review Committee. The proposed consent order contained the following
25 sanctions:

- 28 3. Publication on the Board's website and in the Journal with name

58 offered to practice engineering with an expired license; and **(d)** aided or
59 assisted another person in violating the laws and/or rules of the Board. The
60 respondent has signed and returned the proposed consent order offered by the

1 Complaint Review Committee. The proposed consent order contained the
2 following sanctions:

26 D. Copeland, Jr., P.E. After discussion, the Board unanimously approved the motion

28 Copeland's Petition for Declaratory Order and Ruling:

30 31 **RULING ON PETITION FOR DECLARATORY ORDER**

32
33 1.

34 On or about December 27, 2022, Richard D. Copeland, Jr., P.E.
35 ("Petitioner") filed with the Louisiana Professional Engineering and Land
36 Surveying Board (the "Board") a petition for declaratory order and ruling
37 pursuant to LAC Title 46:LXI§727.

38 2.

39 Petitioner seeks a declaratory order as to whether the Board may list a
40 professional engineer in a discipline of engineering other than the discipline in
41 which the professional engineer has passed a National Council of Examiners
42 for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) principles and practice of engineering
43 examination.

44 3.

45 La. R.S. 37:693(A)(2) states as follows:

46 Professional engineers shall be issued licenses by the board as a
47 professional engineer. The board shall list a professional engineer in
48 one or more of the disciplines of engineering approved by the National
49 Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying to signify the area
50 in which the professional engineer has demonstrated competence
51 pursuant to education, experience, and examination. The professional
52 engineer may use a seal that designates the discipline of engineering in
53 which the board has listed the professional engineer or a seal that
54 identifies the licensee as a professional engineer.

55 4.

56 LAC Title 46:LXI§1901 states as follows:

57 Professional engineers will be issued licenses by the board as a
58 professional engineer, and the board shall list a professional engineer
59 in one or more of the disciplines of engineering approved by NCEES
60 based on such individual having passed the examination in the
61 principles and practice of engineering in such discipline(s).

62 5.

63 LAC Title 46:LXI§1311 states as follows:

64 The board provides the opportunity for professional engineers who
65 were previously licensed in Louisiana to take the examination in the

1 principles and practice of engineering in the discipline(s) of
2 engineering in which they seek to be listed without affecting their
3 current licensure status with the board. These examinations are
4 offered at times and places designated by the board or NCEES. Each
5 individual will be charged a fee for this service.

6 **ORDER**

7 After due consideration of the petition for declaratory order and ruling filed
8 by Petitioner and after discussion by the Board during its meeting on January
9 23, 2023:

10 **IT IS THE RULING** of the Board that:

11 6.

12 The Board can only list a professional engineer in a discipline of
13 engineering which is approved by NCEES based on the individual having
14 passed an NCEES examination in the principles and practice of engineering in
15 such discipline.

16 7.

17 If an individual who is already licensed as professional engineer and listed
18 by the Board in one discipline of engineering desires to be listed in an
19 additional discipline, such individual can do so by taking and passing the
20 NCEES examination in the principles and practice of engineering in the
21 additional discipline of engineering in which he/she seeks to be listed
22 (without affecting his/her current licensure status with the Board).

23
24 **Applications**

25
26 The Board reviewed the request from **Anthony R. Venson** for reinstatement of his
27 revoked professional engineer license. After discussion, the Board unanimously
28 approved the motion made by Mr. Benoit, seconded by Dr. Gopu, to request that Mr.
29 Venson formally submit a modified application to reinstate an expired license. The
30 application and supporting documentation submitted by Mr. Venson will then be
31 reviewed by the Board.

32
33 **Application Appeals**

34
35 The Board unanimously approved the motion made by Ms. Bergeron, seconded by Dr.
36 Gopu, to affirm the reviewing committee's decision to *disapprove* the application of
37 **John Thompson** for licensure as a professional engineer based on not satisfying the
38 educational requirements of the Board.

39
40 The Board recessed for lunch at 12:35 p.m. and resumed at 1:11 p.m.

41
42 Dr. Gopu exited the meeting at 1:00 p.m. Mr. Landry exited the meeting at 1:20 p.m.

43
44 Cheron Seaman, Deputy Executive Director of the Board, entered the meeting at 1:25

62 on March 10, 2023.



