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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. We'll call the Board of Certification and Training for Solid Waste Management Operators meeting to order, March 18, 2016, ten o'clock at the Cajundome Convention Center.

Miss Bordelon, can we have the role call, please.

MS. BORDELON:

Sure. Mia Townshel.

MS. TOWNSEL:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Lindsey Turtle.

MS. TURTLE:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Jason Creel.

MR. CREEL:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Jonathan Fourrier.

MR. FOURRIER:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

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Fred Williams.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Bubba Wynn.

MR. WYNN:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Bo Lagrange.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Troy Barber.

MR. BARBER:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Connie Henry.

MS. HENRY:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Gary Bonvillian.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Here.

Okay. First up we have the review of
the minutes for the October 27th and

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December 11th minutes. Ms. Bordelon had sent it to everybody via e-mail.

Does anybody have any corrections or comments about the minutes?

MR. BARBER:

Offer a motion we approve them.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Who was that? Mr. Wynn?

MS. BORDELON:

Troy.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Troy.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Troy. Okay. Motion by Mr. Barber, second by Mr. Lagrange that we approve the minutes of the October 27th and December 11th meetings.

Any opposition --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Excuse me, that was seconded by Mr. Williams.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Oh, by Mr. Williams?

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MS. BORDELON:

Yeah.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

I know we look alike, but.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, y'all kind of look alike.

Seconded by Mr. Williams. Is there any objection to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

Next up we have issuance of certificates to Connie Henry and Jason Creel. According to tradition in the past when we've gotten new members on the board they have been granted certifications, the nine different certifications that we offer.

Any motion to that effect?

MR. WYNN:

I'll make a motion.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

1 Motion by Mr. Wynn. Seconded by
2 Mr. Williams that Ms. Connie Henry and
3 Mr. Jason Creel be given certifications
4 that they do not already have.

5 Any objections to the motion?

6 The motion carries.

7 Review the agenda for the 2016 LSWA
8 workshops for approval of hours.

9 Mr. Mollere, will you be making the
10 presentation?

11 MR. MOLLERE:

12 Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

13 Members of the Board, it's a pleasure
14 to be before you this morning. We have, I
15 think, a copy presented to you for the two
16 workshops that we're proposing in
17 Marksville on July 19th and 20th and in
18 Shreveport on October 25th and 26th. As
19 you can see, the proposed agenda leans
20 more toward the C&D topics this time, but
21 the ten hours that we are proposing we
22 think we have a pretty good program. We
23 have, again, one of the areas,
24 role-playing, which has been very, very
25 familiar -- very popular in the past.

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1 Ms. Swacker has agreed to do that. We'll
2 also have the -- Mr. Majors from DEQ come
3 on the second day and present a topic on
4 inspections. And then, the last thing
5 that we have is something that we felt was
6 very important. On the waste tire program
7 we're proposing a panel with a regulator
8 and several processors, perhaps, that will
9 actually talk about what's happening to
10 the tire program in the state. We think
11 that that's very relevant at this time.

12 But I would hope that the Board would
13 find this acceptable and you would grant
14 the ten hours that we are asking for.

15 MR. BARBER:

16 I offer a motion we approve it.

17 MR. BONVILLAIN:

18 Okay. A motion by Mr. Barber.

19 MS. TOWNSEL:

20 Second.

21 MR. WYNN:

22 Second.

23 MR. BONVILLAIN:

24 You can't second.

25 MS. TOWNSEL:

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You're not a voting member of the
counsel.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Wynn that the agenda
for the LSWA workshop be approved for ten
hours of CEU.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Thank you, Mr. Mollere.

MR. MOLLERE:

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Thank you,
members of the Board.

With your permission, I'll excuse
myself.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

You may excuse yourself.

Okay. Next up we have consideration
of operator certifications, review of
applications for certifications.

First off, we have Scott Berry
requesting A level A Transfer Station.

MR. BARBER:

Did he pass the test.

MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

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MR. BARBER:

I'm good with him.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. At this point all we're doing is approving the application and then we'll get to the test part later when we actually issue the certificates.

Okay. Next we have Marcus Breaux for a Landfill Level B.

Next, James Chaney, C&D, Level A.

Marcus Chauvin for a --

MS. BORDELON:

Transfer Station, Level A.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Transfer Station, Level A. Here it is. Okay. Transfer Station, Level A.

Okay. You've got Davis and Gonzalez, should we put those off until --

MS. BORDELON:

Well, no, because they were -- well, they were -- they were applying for regular according to his letter.

MR. WYNN:

Neither one of them has enough hours.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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1 Okay. Let's take one at a time,
2 then.

3 Matthew Davis applying for
4 Incinerator, Level B.

5 MR. BARBER:

6 Well, they're trying to get his work
7 at the fire department to classify as
8 experience, and it doesn't. We all know
9 that. And, of course, the short time that
10 he's been with the company actually doing
11 the operation has only been since
12 November. So, he certainly doesn't have
13 the --

14 MS. BORDELON:

15 Well, he's got work at -- trackhoe
16 and bulldozer work at another position
17 from 2007 to 2009.

18 MR. BARBER:

19 But that wasn't -- that says well
20 service.

21 MR. BONVILLAIN:

22 I think that's the type of experience
23 if he was applying for landfill or a
24 C&D --

25 MR. WILLIAMS:

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Right.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- would be properly applied, but I can't see where that would be applied for an incinerator.

MS. BORDELON:

Well, I thought the construction -- the substitution just simply said construction experience. I could be wrong.

Level B operator experience requirements: A minimum of two years of experience as described in blah, blah, blah in the field of solid waste management. A minimum of one year in the field of solid waste management or two years as a supervisor in a construction field relating to the use of heavy equipment, good drainage practice, and other skills to ensure proper operation of a solid waste processing or disposal facility.

MR. WYNN:

That is a situation where, you know, they might be able to pass with a -- with

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1 that type of experience with the equipment
2 but that -- here we go again. I'm like
3 Gary, that does not have anything to do
4 with that type of work.

5 MR. FOURRIER:

6 Well, he still has to have one year
7 experience as a Level B and construction,
8 so he doesn't have the one year.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 Right.

11 MR. BONVILLAIN:

12 Yeah. He doesn't have the one year
13 either.

14 MR. FOURRIER:

15 It says a Level B. And they're
16 trying to replace a conditional with a
17 conditional.

18 MR. BONVILLAIN:

19 Well, we'll address that when we get
20 to conditional certificates, but this is
21 whether or not we approve the application
22 for a regular certificate.

23 MR. WYNN:

24 I can't see it.

25 MR. BARBER:

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I offer a motion --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Would somebody like to make a motion?

MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion to deny it.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. A motion Mr. Barber.

MR. WYNN:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Second by Mr. Wynn that the application for Matthew Davis for a landfill -- I mean, Incinerator, Level B, be denied.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion carries.

MR. WYNN:

Are we going to explain why he was denied?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Do what?

MR. WYNN:

And when you tell him, you'll explain why he was denied?

MS. BORDELON:

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Sure.

MR. WYNN:

Okay.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, that he doesn't meet the experience requirement.

Okay. Next we have Salvador Gonzalez, also Incinerator, Level B.

Any comments on this one?

MR. BARBER:

I think it's the same situation --

MR. FOURRIER:

Same situation.

MR. BARBER:

-- as before.

I offer a motion to deny it.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. A motion by Mr. Barber.

Any second?

MR. FOURRIER:

I second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Second by Mr. Fourrier that the application for Salvador Gonzalez for a Level B Incinerator be denied.

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Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Next we have Alfredo Gutierrez, C&D, Level B.

Next, Daniel Hylton, Landfill, Level A.

Clinton Johnson, Separation, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

He will be -- it looks to me like he will be eligible on 4/14 for a regular certification. Am I looking at that right?

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BARBER:

So, I think being that's the case I would offer a motion that --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Upon the completion of --

MR. BARBER:

-- upon that date, on 4/14 of 2006 that he be approved for his regular certification.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

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MR. WYNN:

Second that motion.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Got a motion by Mr. Barber.

MR. WYNN:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- seconded by Mr. Wynn that
Mr. Johnson's application be approved
effective 4/14/16.

Any objections to the motion?

Motion carries.

Next, John Mickey, Transfer Station,
Level A.

MR. BARBER:

Who?

MS. BORDELON:

John Mickey.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

John Mickey. If you've got an
e-mail, his was the one that was --

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, that was one of the late ones.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- turned around.

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MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, that was the one that was sideways.

MR. BARBER:

I must have not had -- oh --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Suzanne sent that one --

MR. BARBER:

Yeah.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- a day or two late.

MR. BARBER:

I had trouble with that one. I do have it somewhere.

MS. BORDELON:

I made it bigger, because I couldn't read it. But I did get the original.

MR. BARBER:

That looks good to me.

MS. BORDELON:

He used to have a Landfill, Level A certification years ago.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Everybody okay with that?

MR. BARBER:

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Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Next is Joshua Morris, Separation,
Level B.

MR. BARBER:

I'm a little confused. I think I'm
okay with it, but I'm a little confused.
He puts in here that he has worked from
October of 2011 to present at a scrap
metal facility and then he's also worked
at a separation facility, it looks like
for the same period of time.

MR. WYNN:

Southern Disposable.

MS. BORDELON:

He's working a hundred hours a week.

MR. WYNN:

Troy, on this situation, I know
this -- the one -- the Johnson and Morris
both, they are half-brothers and they both
own Southern Disposal, and they are
also -- have that metal operation.

MR. BARBER:

So, you're satisfied with their
experience?

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MR. WYNN:

Yes, very well.

MR. BARBER:

Okay. I'm good.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I do have one thing. He did not sign his application.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, Mia just brought that up, too.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. So you'll make sure that you get the signature on that?

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MR. WYNN:

I make a motion -- well, nevermind, we can't do that now.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, this guy's had a conditional for two years, now, too.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Next is John Roofner, C&D, Level B.

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MR. WYNN:

When did -- how long of a time did elapse for this, Suzanne?

MR. WILLIAMS:

For his application?

MR. WYNN:

Yeah.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

July 15.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Is he also applying for a Separation, Level B?

MS. BORDELON:

No.

MR. LAGRANGE:

He's not?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

No.

MS. BORDELON:

No.

MR. BARBER:

It looks like it was checked off, that's why.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, I tried to white them out. He

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only had a C&D.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah. I mean, he's had a Level B that expired, so I mean, he meets all the requirements.

Next Rodley Jude Roy, Landfill, Level B.

MR. WYNN:

Back to that one, did he retest?

MS. BORDELON:

He did retest.

MR. WYNN:

And he passed?

MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

MR. WYNN:

Okay.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Rodley Roy, Landfill, Level B. Heather Rene Schamerhorn, C&D, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

I got a question here. I think I'm okay with it, but when we talk about experience, is this -- is there anywhere

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1 that would indicate that it has to be
2 full-time experience? It looks like that
3 she only works 20 hours a week.

4 MR. WYNN:

5 They probably, since they -- it's a
6 family-owned business, they probably work
7 more than what they're just putting down.
8 And they grew up in the business.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 Four years of 20 hours a week.

11 MR. BONVILLAIN:

12 Yeah, it's -- she's got four years of
13 20 hours a week, so that's equivalent to
14 two years at 40 hours a week. So, yeah.

15 MR. BARBER:

16 I guess if you do the math, that's
17 okay.

18 MR. WILLIAMS:

19 That's the new math.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 No, that's old math.

22 MR. BONVILLAIN:

23 Thank you for pointing that out,
24 Suzanne.

25 Next is Tammy Schamerhorn, C&D, Level

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1 B. And pretty much more of the same.
2 MR. WILLIAMS:
3 Same.
4 MR. BONVILLAIN:
5 Twenty-five hours a week for a little
6 bit longer period of time.
7 Next, Joshua Sturgeon, C&D, Level B.
8 Travis Scott, C&D, Level A.
9 MR. WYNN:
10 He took the test?
11 MS. BORDELON:
12 He did.
13 MR. WYNN:
14 Okay.
15 MS. BORDELON:
16 And he passed.
17 MR. BONVILLAIN:
18 Kristal Smith, Landfill, Level B.
19 MR. BARBER:
20 This is another one of those --
21 MR. WYNN:
22 I thought this was a conditional?
23 MR. BARBER:
24 Well, as of --
25 MR. WYNN:

1 She's got conditional marked in the
2 block.

3 MR. BONVILLAIN:

4 Well, she's got both of them.

5 MS. BORDELON:

6 She did -- well, yeah, she does. She
7 has -- she's had a conditional, she's
8 applying for a regular now.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 As of five --

11 MS. BORDELON:

12 What's the date? Yeah.

13 MR. BARBER:

14 As of 5/3/16 she will be eligible for
15 a regular certification, so --

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 I did notify her of the date and told
18 her that it would be possible that it
19 would not be issued until May.

20 MR. BARBER:

21 And I will offer a motion that as of
22 May 3, 2016 that we issue her a regular
23 certification.

24 MR. BONVILLAIN:

25 Okay. Motion by Mr. Barber.

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MR. WILLIAMS:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Williams.

Any objection to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Review requests for conditional certification.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Excuse me, Mr. Chairman, do you need a motion to approve all the rest of the applications -- regulars?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Not yet, we're going to issue them later -- it's later on in the agenda that we issue -- oh, okay. I'm sorry. You're right. You're right.

Yeah, do I have a motion --

MR. LAGRANGE:

I'll make that motion.

MR. BARBER:

(INDICATING)

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. We have a motion from Mr. Lagrange, and second from Mr. Barber

1 that the approve all of the
2 applications -- do I need to name them --
3 that we did not act on separately in the
4 list.

5 Any objection to the motion?

6 Hearing none, the motion carries.

7 Okay. Review requests for
8 conditional certification.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 I have those two Stericycles if you
11 want to look at those now, for
12 conditional. We don't have any others.

13 MR. BONVILLAIN:

14 We've got some conditional renewals?

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 They're all extensions.

17 MR. BONVILLAIN:

18 All right. Okay. The two we have,
19 then, are those two from Stericycle.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 Well, excuse me --

22 MR. BONVILLAIN:

23 Which is Matthew Davis and Salvador
24 Gonzalez.

25 MS. BORDELON:

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What is that?

MR. BARBER:

What were you saying about these?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Those are extensions of conditionals.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. So we don't have to review them.

MS. BORDELON:

We are. It's next on the agenda.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

We'll get to that later, but first we have a request for conditionals from those two from Stericycle that we did not approve their regular application.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. And that is Matthew Davis first.

MR. BARBER:

Well, I guess, for the record, everybody knows where I stand on this. I have a problem granting a conditional that is replacing a conditional.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Would you like to make a motion to deny the issuance of the conditional?

MR. BARBER:

Let's see if there's any more discussion.

MR. WILLIAMS:

How many regulars do they have?

MS. BORDELON:

I don't have it in front of me, but if I'm not mistaken I think we issued them three regulars.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

For this location?

MS. BORDELON:

For that location. We've issued, I think, three regulars and we originally had issued eight conditionals. We've replaced some of those conditionals already with conditionals.

MR. WYNN:

Do you know what meeting that was when we first issued the conditions?

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MS. BORDELON:

It was in Shreveport last year.

MR. WILLIAMS:

It was in Shreveport, I remember that.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, we've kind of set a precedent by issuing -- replacing conditionals with conditionals, you said a couple already.

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. LAGRANGE:

Of those eight original conditionals --

MS. BORDELON:

There are probably only four of those original eight still there.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And these applications are -- would replace --

MS. BORDELON:

Two of the original eight.

MR. LAGRANGE:

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1 And you said we have approved some
2 replacements already?

3 MS. BORDELON:

4 Uh-huh (yes).

5 MR. BONVILLAIN:

6 At previous meetings we have approved
7 to replace a conditional with a
8 conditional.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 And I think it's on the
11 applications -- on one of the
12 applications. I think it's Dustin
13 Valentine is one that we actually replaced
14 a conditional with Dustin Valentine and
15 now Dustin Valentine is also -- has left.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 All right. This -- on Davis'
18 application he says he is replacing
19 Charles Smith.

20 MS. BORDELON:

21 I think he was an original one. Does
22 the other say Dustin Valentine?

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 Yes. Dustin.

25 MS. BORDELON:

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1 Yeah. And Dustin Valentine, we just
2 issued his in -- I believe in October. He
3 was -- Dustin replaced another conditional
4 and now he's gone.

5 MR. BARBER:

6 Well, he says in his narrative here
7 that these individuals will be replacing
8 two conditional employees who are no
9 longer with the company. So, we know
10 that. And, you know, I feel like they're
11 taking advantage of this Board by just
12 continuing this thing. This could go on
13 forever. I think they need some regular
14 certifications.

15 MR. WYNN:

16 I also agree with --

17 MR. WILLIAMS:

18 I agree with it.

19 MR. WYNN:

20 -- I agree with that.

21 MR. WILLIAMS:

22 I agree with you.

23 MR. WYNN:

24 Because they are looking for the
25 Board to keep them in compliance.

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MR. BARBER:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. WYNN:

And it's not the Board's policy to keep them in compliance.

MR. BARBER:

Absolutely.

MR. WILLIAMS:

You know, I was in favor of granting the conditionals initially.

MR. WYNN:

I was, too, because it was a startup operation.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Exactly. Exactly. But now, you know, at some point --

MR. WYNN:

Right.

MR. WILLIAMS:

-- in my opinion we have to draw the line.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. But you also need to consider that we have already approved some conditionals replacing conditionals since

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the original --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- times.

MR. WILLIAMS:

I understand what you're saying, but we're not --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

That doesn't bind us for any future --

MR. WILLIAMS:

No. I think we have to look at each one as an individual situation. And, like I said, I was originally for, and I voted to grant the eight conditionals, but now, to me, I think it's just, you know, I find myself having to agree with Troy.

MR. WYNN:

You would think that --

MS. BORDELON:

Is that on the record?

MR. WILLIAMS:

I couldn't resist that, Troy.

MR. BARBER:

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Thank you, Fred.

MR. WILLIAMS:

No problem.

MR. WYNN:

I would say in this period of time you would think they had enough time to go out and find B Levels in fields, not only from Louisiana, but also from all across America.

MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion we deny these two applications.

MR. WILLIAMS:

I second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. A motion by Mr. Barber, seconded by Mr. Williams that we deny the conditional certification requests for Matthew Davis and Salvador Gonzalez.

Is there any objection to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Request -- review requests for conditional certification extensions.

Okay. We have Shari Dartez, C&D, Level B, Gordon's Landfill, Nature Frycka,

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1 C&D, Level B, Lincoln Parish Landfill,
2 Frank Goetz, Landfill, Level A, Woodside
3 Landfill, William Rod McHugh, C&D, Level
4 A, Gordon's Landfill, Terry Mestayer, C&D,
5 Level B, Gordon's Landfill, and Gretchen
6 Tullier, Landfill, Level B, Chocktaw Road
7 Landfill.

8 Ms. Bordelon, have they all met the
9 necessary requirements for the conditional
10 extension?

11 MS. BORDELON:

12 Yes, they have.

13 MR. BONVILLAIN:

14 Okay. Do I hear a motion?

15 MR. WYNN:

16 I'll make a motion.

17 MR. BONVILLAIN:

18 A motion by Mr. Wynn.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Second.

21 MR. BONVILLAIN:

22 Second by Mr. Lagrange that the
23 conditional extensions be granted.

24 Is there any objection to the motion?

25 Hearing none, the motion passes.

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Review requests for recertification.

MR. BARBER:

We haven't done two from Pineville yet.

MS. BORDELON:

We're going to add --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

We haven't added them to the agenda yet.

MR. BARBER:

Okay.

MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Recertification applications, the first list they have already completed their 40 hours.

MS. BORDELON:

Current.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Correct. Okay. David Clabo, Landfill, Level A, Transfer Station, Level A, Alvin Declouette, Landfill, Level B, Elliot Donato, Landfill, Level A, Donovan Driskill, Landfill, Level A, James Brian

1 Duff, Landfill, Level A, Katry Martin,
2 Landfill, Level A, George Mason, Landfill,
3 Level A, Jeremy Matthews, Landfill, Level
4 A, Judy Ortego, Landfill, Level B,
5 Charmaine Sandolph, Landfill, Level B,
6 Elijah Silverand, Landfill, Level B,
7 Alonzo Smith, C&D, Level B.

8 Do I hear a motion to approve the
9 recertification?

10 MR. BARBER:

11 So moved.

12 MR. BONVILLAIN:

13 Moved by Mr. Barber.

14 MR. WYNN:

15 Second.

16 MR. BONVILLAIN:

17 Seconded by Mr. Wynn. Any objection
18 to the motion?

19 Hearing none, the motion passes.

20 Incomplete recertification
21 application.

22 First one we have Ronald Dunn,
23 Republic Services, upon approval of 30
24 SWANA hours. Do we have that --

25 MS. BORDELON:

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1 Yes, you should have --

2 MR. BONVILLAIN:

3 -- later on in the agenda?

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Uh-huh (yes).

6 MR. BONVILLAIN:

7 Okay.

8 MS. BORDELON:

9 Did I send that to y'all?

10 MS. TOWNSEL:

11 Uh-huh (yes).

12 MR. FOURRIER:

13 It's in the packet you left this

14 morning.

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 Okay. Oh, yeah yeah yeah. The SWANA

17 hours. So, I guess do the ones that

18 are --

19 MR. BONVILLAIN:

20 Yeah. Okay. Let's --

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 -- are contingent upon being at this

23 conference first.

24 MR. BONVILLAIN:

25 Right. Okay.

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We'll defer Mr. Dunn for a few minutes.

Chad Hollins, C&D, Level A, needs ten hours at this conference. Is he registered or do you know?

MS. BORDELON:

I'm not sure.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Well, let's go ahead and do this. We'll go ahead and name them all, and then upon proof that they have attended this conference then we'll give Ms. Bordelon the authority to go ahead and reissue the certificates.

Chad Hollins, Level A, Gentilly Landfill, Percy Hollins, C&D, Level B, Gentilly, Randy Landry, Landfill, Level A, River Birch, and Michael Weekley, C&D, Level A, Gentilly Landfill.

They all need attendance at this conference to complete their 40 hours.

Do I hear a motion to authorize recertification upon proof of attendance at this conference?

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So moved.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Moved by Mr. Barber, second by
Mr. Williams.

Any objection to the motion?

Okay. And Mr. Dunn, we'll just wait
until we get down to the agenda on his
SWANA hours.

Okay. Next is the issuance of
operator certificates. Ms. Bordelon,
would you read off those that have been
approved and pass their tests?

MS. BORDELON:

Scott Berry, Transfer Station, Level
A, Marcus Breaux, Landfill, Level B, James
Chaney, C&D, Level A, Marcus Chauvin,
Transfer Station, Level A, Alfredo
Gutierrez, C&D, Level B, Daniel Hylton,
Landfill, Level A, John Mickey, Transfer
Station, Level A, Joshua Morris,
Separation, Level B, John Roofner, C&D,
Level B, Rodley Roy, Landfill, Level B,
Heather Schamerhorn, C&D, Level B, Tammy

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1 Schamerhorn, C&D, Level B, Joshua
2 Sturgeon, C&D, Level B, and Travis Scott,
3 C&D, Level A.

4 MR. BONVILLAIN:

5 Do I hear a motion to approve the
6 issuance of the certificates?

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Moved.

9 MR. BONVILLAIN:

10 Moved by Mr. Lagrange.

11 MR. WYNN:

12 Second.

13 MR. BONVILLAIN:

14 Second by Mr. Wynn.

15 Any objections to the motion?

16 Hearing none, the motion passes.

17 Okay. Committee reports. Awards
18 committee, Ms. Turtle?

19 MS. TURTLE:

20 Yes, I move to ratify the three
21 awards for Donovan Driskill, Evita Logard,
22 and Jason Williams.

23 MR. BONVILLAIN:

24 Okay. I've got a motion to ratify
25 the e-mail vote that we had taken on the

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issuance of those three awards.

Is there second to the motion?

MR. BARBER:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Barber.

Any objection to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

Any other report from the awards committee.

MS. TURTLE:

No.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Testing, Mr. Lagrange?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Testing, I'll defer my report to Ms. Bordelon.

MS. BORDELON:

We had 14 that took the test on Wednesday, twelve passed, two failed.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

You had some that had tested interim, too?

MS. BORDELON:

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1 Oh, yes, actually I did. I had five
2 that came to the office and tested and
3 passed.

4 MR. BONVILLAIN:

5 Okay. Continuing --

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 That concludes my report.

8 MR. BONVILLAIN:

9 Continuing education, Mr. Barber?

10 MR. BARBER:

11 We will have two training classes
12 this coming year, July 19th at --

13 MR. WILLIAMS:

14 Marksville --

15 MR. BARBER:

16 -- July 19th and 20th at Marksville
17 and October 25th and 26th at Shreveport.

18 MR. BONVILLAIN:

19 Okay. Nominating committee,
20 Mr. Williams?

21 MR. WILLIAMS:

22 What Bo said. Nothing to report.
23 Except --

24 MS. BORDELON:

25 Well, yeah, we have Jason and -- and

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1 I know Jonathan, when we met in October
2 his letter hadn't been officially signed,
3 and it was signed right after the October
4 meeting.

5 MR. WILLIAMS:

6 Right.

7 MS. BORDELON:

8 And we didn't report on it in
9 December, so -- but Jonathan's letter, as
10 y'all know was signed.

11 MR. BONVILLAIN:

12 So, he's now legal.

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 He's legal.

15 MR. WILLIAMS:

16 That concludes my report.

17 MS. BORDELON:

18 To serve another three-year term is
19 what I'm referring to.

20 MR. WILLIAMS:

21 Thank you. That concludes my report,
22 Mr. Chairman.

23 MS. BORDELON:

24 Y'all want to know any other term
25 dates? Who's going off or what your -- do

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1 y'all know -- does everybody know their
2 term dates?

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 No.

5 MS. BORDELON:

6 Actually, I made a copy of this for
7 Jason, he may want a list of Board
8 members.

9 Bubba's first term will end October
10 of this year. Let's see. Troy's first
11 term will end October of this year. Bo's
12 first term will end October of '17. Of
13 course, Jonathan is good until '18.
14 Lindsay's first term will end October of
15 '17. Connie is good until '18. Gary's
16 first term ends October of this year. And
17 Fred's second term will end October of
18 next year.

19 MR. WILLIAMS:

20 That concludes my report,
21 Mr. Chairman.

22 MR. BONVILLAIN:

23 Thank you, Mr. Williams.

24 MR. WILLIAMS:

25 You're welcome.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Next item on the agenda is a request for lifetime certification from Terrance Stewart. This was put in here -- in our packet this morning. I'll go ahead and read what he wrote. It says: "To the Board of Certification and Training for Solid Waste Management Operators, I have reviewed the minutes from a previous Certification Board meeting from October of 2010 regarding eligibility for lifetime certification. And it states any member of the Board of Certification who has served at least two terms may request in writing a lifetime certification in all categories and classes of the certification, and an exemption from all fees, provided that the individual maintain the required hours of certification, training at an association with and in the solid waste management profession. It also states the operator must submit an application for recertification and proof of 40 hours before the expiration of their

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1 certificates. With that being said, I
2 feel that I have and will continue to meet
3 these requirements and would like this
4 letter to serve as my formal request for
5 consideration.

6 Any comments?

7 MR. WYNN:

8 Connie, did you write that for him?

9 MS. HENRY:

10 No, because I'm looking at some of
11 the run-on sentences and it's making me
12 twitch.

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 Actually, that was actually taken --
15 I went back and looked at the minutes from
16 when we originally spoke of lifetime
17 certifications, and that was Bill
18 Mollere's motion.

19 MR. WILLIAMS:

20 Can you verify that he has met all of
21 the qualifications?

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 Well, he's actually not due for
24 renewal at this time, he's just requesting
25 it now --

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MR. WILLIAMS:

Okay.

MS. BORDELON:

-- so that when he does -- I don't think he's up for renewal for another two years.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, well, according to this the only requirement initially is that he has served two terms on the Board.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right.

MS. BORDELON:

Right.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

And everything else is going forward as far as requirement that he has to do.

MR. LAGRANGE:

I offer a motion that we grant Mr. Stewart lifetime certification.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Motion by Mr. Barber.

MR. WILLIAMS:

I second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Seconded by Mr. Williams that
Mr. Terrance Stewart be granted lifetime
certification as long as he continues to
meet the requirements of -- that the Board
set forth in 2010.

Any objection to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Next we have a request for
approval of SWANA CEUs from Ronald Dunn.
You've got a SWANA certification
continuing education form showing 30 hours
for the manager of landfill operations
that he attended March 16th through 18th
2015.

MS. BORDELON:

SWANApalooza.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah. This was the one that was held
in New Orleans last year at the same time
that our conference was going on here.
And I know in the past we have granted 30
hours for the manager of landfill
operations course.

MR. LAGRANGE:

I moved to grant 30 hours,

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Mr. Chairman's.

MR. BARBER:

(INDICATING)

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Moved by Mr. Lagrange,
seconded by Mr. Barber that we grant 30
hours of credit to Mr. Ronald Dunn for the
manager of landfill operations class he
took March 16th to 18th 2015.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Now, we would need to issue
his recertification.

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. This will grant -- this will
complete his 40 hours?

MS. BORDELON:

Correct. He has another ten hours
from this conference.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MS. BORDELON:

From 2013.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Do I hear a motion to approve the recertification for Mr. Ronald Dunn?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Moved by Mr. Lagrange.

MS. TURTLE:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Second by Ms. Turtle.

Any objection to motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. We have a couple of items that we'd like to add to the agenda. The first is to late applications received from the city of Pineville for two of their operators. This would be for conditional certifications.

Do I hear a motion to add this to the agenda?

MR. WILLIAMS:

So moved.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Moved by Mr. Williams.

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MR. BARBER:

(INDICATING)

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Barber that they be added to the agenda.

Any objections to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

Ms. Bordelon, would you like to explain the situation?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, Wednesday when I was testing operators, these two individuals were there and I didn't have them on the list. I hadn't received applications from them -- or I think they were a little confused as to what they were supposed to be doing. They thought registering for this conference also had them -- they were registered to take the test.

So, I had extra tests, so I went ahead and allowed them to test, and asked them to go back, fill out applications, make copies for everybody to have -- to present at this Board meeting today.

1 Apparently, they have no operators
2 currently at the city of Pineville and
3 Charles Dixon -- I haven't even looked at
4 it, but I think he said he's been there
5 about a year. Yeah. In June he'll have
6 been there a year. And he has pretty much
7 replaced the other operator that was
8 there, which -- why don't I see that page?
9 I'm missing a page of who that operator
10 was. I think it was Vincent Smith, I
11 believe is what his name was. Yeah, we're
12 missing -- he's missing that page. Or is
13 it just me? Is everybody missing page
14 five?

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 Yeah, we're all missing.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Yeah.

19 MS. BORDELON:

20 Okay. I believe the operator's name
21 was Vincent Smith that had a C&D, Level A.
22 And he left just a few months ago. So, he
23 is replacing Vincent.

24 The other gentleman, Damon Archinard
25 -- Archinard, he is requesting a

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1 conditional -- wait a minute. He told me
2 he had only been there three months, but
3 his application says 2012.

4 MR. WYNN:

5 That's what I was looking at. I was
6 going to say, he doesn't need a
7 conditional, he needs a regular
8 certification.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 He told me he'd --

11 MR. WILLIAMS:

12 If that's --

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 -- he told he'd only been there three
15 months.

16 MR. WYNN:

17 All right. So --

18 MS. BORDELON:

19 Like I said, this is the first time
20 I've looked at the applications because
21 they were just handed to me this morning.

22 MR. WYNN:

23 Both of these passed their tests.

24 MS. BORDELON:

25 Actually, neither one did.

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MR. WYNN:

The only thing --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Both of them are replacing certified operators?

MS. BORDELON:

What's that?

MR. LAGRANGE:

They are replacing.

MS. BORDELON:

Just one. The one that's asking for the Level A, that took the Level A test, which is irrelevant, because he didn't pass. But he was the one that was asking for a conditional, replacing the other operator, the one that's been there for a year.

I wish -- I should have told them to come to the meeting.

MR. BARBER:

And you actually have documentation of which certified -- which regular certified operator he is replacing?

MS. BORDELON:

I don't have it with me. I'll have

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to go back and look -- and double --

MR. BARBER:

But he did indicate that on --

MS. BORDELON:

He did indicate that --

MR. BARBER:

-- the original application?

MS. BORDELON:

Right -- no, not the -- this is the original application.

MR. BARBER:

Well, I mean --

MS. BORDELON:

He indicated to me when we spoke that he was replacing --

MR. BARBER:

Okay.

MS. BORDELON:

-- I believe his name was Vincent Smith.

MR. BARBER:

Okay.

MS. BORDELON:

And the page is missing on this application where it should indicate that.

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1 Can I just -- while y'all are looking
2 at that can I just walk out and see if
3 they're on a break right now? Because I
4 know they're both here.

5 Let me just see if I can spot them
6 real quick.

7 MR. BONVILLAIN:

8 They shouldn't be on break, they
9 should be back in class.

10 MR. WYNN:

11 Well, if they had two certified
12 operators, an A and a B level, that has
13 both left, I don't mind giving two
14 conditionals to -- for replacement.

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 They are not a break right now. So
17 I'm sure they're upstairs.

18 MR. FOURRIER:

19 And they have six months until after
20 they get the conditionals to pass the
21 test.

22 MR. BONVILLAIN:

23 Correct.

24 MR. BARBER:

25 Well, if we can just take one at a

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time.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, that's --

MR. BARBER:

I guess start with Charles Dixon.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah. Let's go ahead and take Dixon first.

MS. BORDELON:

Actually, that's true, because even with the other one, even if the dates are correct and he does qualify for regular, we can't issue it now anyway, because he didn't pass the test.

MR. WYNN:

Right.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Okay.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, we can approve the application, we just can't issue the certificate.

Okay. Charles Dixon, what's your pleasure? He's asking for a conditional.

MR. WYNN:

This is the motion I put up: I will

1 grant the conditional as long as we can
2 verify that he is replacing a
3 conditional --

4 MR. BONVILLAIN:

5 No, a regular.

6 MR. WILLIAMS:

7 A regular.

8 MR. WYNN:

9 A regular, yeah. A regular, excuse
10 me. We're not getting into that, Troy.

11 But, that is my motion.

12 MR. BONVILLAIN:

13 Okay. Got a motion from Mr.
14 Barber -- I mean, Mr. Wynn.

15 MR. WYNN:

16 Don't start.

17 MR. WILLIAMS:

18 They look alike.

19 I second.

20 MR. BONVILLAIN:

21 Seconded by Mr. Williams, that we
22 approve the conditional Level A operator
23 for Charles Dixon upon confirmation that
24 he is replacing a regularly certified
25 operator.

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Any discussion?

Any objection to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Next, we have Damon Archinard.

Okay, and if his dates are correct, he meets the requirements for a regular certification.

MR. WYNN:

As long as he passes the test, but he didn't.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

That -- now, okay, again, we're approving an application, we're not issuing a certificate.

MR. WYNN:

Okay. Right.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

The application we can approve, then the issuance of the certificate is dependent upon him passing the test.

MR. WYNN:

But here's another situation, also. Now, if he can prove that he's taking the place of a certified B level, he is eligible for a conditional.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

That is correct.

MR. WYNN:

And, in that case, I would grant it, but other than that I would not. I would -- that's the only way I would grant a conditional.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Correct.

MR. WYNN:

But he did not have one on the application.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

But, if the dates are correct he qualifies for a regular certification.

MR. WYNN:

That's correct.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Upon passing the test.

MR. WYNN:

That's correct. He can do it either way.

MR. BARBER:

Well --

MR. WYNN:

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1 As long as he is replacing -- I mean,
2 replacing somebody that's got a
3 certification.

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Okay. Wait a minute, we already
6 made -- y'all already made a motion to
7 approve a conditional for --

8 MR. BONVILLAIN:

9 Dixon.

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 -- for Dixon --

12 MR. BONVILLAIN:

13 Correct.

14 MR. WYNN:

15 Correct.

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 -- replacing the A level operator
18 that was there.

19 MR. WYNN:

20 That's correct.

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 It's my understanding that's the only
23 operator that was there. They have zero,
24 so there's no way he can be replacing
25 anyone.

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MR. WYNN:

Okay. Well, if that was the only one, well then -- but there is a situation where you can grant him a conditional since he is the only -- they only had two operators, one's A level and if your A level leaves, then you don't have a certified operator on site.

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. WYNN:

That's why, usually, you got an A and B level.

MR. BARBER:

Well --

MS. BORDELON:

They're asking for -- he's asking for a conditional B. So that they do have two operators.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Chairman, I moved to grant a conditional.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. A motion by Mr. Lagrange.

MR. WILLIAMS:

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Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Williams that a conditional Level B be granted to Damon Archinard for a C&D, Level B.

Any further discussion?

MS. BORDELON:

Do you still want to approve the application for regulars?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Well, we're going to -- we've got a motion on the floor.

MS. BORDELON:

We'll take care of this motion.

MS. BORDELON:

Okay.

Any discussion?

Is there any objection to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

Now, would you also consider approval of the application for a regular certification?

MR. WYNN:

I would make a motion to approve him

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1 for regular certification as long as he
2 passes his test --

3 MR. BONVILLAIN:

4 No, no.

5 MR. WYNN:

6 The application --

7 MR. BONVILLAIN:

8 The application.

9 MR. WYNN:

10 -- I would approve it for that.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 Provided we verify --

13 MR. BONVILLAIN:

14 The dates.

15 MR. WILLIAMS:

16 The dates.

17 MR. WYNN:

18 Right.

19 MR. BONVILLAIN:

20 Since we have a question --

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 So we need a motion?

23 MR. BONVILLAIN:

24 Okay. Motion by Mr. Wynn that we
25 approve the application for a regular

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1 certificate for Mr. Archinard, subject to
2 verification of the dates of employment.

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 Second.

5 MR. BONVILLAIN:

6 Seconded by Mr. Lagrange.

7 Any further discussion?

8 Okay. Is there any objection to the
9 motion?

10 Okay. Hearing none, the motion
11 passes.

12 Okay. We have one more item we'd
13 like to add to the agenda.

14 Okay. This is a request for a waiver
15 from Clinton Farmer. His certificate has
16 expired. He's requesting a waiver to
17 renew his certificate without having to
18 retest.

19 Is -- I'd like to have a motion to
20 add it to the agenda. This is not to
21 approve it. This is to add it to the
22 agenda.

23 MR. WILLIAMS:

24 So moved.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

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Second.

MR. BARBER:

Moved by Mr. Williams.

Seconded by who?

MR. LAGRANGE:

(INDICATING)

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Mr. Lagrange.

Okay. Motion by Mr. Williams and Mr. Lagrange to add this item to the agenda. Is there any objection to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. I will read his letter and then we can act accordingly. I, Clinton Farmer, am a certified solid waste operator currently employed as operations manager at American Advanced Technologies, LLC in Houma, AAT is a Type I-A, Type II-A solid waste processing facility and services local, industrial, and commercial clients in the Houma, Louisiana area. The facility's primary business is the receipt, processing, separation, storage,

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1 and sale of recovering nonhazardous waste
2 oil to be sold as recycled fuel oil. For
3 reference only, this operator's
4 certificate expired on October 26, 2015.
5 Due to an unintended oversight, the
6 application for renewal of a solid waste
7 operator could not be submitted to the
8 Louisiana Board of Certification and
9 Training for Solid Waste Operators during
10 the timeframe allowed under LAC 46:23.9
11 23.B. Through this letter I herein
12 petition the Board of Certification and
13 Training for Solid Waste Operators for
14 granting a one-time exemption from the
15 reference regulation and allowing late
16 recertification of my solid waste
17 operator's certificate for the next
18 four-year term. This one-time exemption
19 is sought due to the following
20 justification as presented below. Number
21 one, this was an unintended oversight on
22 my part. Number two, there's been no
23 disruption of work performed by me for
24 which the solid waste operator certificate
25 was issued. I remained employed by AAT

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1 during the last four years, and have been
2 responsible for oversight of solid waste
3 management activities currently being
4 performed at the facility. Number three,
5 I have met the requirement of 40 hours of
6 contact training continuing education
7 requirement for the purpose of
8 recertification of my solid waste
9 certificate, copies enclosed. Number
10 four, since I have been attending solid
11 waste workshops each year and earning ten
12 hours of contact training continuing
13 education credit each year, I am eligible
14 for solid waste management requirements.
15 No significant impact on the public
16 health, safety, and welfare in the
17 environment is anticipated from this
18 request for late recertification. Number
19 five, retaking the test will place
20 additional financial burden on me as the
21 oil recycling industry is already going
22 through tough economic times. A complete
23 solid waste operator recertification
24 application along with the late fee of
25 \$200 is enclosed with this submittal.

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1 Your approval in this regard would be
2 appreciated.

3 And he's got his application and his
4 continuing education thing.

5 MR. WYNN:

6 What's this guy's name?

7 MR. BONVILLAIN:

8 Clinton Farmer.

9 Okay. We -- in our regulation, we do
10 allow for late recertification if it's
11 filed within three months of the
12 expiration.

13 MR. WYNN:

14 Correct.

15 MR. BONVILLAIN:

16 This is well past the three month
17 period.

18 MR. WILLIAMS:

19 Yes.

20 MR. BONVILLAIN:

21 Also, in regards to the financial
22 burden of the \$200 --

23 MR. WILLIAMS:

24 There's no --

25 MR. BONVILLAIN:

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It's \$200 either way.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right. He's got to pay it either way for the test --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

He can pay \$100 to take the test and \$100 for the certificate or \$200 for the late recertification. Either way it's \$200.

MR. WILLIAMS:

So, that's not a financial burden.

MR. BARBER:

How long has he been certified?

MS. BORDELON:

Let me see the certificate. Does he have a copy of his certificate there? The current certificate?

MR. FOURRIER:

He really doesn't want to take that test.

MR. WILLIAMS:

I know, but he's going to have to as far as I'm concerned.

MR. LAGRANGE:

While she's looking, Mr. Chairman,

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1 also there is the -- in our regs the
2 exemption section, and I think that's
3 where he got some of his verbiage. It
4 says, the Board may provide exemptions
5 from these regulations or any portion
6 thereof when petitions for such are deemed
7 to result in no significant impact on the
8 public, health, safety, and welfare of the
9 environment.

10 Just for the Board's benefit.

11 MS. BORDELON:

12 It appears he's only been -- for four
13 years, because this certificate was issued
14 in '11.

15 MR. BONVILLAIN:

16 We had one of the applications we
17 proved earlier today, Mr. Hylton, has been
18 certified and his certification expired.
19 He came and he retested.

20 And, for my personal point of view,
21 you know, he just didn't take care of
22 business. I mean, if this would have been
23 a situation where he'd been hospitalized
24 or out of action or something like that
25 and the timeframe had passed, I might be

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1 amenable to it, but as far as I'm
2 concerned he just didn't take care of his
3 business.

4 But, up to the Board. What do you
5 want to do?

6 MR. WYNN:
7 Make a motion he's going to have to
8 take -- retest.

9 MR. BONVILLAIN:
10 Okay.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:
12 Make a motion to deny.

13 MR. WYNN:
14 To deny.

15 MR. BONVILLAIN:
16 Okay. Motion by Mr. Wynn to deny the
17 request.

18 MR. WILLIAMS:
19 (INDICATING)

20 MR. BONVILLAIN:
21 Seconded by Mr. Williams.
22 Any further discussion?
23 Is there any objection to the motion?
24 Okay. Hearing none, the motion
25 passes.

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MR. BARBER:

You just didn't want to be the bad boy and deny.

MR. WYNN:

Well, I seconded it. What do you want from me?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Bubba, don't worry about it, he don't have a clue who you are.

Okay. Public comments. I don't see any public out there. Does anybody else have any comments?

MS. BORDELON:

There is one more thing on the agenda.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Not on my copy.

MS. BORDELON:

Maybe the one that I gave y'all today.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Oh, I'm sorry. I've got it checked off already.

Discuss operator awards and participation. I'm sorry.

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MS. BORDELON:

We had discussed before, a few of us, how we're not getting much very much participation from the facilities that require certified operators to submit nominations for the Landfill, Level A, and B awards -- or BC, rather, for this conference. We send e-mails out notifying operators and their employers to nominate an operator that we're not getting much participation, and we thought maybe a little bit of discussion on how we might can get some more -- get these people to participate more or we had discussed maybe just doing away with the program for a little while and --

MR. WILLIAMS:

What are your thoughts?

MS. BORDELON:

I don't know what else to do. We talked about this about a year ago, and we handed out nomination forms at the workshops to try to get them out there. But maybe that was too soon. We normally -- I normally send out the

1 nomination forms late December.

2 MR. BONVILLAIN:

3 And we did address it at the
4 workshops, you know.

5 MR. WILLIAMS:

6 Yeah.

7 MR. BONVILLAIN:

8 I made the announcement, I know for
9 sure, asking them to please --

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 I've even changed my application to
12 include their e-mail address so that I can
13 try to get more emails from the individual
14 operators or applicants so that when I
15 send those out I have more e-mail
16 addresses. Because if you send it to just
17 the facility owner, you know, operator --
18 main operator, they're not -- half the
19 time they don't distribute them to
20 their -- to the rest of their operators.

21 MR. BARBER:

22 Well, I have an idea. I know we've
23 always left it open to all operators to
24 nominate whoever they wanted to, but what
25 if at our two workshops we have more than

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just an announcement, have a little session on this and at the workshops let the people that are attending that particular workshop nominate two B Level and to A Level from among that group at each one of the two workshops. And then if anybody else wants to nominate through the course of the year from their facility or whatever, but at least that way you would have some participation, people would be aware and they would have -- we would have some nominations way in advance of the conference.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

And we wouldn't have to limit it to two. I mean, we --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right.

MS. BORDELON:

Huh-uh (no). Yeah.

MR. BARBER:

Yeah, I mean, we could have as many as you wanted.

MS. BORDELON:

Well, like I said, and that's --

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MR. BARBER:

At least have an A and a B.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, that's a good point, because at the other workshop we just handed out the forms, but if we told them, fill them out before you leave --

MR. BARBER:

Uh-huh (yes).

MS. BORDELON:

-- and turn them in --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MS. BORDELON:

Maybe.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, and, you know, and they may not have all the information, at least a preliminary portion where we've got the name and the address and who they are. Then we can follow up on it.

Mr. Lagrange?

MR. LAGRANGE:

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1 Yeah, that what's I was going to
2 expound on was that ask them even if it's
3 just to write down the name and the
4 facility and then we get those names and
5 let everyone in the room that wants to put
6 a name down put it down. You may get 20.
7 And then we can mail either that person's
8 supervisor or that person and say, You've
9 been nominated at the workshop, your name
10 was submitted as being nominated to be
11 considered for this award. Here is the
12 complete application, fill it out and
13 return it if you wish to continue to be
14 considered, or something.

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 Yeah, that's a good idea.

17 MR. BONVILLAIN:

18 I like that idea.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 You may get some responses -- the
21 ones that are interested in being
22 considered will take the time to do that
23 and send it back to us.

24 MR. WILLIAMS:

25 So, are we going to allow that to be

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1 the nomination or are we recommending that
2 they been nominated?

3 MR. BONVILLAIN:

4 Well, this is going to be in addition
5 to what we already do.

6 MR. BARBER:

7 That would just be in addition to
8 what -- yeah.

9 MR. WILLIAMS:

10 Okay. All right.

11 MS. HENRY:

12 They may not know that they can
13 nominate their peers.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Right.

16 MS. HENRY:

17 I think right now the perception is
18 that it has to come from management. And
19 they may not know that, you know, it
20 doesn't have to be management level.

21 MR. WILLIAMS:

22 And management may not want to.

23 MS. HENRY:

24 Right. And I think that's --

25 MR. BARBER:

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1 That's true. What if they don't
2 want -- maybe not want to fool with it.

3 MR. WILLIAMS:

4 They may see that someone's maybe
5 getting ahead or getting recognition that
6 they're not getting.

7 MS. HENRY:

8 Right. They don't want to get
9 one-upped.

10 MR. WILLIAMS:

11 So, they may be reluctant --

12 MR. WYNN:

13 That's the big deal.

14 MR. WILLIAMS:

15 -- to do that.

16 MR. BARBER:

17 But -- and I'm going to add this, I
18 have heard comments from some, just,
19 certified operators that doesn't have a
20 connection with someone on this Board or
21 connection with someone at DEQ, they feel
22 like they have no chance to be -- to get
23 the award anyway because they don't have a
24 connection. And I know that's not right,
25 and we all know that, but historically

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1 it's been pretty much this group and the
2 LSWA group that has nominated, because
3 we're more on top of it and aware of it.
4 So -- and I'd like to break that barrier,
5 and let them know that you -- you know, if
6 you meet the qualifications and you're the
7 best nominee, then you have every chance
8 that anybody that has a connection has.

9 MR. BONVILLAIN:

10 And I can tell you from early on when
11 we started these awards, we would get
12 nominations from throughout.

13 MR. WILLIAMS:

14 Uh-huh (yes).

15 MR. BONVILLAIN:

16 Okay. And -- because -- most times I
17 was on the committee that was selecting
18 the winner. And there were names on there
19 I had no clue who they were, but they had
20 a good resume. And they got the award.
21 But I can understand what you're saying
22 about perception.

23 MR. BARBER:

24 Uh-huh (yes).

25 MR. BONVILLAIN:

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1 And especially lately, you know,
2 that's like the only ones that's being
3 nominated.

4 MR. BARBER:

5 Uh-huh (yes).

6 MS. BORDELON:

7 One is to avoid having no
8 nominations.

9 MR. BARBER:

10 Right.

11 MS. BORDELON:

12 And I know a big part of it probably
13 is because I do now e-mail the nomination
14 forms out as opposed to in the past we
15 used to physically mail nomination forms
16 out to every operator. But that was a lot
17 of mail -- was a lot of copying, a lot of
18 mailing, a lot of, you know, postage.
19 That's why I changed -- added the e-mail
20 address to the application so I'm trying
21 to get more of the individual e-mail
22 addresses to be able to send it out.

23 MR. BONVILLAIN:

24 Yeah. But I know certainly at the
25 seminars we can definitely institute that.

1 We don't need a motion or anything, we can
2 go ahead and do it. And since I generally
3 MC those sessions, I'll make sure it
4 happens.

5 MS. BORDELON:

6 Well, I can include it on my talk
7 this year for the --

8 MR. BONVILLAIN:

9 Very good.

10 MR. WILLIAMS:

11 Yeah. That would be a good.

12 MR. BONVILLAIN:

13 That's right. You will be presenting
14 this year, so we can do it at your
15 session. Very good.

16 MR. WILLIAMS:

17 Yeah.

18 MR. BONVILLAIN:

19 Okay. Any other suggestions?

20 And, of course, the Bentley-Mackay
21 award is -- that's nominated by somebody
22 from the Board. So, we'll always have
23 somebody there. I'm not too concerned
24 about that one.

25 MR. WILLIAMS:

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Right.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

And we can have more than one nomination. If we do -- then the Board decides, you know, who it will come down to.

Okay. Any other comments?

Do I hear a motion to adjourn?

MR. WILLIAMS:

I so move.

MR. BARBER:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Second by Mr. Williams -- motion by Mr. Williams, seconded by Mr. Barber.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

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
