# MS. ANDERSON:

So we'll go over the financial statement for June 2013 in your packet. If you turn to Page 1, the balance sheet, the balance in the bank account as of June 30th was \$1,344,551. Reviewing the cash flow without the deferred revenue and the current liabilities, there was an approximate increase of \$200,000 in cash over last year at this time. The accounts receivable hearings and fines line item was \$61,950. Under the asset -- the property and equipment, equipment increased by about \$19,000. That was for budgeted furniture for the lobby and for offices. We obtained furniture through the State contract and we got a 62 and a half percent discount off of retail on that furniture. So that was a pretty good deal for that much furniture. On the vehicles line item, we purchased a 2013 Dodge Avenger to replace a vehicle that we were -- that the field investigators were using to -- that was no longer operational,

and so that vehicle was not operational.

Current liabilities, as of June 30, were \$47,271. And on Page 2, the deferred revenues was roughly \$306,000. Page 3 is the revenue and expenditure statement. The annual budget shown there has been amended per the budget amendments that were passed at the last meeting. about midway down the page, the year-to-date revenues were \$1,141,931, which was down about \$102,000 from last year. The fee revenue was up \$36,898, but we had a lot of hearing fines last year. So that part was down about \$124,000. We had some big cases last year that we completed. On the expenditure side, year-to-date salaries and related benefits were \$711,720 compared to \$659,000 in 2012. The remainder of the expenditures were down from -- decreased from the prior year.

On Page 5 of this report, the year-to-date expenses were \$931,662, which is down about \$8,700 from last year. Net loss for June was \$50,400, but our year-to-date income was \$210,629 compared to

\$303,679 last year. And, of course, these are unaudited figures. So we'll probably have some accruals that will happen after we go through the audit.

Okay. And turning on to the next page, the revenue and expenditures comparison, that shows you our revenue, expenditures and fund balance compared to last year by month. And the following page is a graph of that. You can see our -- we have a healthy fund balance. It went down a little bit, but we're still ahead of last year.

On Page 8, the accounts receivable hearings, fines, we've had some activity in there. The total was \$61,950. The changes included -- we collected \$23,875 from Car Boyz and the -- and we charged A-Plus Autoplex, L.L.C. \$500.

And on Page 9, the certificate of deposit summary is unchanged from the last report.

1 The next item on there, 2 Executive Director's report, is just general information I kind of want to let you all 3 4 know what's going on. I did speak with Holly Robinson, who is the assistant to the 5 6 Board Commission's Director, about our 7 replacing a Commissioner. I was informed 8 that the Director, Kendal Melvin of the 9 Board of Commissions with the Office of the 10 Governor, she resigned shortly after the 11 2013 legislative session, which means we 12 will not get a replacement until the 13 Governor has replaced the Director of that 14 So I don't know how far out that position. 15 will be.
