Certification

Pursuant to the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act, the Governor declared a Public Health emergency in Proclamation Number 25 JBE 2020 due to the COVID-19 outbreak in Louisiana. Additional measures are now necessary to further protect the health and safety of the public; therefore, in accordance with Proclamation Number JBE 2020-30, Section 4, I hereby certify:

- 1) That the Louisiana Public Defender Board (LPDB) has urgent issues upon which to act which require adherence to the Open Meetings Law, in particular, quorum requirements;
- 2) That given the expansion of the COVID-19 outbreak, the Louisiana Public Defender Board should not call a meeting in a public venue;
- 3) That, during the pendency of this emergency, attendance shall be provided for and allowed via teleconference or videoconference;
- 4) That all efforts shall be made to provide for observation and input by the public; and
- 5) That this certification shall be posted at the same time and in the same manner as the agenda for any LPDB meeting until further notice from the Governor.
