PART 1 - GENERAL

1.01 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The provisions of the entire contract documents are hereby made a part of this section.

1.02 STANDARDS

Meet the requirements and recommendations of the applicable portions of the latest edition of Guidelines by the Consumer Product Safety Commission Publication No. 325, Standards by the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM Standard #1487-07) and the Americans with Disabilities Act Architectural Guidelines (ADAAG) as set forth in the Federal Register.

1.03 SUBMITTALS

If bidding other than the specified product, contractors shall submit the following information within 10 calendar days of the bid opening date, along with a list of deviations from the actual specified items.

- A. Submit product data on all materials specified herein.
- B. Submit complete shop drawings showing all dimensions, details, and specifications of equipment.
- C. Submit colored 3-D drawings
- D. Submit proof of warranty as specified herein.
- E. Submit a detailed list of any deviations from the specified product.
- F. Submit IPEMA certification showing compliance with all applicable portions of the current ASTM F-1487 Standard.

PART 2 - PRODUCTS

2.01 MANUFACTURER

Basis of design is Landscape Structures, Inc. as listed for each of the following Playgrounds:

- 1.) **Lemon Playground:** (1) # 177332A 2-seat single post swing, (2) #182503 Age appropriate Welcome signs, (2) #CL208794 CUSTOM age appropriate signs with JPRD colored logo, (1) Custom Aluminum PlayBooster structure (5-12 yrs.), (1) Custom Aluminum PlayShaper structure (2-5 yrs.) per design #78909, (3) #141683B 6' TenderTuff (vinyl coated) benches with backs or Equal.
- 2.) **Jesse Owens Playground:** (1) # 177332/33A 4-seat single post swing (*Set at 7' beam height), (2) #182503 Age appropriate Welcome signs, (2) #CL208794 CUSTOM age appropriate signs with JPRD colored logo, (1) Custom Aluminum PlayBooster structure (5-12 yrs.), (1) Custom Aluminum PlayShaper structure (2-5 yrs.) per design #69265, (2) #141683B 6' TenderTuff (vinyl coated) benches with backs or "_ Equal".

2.02 SCOPE

- 1.) **Lemon Playground:** This section includes all materials, components, and associated accessories to complete and install the playground equipment/site furnishings specified, or approved equal. **JPRD will remove and dispose of existing equipment and rubber surfacing.**
- 2.) **Jesse Owens Playground:** This section includes all materials, components, and associated accessories to complete and install the playground equipment/site furnishings specified, or approved equal. Contractor must add a minimum of 350 s.f. of concrete to existing slab. **JPRD will remove and dispose of existing equipment and rubber surfacing.**

2.03 GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

- A. **MATERIAL:** All materials shall be structurally sound and suitable for safe play. Durability shall be insured on all steel parts by the use of time tested coatings such as zinc plating, galvanizing, ProShield finish, Tendertuff (PVC) coating, etc. Color shall be specified.
- B. **HARDWARE (FASTENERS):** Primary fasteners shall be socketed and pinned tamper-proof in design, stainless steel (SST) per ASTM #F879 unless otherwise indicated. All primary fasteners shall include a locking patch type material that will meet the minimum torque requirements of IFI-125. The material, when allowed the 72-hour cure time, shall require a minimum of 4 times the installation torque to remove the fastener. Manufacturer to provide special tools for pinned hex fasteners. **NOTE: HARDWARE SHALL BE VANDAL RESISTANT.**
- C. **TENDERTUFF COATING (or equal):** All metal components to be Tendertuff-coated shall be thoroughly cleaned in a hot phosphatizing pressure washer, and then primed with a water-based thermosetting solution. Primed parts shall be preheated prior to dipping in U.V. stabilized, liquid poly vinyl chloride (PVC), and then salt cured at approximately 400 degrees. The finished coating shall be approximately .080" thick plus or minus .020", at an 85-durometer hardness and have a matte finish. Standard colors are brown, tan, red, and blue.
- D. **PROSHIELD FINISH (or equal):** All material components with ProShield finish shall be thoroughly cleaned and phosphatized through a five-stage power washer. Parts are then thoroughly dried, preheated and processed through a set of automatic powder spray guns where a minimum .002" of epoxy primer is applied. The parts are allowed to cool and then pass through a second set of automatic powder spray guns. A minimum .004" of architectural-grade Super-Durable polyester TGIC powder is applied. The parts are oven-cured at 400 degrees F metal temperature for 10 minutes. The average ProShield film thickness is .006"

ProShield is formulated and tested per the following ASTM standards. Each color must meet or exceed the ratings listed below:

1. Adhesion (D-3359B) rating 5B
2. Hardness (D-3363) rating 2H

3. Impact (D-2794) rating minimum 80 inch-pounds
 4. Salt Fog Resistance (B-117 & D1654) 4000 hrs; rating 7 or greater
 5. UV Exposure (G154, 340 bulb) 3,000 hrs; rating delta E of 2 and 90% gloss retention
- E. **DECKS:** All Tenderdecks (Or Equal) shall be of modular design and have 5/16" diameter holes on the standing surface. There shall be a minimum of (4) slots in each face to accommodate face mounting of components. Tenderdecks shall be manufactured from a single piece of low carbon 12 gauge (.105") sheet steel conforming to ASTM specification A-569. The sheet shall be perforated then flange formed and reinforced as necessary to ensure structural integrity. The unit shall then be Tendertuff coated brown only. Tenderdecks shall be designed so that all sides are flush with the outside edge of the supporting posts.
- F. **ROTATIONALLY MOLDED POLY PARTS:** These parts shall be molded using prime compounded linear low-density polyethylene with a tensile strength of 2500 psi per ASTM D638 and with color and UV stabilizing additives. Wall thickness varies by product from .187" (3/16") to .312" 5/16". Four standard colors are available.
- G. **PERMALENE PARTS (Or equal):** These parts shall be manufactured from 3/4" thick high-density polyethylene that has been specially formulated for optimum U.V. stability and color retention. Compression molded products shall meet or exceed density of .960 G/cc per ASTM D1505, tensile strength of 2400 PSI per ASTM D638. Standard solid colors are tan, red, blue, green, and yellow. Some Permalene parts are available in a two-color product with (2) .100" thick exterior layers over a .550" interior core of contrasting color. Eight standard two-color options are available.
- H. **FOOTINGS:** Unless otherwise specified, all footings shall be for shall be designed for a 2" below grade surface mount application (**exception – Swings, and Cascade climber**)
- I. **MAINTENANCE KIT:** An order-specific maintenance kit shall be provided for each structure order. The kit shall include a notebook or packet with a 2nd set of installation documents and order-specific documentation with recommendations on how often to inspect, what to look for and what to do to keep the equipment in like-new condition. The kit also includes touch up primer, appropriate color touch up paint, sand paper, appropriate color touch up PVC, graffiti remover and additional installation tools for the tamperproof fasteners.

2.04 PLAYGROUND GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

- A. **POSTS:** Post length shall vary depending upon the intended use and shall be a minimum of 42" above the deck height. All posts shall be Powdercoated as specified. All posts shall have a "finish grade marker" positioned on the post identifying the top of the protective surfacing. Top caps for posts shall be aluminum die casts from 369.1 aluminum alloy and Powdercoated to match the post color. All caps shall be factory installed and secured in place with (3) self-sealing rivets. A molded low-density polyethylene cap, with drain holes, shall be pressed onto the bottom end of the post to increase the footing area from 2 square inches to 20 square inches.
1. PlayShaper Posts: 2-3/8" square aluminum posts shall have a minimum wall thickness of .125" and be extruded of 6061-T6 aluminum alloy and have rounded

corners and ribbed faces for maximum safety. A cast aluminum top cap shall be installed at the factory with stainless steel knurled spacers and aluminum drive rivets. Flanges for panels and deck supports shall be extruded of 6061-T6 aluminum alloy and slide into slots extruded in posts. Flanges and deck supports shall be attached in the factory with stainless steel knurled spacers and aluminum drive rivets. All direct bury posts shall have a "finish grade marker" positioned on the post identifying the 34" bury line and the top of the required surfacing. A molded low density polyethylene cap shall be pressed onto the bottom end of the post at the factory providing a spread footing. Posts shall have a post number sticker for installation purposes. All surface mount posts shall be continuously welded to a 1/4" x 5" diameter 6061-T6 aluminum surface mount plate and allow for 2" of protective surfacing. Posts shall be powder-coated as specified. **NOTE: STEEL POSTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE DUE TO RUSTING.**

2. PlayBooster Posts: Aluminum posts are constructed of 6005-T5 extruded tubing conforming to ASTM B-221 and QQ-A-200/8. Posts shall have a 5" outside diameter with a .125" wall thickness. Yield Strength min. 35,000 psi, Tensile Strength min. 38,000 psi elongation in 2" =10, Modulus of Elasticity = 10 x 10(6) psi. **NOTE: STEEL POSTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE DUE TO RUSTING - (ACCEPTION ON SWING POSTS).**

B. **PLAYBOOSTER CLAMPS**: All clamps, unless otherwise noted, shall be die cast with a 369.1 aluminum alloy and have the following mechanical properties:

1. Ultimate Tensile: 47,000 PSI
2. Yield Strength: 28,000 PSI
3. Elongation: 7% in 2 inches
4. Shear Strength: 29,000 PSI
5. Endurance Limit: 20,000 PSI

Each functional clamp assembly shall have an appropriate number of half clamps and fastened to mating parts with (2) 3/8" x 1 1/8" hex-pin cap screws (SST) and (2) zinc/nickel plated carbon steel recessed "T" nuts. 1/4" aluminum rivet with stainless steel pin is used to insure a secure fit to the post. **NOTE: BOLT THRU DESIGNS (NON-CLAMP) ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE ON 5-12 PLAYSTRUCTURE.**

C. **RAILS, HANDLOOPS**: These parts shall be constructed of 1-1/8" O.D. Steel Tubing with a .120" wall thickness. Each end of the rail/handloop shall have a stainless steel knurled, welded insert with 5/8" internal threads. Exposed rails, and handloops shall be Tendertuff-coated (or equal).

D. **TENDERDECKS**: (or equal) All Tenderdecks shall conform to the General Specifications and utilize 3/8" Stainless steel welded studs with stainless steel nuts and washers to secure them to deck hanger clamps. Optional shapes are listed below.

1. ONE-PIECE SQUARE DECK: This Tenderdeck (or equal) shall conform to the "General Specifications" identified above. Finished size of this deck is 47" x 47" x 2-5/8".

2. 90 DEGREE TRI-DECK: This Tenderdeck (or equal) shall conform to the "General Specifications". The finished size of two of three sides measure 2 5/8" x 37 7/8" on the face of the deck and the other shall measure 2 5/8" x 43 3/4".

3. 8" & 16" KICK PLATE: Shall be fabricated from 11 GA HR flat steel finished with a Tender tuff coating (or equal).

F. COMPONENTS AND ATTACHED PLAY EVENTS:

1. HANDHOLD ENCLOSURES: PERMALENE (Or Equal) enclosure panels are attached to PlayBooster posts with two (2) offset hanger assemblies with bolt extensions and to deck faces with four (4) 3/8" standard fasteners. Enclosures shall extend above the deck a minimum of 38".

2. PIPE BARRIERS: Barrier weldment shall be comprised of 5/8" solid steel vertical rails, 1 1/8" O.D. x 11 GA (.120") steel horizontal rails with 203 or 303 stainless steel welded inserts with 5/8" internal threads, 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" x 29 1/2" angle iron. Barrier measures 33 7/8" wide x 39 13/16" high. After fabrication, the entire unit shall be TenderTuff-coated (Or Equal).

3. WIRE BARRIER: the top and bottom horizontal rails shall be constructed of 1.05" O.D. scheduled 40 tubing. The vertical outside members shall be constructed of 1/4" x 1" flat steel and shall attach to flanges on posts with 3/8" standard fasteners. The inside of the barrier shall be constructed of 3/16" diameter wire welded to the top, bottom and sides. The spacing of the wire shall be 2" high x 3" wide. After fabrication, entire unit shall be TenderTuff-coated (Or Equal)

4. BALCONY DECK (or equal): Deck shall be straight edge flange formed from 12 GA (.105) sheet steel conforming to ASTM A569. Standing surface is perforated with 5/16" diameter holes. The finished size measures 2 5/8" x 34" (straight edge) x 17" radius (curved edge). Unit shall be TenderTuff coated (Or Equal). Barrier weldment is comprised of 5/8" solid steel vertical rails; 1 1/8" O.D. steel horizontal rails with 203 or 303 stainless steel welded inserts with 5/8" internal threads. Barrier shall be TenderTuff coated (Or Equal).

5. PERMALENE PANELS (Or Equal): All Panels shall be manufactured from Permalene (see general specifications). Panel size is 35-5/8" wide x 41" high. REACH panels measure 35 5/8" x 18" high. The panel shall have attached to the posts with two (2) offset hanger assemblies with extension sleeves and standard 3/8" fasteners. Panels shall be secured to the face of the deck with four (4) 3/8" standard fasteners. Panels shall be as follows:

6. TRANSFER MODULE: The 16" high Transfer Module shall be 36" square with rounded edges, 7/8" holes. Finish shall be Tendertuff coated – brown in color. Steps shall be 36" wide, 14" deep, formed from 12 GA (.105) sheet steel

conforming to ASTM A569. Finish shall be Tendertuff coated – brown in color. Railing weldment shall be comprised of formed 1/8" O.D. steel tubing x 11 GA. (.120") steel tubing with 203 or 303 stainless steel 5/8" threaded inserts. Finish shall be Tendertuff coated (or equal), per the (4) standard color selection. Transfer deck leg weldment shall be comprised of 5" O.D. x 11 GA (.120") galvanized steel tubing and 1/4" x 8" zinc plated HRPO mounting plate. Finish shall be powdercoat – brown in color. **NOTE: EXPANDED METAL DECKS AND STEPS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.**

7. **SLIDE HOOD:** Single and double slide hoods, when identified, shall be rotationally molded from U.V. stabilized linear low-density polyethylene, color as specified, to provide a full enclosure. Hoods shall extend 38" above the deck and attach to posts as an enclosure. **NOTE: SIT-DOWN CHAINS & BARS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE AS A SUBSTITUTE FOR SLIDE HOODS. SLIDE HOODS THAT INCLUDE BARS ARE ACCEPTABLE.**
8. **DOUBLE POLY AND DOUBLE SWOOSH SLIDES (Or Equal):** Bedways shall be rotationally molded from U.V. stabilized linear low-density polyethylene, color as specified. Unit shall be designed with minimum of 6" high sidewalls, 16" wide sliding surfaces, 15" or greater exit length and a center divider for double bedways. Slide shall have an average sliding slope of 30 degrees and face mount with standard 3/8" fasteners into molded-in "T" nuts. Powdercoated slide base "T" supports shall have a single 2.375" O.D. RS-20 (.095" -.105") galvanized steel tubing and 1/4" x 3" mounting plate. Mid support shall be comprised of 1.660" O.D. RS-20 (.085"-.095") galvanized steel tubing and 1/4" x 3" mounting plate, with a powdercoat finish. Single and double slides shall include a slide hood with a built in sit-down bar extruded from 1.125" OD x .312 W. 6061-T6 aluminum with a powdercoat finish. Primary fasteners shall be socketed and pinned, tamperproof in design, stainless steel (SST) per ASTM F879.
9. **CLOUDBURST SLIDE (or equal):** Bedways shall be rotationally molded from U.V. stabilized linear low-density polyethylene, color as specified. Unit shall be designed with minimum of 6" high sidewalls, 16" wide sliding surfaces, 15" or greater exit length and 2 center dividers. Slide shall have an average sliding slope of 30 degrees and face mount with standard 3/8" fasteners into molded-in "T" nuts. Slide base "T" supports shall have a single 2.375" O.D. RS-20 (.095" -.105") galvanized steel tubing and 1/4" x 3" mounting plate. Mid support shall be comprised of 1.660" O.D. RS-20 (.085"-.095") galvanized steel tubing and 1/4" x 3" mounting plate, with a ProShield (Or Equal) finish. Slide hood shall be rotationally molded from U.V. linear low density polyethylene and shall incorporate a built in sit-down bar extruded from 1.125" OD x .312 W. 6061-T6 aluminum. Primary fasteners shall be socketed and pinned, tamperproof in design, stainless steel (SST) per ASTM F879.
10. **FIREPOLES:** Poles shall be constructed of 1.900" O. D. galvanized steel tubing. Formed overhead rail is 1.315" O.D. RS-20 galvanized steel tubing. Handhold panel shall be solid color Permalene (or equal). Spacer tube shall be made from 2011-T3 aluminum 3/4" O.D. x 1 11/16". Unit to have a ProShield (Or Equal) finish
11. **OVERHEAD PARALLEL BARS (or equal):** Weldment is comprised of 2.375" OD RS-40 galvanized steel tubing, 1.315" OD x RS-20 galvanized steel tubing and

cast 535 aluminum magnesium attachment brackets with a ProShield (Or Equal) finish. Hanger clamp assembly is cast aluminum. Overhead event offers two different challenges and ways for upper body activity.

12. 2" HORIZONTAL LADDER (or equal): The ladder weldment is comprised of 2.375" O.D. RS-40 (.130"-.140") galvanized steel tubing, 1.125" O.D. x 11 GA (.120") zinc plated steel and casted 535 aluminum magnesium attachment brackets with a ProShield (Or Equal) finish
13. LOOP LADDER (or equal): The weldment is comprised of 1.125" OD x 11 GA black steel tubing with a Tendertuff coated finish. Handhold panels are solid color permalene with ¾" x 1 1/8" handholds. The entire unit is TenderTuff (Or Equal) coated.
14. SUMMIT CLIMBER (or equal): Unit shall be rotationally molded from U.V. stabilized from linear low-density polyethylene, color as specified. The handhold panels shall be solid color Permalene (or equal) with ¾" x 1 1/8" handholds.
15. VERTICAL ASCENT (or equal): Unit shall consist of two solid color Permalene(or equal) handhold panels and a Permalene panel with polyester resin hand/fooholds. Hand/fooholds measure approximately 5 ¾" long x 2 ¼" wide x 1 ¾" high. Panels shall attach to deck with standard 3/8" fasteners and to posts with aluminum spacer tubes made from 2011-T3 aluminum ¾" O.D. x 1 11/16".
16. SUNBEAM CLIMBER (or equal): Climber weldment is comprised of 1.315" O.D. RS20 (.080"- .090" wall) galvanized steel tube, 2.375" O.D. RS40 galvanized steel tube, and 1/4" HRPO steel sheet with a ProShield finish (or equal). The barrier weldment is comprised of 1.125" O.D. 11 Ga. (.120") steel tube per ASTM A513 with 203 or 303 stainless steel threaded insert with 5/8" internal threads and 1/4" tabs with a TenderTuff (or equal) coated finish. Hand loop weldment is comprised of 1.125" O.D. 11 GA (.120") steel tubing with 203 or 303 stainless steel inserts, with 5/8" internal threads with a TenderTuff (or equal) finish. Infill panel is Permalene, color as specified.
17. VERTICAL LADDER (or equal): Weldment shall be comprised of 1.125" x O.D. 11 GA (.120") steel tubing, 1.029" O.D. RS-20 and 3/16" x 2" wide steel flat plates. Finish shall be TenderTuff coated (or equal), as specified. Footer shall be fabricated from 1.315" O.D. RS-20 (.080"- .090") galvanized steel tubing. Ladder shall consist of two handhold solid color Permalene panels (see general specification for panels). The Permalene panels (or equal) shall attach to posts with aluminum spacer tubes made from 2011-T3 aluminum ¾" O.D. x 1 11/16" with a ProShield (Or Equal) finish and two (2) offset hanger clamp assemblies.
18. CORKSCREW CLIMBER (or equal): The weldment is comprised of 1.900" O.D. RS-20 galvanized steel tubing and 1.315" O.D. RS-20 galvanized steel tubing with a ProShield (or equal) finish. The overhead rails are formed from 1.315" O.D. RS-20 galvanized steel tubing. Handholds shall be solid color Permalene (or equal). Spacer tube is made from 2011-T3 aluminum ¾" O.D. x 1 11/16".

19. DECK LINK (or equal): Upper infill panel shall be solid color Permalene (or equal) measuring 6" x 37" high. Lower infill panel shall be solid color Permalene measuring 6" x 41" high. Step section is formed from 12 GA sheet steel conforming to ASTM A569. Standing surface is 24 ¼" wide x 14" deep and is perforated with 5/16" diameter holes with a Tender tuff coated finish (or equal). Handrail weldment is comprised of 1 1/8" OD x 11 GA steel tubing and 1/8" HR flat steel with a Tender tuff coated finish (or equal).
20. CASCADE CLIMBER (or equal): Panels are solid color Permalene (or equal), color specified. The barrier weldment is comprised of 1.125" O.D. 11 Ga. (.120") steel tube per ASTM A513 with 203 or 303 stainless steel threaded inserts with 5/8" internal threads and 1/4" tabs. Finish: TenderTuff-coated (or equal). The support pipe weldment is comprised of 2.375" O.D. RS40 galvanized steel tube, 1/4" x 1 1/4" HR flat steel and 12 Ga. (.105") sheet HRPO steel. Clamps are cast aluminum.
21. GRID WALK (or equal): Wire ramp weldment is comprised of ¼" x 2 ½" x 30" steel plates, 1.660" OD schedule 40 black steel tubing, 1.125" OD x 11GA black steel tubing and ¼" diameter wire with a TenderTuff (or equal) finish.
Handrail weldment is comprised of 1.900" OD RS-40 galvanized steel. Tubing, 1.315" OD RS-20 galvanized steel tubing and ¼" x 1 ¼" steel half clamps.
22. 42" ARCH BRIDGE (or equal): Bridge is fabricated from 12 GA (.105) sheet steel conforming to ASTM A569. Standing surface is perforated with 5/16" diameter holes. Unit is TenderTuff (or equal) coated brown. Panel barrier is solid color Permalene, 35 5/8" wide x 41" high. **NOTE: EXPANDED METAL DECKS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.**
19. WHEEL: The 12" diameter wheel with offset hub shall be cast from 319.1 aluminum alloy. The wheel shall be Tendertuff-coated with a 303 stainless steel shaft. The wheel clamp is formed from 3/16" x 2" HRP) zinc plated and a powdercoat finish. **NOTE: PLASTIC OR PAINTED STEEL WHEELS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.**

EQUIPMENT SOFTILE LAYOUT






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Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the

cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" or "UAVG" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of

each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:
