MINUTES OF THE

RED RIVER WATERWAY COMMISSION MEETING

August 21, 2019 10:00 AM

1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the Red River Waterway Commission was called to order by Chair Designee, Troy Roussell, in the Board Room of the Red River Waterway Commission Office located at 5941 Highway 1 By-Pass in Natchitoches, Louisiana.

2. ROLL CALL

Roll was called and a quorum was present. Others in attendance were asked to identify themselves and offer any comments they may have regarding the agenda. However, no comments were offered.

4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

By motion of Commissioner Burrell, seconded by Commissioner Greer, the agenda was unanimously approved. Comments from the public were called for, however, none were offered.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

By motion of Commissioner Burrell, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the minutes of the July 17, 2019 meeting were unanimously approved.

6. TREASURER'S REPORT

By motion of Commissioner Greer, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the Expenditures, Financial Statements, Investment Reports, & Fund Balance Report for the month of July 2019 were unanimously approved

7. COMMITTEE REPORTS

a) Contracts

Consideration of Colfax RV Park Activity Center Addition Project: By motion of Commissioner Lattier, seconded by Commissioner Fleming, the Commission unanimously approved authorizing staff to proceed with investigation of options and an estimated cost to add a porch that extends the length of the Colfax RV Park Activity Center building and present to the Commission at the September 18, 2019 meeting.

<u>Consideration of Cooperative Endeavor Agreement/City of Alexandria/Alexandria Levee Park Development:</u> By motion of Commissioner Lattier, seconded by Commissioner Greer, the Commission unanimously approved the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the City of Alexandria for Phase I of the Alexandria Levee Development project. The Commission agrees to pay 80% of the Phase I (land side levee features) construction cost up to \$3,249,120.00.

<u>Consideration of Bid/RRWC Project No. 19-01/Contract No. RRW-749/Coushatta Recreation Area-Dock Construction:</u> By motion of Commissioner Lattier, seconded by Commissioner Simpson, the Commission unanimously approved award of bid to Testament Construction Services in the amount of \$932,973.38 for the Coushatta Recreation Area dock project.

Consideration of Change Order No. 5/Teague Parkway and Stoner Avenue Dock Rehabilitation/RRWC Project No. 15-06/Contract NO. RRW-730: By motion of Commissioner Lattier, seconded by Commissioner Burrell, the Commission unanimously approved change order number 5 to increase the contract cost by \$48,840.56, with no budget amendment required, establishing a final contract cost of \$2,732,197.17 and increase the contract time by 444 days.

<u>Consideration of Approval of GIS Consultant Contract/PPMP, LLC:</u> By motion of Commissioner Lattier, seconded by Commissioner Burrell, the Commission unanimously approved contracting with GIS Consultant, Tyler Jusselin of PMP, LLC at an hourly rate of \$65.00 per hour.

<u>Consideration of Ratification of Dredging Contract/Crosby Dredging:</u> By motion of Commissioner Lattier, seconded by Commissioner Burrell, the Commission unanimously approved the ratification, and final negotiated contract with Crosby Dredging to perform channel dredging on the Red River.

b) Land Management, Legal Affairs & Affirmative Action

Consideration of Authority to Award Land Lease Extension/Lock & Dam 2, Tract 14, Segments A & B/20 Acres:

By motion of Commissioner Sayes, seconded by Commissioner Burrell, the Commission unanimously approved award of the 5-year lease extension agreement with Mr. Charles Bob Stevens for \$3,300.00 (\$33.00 per acre) for the 5-year term.

<u>Consideration of Authority for Water Well Installation/Grand Ecore Recreation Area Land Lease:</u> By motion of Commissioner Sayes, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the Commission unanimously approved authorizing staff to hire Red River Well Service to install a 4 inch well casing on the leased property at a cost of \$2,750.00.

c) Recreation

<u>Recreation Area Status Report</u> - Mr. Mike Boydstun highlighted the prepared report provided in the meeting packet, noting that there had been 153,000 visitors to the District recreation areas during the month of July 2019. Updated maintenance items include, but not limited to:

- Have determined 38 sites for dredging
- Dredging will be done at openings of oxbows
- A cutterhead dredge is currently at the Stoner Avenue Recreation Area, however the Stoner Avenue site is still closed
- A final cleanup of the Alexandria Recreation Area completed August 20th and the launch is now open

<u>Consideration of Funding Request/Caddo-Bossier Port/Project Essence:</u> Caddo-Bossier Port requested removal from the agenda. No action was taken.
