13. Presentation: Severn Ave. Corridor

By: David Dupre and Charles Caplinger Of Meyer Engineers and Perez, APC Maggie Woodruff of the RPC staff introduced Mr. Dupre & Mr. Caplinger to the board. Mr. Dupre & Mr. Caplinger updated the board on a nearly-completed feasibility study commissioned by the RPC aimed at turning Severn Avenue into a more attractive, pedestrian- and bicycle-friendly corridor. They outlined proposed improvements including widened sidewalks, a "parklet" with street furniture, a dedicated bike lane running between 18th Street and W. Esplanade Avenue, upgraded pedestrian and street lighting, treatments to screen parking structures, new vegetation along the median and to disguise power poles and the possible removal of some curb cuts to minimize conflicts between cars and pedestrians and bicyclists. The work would also include drainage improvements. The current estimated cost of construction for the full slate of projects is just under \$8 million. Mr. Brooks thanked Mr. Dupre & Mr. Caplinger for their presentation.
