

Tony Duvall was present on behalf of DUVALL SERVICES, LLC and was sworn in. Mr. Duvall gave a statement affirming that there was a lapse in insurance coverage for General Liability, but has proof of no lapse for Worker's Compensation. Mr. Castjohn made a motion to revoke the license back to the date of last insurance coverage for the General Liability, assess \$250 in administrative costs, to issue a cease and desist order, and to allow the company to reapply for license/registration in 30 days if there was a lapse in coverage. Mr. Ward seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Rawls gave a summary of the allegations. Blake Sebastian was present on behalf of BLAKE SEBASTIEN D/B/A BPS CONTRACTORS and was sworn in. Mr. Sebastian gave a statement and requested a continuance for this matter. Mr. Castjohn made a motion to grant the continuance. Mr. Ward seconded. Mr. Sebastian agreed to waive formal notice of the next hearing for June 17, 2015.

3. **EDGAR LANDOR D/B/A LANDOR & ASSOCIATES CARPENTRY**, Paulina, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2175.2 (A)(1).

Mr. Rawls gave a summary of the allegations. No one was present on behalf of EDGAR LANDOR D/B/A LANDOR & ASSOCIATES CARPENTRY. Investigator Carl Bourque was called to the stand and was sworn in. Mr. Bourque reviewed the exhibit packet. Ms. Sims entered the exhibit packet into evidence and it was admitted. Mr. Castjohn made a motion to find EDGAR LANDOR D/B/A LANDOR & ASSOCIATES CARPENTRY to be in violation, to assess the maximum fine plus \$1000 in administrative costs, to issue a cease and desist order, and to turn over this matter to the local District Attorney's office. Mr. Gibson seconded. The motion passed.

4. **TONKON WILLIAMS**, Minden, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2175.2 (A)(1).

Mr. Rawls gave a summary of the allegations. TONKON WILLIAMS was present and was sworn in. Mr. Williams entered a guilty plea. Mr. Castjohn made a motion to accept the plea. Mr. Wyman seconded. The motion passed. Mr. Williams gave a statement and supplied documents to the board from the Secretary of State's office. Ms. Sims entered the documents Mr. Williams supplied into evidence and they were admitted. Mr. Williams changed his previous guilty plea to a no contest plea. Mr. Castjohn made a motion to amend the original plea. Mr. Wyman seconded. The motion passed. Ms. Gibson made a motion to fine TONKON WILLIAMS the maximum fine plus \$500 in administrative costs, to issue a cease and desist order, and to reduce the fine to \$500 plus \$500 in administrative costs if Mr. Williams obtains a license or registration in 90 days. Mr. Wyman seconded. The motion passed.

5. **WILBERT THOMAS D/B/A QUALITY ROOFING AND CARPENTRY**, Baton Rouge, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2175.2 (A)(1).

Mr. Rawls gave a summary of the allegations. No one was present on behalf of WILBERT THOMAS D/B/A QUALITY ROOFING AND CARPENTRY. Homeowners Martha and Carl Robinson were present and were sworn in. Investigator Carl Bourque, who was previously sworn in, was called to the stand and reviewed the exhibit packet. Ms. Sims entered the exhibit packet into evidence and it was admitted. Mr. and Mrs. Robinson gave a statement. Mr. Castjohn made a motion to find WILBERT THOMAS D/B/A QUALITY ROOFING AND CARPENTRY to be in violation, to assess the maximum fine plus \$1000 in administrative costs, to issue a cease and desist order, and to turn over this matter to the local District Attorney's office. Ms. Gibson seconded. The motion passed.
