MIZE: Mr. President, on the application it's 15 got the number, for formal education, it's got 16 nine years. I think an A is supposed to have a 17 18 high school diploma or equivalent. This is only 19 showing nine. 20 MR. LAGRANGE: 21 This is on Rene Duhon's application? 22 MR. MIZE: 23 Yes, sir. 24 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. 25

MR. MIZE: 1 Have they taken a test? 2 3 MS. BORDELON: They did come and take the test the day 4 5 before yesterday in the office and they both passed. 6 MR. STEWART: Doesn't have a GED, right? 8 9 MS. BORDELON: 10 And I apologize; I completely 11 overlooked that. SHARAFKHANI: 14 15 well, I mean, three days, if you start 16 at 8:30 and ending at 5:00, you know, that's not ten hours. And an hour and a half for lunch. . 17 MR. MIZE: 18 Can I ask Mr. Breaux a question? 19 MR. LAGRANGE: 20 21 Sure... MR. MIZE: 22 Do y'all get thirty hours when y'all go 23 24 to the MOLO training? 25 MR. DON BREAUX:

It's that time in three days. MOLO 1 courses are eight hours for three days and a four 2 hour test on your fourth day. 3 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Oh, okay. 5 MR. DON BREAUX: 6 It's even more comprehensive than 7 anything that we do in Louisiana. 8 MR. LAGRANGE: 9 Thank you. Mr. Bonvillain? 10 MR. GARY BONVILLAIN: 11 I'd just like to make a comment. 12 13 past, when I was at St. Landry, I had an 14 individual that would go to the MOLO courses, and he was granted thirty hours for the MOLO courses 15 in the past. 16

MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

And one other comment is that if you're going to approve the CEU hours, if you approve the hours for Mr. O'Mary, whoever that is, then you approve the hours in general. Since he's got credit for it, then you approve those hours.

And Damian Wiltz, 17 18 C. & D, Level B. 19 MR. LAGRANGE: I'll entertain a motion to issue those 20 certificates. 21 22 MR. MIZE: 23 So moved. 24 MR. LYONS: 25 Second.

1 MR. LAGRANGE: -Moved by Mr. Mize. Seconded by Mr. 2 Lyons. Any other discussion? All in favor 3 signify by saying "aye". 4 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY) 5 MR. LAGRANGE: 6 Opposed, nay? Motion carried. 7 Next we have review request for 8 conditional certification from Daria Ransom Jones. 9 She's at Gator Environmental Waste Solutions in 10 Sorento. This is a C & D. Level B. 11 MR. SHARAFKHANI: 12 Mr. Chairman, is this a conditional or a 13 regular certification? 14 15 MS. BORDELON: She's asking for a conditional. 16 MR. LAGRANGE: 17 Is it conditional out of need for the 18 facility or --19 20 MS. BORDELON: . Right. Right now they have two 21 22 conditional Level B's and one regular Level A. MR. LAGRANGE: 23 24 She gave a detailed description of her 25 work.

1 MS. BORDELON: And she has come in and passed the test 2 as well. She also attended the training in 3 4 Shreveport. 5 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Mr. Chairman, my question is she just 6 started working for the company, and she could 7 qualify for Level C --. 8 MS. BORDELON: We don't offer Level C's to --10 MR. SHARAFKHANI: 11 I'm sorry. -- B two years down the 12 13 road. So the minimum, we have to issue conditional to her for two years, right? 14 MR. LAGRANGE: 15 Yes, until she obtains her experience. 16 MR. SHARAFKHANI: 17 Her experience. 18 19 MR. LAGRANGE: 20 Her years of experience. She would have 21 to apply every six months. 22 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Every six months. 23 24 MR. LAGRANGE: And she's passed the test, so that 25

requirement is met. Again, you know, we've got to discuss this usually when these conditionals come up. But based on her application we have to determine if she's qualified, and based on what she's showing us to have a Level B at that specific facility, and that's basically what we need to do. I don't recall that we have any maximum or minimum numbers of conditionals that we can or cannot issue for a facility as well. I think we have someone who has taken the initiative, even though she just came to work for that facility, to pass the exam and attend the training session already as well. Any other discussions?

MR. LEWIS:

I guess on a conditional, just like this one, she needs two years of experience to be qualified for a regular, and you give a conditional and you just keep recertifying that until she meets that time. I guess my question is is there any -- you know, is that ten hours a year going to one course? Or could you say if you have a conditional and you're that far away maybe you go to four trainings a year or something to speed that process up when they're in conditional.

1 MR. LAGRANGE: well, you can't speed up the two years. 2 You've got to be in it for two years. Anyone 3 Mr. Mollere, you have any thoughts on this? 4 5 MR. MOLLERE: I'm just thinking about her having to 6 come back to this Board on those conditionals that 7 many times. I think it's going to be her --8 9 . MR. LAGRANGE: Right, it'll be an obligation for her, 10 and that'll ensure that she does attend her 11' training hours as well. 12 13 MR. MOLLERE: I don't think the conditional originally 14 was intended to be quite like that, but that's 15 what we have to deal with. 16 17 MR. LAGRANGE: Do I have a motion? 18 19 MR. BERTHELOT: 20 So moved. MR. LAGRANGE: 21 22 Moved by Mr. Berthelot. Do I have a second? 23 24 MR. LEWIS: 25 Second.


