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MR. LAGRANGE:

I'd like to call to order the meeting of
the Board of Certification and Training for Solid
Waste Management Operators. Roll call.

MS. BORDELON:

Delaney Lewis.

MR. LEWIS:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Denny Mize.

MR. MIZE:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Scott Lyons.

MR. LYONS:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

James Berthelot.

MR. BERTHELOT:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Fred Williams.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

1 Bill Mollere.

2 MR. MOLLERE:

3 Here.

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Bo Lagrange.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Present.

8 MS. BORDELON:

9 Sam Phillips.

10 (NO RESPONSE)

11 MS. BORDELON:

12 David Guillory.

13 (NO RESPONSE)

14 MS. BORDELON:

15 Terrance Stewart.

16 (NO RESPONSE)

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 The minutes of our October 26th meeting
19 were sent to you previously. Hopefully you had a
20 chance to review them. I'll entertain a motion to
21 accept the minutes.

22 MR. LYONS:

23 So moved.

24 MR. MIZE:

25 Second.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Moved by Mr. Lyons. Seconded by Mr.
3 Mize. Any discussion? Any opposition?

4 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 So carried.

7 Next is a request for approval of
8 continuing education hours for the Annual Waste
9 Conference of the Louisiana Solid Waste
10 Association. Ms. Yolunda Righteous.

11 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

12 I'll give you guys and ladies a minute
13 to take a look at the agenda. And to make it a
14 little easier for you you can see the hours kind
15 of denoted along the right-hand side of the
16 agenda. Basically during the opening session in
17 the morning you have four hours in the beginning
18 session. And then the break-out sessions. If
19 you'll notice, what we ended up doing was having
20 solid waste and industrial waste kind of combined.
21 Those two tracks alone constitute twelve hours,
22 the solid waste track and industrial track. And
23 then we have some additional hours in the air
24 track as well as the water and waste water track.
25 There's a topic in the morning of the first day on

1 open burning in Louisiana under the air track.
2 And then if you'll scoot down to the bottom on the
3 second day there's a topic on concrete crushing
4 with air regulations, what air regulations apply.
5 So that's an additional 1.5 hours under the air
6 track. And then under the water and waste water
7 track we have an additional 3.5 hours in the
8 afternoon of the first day, Drought Impacts on
9 LPDDDES discharges. And then on Friday we have
10 topics on E & P orders. Those were the orders
11 that were issued to several solid waste landfills
12 in the state for the acceptance of E & P waste.
13 An additional topic on Managing Landfill
14 Discharges. And then down at the bottom we have a
15 topic on New Storm Water Rules. And then we have
16 an open panel to discuss landfill water questions
17 and issues at solid waste landfills. So actually
18 if you combine all of the total hours involved
19 with the tracks it's actually twenty-one hours,
20 well above the required ten hours for the solid
21 waste operators.

22 MR. MOLLERE:

23 Mr. Chairman, may I ask a question?

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Yes, sir.

1 MR. MOLLERE:

2 Obviously they'll have to pick and
3 choose because they couldn't go to all of them.

4 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

5 Right. But there's an opportunity.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 So overall you've got twenty-one hours,
8 but a lot of that is concurrent. Some of the
9 sessions are concurrent with each other.

10 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

11 Exactly.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 Do you have an oversight on the
14 attendance for the sessions? Y'all are going to
15 do that, as far as stamping something?

16 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

17 Yes. In order to get credit for the
18 session at the end of the session they have to get
19 their card stamped, in order to get credit for
20 attendance.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Anyone have any questions or comments?
23 I see you have ethics training.

24 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

25 Yes.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 which is the big thing this year because
3 it's required for all public employees to get the
4 minimum training.

5 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

6 Right.

7 MR. WILLIAMS:

8 Yolunda, on the stamping, is that done
9 after each session?

10 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

11 Yes, after each session.

12 MR. WILLIAMS:

13 I was wondering how you were going to
14 keep up with the hours.

15 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

16 After each session, yes.

17 MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

18 The speakers or moderators up front will
19 have the stamps. They'll come up after the
20 session is over.

21 MR. MOLLERE:

22 And the UST would be monitoring their
23 own programs?

24 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

25 Exactly.

1 MR. MOLLERE:

2 And do their own certifications.

3 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

4 Exactly.

5 MR. WILLIAMS:

6 And that would be closely monitored to
7 ensure that each participant did get at least the
8 minimum of ten hours?

9 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

10 Minimum of ten hours, yes.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 Mr. Lewis, you have any comments or
13 questions?

14 MR. LEWIS:

15 well, I was just curious, what if they
16 don't get the ten hours?

17 MR. MOLLERE:

18 They don't get certified.

19 MR. LEWIS:

20 But what I'm saying, how does that get
21 back to the Board? Is there a sheet that that's
22 stamped on that's turned back in to the Board?
23 How does that information get back to the Board?

24 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

25 well, I guess it would be during the

1 time that they -- they have to supply you with
2 proof. Is that correct, Suzanne?

3 Connie, you would provide them with the
4 certification?

5 MS. CONNIE HENRY:

6 Yes.

7 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

8 And then they would have to in turn
9 supply you with that information whenever --

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Right. The Solid Waste Association will
12 gather the information, submit it to DEQ, to
13 Suzanne, and she'll go through the --

14 MR. MOLLERE:

15 Well, they wouldn't get a certificate if
16 they didn't get their ten hours, would they?

17 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

18 Exactly. Right.

19 MR. MOLLERE:

20 So then they submit their certificate to
21 Suzanne.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 When they recertify.

24 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

25 When they renew their certificate.

1 Exactly.

2 MR. WILLIAMS:

3 I'm saying what we're trying to ensure
4 is that just because a person attends the
5 conference doesn't necessarily mean that they're
6 going to be getting their ten hours. They have to
7 have some proof that they actually attended these
8 sessions in order to get certification.

9 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

10 Right.

11 MR. WILLIAMS:

12 In other words, just registering for the
13 conference does not guarantee ten hours of
14 training.

15 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

16 Exactly.

17 MR. MIZE:

18 How does it get back to her? Do you
19 have to mail it back to her to get the
20 certification?

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 No. The Solid Waste Association will
23 issue the certificates, and they send them to the
24 conference attendees. It's their responsibility,
25 when they apply for recertification, that they

1 submit that with their applications. Is that
2 right?

3 MS. BORDELON:

4 Right. I think what they're asking is
5 how are you going to prove that they went to all
6 the sessions. How's the Association going to know
7 that they -- do they have to turn in their sheet
8 with the stamps on them?

9 MS. CONNIE HENRY:

10 At the end of the conference they come
11 forward with their name tag and their sheets and
12 present it to us. And then we go back and
13 compare, yes, they actually picked up their name
14 tag and attended, as well as they checked in at
15 each of these classes. And they can't get their
16 stamp prior to the class starting. The stamps are
17 issued at the end of the session so that we make
18 sure that they actually sat through a session.

19 MR. MIZE:

20 Do they turn that sheet in to you at the
21 end of the conference?

22 MS. CONNIE HENRY:

23 Correct.

24 MR. MIZE:

25 That's got all the stamps on it?

1 MS. CONNIE HENRY:

2 Right.

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 And those announcements will be made in
5 the opening session, I'm sure, and they're
6 reminded during the day.

7 MS. CONNIE HENRY:

8 And at registration.

9 MR. MOLLERE:

10 And then you mail the certificates to
11 the --

12 MS. CONNIE HENRY:

13 Yes, we mail the certificates. And then
14 I scan and send Suzanne a copy of all of them as
15 well so that she has that.

16 MR. MOLLERE:

17 Oh, okay. So it's a double -- if I lost
18 my certificate, Suzanne would have that.

19 MS. CONNIE HENRY:

20 But we don't advertise that.

21 MR. WILLIAMS:

22 I just wanted to make sure that we had
23 documentation for the participants so that it's
24 not just carte blanche thing, "well, I attended
25 the conference, so therefore I should get ten

1 hours". So we just wanted to be sure that you had
2 some proof that they actually attended the
3 sessions.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:
5 Mr. Mize, anything else?

6 MR. MIZE:
7 No.

8 MR. LAGRANGE:
9 Mr. Lyons, any comments?

10 MR. LYONS:
11 No.

12 MR. BERTHELOT:
13 I'll make the motion.

14 MR. WILLIAMS:
15 Second.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:
17 Motion by Mr. Berthelot to approve.
18 Second by Mr. Williams. Any other discussion?
19 Any objections?

20 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

21 MR. LAGRANGE:
22 Motion carries. Thank you.
23 Next we have the consideration of
24 operator certifications, the review of applicants
25 for certification. I don't have that list,

1 Suzanne.

2 MS. BORDELON:

3 Wade Scott is the only one.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Wade Scott is the only one we have.

6 Wade Scott applied for a Level A, C & D, wood
7 waste facility license certification with KV
8 Landfill, KV Enterprises, LLC in Killona,
9 Louisiana. He currently holds a Class B since
10 2003, which has expired. It expired, right? He's
11 currently not certified?

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 He's currently not certified.

14 MR. MIZE:

15 Did he come back and -- he hasn't even
16 had a chance to take the test yet, right?

17 MS. BORDELON:

18 He did. He came in this week and took
19 the test and passed it.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 Can I have a motion?

22 MR. MIZE:

23 So moved.

24 MR. LYONS:

25 Second.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Moved by Mr. Mize. Seconded by Mr.
3 Lyons. Any other discussions? Any questions?
4 Any comments?

5 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Motion carries.

8 Next we have the review of applications
9 for recertification. We have Bernard Ashford, C &
10 D, Level B, Angco, Inc.; Steven B. Dupre,
11 Landfill, Level A, Terrebonne Parish Landfill;
12 Lawrence S. Glosson, Landfill, Level A, Union
13 Parish Landfill; Darrell Lewis, C & D, Level B,
14 Krause & Managan Disposal; Raymond Miller,
15 Landfill, Level A, Choctaw Road Landfill; and
16 Tharell Phelps, Landfill, Level B, Choctaw Road
17 Landfill. All of these have completed the
18 requirements for recertification. Can I have a
19 motion?

20 MR. MOLLERE:

21 So moved.

22 MR. MIZE:

23 Second.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Moved by Mr. Mollere. Seconded by Mr.

1 Mize. Any other discussion? Any opposition?

2 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 Motion carries.

5 Next is issuance of operator
6 certificates. Ms. Bordelon, would you --

7 MS. BORDELON:

8 That would just be Wade Scott, C & D,
9 Level A.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Can I have a motion to issue the C & D,
12 Level A?

13 MR. WILLIAMS:

14 So moved.

15 MR. MOLLERE:

16 Second.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Moved by Mr. Williams. Seconded by Mr.
19 Mollere. Any other discussion? Any objections?

20 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 So carried.

23 Next is review request for conditional
24 certification from Lacey Hollinghead. This is for
25 a Level A for Republic Services, Webster Parish

1 Landfill. Is this replacing someone, Suzanne?

2 MS. BORDELON:

3 Yes. Actually, we had already issued a
4 conditional certificate to Amy Stewart replacing
5 Esta Monzingo, who left in May. But Amy has since
6 left, and so they're asking for another
7 conditional, still replacing Amy. It'd still be
8 replacing Amy.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Replacing Esta, right?

11 MS. BORDELON:

12 I'm sorry. Replacing Esta, right.

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 She's attached a resume' showing her
15 experience for a conditional Level A, Webster
16 Parish Landfill. Any questions?

17 MS. BORDELON:

18 And she plans on taking the exam in
19 April.

20 MR. MIZE:

21 How long has she worked at the site?
22 Maybe I missed that somewhere, but I couldn't see
23 it.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 The last experience she shows is through

1 April of 2011 as a medical office assistant.

2 MS. BORDELON:

3 You're right, it's not actually on the
4 application. But she has been hired on just since
5 Amy Stewart left, so probably just a month or two.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Is that the only Level A they have on
8 site?

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 No. Webster has others, but -- I think
11 they may have -- I think they do have another
12 Level A. But they're requesting a conditional
13 Level A because Esta was a Level A. Jamie Gieger
14 is a Level A.

15 MR. MIZE:

16 Usually they fill out the application.
17 She put a resume' on there. I think we should --
18 you know, they're supposed to fill out the
19 application, and the application's not even filled
20 out.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 well, part of that is looking at
23 considering the experience, even though it would
24 be replacing a certified operator.

25 MR. MIZE:

1 I can't see on here where she's even got
2 the experience.

3 MS. BORDELON:

4 For conditionals, if you're replacing
5 another operator, she doesn't necessarily have to
6 have the experience.

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Is anyone else familiar with this
9 facility? Mr. Williams?

10 MR. WILLIAMS:

11 Yeah, I'm familiar with it.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 Are you wanting to make a comment?

14 MR. WILLIAMS:

15 No. I was going to make a motion that
16 we approve it.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Moved to issue a conditional
19 certification. Do I have a second?

20 MR. BERTHELOT:

21 Second.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Seconded by Mr. Berthelot. Any other
24 discussions? Any objections?

25 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Motion carries.

3 Next is a request for conditional
4 certificate extensions from Daria Jones, Tara
5 Keith, and Clay Naquin. You have their
6 applications in front of you. Mr. Naquin is a
7 Landfill, Level A conditional extension from
8 Terrebonne Parish, Ashland Landfill. Tara Keith,
9 City of Winnfield, City of Winnfield Compact
10 Station, for a -- do you know what it is, Suzanne?
11 It's not marked.

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 Her's is for a transfer station. I
14 believe it's a Level B.

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 That's what she shows here. Okay,
17 Landfill, Level B. And Daria Jones, Gator
18 Environmental Waste Solutions, for a C & D, Level
19 A. All of them have met the requirements for
20 extension?

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 Yes. They've all taken and passed the
23 test. This is actually, with the exception of
24 Tara Keith -- for Clay Naquin and Daria this is
25 their second and third extensions.

1 MR. WILLIAMS:

2 So moved.

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 Moved by Mr. Williams to grant
5 conditional certificate extensions to Daria
6 Jones, Tara Keith, and Clay Naquin. Do I have a
7 second?

8 MR. MIZE:

9 Second.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Seconded by Mr. Mize. Any other
12 discussion? Any opposition?

13 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Motion carries.

16 Committee reports. Awards Committee,
17 Mr. Mize.

18 MR. MIZE:

19 We're going to start sending out emails
20 in January some time. Hopefully we can get some
21 people to send in some stuff this time. Didn't
22 get too many last time.

23 MS. BORDELON:

24 Nominations for the operator and the
25 Bentley Mackay.

1 MR. MOLLERE:

2 We need to do something this year to get
3 more of these. Did we only get one last year?

4 MR. MIZE:

5 We got one A.

6 MR. MOLLERE:

7 There's some good people out there that
8 we're overlooking.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 If there's any other ideas to get more
11 participation, more competition --

12 MR. MIZE:

13 I'm open for ideas from anybody.

14 MR. MOLLERE:

15 We've had some good A's, and we've had
16 some great Bentley Mackays.

17 MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

18 Does it have to be a board member to
19 nominate?

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 Right, for Bentley Mackay.

22 MR. MOLLERE:

23 For Bentley Mackay you have to be a
24 board member, yes.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1 So Mr. Mize and Suzanne, y'all will send
2 out the solicitations for nominations, right?

3 MR. MIZE:

4 Yes.

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 Testing, Mr. Mollere.

7 MR. MOLLERE:

8 We had no tests, therefore everyone
9 passed. No one failed.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Continuing education, Mr. Berthelot.

12 MR. BERTHELOT:

13 The Town of Alexandria is having one
14 Wednesday, January 25th. And there's going to be
15 one in Lafayette at the Dome on April the 25th.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Nominating committee, Mr. Lewis.

18 MR. LEWIS:

19 I missed the last meeting, but going
20 back into the minutes I see that Mr. Berthelot was
21 to see about his reappointment request, and he's
22 here, so I'm assuming that he has been
23 reappointed.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 I got an email late yesterday afternoon

1 that the Police Jury Association did fax over a
2 letter to DEQ reappointing Mr. Berthelot for a
3 second three-year term.

4 MR. LEWIS:
5 Congratulations.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:
7 Anything else, Mr. Lewis?

8 MR. LEWIS:
9 That's it.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:
11 Other business. We have Ms. Ann Wilson
12 to request ten hours, continuing education hours,
13 for her 2012 Environmental Regulatory Compliance
14 Conference. Ms. Wilson.

15 MS. ANN WILSON:
16 Thank you so much. In order to look at
17 the agenda I sent to Suzanne, the full agenda
18 would be abstracts and bios. And then also I did
19 an Excel spreadsheet which summarized the approval
20 at the July and the October meeting. So if the
21 Board would like I can --

22 MR. LAGRANGE:
23 What are the items that you've added
24 since that meeting that we need to review?

25 MS. ANN WILSON:

1 They're under the CEUs pending.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 Let's take each one of those, since the
4 other items have been previously approved at our
5 last meeting.

6 MS. ANN WILSON:

7 So from 4:00 to 5:30 that speaker asked
8 to extend the amount of time that he had, so it
9 went from one hour -- we added an addition 0.5 to
10 Mr. Whitescarver's presentation.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 So previously on the first day the
13 sessions were going to end at 5:00, and now
14 they'll end at 5:30?

15 MS. ANN WILSON:

16 Yes.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 On the same topic?

19 MS. ANN WILSON:

20 Correct.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Any discussion on that topic?

23 (NO RESPONSE)

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Any questions for Ms. Wilson?

1 (NO RESPONSE)

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 Next?

4 MS. ANN WILSON:

5 On the second day Jason Meyers with LDEQ
6 is going to give a regulatory update on changes in
7 the solid waste regs that took effect in, I
8 believe, November. He asked for thirty minutes,
9 so that's 0.5.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Any questions or comments on that?

12 (NO RESPONSE)

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Next?

15 MS. ANN WILSON:

16 And then Volvo, their corporate office,
17 I believe out of St. Louis, has put together a
18 presentation directly involving heavy equipment,
19 the type of equipment used at landfills, on how a
20 preventative maintenance program can help reduce
21 operating costs or reduce, you know, having to
22 purchase this expensive equipment on an ongoing
23 basis. And that's a forty-five minute
24 presentation.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1 Any questions on that?

2 (NO RESPONSE)

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 Next?

5 MS. ANN WILSON:

6 And then Scott Lemmons was approved at
7 the October meeting. I've since gotten his bio
8 and abstract and put it in the program. And he
9 requested additional time, forty-five minutes,
10 from thirty to forty-five minutes. And so that is
11 why we have .25. So those add up to an additional
12 two hours, and so we have total eleven and a half,
13 and so people can choose, you know, to leave early
14 or not attend all the sessions. So we're only
15 asking for ten hours, and we have eleven and a
16 half.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 And y'all also do a stamp or some
19 confirmation of attendance?

20 MS. ANN WILSON:

21 Right. We actually print out the entire
22 agenda on a sheet where the operator puts his name
23 at the top and has each session listed with the
24 time. We have monitors in the room where we sign
25 off. They initial by the different hours. And

1 then once we verify that we issue a certificate.
2 And in the past we've summarized the information
3 and sent it to LDEQ within a week after the
4 conference. And we keep all those records on file
5 in case someone ever questions, "I didn't get a
6 certificate", or "I didn't -- ". You know, we
7 have the actual sign-in sheets where our monitors
8 have initialed next to the attendees.

9 Our solid waste operators, these
10 sessions are in a separate area from the other
11 sessions, and so we can closely monitor people
12 coming and going in that room.

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Any questions or comments?

15 MR. MOLLERE:

16 I thought we had eight and a half last
17 time?

18 MS. ANN WILSON:

19 well, when I added them up on the
20 spreadsheet it came to nine and a half. And I
21 didn't do it by hand. I entered all the numbers
22 into the spreadsheet.

23 MR. MOLLERE:

24 But didn't we approve eight and a half
25 last time compared to --

1 MS. ANN WILSON:

2 Yeah. I went through the --

3 MR. MOLLERE:

4 You have two more here, I know, but
5 didn't we approve eight and a half?

6 MS. ANN WILSON:

7 Yes. I went to the minutes and I
8 actually got the minutes from both July and
9 October. So I didn't know if we added wrong, but
10 those were the sessions, so -- in fact, the one in
11 July was approved, but it wasn't approved in
12 October, so I put that down as zero. The site
13 investigation and the national accreditation
14 wasn't approved, so you see the things that
15 weren't approved I have still listed, but I have
16 zeros by them.

17 MR. MOLLERE:

18 well, you still have two hours that
19 you're adding.

20 MS. ANN WILSON:

21 Right.

22 MR. MOLLERE:

23 so that would still be ten and a half,
24 so --

25 MS. ANN WILSON:

1 Right. I don't know where the
2 discrepancy was. You know, that's why I went back
3 to the minutes when I --

4 MR. WILLIAMS:

5 I think in one or maybe two instances
6 there were presentations, but the persons that
7 were going to do the presentations had not
8 confirmed or --

9 MS. ANN WILSON:

10 Maybe that was it.

11 MR. WILLIAMS:

12 Right. I think that's probably what it
13 was. I want to say EPA was one of them, and there
14 was one other one in which the person who was
15 supposed to do the presenting had not confirmed
16 that they would be there.

17 MS. ANN WILSON:

18 Right. Scott Lemmons, I think, so that
19 may have been the one.

20 MR. WILLIAMS:

21 So have they now confirmed?

22 MS. ANN WILSON:

23 Right. And their abstract is in the
24 large document.

25 MR. WILLIAMS:

1 And the procedure that you use to
2 certify that these persons are actually attending
3 these sessions, could you talk about that again?

4 MS. ANN WILSON:

5 Right. What we do is take the entire
6 program, like these titles with the amount of
7 hours, and they're listed on a form. And each
8 individual person in that room gets this form.
9 And they initial by that session that they were
10 there, and we have monitors in the room that then
11 go around and sign off that that person was
12 actually there.

13 MR. WILLIAMS:

14 You do that at the beginning?

15 MS. ANN WILLIAMS:

16 We do that at the end of the session.

17 MR. WILLIAMS:

18 Of each session?

19 MS. ANN WILSON:

20 Right. And then from there we take
21 those sign-in sheets and issue a certificate of
22 attendance based on the number of hours that are
23 on those sign-in sheets. And then we summarize
24 that in a report and send it to DEQ that these
25 operators were here and they received this many

1 hours.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 So we have a request for an additional
4 two hours.

5 MR. BERTHELOT:

6 So moved.

7 MR. MIZE:

8 Second.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Moved by Mr. Berthelot. Seconded by Mr.
11 Mize. Any other discussion? Any opposition?

12 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Motion carries.

15 MS. ANN WILSON:

16 Thank you.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Next we have a request for a lifetime
19 certification for Mr. Norris J. Crappell. He has
20 pledged that he understands he will continue to
21 submit his recertification and provide proof of
22 forty hours continuing education every four years.
23 Any discussion?

24 MR. WILLIAMS:

25 Mr. Chairman, I make the motion that we

1 approve it.

2 MR. MOLLERE:

3 Second.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Moved by Mr. Williams. Seconded by Mr.
6 Mollere. Any other discussions? Any opposition?

7 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

8 MR. LAGRANGE:

9 Motion carries.

10 Next is public comments. Any public
11 comments?

12 MR. MOLLERE:

13 Just Merry Christmas.

14 MR. WILLIAMS:

15 Mr. Chairman, I'll make the motion that
16 we adjourn.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 All right. Before I entertain that
19 motion, as Mr. Mollere said, I want to wish all of
20 you a very Merry Christmas, a safe season, and
21 hope y'all have an opportunity to spend time with
22 your families over the holidays.

23 MR. BERTHELOT:

24 Second.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1 Moved by Mr. Williams. Second by Mr.
2 Berthelot.

3 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Meeting is adjourned.

6 (MEETING ADJOURNED AT 10:30 A.M.)
