PROCEEDINGS

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MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. We want to call to order the meeting of Board of Certification and Training for Solid Waste Management Operators. Would you call roll, please?

MS. BORDELON:

Sure. Bo Lagrange?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Denny Mize?

MR. MIZE:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Troy Barber?

MR. BARBER:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

James Berthelot?

MR. BERTHELOT:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Bijan Sharafkhani?

MR. SHARAFKHANI:

1 Here.

2 MS. BORDELON:

3 William Mollere?

4 MR. MOLLERE:

5 Here.

6 MS. BORDELON:

7 Terrance Stewart?

8 MR. STEWART:

9 Present.

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 David Guillory?

12 Robert McMullen?

13 Delaney Lewis?

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Okay. Thank you. The first item on the  
16 agenda is review of the March 26, 2010  
17 meeting minutes. Do we have any comments,  
18 corrections, questions? If not, I will  
19 entertain a motion.

20 MR. MOLLERE:

21 I move to adopt.

22 MR. BARBER:

23 Second.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Moved by Mr. Mollere, seconded by Mr.

1 Barber. Any opposition? Motion carries.

2 Thank you.

3 All right. Next we move into  
4 considerations of operator certifications and  
5 we will go one at a time. I'll read the name  
6 and the level. And, if anyone has any  
7 questions or comments please speak up. First  
8 is William B. Book for a Landfill, Level B.

9 Next is Carlon Campbell for a Landfill,  
10 Level B. You will note his original  
11 application was a C. His supervisor did call  
12 and Mr. Campbell requests consideration for a  
13 B.

14 Randall Clark, Jr., Landfill, Level --

15 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

16 Mr. Chairman, are we discussing the  
17 applications now?

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Yes, sir.

20 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

21 Okay. Can we discuss?

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Yes.

24 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

25 Mr. Clark is asking for a Level A, and

1 in reviewing his experience there are some  
2 questions whether or not he qualifies as  
3 Level A operator.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 And your question is the types of  
6 experience he's put on his application?

7 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

8 Precisely.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Because he does have the minimum three  
11 years.

12 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

13 Precisely. My question --

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 It's the type of experience?

16 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

17 The type of experience.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Okay. All right. And what are some of  
20 the things you think that are missing or we  
21 look for in experience for Level A, in  
22 addition to what he has on there?

23 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

24 What he's presenting here really doesn't  
25 show any kind of managerial experience and,

1           you know. It basically shows operational  
2           experience. Now, unless he has the  
3           experience and he failed to indicate it.

4   MR. LAGRANGE:

5           Fully disclose it.

6   MR. SHARAFKHANI:

7           Yeah.

8   MR. MIZE:

9           On here he's got nothing; he doesn't  
10          supervise anybody. It doesn't have any name  
11          or title that implies supervisor at all.

12   MR. BARBER:

13          Is there someone in the audience that  
14          speak on his behalf?

15   MS. BORDELON:

16          No, he was just one of the last ones  
17          that just tested. I doubt he's out there  
18          now.

19   MR. BONVILLION:

20          What's his name?

21   MS. BORDELON:

22          Randall Clark. He was the big black guy  
23          that was sitting right --

24   MR. STEWART:

25          And I just met him, too, going down the

1 hall.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 The --

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Yeah, because I really think somebody  
6 else actually fills these applications out  
7 for them and just gets them to sign them,  
8 which doesn't mean that he shouldn't have  
9 looked at it.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 No, it doesn't.

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 Yeah.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Okay. Any other comments on experience?

16 MR. MOLLERE:

17 Mr. Chairman, I will move that  
18 Mr. Clark's application be held over until  
19 the next meeting, and then if he can supply  
20 sufficient information on his managerial  
21 areas that we re-consider it.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 All right. We have a motion.

24 MR. BARBER:

25 I'll second the motion.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Motion by Mr. Mollere, seconded by  
3 Mr. Barber. Any discussion? Any objection?

4 MR. MOLLERE:

5 River Birch has more than a enough Level  
6 A's, so there shouldn't be a problem.

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Okay. Motion carries. Thank you. Next  
9 we will go to Darby Douglass for a C&D, Level  
10 A. Any comments or questions on Mr.  
11 Douglass?

12 Okay. Next we move to Leo Harmon.

13 MR. BARBER:

14 I have a question.

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 For Landfill, Level B for Mr. Harmon.

17 MR. BARBER:

18 Yeah. The date of employment is not  
19 even on this application.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 Yes, sir. Suzanne hasn't updated --

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 I think a couple times I probably had to  
24 call them and, of course, request more  
25 information, which they didn't actually put

1 much more on there. But the original that I  
2 have has the dates of employment as July of  
3 '08 to present.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 So he is applying for a Level B.  
6 Employment July '08 to present. He would  
7 meet the two year experience requirement in  
8 just the actual experience that he has  
9 listed. Is there any questions or comments  
10 on that?

11 MR. MIZE:

12 Is he asking a conditional, too?

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 I don't believe. He's not asking for a  
15 conditional.

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 No.

18 MR. MIZE:

19 Because he signed it as a conditional.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 He signed it both places.

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 They usually do. He didn't check off  
24 number eight, though.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1           Several did that.

2           All right. No comments? Any further  
3           comments on Mr. Harmon?

4           If not we will move to Ronald Istre,  
5           Landfill, Level B.

6       MR. BARBER:

7           I have a question on him, also. I'm not  
8           sure what I marked here. Yeah, I have a  
9           question on his educational.

10       MR. LAGRANGE:

11           All right. Level B. Does Level B  
12           require high school?

13       MS. BORDELON:

14           No.

15       MR. LAGRANGE:

16           No.

17       MR. BARBER:

18           It doesn't?

19       MR. MIZE:

20           Just a Level A?

21       MR. BARBER:

22           Only the Level A?

23       MR. LAGRANGE:

24           Only the Level A.

25       MR. BARBER:

1                   Okay.

2   MR. LAGRANGE:

3                   And he shows his date of employment as  
4                   May 15, '08 to January 13, '10. But if you  
5                   look at his application he signed and dated  
6                   it -- his supervisor dated it in March.

7   MR. BARBER:

8                   Right.

9   MR. LAGRANGE:

10                  So he should meet his years of  
11                  experience.

12                  Okay. Next is Walter Johnson, C&D,  
13                  Level A.

14   MR. BARBER:

15                  I think I have a question on this one,  
16                  too. Did he test today, Suzanne?

17   MS. BORDELON:

18                  He did.

19   MR. BARBER:

20                  And what test did he take?

21   MS. BORDELON:

22                  C&D, Level A.

23   MR. BARBER:

24                  It appears -- is this facility a  
25                  Transfer Station and C&D?

1 MS. BORDELON:

2 I think Jackson Parish is just a C&D.

3 MR. BARBER:

4 Well --

5 MR. MOLLERE:

6 (NODDING)

7 MR. BERTHELOT:

8 It says Transfer Station.

9 MR. BARBER:

10 It says Solid Waste Transfer Station.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 Well, it says type of facility C&D  
13 Landfill. The name -- the firm or site name  
14 is Solid Waste Transfer Station. I mean, you  
15 can have a C&D landfill at a Transfer Station  
16 if that's the name. Mr. Bijan, would you be  
17 familiar with this permit?

18 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

19 I think there is a Transfer. I don't  
20 think they have a C&D permit. I could be  
21 wrong.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 His work -- if you read his description  
24 of his work. It looks like --

25 MR. BARBER:

1                   It's Transfer Station.

2   MS. BORDELON:

3                   And all the other operators at that  
4                   facility have C&D certifications.

5   MR. LAGRANGE:

6                   He talks about moving and loading dirt  
7                   for cover, and crushing and covering shingles  
8                   and lumber.

9   MR. BARBER:

10                  Okay. The only question I had -- it  
11                  appeared to me that it was a Transfer Station  
12                  and he was asking for a C&D certification. I  
13                  wasn't sure if we needed to address that.

14   MR. LAGRANGE:

15                  Okay.

16   MR. BARBER:

17                  So, if everybody else is cool with it  
18                  then I am.

19   MR. LAGRANGE:

20                  I think we're good. Okay.

21                  Stacey Landry, C&D, Level A. I think  
22                  she is reapplying. It appears her license  
23                  lapsed; is that correct?

24   MS. BORDELON:

25                  Correct.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Okay.

3 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

4 She has to make a perfect score, right?

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 All right.

7 James Roepke, that's a C&D, Level B.

8 And Scottie Shreve, which is a Landfill,  
9 Level A.

10 MR. MOLLERE:

11 Is this the updated one?

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 Yes, it is.

14 MR. BARBER:

15 I have a question, but I'm trying to  
16 figure out what my question was now.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 It shows he previously had a Level B  
19 license issued in 2002, which I'm assuming  
20 lapsed?

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 Uh-huh (yes).

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 Any other questions on this application?

25 MR. MOLLERE:

1           Mr. Chairman, one of our cohorts gave  
2           Stacey Landry the highest compliment I think  
3           can be given. I was told she is the Connie  
4           Henry of Doerle.

5   MR. LAGRANGE:

6           Okay. All right, any other comments?  
7           If not, I will entertain a motion to approve  
8           the applications except for Randall Clark,  
9           Jr., which we previously took action on.

10   MR. MOLLERE:

11           I'll move.

12   MR. LAGRANGE:

13           Moved by Mr. Mollere. Second?

14   MR. STEWART:

15           I'll second.

16   MR. LAGRANGE:

17           Seconded by Mr. Stewart. Any  
18           discussion? Any other comments? Any  
19           against? Motion carries. Okay. Thank you  
20           for that.

21           Next we move to review requests for  
22           conditional certification for Clay Naquin,  
23           David Arthur, Ty Boudoin, Sherman Guilbert,  
24           Terry Levasseur, and Henry Beauchamp. So we  
25           will take Mr. Sharp first. He currently has

1 a Conditional Level A certificate for an  
2 Incinerator which expires September of this  
3 year, and he is asking for an additional six  
4 month Conditional. He has attended the  
5 workshop and has passed the exam?

6 MS. BORDELON:

7 Yes. Both Sharp and Ratcliff --

8 MR. LAGRANGE:

9 And Ratcliff?

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 -- attended the workshop, the conference  
12 in March, and were both issued Conditional  
13 Level A's.

14 MR. BARBER:

15 Now that's --

16 MR. MIZE:

17 They just don't have the experience?

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Right.

20 MS. BORDELON:

21 Right. They still don't have the  
22 experience.

23 MR. BARBER:

24 That's the two from Angola, right?

25 MS. BORDELON:

1 Right.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 Right. And they both passed the exams?

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 They both passed the exams. They're  
6 asking for extensions now because they will  
7 expire prior to the next meeting.

8 MR. BARBER:

9 Can I make a motion to approve both of  
10 these?

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 Yes, sir.

13 MR. BARBER:

14 So moved.

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 Moved by Mr. Barber.

17 MR. STEWART:

18 (Indicates agreement.)

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Seconded by Mr. Stewart. This is to  
21 issue a Conditional Certificate for Jerry  
22 Sharp and Otis N. Ratcliff for Incinerator,  
23 Level A Conditional Certificate.

24 Any discussion? Any opposition? If  
25 none, motion carries.

1 All right. Next we will move to Clay  
2 Naquin for Landfill, Level A. And this is  
3 Conditional, replacing -- is that replacing  
4 Eulin Guidry?

5 MS. BORDELON:

6 Replacing Eulin Guidry.

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Right. We have a motion on Mr. Naquin.

9 MR. STEWART:

10 (Indicates agreement.)

11 MR. BARBER:

12 Yeah, I'll...

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Moved by Mr. Stewart. Seconded by Mr.

15 Barber? Any discussion? Any opposition.

16 Hearing none, the motion carries.

17 All right. Next we will go to David

18 Arthur who is applying for a Conditional

19 Landfill, Level B.

20 MR. BARBER:

21 And he's replacing?

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 And he is replacing a certified

24 operator.

25 MR. BARBER:

1 I'll offer a motion to approve this one.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 Moved by Mr. Barber.

4 MR. BERTHELOT:

5 (Indicates agreement.)

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Seconded by Mr. Berthelot. Any  
8 discussion? Any opposition? Hearing none  
9 the motion carries.

10 All right. Next we go to Ty Baudoin for  
11 a C&D, Level B. And he is also replacing a  
12 certified operator.

13 MR. BARBER:

14 I'll motion to move.

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 Moved by Mr. Barber.

17 MR. MIZE:

18 (Indicates agreement.)

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Seconded by Mr. Mize. Any discussion?  
21 Any opposition? Hearing none, the motion  
22 carries.

23 Okay. Next we have Sherman Gilbert for  
24 a Transfer Station, Level B. And he will be  
25 replacing Mr. Curry who currently had a

1 Conditional Certification and has been --

2 MS. BORDELON:

3 All right. Mr. Curry has held  
4 Conditional Certificate Certification for two  
5 years now. He was just in June -- met the  
6 qualifications for a regular Level B. Upon  
7 receipt of the fee, we would have issued him  
8 his Level B because we approved that at the  
9 last meeting. We approved an extension and  
10 then granted to issue his regular  
11 certification when he met the two years,  
12 which was in June. But, he's since been  
13 called out to go serve in Afghanistan and so  
14 they are requesting another conditional to  
15 replace him.

16 MR. BARBER:

17 You know, I -- all the Board knows how I  
18 feel about these conditionals, but under  
19 those circumstances, I'm going to say approve  
20 it.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Is that a motion to approve?

23 MR. BARBER:

24 Yeah.

25 MR. BERTHELOT:

1                   Seconded.

2   MR. LAGRANGE:

3                   Made by Mr. Barber.   Seconded by Mr.  
4   Berthelot.   Any discussion?   Any opposition?  
5   Motion carries.

6                   Okay.   Next we have Mr. Terry Levasseur  
7   and Henry Beauchamp with Sterecycle for  
8   Incinerator Waste Handling, Level A  
9   conditionals.   It is my understanding this is  
10  a permitted facility that has been permitted  
11  or just received a permit?

12  MR. BARBER:

13                   Can I ask Mr. Bijan what the status is  
14   on this facility?

15  MR. SHARAFKHANI:

16                   I think they have a permit -- they've  
17   already got a permit.

18  MR. MIZE:

19                   Yes.

20  MR. MOLLERE:

21                   Medical waste.

22  MS. BORDELON:

23                   Bob Jackson is their certified operator  
24   now, but he's now a regional manager.   And  
25   so, they have no other operators at the

1 facility.

2 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

3 Mr. Chairman, the question is: Do we  
4 have to issued two Conditional A  
5 Certifications or we can issue one A and one  
6 B?

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Well, right. It sounds like they have a  
9 regular conditional or regular A?

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 A regular A.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 They have a regular A who would be in  
14 responsible charge. They need at least a B  
15 on-site when they are operating.

16 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

17 Yeah.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 The options here would be to issue both  
20 B's or one an A and one a B or both A's.

21 MR. MOLLERE:

22 Do these people have B's now?

23 MS. BORDELON:

24 They have no certifications.

25 MR. MOLLERE:

1                   So, these are brand new employees?

2   MS. BORDELON:

3                   Right.

4   MR. MOLLERE:

5                   Well, we've got an A who is still going  
6                   to be available, right? I mean even --

7   MS. BORDELON:

8                   I don't know how available he is. He's  
9                   the regional manager, so he's not --

10   MR. MOLLERE:

11                   So, we don't know where he's stationed?

12   MS. BORDELON:

13                   Right.

14   MR. BARBER:

15                   Well, as long as he can be reached by  
16                   phone, that's still okay.

17   MS. BORDELON:

18                   District Manager is what his title is.

19   MR. MIZE:

20                   So, they are taking the test and they're  
21                   passing, so they've got to get enough hours.

22   MS. BORDELON:

23                   Right.

24   MR. LAGRANGE:

25                   Years experience.

1 MR. MIZE:

2           Years experience.

3 MR. BARBER:

4           I'm going to make a motion that we  
5           extend to them a Level B -- both a Level B.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7           Both a Level B. And a motion to issue a  
8           Conditional Level B Incinerator Waste  
9           Handling Facility License to both  
10          Mr. Levasseur and Mr. Beauchamp. Do I have a  
11          second?

12 MR. BERTHELOT:

13           Second.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15           Seconded by Mr. Berthelot. Any other  
16          discussion? Any opposition to the motion?  
17          Hearing none, the motion carries.

18 MR. MOLLERE:

19           Mr. Chairman, I know you're from Denham  
20          Bayou but I've always been told that it's  
21          pronounced Beauchamp.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23           Beauchamp, thank you.

24           Okay. Next we have a list of

25          applications for recertification and I'll

1 read them out to you for the record.

2 John Armstrong, Landfill, Level B, Jeff  
3 Davis Landfill.

4 Jesse L. Bamburg, Landfarm, Level A,  
5 City of Shreveport Landfarm.

6 MR. MOLLERE:

7 Now you're getting into the  
8 controversial ones.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Troy Barber, Landfill, Level A, Surface  
11 Impoundment, Level A, Landfarm, Level A,  
12 Incinerator, Level A, Refuse-Derived Fuel,  
13 Level A, Transfer Station, Level A, C&D,  
14 Level A, Composting, Level A, Separation,  
15 Level A, Washington Parish Government --  
16 Choctaw Road Landfill.

17 Bill Booty, Landfill, Level A, River  
18 Birch, Inc.

19 Dusty Braase, Landfill, Level B,  
20 Tangipahoa Parish Solid Waste Facility.

21 Vincent Bundrick, C&D Level A, Scott  
22 Construction.

23 Robert Campbell, Landfarm, Level A, City  
24 of Shreveport Landfarm.

25 Tina Davis, Landfill, Level B, Jefferson

1 Davis Landfill.

2 Steve Hoss, Landfarm, Level A, Retired.

3 Zachary Johnson, Incinerator, Level A,  
4 City of Lake Charles.

5 Ken Myers, Landfill, Level B, IESI --  
6 Timberlane Landfill.

7 Mia Townsel, Landfill, Level A, Surface  
8 Impoundment, Level A, Landfarm, Level A,  
9 Incinerator, Level A, Transfer Station, Level  
10 A, C&D, Level A, Composting, Level A,  
11 Separation, Level A, DEQ.

12 And Roy Walters, Landfill, Level A,  
13 Allied Waste -- Woolworth Road Landfill.

14 All of these have completed their  
15 recertification requirements including  
16 completion of their 40 hours of continuing  
17 education.

18 MS. BORDELON:

19 Correct.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 I will entertain a motion to issue  
22 certificates.

23 MR. STEWART:

24 (Indicating agreement.)

25 MR. MIZE:

1 (Indicating agreement.)

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 Motion by mr. Stewart. Seconded by Mr.  
4 Mize. Any discussion? Any oppositions?  
5 Hearing none, the motion carries.

6 Next we have an incomplete certification  
7 application of Mr. Bruce Harris, C&D, Level  
8 A, Vernon Parish C&D. He currently has 30  
9 hours continuing education. He is scheduled  
10 to attend the workshop today and tomorrow.  
11 I'm going to entertain a motion to issue his  
12 regular certificate upon completion of his  
13 remaining ten hours continuing education.

14 MR. BARBER:

15 So moved.

16 MR. MIZE:

17 Seconded.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Moved by Mr. Barber, seconded by Mr.  
20 Mize. Any discussion? Any opposition?  
21 Hearing none, the motion carries. Thank you.

22 Okay. Next we will go to issuance of  
23 operator's certificates. I'll ask Ms.  
24 Bordelon to present those names to us.

25 MS. BORDELON:

1 William Book, Landfill, Level B.  
2 Carlton Campbell, Landfill, Level B.  
3 Darby Douglass, C&D, Level A.  
4 Leo Harmon, Landfill, Level B.  
5 Walter Johnson, C&D, Level A.  
6 Stacey Landry, C&D, Level A.  
7 Jennifer Scott, C&D, Level A and  
8 Separation, Level A.  
9 Scottie Shreve, Landfill, Level A.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Okay. I will entertain a motion to  
12 issue regular certificates.

13 MR. MIZE:

14 (Indicating agreement.)

15 MR. BERTHELOT:

16 Seconded.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 By Mr. Mize. Seconded by Mr. Berthelot.  
19 Any discussion? Any opposition? Motion  
20 carries. Thank you.

21 Next we move on to committee reports.  
22 We will start off with the awards committee.  
23 Mr. Mize, do you have anything to report at  
24 this time?

25 MR. MIZE:

1                   No, sir.

2   MR. LAGRANGE:

3                   Okay. Thank you.

4                   Testing committee, Mr. Mollere?

5   MR. MOLLERE:

6                   Mr. Chairman, we have nothing new to  
7                   report.

8   MR. LAGRANGE:

9                   Okay. Continuing education. Mr.  
10                  Berthelot?

11   MR. BERTHELOT:

12                  We had 56 to register for the workshop.  
13                  Five tested before today, eight tested today  
14                  for a total of thirteen.

15   MR. LAGRANGE:

16                  Okay. Nominating Committee.  
17                  Mr. Barber?

18   MR. BARBER:

19                  Okay. We have one going off the Board  
20                  this year, which is myself, in October. I  
21                  will be the only one to be replaced, and the  
22                  letter is being written as we speak for a  
23                  replacement -- recommending a replacement.  
24                  So, hopefully we won't get into the situation  
25                  we did last year with the delay of replacing.

1                   And then we have two that their first  
2                   terms expired -- expiring this year -- but  
3                   the second term will be a follow-up and  
4                   that's all I have to report.

5   MR. LAGRANGE:

6                   Who are the two's terms that were --

7   MR. BARBER:

8                   Mr. Bo Lagrange and --

9   MS. BORDELON:

10                  Mollere.

11   MR. BARBER:

12                  -- and Mr. Bill -- William J. Mollere.

13   MR. LAGRANGE:

14                  Okay. Is that all you have to report,  
15                  Mr. Barber?

16   MR. BARBER:

17                  That completes my report.

18   MR. LAGRANGE:

19                  Well, thank you. At this time I'd like  
20                  to take a minute and on behalf of the Board  
21                  and all of the solid waste community to  
22                  extend a big thank you in appreciation to you  
23                  for all of your service to the Board and your  
24                  hard work and dedication. I think you've  
25                  brought a lot to the Board on the three years

1 that I've served with you and have helped  
2 maintain a high level of integrity of the  
3 Board to ensure that we do continue to have  
4 educated, experienced solid waste operators.  
5 So, Mr. Barber we will appreciate you with a  
6 token -- a plaque -- at our next meeting or  
7 the meeting after that, but in the meantime I  
8 want to stand up and give you a round of  
9 applause for your hard work.

10 Anyone have anything else to add? Okay.

11 Next we move to other business. We have  
12 a review of a request from the city of  
13 Alexander from the approval of continuing  
14 education units for its annual Environmental  
15 Regulatory Compliance Conference to be held  
16 January 26th and 27, 2011 in Alexandria.  
17 You've been provided the agenda, a  
18 description of the topics that will be  
19 presented, and if you've had a chance to  
20 review them, I will entertain any discussion  
21 at this time or comments relative to that.

22 MR. BARBER:

23 Mr. Chairman, I would like to say a  
24 couple of things about this. I've looked  
25 over their sessions and I'm only seeing about

1 four, possibly five, that I feel cover solid  
2 waste. And I don't want to get to a point  
3 that we're approving hours for something that  
4 is not going to at least equal what we are  
5 doing in our workshops. So, the best I could  
6 suggest here is four, possibly five, hours.

7 MR. MOLLERE:

8 Mr. Chairman, I would agree with  
9 Mr. Barber. Having a chance to look over  
10 this, I think five hours would be probably  
11 about the level that -- looking at all of the  
12 different topics, they're getting more and  
13 more into areas that we need. Certainly this  
14 topic on governmental ethics, the area that I  
15 think would be good for all of our folks to  
16 be involved in, but I would think five hours.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Okay. I'll entertain a motion to that  
19 effect.

20 MR. BARBER:

21 So moved.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Moved by Mr. Barber to grant five hours  
24 to continuing education for any operators who  
25 attend the Environmental Regulatory

1 Compliance Conference on January 26 and 27,  
2 2011 in Alexandria. Do we have a second?

3 MR. STEWART:

4 Second.

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 Seconded by Mr. Stewart. Any other  
7 discussion?

8 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

9 Mr. Chairman.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Yes, sir.

12 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

13 In order to receive five hours, the  
14 attendees, I guess, are required -- attendees  
15 are required to participate in all of these  
16 sessions? Or are we going to identify those  
17 sessions that will be granted continuing  
18 education? Meeting our requirements?

19 MS. WILSON:

20 May I speak, too?

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Normally the requirement is, they would  
23 present a certificate of completion for  
24 attendance, is that we require?

25 MS. BORDELON:

1 Right.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 And so, if they attended it, then  
4 there's no -- I don't think there's any  
5 delineation that they attended it and then  
6 they attended those sessions pertaining to  
7 solid waste. Is that what you're referring  
8 to?

9 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

10 Well, my question, you know, is it's  
11 either all or none; that's my question.  
12 Either they have to participate -- that's the  
13 question -- whether or not they have to  
14 participate in all of these sessions, or sign  
15 up for the whole conference, or what if they  
16 attend one day and then they take some, you  
17 know, as Mr. Mollere alluded to, the course,  
18 it's an overview of the code of government  
19 ethics. That's one hour. Can they just sign  
20 up for that particular session or particular,  
21 I guess, hour and get a one hour?

22 MR. MOLLERE:

23 I don't think the registration allows a  
24 partial. I think it's either -- you either  
25 go or you don't go and it's kind of like the

1 environmental conference in Lafayette. You  
2 sign up for it you register, and we really  
3 don't monitor who shows up. I mean, you  
4 could register and then go home.

5 MS. BORDELON:

6 Ann, typically don't y'all have sign in  
7 sheets?

8 MS. WILSON:

9 Yes, if I could --

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 We have Ann Wilson, the Superintendent  
12 of Environment Services Department with the  
13 City of Alexandria.

14 MS. WILSON:

15 Thank you. We require sign in sheets at  
16 the beginning of the session at 8:00 and then  
17 they have to sign out at noon. They have to  
18 sign in at 1:00 then they sign out at 5:00.  
19 Some of the things that we added to this year  
20 is a solid and hazardous waste breakout  
21 session on the second day which covers solid  
22 waste and hazardous waste topics. So, we  
23 have this year coming up, 2011, a four hour  
24 concentrated solid and hazardous waste. As  
25 you mentioned, the ethics is an hour long and

1 that is a very good session taught by the  
2 Board of Ethics. Peggy Hatch, as well as,  
3 Region Six administrator, Peggy Hatch has  
4 confirmed that she will be speaking.

5 The Bid Law is another example of an  
6 issue that we all need to follow very closely  
7 in government and solid waste landfills and  
8 transfer stations and the like. We also have  
9 the Corps of Engineers speaking on wetlands  
10 issues and mitigation. And we have a lot of  
11 issues at those sites with wetlands issues.

12 Jeff Nolan with the Department of  
13 Environmental Quality is speaking on Criminal  
14 Enforcement, and I see by DEQ's website that  
15 we have lots of solid waste issues with  
16 criminal enforcement. And we also have David  
17 Dugas speaking on federal environmental  
18 criminal enforcement. The other aspect -- on  
19 the regulatory side of enforcement action and  
20 also as operators of facilities what are our  
21 rights when we're investigated by the  
22 regulatory agencies.

23 We also have nearly 50 exhibitors which  
24 will allow the attendees to see the latest  
25 technology. We're getting more and more

1 cross-section of not only water and  
2 wastewater but solid and hazardous waste  
3 vendors, as well. These are some of the  
4 exhibitors from last year's conference and we  
5 are extending our scope of who is being  
6 exhibited.

7 But we also have water, wastewater  
8 certification, 12 hours each for that.  
9 Attorneys are 9 hours and engineers are 13  
10 hours for our conference. So I would hope  
11 that we can get more than 5 hours because  
12 when they pay the fee they want to be able to  
13 get, you know, the number of hours that they  
14 need to make a difference. And that's always  
15 their question is, "Which sessions are  
16 certified for us?" And that's why this year,  
17 when we did our breakout sessions we  
18 specifically included a solid and hazardous  
19 waste. In our general session on the first  
20 day, I think there are a number of topics  
21 that could be of great benefit to the solid  
22 waste operator. Thank you.

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 Thank you, Ms. Wilson. Anyone have any  
25 questions for Ms. Wilson?

1 MR. BARBER:

2 I'd like to comment just little bit on  
3 that. And, I appreciate all of the classes  
4 that are offered at this conference, there's  
5 a lot of good stuff. And at a manager level,  
6 I think there's a lot more offered, but when  
7 I look at the whole picture of who possibly  
8 would attend, it possibly is going to be some  
9 of the guys that are in the trenches, so to  
10 speak, operational people. And I don't see  
11 enough on here to justify me giving more or  
12 voting for more than five hours for that  
13 level of personnel.

14 MR. MIZE:

15 I know one thing, I wouldn't send one of  
16 my operators up here for five hours. I mean,  
17 it just ain't worth it to get five hours for  
18 two days worth of deal. I'd send them to  
19 another conference. I don't think you would  
20 either, would you?

21 MR. BARBER:

22 I wouldn't send one of mine to that  
23 anyway whether you've got five or ten.

24 MR. MIZE:

25 Yeah.

1 MR. BARBER:

2 Because I don't think he's getting  
3 training necessary.

4 MR. MIZE:

5 He's not.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Is there any other -- based on  
8 Ms. Wilson's comments are there any other  
9 topics on here that may be reconsidered for  
10 additional hours or do we feel comfortable  
11 with the five hours?

12 MR. MIZE:

13 I do know last year it was okay for ten.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 It was?

16 MR. MIZE:

17 This was, yes.

18 MS. BORDELON:

19 Yes, it was.

20 MR. MIZE:

21 Because I attended it last year.

22 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

23 Mr. Chairman, does Ms. Wilson need an  
24 answer right away or could we have the  
25 committee look into it?

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 We can ask her.

3 MS. WILSON:

4 Well, we're starting to advertise the  
5 conference. Our brochures will go out  
6 probably September, and I don't think you  
7 meet again until October.

8 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

9 October.

10 MS. WILSON:

11 You know, we can always just leave "to  
12 be determined," but we are starting to  
13 advertise in regional journals and we've  
14 developed our own website for registration.  
15 So, the number of CEUs is key to, you know,  
16 people wanting to go. And the solid waste is  
17 the last one I haven't confirmed.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Okay. Mr. Mize, you mentioned going to  
20 it, are you comfortable with the number of  
21 hours or do you feel differently about it?

22 MS. WILSON:

23 Last year we did get ten CEUs.

24 MR. MIZE:

25 I think they actually, probably, got

1 more in it this year than what they had last  
2 year.

3 MS. WILSON:

4 Yeah. And next year we would be happy  
5 to have someone from this organization sit on  
6 our committee when we plan the program. We  
7 meet in Baton Rouge. A number of personnel  
8 from DEQ, DHH and different organizations sit  
9 on the committee, so, if possible to have ten  
10 hours then next year have someone from your  
11 committee sit on the program committee then  
12 we can gear it even more to what your needs  
13 are. Thank you.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Thank you. Okay. We have a motion and  
16 a second on the floor for five hours. Any  
17 other discussion? Hearing none, then any  
18 opposition to the motion to grant five hours?

19 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

20 (Indicates agreement.)

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 We have one opposed, Mr. Sharafkhani.  
23 Other than that, motion carries for five  
24 hours. Thank you.

25 All right. Next we will go into public

1           comments.

2   MR. MOLLERE:

3           Mr. Chairman, I'd like to raise one  
4           question. Mr. Hugh "Buddy" Till, of course,  
5           has left. He has certification in almost all  
6           of the areas. In the past when one of our  
7           members has left, such as he has done, we  
8           have offered them the opportunity to have  
9           continuing certification. The precedent was  
10          set several years ago and I'm wondering if we  
11          have the ability to do that with Mr. Till.

12   MR. LAGRANGE:

13           You called it continuing certification?

14   MR. MOLLERE:

15           Correct. It would basically be ongoing  
16           as long as he has -- I think he has to  
17           indicate that he has kept up his hours of  
18           certification. And has to show that -- but  
19           would be an ongoing, almost an automatic. I  
20           think. Well...

21   MR. LAGRANGE:

22           It would seem that if he -- every four  
23           years, if he shows proof of continuing  
24           education and pays his fees then he would get  
25           his certification.

1 MR. MOLLERE:

2 Right, even though he's in Florida?

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 Right.

5 MR. BARBER:

6 Is...

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 So I don't think it requires any action  
9 of the Board. I don't know that there's any  
10 restriction against that.

11 MR. BARBER:

12 Is this saying that he wouldn't have to  
13 pay the fees? Is that --

14 MR. MOLLERE:

15 That's the precedent that had been set,  
16 yes.

17 MR. BARBER:

18 And this is for a person leaving the  
19 business or leaving the Board?

20 MR. MOLLERE:

21 Leaving the Board, basically. He -- and  
22 I'm questioning if Mr. Bonvillion and I both  
23 came under that. I think when I came back on  
24 the Board it sort of negated my old motion,  
25 but that's what I'm trying to find out. How

1 we exactly did that, because I wasn't a party  
2 to it, it was done and was offered because of  
3 the years that we had been on the Board.

4 MR. BARBER:

5 Well, I remember doing it for you, but I  
6 don't remember -- we've had Buddy Villeman's  
7 gone off, Red Williams has gone off, Bubba  
8 Winn has gone off.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Right.

11 MR. BARBER:

12 And I don't recall doing it for those.

13 MR. MOLLERE:

14 Well, we just --

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 And Ms. Swacker.

17 MR. BARBER:

18 And that's right, Karla --

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Can I interrupt you a minute? Ms.

21 Karla, did you want to say something relevant  
22 to that? I saw you standing up.

23 MS. SWACKER:

24 Oh, no, no, no. I wasn't going to --

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1 Oh, okay.

2 MS. SWACKER:

3 -- no.

4 MR. MOLLERE:

5 So, I'm just questioning if that is an  
6 appropriate thing to do. If he, in fact,  
7 continued showing his certification, he would  
8 continue to be recertified.

9 MR. BARBER:

10 Well I wouldn't just offer it just to  
11 him, I would offer it to anyone going off the  
12 Board. And I think that's only fair.

13 MR. MOLLERE:

14 Right.

15 MR. BARBER:

16 Am I correct about that?

17 MR. MOLLERE:

18 Right. And I think everybody who had  
19 been on the Board has continued in that area  
20 in some way or another. And certainly keeps  
21 up their hours.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Okay. Can we maybe do a little  
24 research?

25 MR. MOLLERE:

1 Right. And I --

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 And take some official action --

4 MR. MOLLERE:

5 -- don't want to present it as a motion.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 -- bring it up at the next meeting,

8 maybe to clarify it. How about that?

9 MR. MOLLERE:

10 Right. And that would be what I

11 would -- I guess what I would ask, if we can

12 consider that before he becomes cold.

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Any other discussion on that topic? Any

15 other public comment?

16 MR. MIZE:

17 I've got one thing.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Yes, sir.

20 MR. MIZE:

21 They had a seminar down in Mississippi

22 back in April, and I know there's a lot of

23 Louisiana people over there trying to get

24 some DEQ hours, but evidently that seminar

25 was not approved by the Board. Has anybody

1 got any -- heard anything about it or has any  
2 feedback on it or anything?

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 Was it not approved because we were not  
5 asked to approve it?

6 MR. MIZE:

7 Probably not. Yeah.

8 MS. BORDELON:

9 Well, they could submit an agenda, if  
10 they have an agenda, after the fact and the  
11 Board can approve it for hours after the  
12 fact.

13 MR. MIZE:

14 Well, I know quite a few people over  
15 there.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Well, if you know any operators that  
18 attended and would like for us to consider  
19 hours for that, they would need to submit,  
20 make a formal request in writing to Ms.  
21 Bordelon.

22 MR. MIZE:

23 SWANA Mississippi to send the letter to  
24 us or something to request it -- them hours,  
25 you know those hours.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Okay.

3 MR. MIZE:

4 I know SWANA gave 14 hours for that  
5 course.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Any other public comment? Any other  
8 business to come before the Board?

9 Mr. Berthelot?

10 MR. BERTHELOT:

11 Motion to adjourn.

12 MR. BARBER:

13 (Indicates agreement.)

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Motion to adjourn, seconded by Mr.  
16 Barber. Thank you.

17 (PROCEEDINGS WERE CONCLUDED AT 11:45 A.M.)

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
