I know that we have three classes in here. We have the pre -- we have 14 new pre-EO applications, we have four new post-2017 applications, and then eight new post-Executive Order 2018 Rule applications, and then if Ms. Cheng or Mr. Usie can just give a little brief synopsis of what the differences are for Senator Hewitt because I believe the rest of them know.

MS. CHENG:

Okay. Pre-Executive Order would be it did not require local approval, didn't require jobs and it provided for a five-year initial contract with 100 percent tax abatement and a five-year renewal term for 100 percent abatement, and that was anything on the manufacturing site. 2017 rules require local approval and jobs. However, that comes prior to them coming to the Board, so we have resolutions from the locals for those approving them already, and that provides for an up to five-year initial term and up to 100 percent for the initial term and it's an option to renew for three



1 years at 80 percent. 2 And then the 2018 rules, that's the most 3 recent set of rules, these are coming to this Board 4 first, and then after this Board's preliminary approval, LED notifies the locals that it's been approved by the 5 6 Board, and they can either say yes or no to an initial 7 term of 80 percent and a renewal term of 80 percent. 8 MR. WINDHAM: 9 Thank you, Ms. Cheng. Very nicely done. 10 MS. CHENG: 11 All right. Thank you. 12 MR. 6	loosing a year of eligibility, but we submitted it
7	whenever the project was completed.

L 6	of these names and some of them are very, you know,
L7	ambiguous as to what they may do. Tell us a little bit
18	about your company.
19	MR. LANDRY:
20	Sure. We're a manufacturing brewery.
21	We started making beer in 2016. We've grown pretty
22	tremendously since then. We're now the third largest
23	brewery in Louisiana and now the largest in New Orleans.
24	All of our jobs were net new jobs. We've got 35
25	employees today.



1	MR. CHABERT:
2	What's the name of your brewery?
3	MR. LANDRY:
4	The brewery itself is called Urban
5	our trade name is Urban South Brewery. So some of our
6	most popular beers are Paradise Park Lager and Holy
7	Roller IPA. We're distributed throughout South
8	Louisiana, so you could find us to Lake Charles up to
9	New Orleans and Alexandria.
10	MR. CHABERT:
11	And I think people are unaware how much
12	the brewery industry, both from a craft standpoint and
13	the various tiers.
14	MR. LANDRY:
15	Yeah.
16	MR. CHABERT:
17	That the respective brewers doing the
18	micro brews and some of the niche ones that are only
19	doing tasting rooms and restaurants and whatnot.
20	MR. LANDRY:
21	Yeah. We've got a mix of members in our
22	industry. So we've got smaller breweries that only make
23	beer to be drunk on site. Then we have breweries like
24	us and another one her today who make beer to be
25	distributed. We also serve beer to be drunk on site.



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The industry is certainly growing.
We're still third-to-last in breweries I believe in per
capita in the country, so we're still really far behind
the rest of the country, but we've doubled the amount of
breweries in the last five or six years.
MR. CHABERT:
And these are, at the end of the day,
are manufacturing jobs.
MR. LANDRY:
These are manufacturing jobs. You know,
they're keeping a lot of those jobs in state when people
choose to buy local beer versus, you know, macro beer
that's being made out of state.

For the 10 years that I've served on the
Senate, I've served on the judiciary committee that
oversees all of those any alcohol or licensure of
that nature, and the industry has grown just so much in
the 10 years that we've had on site. So it's a credit
to you. Get your stuff in on time.
