18	20100854, and I did notify the
19	company prior to the Board
20	meeting, so they are well aware
21	of the situation.
22	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
23	Okay. That's three. We have
24	one more.
25	MS. WEBER:



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1	Yes, ma'am. Oxbow Calcining.
2	I did not have documentation that
3	shows that they were they
4	filed on time. They provided it
5	after the agenda had gone in, so
6	I I am bringing them in as
7	considered timely filing. If they
8	file on March 31st or mail it in
9	by March 31st they are considered
10	timely, and they provided the
11	documentation to me to show that
12	they had gotten in on time.
13	Okay. The total applications
14	are 167 with investment of
15	\$2,186,911,849 with creating 636
16	new jobs with an estimated salary
17	of \$199,860,620. They created
18	6,440 construction jobs with
19	salaries of \$406,321,424.
20	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
21	Okay. At this time I would
22	like to open the floor for
23	comments in reference to the
24	Industrial Tax Exemption
25	Application as presented with its



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1	amendments.
2	MR. KING:
3	Madam Chair, I got a question
4	on the next to the last page.
5	Performance Energy Services is
6	marked with an asterisk, and on
7	the bottom of the page it shows
8	Performance Energy does one
9	hundred percent manufacturing at
10	this location. I would like to
11	get clarification on that because
12	I'm not too sure as
13	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
14	What's the name of the
15	company again, sir?
16	MR. KING:
17	Performance Energy.
18	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
19	Okay. Can we have a staff
20	member
21	MS. WEBER:
22	Yes. Performance Energy their
23	code is listed as oil field
24	services, 213. Daryl Manning and
25	I did go out to their facility



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1	and inspect it, and they do
2	they do one hundred percent
3	manufacturing at that facility.
4	They do have an administration
5	office there, but they the
6	primary purpose at that facility
7	is manufacturing. They make the
8	frames for the what is it, oil
9	well, you know, where they put
10	the wells out in the ocean.
11	Yeah.
12	MR. KING:
13	Madam Chair, my question is
14	if they don't do one hundred
1 5	percent manufacturing, because
16	she just mentioned they have an
17	administration building, are all
18	of these come in this way given
19	one hundred percent exemption or
20	just part of the plan that is
21	manufacturing is given the
22	exemption? I would like
23	clarification on that.
24	MS. WEBER:
25	In the past we have exempted



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1	the whole facility, but that may
2	be something that the Board might
3	want to make a determination as
4	to what they are going to approve
5	in the future, and I can I can
6	bring the applications in with
7	the differences split up, you
8	know, like if they are applying
9	for manufacturing, the
10	manufacturing building or the
11	administration building, I can
12	let you know what those
13	expenditures are, and if the
14	Board determines they would
15	rather just have the
16	manufacturing aspect only, that's
17	fine, I can bring that in as
18	well. But I kind of need
19	clarification on that. They do a
20	manufacturing they do
21	manufacturing at this facility,
22	but does the Board want to give
23	them one hundred percent approval
24	for their exemption if they don't
25	aren't listed as the



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1	manufacturer.
2	MR. FRUGE:
3	Yes.
4	MR. BELCHER:
. 5	So, Mr. King, what you are
6	saying is the administrative
7	building is attached to the
8	manufacturing facility, do we
9	<pre>include all of it?</pre>
10	MR. KING:
11	Or a part of the
12	manufacturing being done. I would
13	like to see the employees, if
14	somebody turns in an application
15	do they get a recommendation both
16	ways on either one hundred
17	percent of the plan or just the
18	manufacturing part of the plan.
19	Just to see what the difference
20	is.
21	MS. WEBER:
22	Okay.
23	MR. KING:
24	And I'm afraid this isn't the
25	only company that we are giving



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1	exemptions to that might fall
2	under that umbrella. The reason
3	why I'm bringing this up is it
4	could result in a lot of money
5	that they are getting exempted
6	for and they are not entitled to
7	it.
8	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
9	Mr. Allison.
10	MR. ALLISON:
11	Yes, ma'am. Thank you. My
12	name is Don Allison. I'm with
13	Advantage Consulting here in
14	Baton Rouge. I guess I'm here
15	kind of speaking up because I see
16	a lot of people in the audience
17	really concerned about this
18	discussion, and so I wanted to
19	anybody else want to join me,
20	come on please feel free to
21	come on up. Somebody had to speak
22	up, I think, to shed some light
23	on this subject. I think that, as
24	I appreciate it, the program has
25	been operating since the 1930s,



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1	and in the way that has been
2	described today by Lori, as I
3 .	appreciate, and correct me if I'm
4	wrong, somebody, but the
5	generally speaking in a
6	manufacturing facility there is
7	going to be some administrative
8	or administration type assets,
9	you know, the administration
10	building, administrative assets
11	at that facility. But as the
12	site is a manufacturing location.
13	The site qualifies for the
14	manufacturing exemption. That
15	includes everything on that site.
16	I mean, staff, please correct me
17	if I'm not describing the way
18	it's been operating for decades
19	now, but basically the
20	determination was made on that
21	site. If it was a manufacturing
22	facility then the assets that
23	were actually directly touching
24	the product, etc., that might be
25	in the manufacturing process and



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1	the assets that were in the
2	administration building or other
3	types of assets like that that
4	didn't actually touch the product
5	but were part of the site, were
6	part of what was necessary to
7	operate the manufacturing
8	facility. The administrative
9	office, administrative functions
10	are critical to the operation of
11	the manufacturing facility,
12	manufacturing function, so it was
13	all intertwined as one, so the
14	whole facility was considered a
15	manufacturing facility and
16	therefore
17	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
18	As long as they are on the
19	same site.
20	MR. ALLISON:
21	On the same site. Now, I will
22	grant you that as a matter of
23	fact, you know, administrative
24	facility of different site, and
25	somebody else correct me if I'm



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1	wrong here, was at a different
2	site it would not be eligible.
3	We are talking about the
4	administrative function, the
5	administrative assets that are at
6	the same site as the
7	manufacturing facility,
8	manufacturing assets. Those have
9	always been considered all as
10	one, part of one big
11	manufacturing process that was
12	exempt.
13	MR. BELCHER:
14	I have a question for you.
15	You are saying touching one
16	another. Did you mean on the
17	same property or if you have a
18	three story building over here,
19	like he was saying,
20	administrative, manufacturing
21	plant over here, you are
22	considering it one
23	MR. ALLISON:
24	If It's one continuous site
25	then



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1	MR. BELCHER:
2	When you meant touching, you
3	mean they are joined together?
4	MR. ALLISON:
5	When I say "touching," I was
6	talking about the equipment and
7	assets touching the product, but
8	if the site is contiguous it's
9	considered one site. If the
10	administrative facility is at a
11	separate site that is not
12	contiguous to the manufacturing
13	site then those administrative
14	assets would not be considered
15	exempt. They would not be
16	considered manufacturing.
17	MR. ELMORE:
18	Thank you, Don. Talking
19	about the site. Let's get back to
20	Mr. King's question.
21	MS. WEBER:
22	Well, I think part of it is
23	the fact that it's not considered
24	technically a manufacturer based
25	on the criteria that we have used



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1	based on the codes. Now, they do
2	manufacture at that facility,
3	that's correct. Mr. Allison is
4	correct, in the past we have done
5	that, but it hasn't been one
6	hundred percent, and the problem
7	is that we are getting a lot of
8	companies that do some
9	manufacturing, but they are not
10	wholly manufacturing, and it's
11	become a little bit of a concern
12	that if you are given the
13	exemption for that asset, like
14	the last company that we we
15	did last last Board meeting,
16	the HVAC component, they only got
17	a quarter of their application
18	amount because only 25 percent of
19	theirs was considered
20	manufacturing for the assets. So
21	that is where this has come up.
22	I mean, this is I think we
23	have seen this in the past.
24	MR. KING:
25	I still like to see in the



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1	future for the next to get a
2	comparison of cost differential
3	based on his definition of
4	contiguous site or just a
5	manufacturing portion of the
6	site. I would still like to see
7	a comparison.
8	MS. WEBER:
9	Okay. So you are asking on
10	let me get this so I'm clear on
11	it.
12	MR. KING:
13	Well, it's up to the
14	chairman.
15	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
16	Well, I'm hearing I
17	understand the program to operate
18	the way Don Allison is saying.
19	MS. WEBER:
20	Right.
21	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
22	On the same site it all goes
23	into the exemption.
24	MS. WEBER:
25	If the company is a



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1	manufacturer.
2	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
3	Manufacturer. Now, when you
4	start talking about granting
5	percentages
6	MS. WEBER:
7	Right.
8	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
9	of the business eligible
10	for
11	MS. WEBER:
12	Right.
13	MS. POTTS ROQUE:
14	for these exemptions,
15	then what makes some eligible for
16	full participation and others
17	partial?
18	MS. WEBER:
19	This has been, I guess, a
20	conundrum this whole time that I
21	have been here because some
22	companies will be considered
23	manufacturers by virtue of their
24	NAICS code and what they do with
25	their facility. But other



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1	companies they are not considered
2	manufacturers, they are
3	considered service industries or
4	they are considered oil
5	reclamation or something I
6	mean, you know, we have been
7	giving exemptions to companies
8	that don't fall within the
9	traditional manufacturing areas.
10	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
11	Okay.
12	MS. WEBER:
13	But what's what's coming
14	up is a lot of companies are
15	approaching us and they don't
16	have, I mean, the manufacturing
17	NAICS code. They do a small
18	portion of manufacturing in their
19	facility, but if they give me an
20	application for a new building
21	that they have built for a
22	warehouse or a new administration
23	office but they actually are
24	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
25	Storing stuff.



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1	MS. WEBER:
2	storing stuff or doing
3	something else at that facility
4	other than manufacturing and a
5	small portion of that facility is
6	manufacturing then do we give the
7	whole facility the exemption.
8	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
9	I don't think that's
10	something that Mr. Belcher.
11	MR. BELCHER:
12	Yes, ma'am. Me being a
13	developer, do you get site plans?
14	MS. WEBER:
15	Not historically. We have
16	gotten some site plans like for
17	expert risers. I believe they
18	sent us photography.
19	MR. BELCHER:
20	Not detailed, but just, you
21	know, you know, hear's
22	manufacturing A, potato chip
23	plant, bagging, etc.?
24	MS. WEBER:
25	No, sir.



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1	MR. KING:
2	Do you go out there to the
3	site that is applied for?
4	MS. WEBER:
5	If they are not under the
6	historical manufacturing NAICS
7	codes, we are required to. I have
8	one in Shreveport that I have not
9	been able to get to yet. I have
10	a couple of others that have
11	provided me with applications
12	that I have informed them that I
13	need to come out to their
14	facility.
15	MR. KING:
16	Basically you go see them
17	before we approve the
18	applications?
19	MS. WEBER:
20	Yes, sir.
21	MR. KING:
22	I don't see a problem if the
23	employees go out and look and see
24	if they are a bona fide
25	manufacturer. I don't see what



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1	the problem is, but I would like
2	to see a cost comparison and put
3	it under his ruling as everything
4	I would definitely like to see
5	the comparison.
6	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
7	I would like to make a
8	recommendation that we ask the
9	department to look into it and
10	come back at the next Board
11	meeting and give a report.
12	Mr. Grissom, is that
13	something that you-all can do for
14	us?
15	MR. GRISSOM:
16	Certainly. The team will work
17	with Lori and we will try and
18	come back with the perspective
19	and data that might help the
20	discussion.
21	MR. HARRIS:
22	I will second that. If
23	that's a motion I would like to
24	second it.
25	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:



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1	Well, it wasn't a motion. I
2	was just asking.
3	MR. HARRIS:
4	In that case I would like to
5	make a motion.
6	MS. POTTS- ROQUE:
7	We have a motion by Mr.
8	Harris in reference to asking for
9	a report in reference and a
10	second by Mr. Elmore. All in
11	favor?
12	ALL BOARD MEMBERS:
13	Aye.
14	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
15	Would there be any comment in
16	reference to us requiring this
17	report? Mr. Allison.
18	MR. ALLISON:
19	I wanted to clarify and add
20	something here. I think there are
21	actually two different issues
22	that we are kicking around right
23	here, and I want to clarify that.
24	One is regarding an NAICS code.
25	Okay. Lori has mentioned that



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1	several times. I think there's
2	that's an issue that's concerned
3	a lot of folks that are in the
4	business community that the staff
5	is trying to determine if someone
6	is a manufacturer or not based on
7	whether they have a certain NAICS
8	code or not. And there are a lot
9	of cases where let me backup.
10	This Industrial Tax Exemption
11	Program resides in the state
12	constitution. The definition of
13	a manufacturer, manufacturing
14	establishment and all of those
15	terms that are important are in
16	the constitution. And those are
17	words and not NAICS codes, and
18	they were written many years ago
19	before NAICS codes probably even
20	existed. And so that's the
21	definition that we think ought to
22	be used to determine if someone
23	is a manufacturer or not. There's
24	a definition in the constitution,
25	does someone meet that



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1	definition. If they do they
2	qualify. If they don't, they
3	don't, and so regardless of
4	whether they have the right NAICS
5	code, the wrong NAICS code, a
6	different NAICS code or whatever,
7	we would like to see a little
8	less connection between
9	qualification for this program
10	and qualification as a
11	manufacturer and the NAICS code.
12	I think what happened here is
13	that what Lori saying that when
14	someone doesn't have the NAICS
15	code that she is looking for,
16	then she looks at that company
17	and says, well, they might be
18	part manufacturing and part not
19	and maybe there will be a partial
20	exemption, you know, that will be
21	proper in that case or not, but
22	the general, I think, concern
23	that we have in the business
24	community is the tying of the
25	qualification for this exemption



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1	to a company's NAICS code. We
2	think it ought to be, again, just
3	do you meet the definition of the
4	constitution? If you do, you
5	qualify; if you don't, you don't.
6	So that's one issue.
7	The other issue is there are
8	a lot people out there that do at
9	one site some manufacturing and
10	some non-manufacturing. Maybe a
11	service company also does
12	manufacturing or, vice versa,
13	manufacturing company also does
14	service, and when a company is at
15	one site has some manufacturing
16	assets and some that are clearly
17	in a different type of business,
18	in retail sales, may have retail
19	sales operation or something, but
20	if a company is I think there
21	was a salt mining company at one
22	time that they got a partial
23	exemption because they were doing
24	some mining and some
25	manufacturing, okay, and so the
L	



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1	mining assets were not allowed an
2	exemption and the manufacturing
3	assets were, and the distinction
4	had to be made between which
5	assets are doing the mining and
6	which assets are doing the
7	manufacturing, okay. But in that
8	case I think a partial exemption,
9	and I think most people, correct
10	me if I'm wrong here, most people
11	would say that, yeah, we would
12	agree with that, the
13	manufacturing assets only would
14	qualify, but that's when the site
15	is doing some manufacturing and
16	some other type of production for
17	revenue that is not
18	manufacturing. But when a
19	facility is doing strictly
20	manufacturing at a site, that's
21	it's only source only product,
22	only source of revenue from that
23	site and also had some
24	administrative functions at that
25	same site, that entire site has



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1	always qualified for six or seven
2	decades now, I guess, so if
3	that's going to be changed,
4	that's going to be a major change
5	that's going to be very upsetting
6	to a lot of folks that are just
7	not a lot of folks that are
8	not in this room today.
9	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
10	Okay. Now, I would like to
11	ask if there are anymore comments
12	in reference to the applications
13	as presented for the Industrial
14	Tax Exemption Program?
1 5	MR. HARRIS:
16	I just have one.
17	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
18	We're in the comment period.
19	You may comment.
20	MR. HARRIS:
21	It's amazing to me how two
22	little asterisks now have evolved
23	into a major decision facing this
24	Board. I got to tell you, if
25	there are two issues, you know a



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1	lot more about two issues than I
2	do, so that's why I really urge
3	the Department to please tell us
4	what is the issue and what is the
5	recommendation by the Department
6	because I'm lost, and, you know,
7	somewhere, somehow, somebody has
8	got to make a determination, and
9	I would love to have a third
10	party non-binding thing by the
11	way of a code or whatever to tell
12	us what it is because then I
13	don't want to get to a point to
14	be arbitrary or capricious.
15	MR. FRUGE:
16	Madam Chair, let me add to
17	that comment by Mayor Ronnie
18	Harris. In my experience, it's
19	extremely common for NAICS code
20	to be incorrect. It happens a
21	lot. It may be as much as 50
22	percent when we are talking about
23	folks that employ a lot of people
24	like manufacturers. But I think
25	we have been talking about this a



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1	while, but what I heard early on
2	is we're addressing it
3	appropriately. I mean, you have
4	to have some benchmark, so you
5	use a NAICS code. If the
6	application were denied because
7	it was the wrong code then there
8	is an opportunity for that
9	manufacturer or whoever it is
10	that is applying for that
11	application to come back and say
12	our NAICS code is wrong. Now,
13	getting it changed is a bit of a
14	bureaucratic issue as well, but
15	absent that or maybe in advance
16	of that application, I think Lori
17	has been out and she said she had
18	narrowed the site and one hundred
19	percent manufacturing, so we
20	resolved that issue. There is no
21	issue. It just was a wrong NAICS
22	code. So, you know, it sounds
23	like we are approaching it right.
24	I mean, we are trying to get to
25	the bottom of it, but an



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1	applicant that has an incorrect
2	NAICS code gets rejected and then
3	it's incumbent on that applicant
4	or its representatives to come
5	before the staff, before LED and
6	say, guess what, NAICS code is
7	wrong, this is why, can you
8	either come out and take a look
9	or we have had a change, right?
10	MS. WEBER:
11	Correct. And in the past we
12	have had issues, and I will bring
13	up Expert Risers, because that
14	was one that Mr. Allison worked
15	with. That company could not get
16	a manufacturing NAICS code but we
17	did determine that they did
18	remanufacture at the facility
19	that they that we were
20	investigating. Now, the parent
21	company has the NAICS code, but
22	if that's not the case, if the
23	company actually, say, 75 percent
24	of their business is in the
25	service industry and only a small



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l	
1	portion of it is in the
2	manufacturing, they are not going
3	to get the NAICS code, so we
4	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
5	Gentleman at the podium. I am
6	sorry, Lori, were you finished?
7	MS. WEBER:
8	Yes, ma'am.
9	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
10	We have a gentlemen at the
11	podium. Please state your name
12	and the company you are
13	representing.
14	MR. STUDS:
15	Yes. My name is Brian Studs.
16	Consultant with Standard Business
17	Solutions. I think I'm pretty
18	much agreeing with what everybody
19	is saying here, and I agree with
20	Mr. Harris that it would be nice
21	if things were cut and dry like
22	that, but, I mean, it just isn't
23	that way in reality, and I found
24	I just want to say that my
25	experience with this Board and



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1	the administrators has always
2	been extremely positive and the
3	administrators do an excellent
4	job of pursuing the realities of
5	a project to find out what is and
6	is not manufacturing. I have had
7	projects that have been allowed
8	the administrative building that
9	were non-manufacturing NAICS code
10	but they were doing manufacturing
11	on the site, and then other ones
12	where the administrative section
13	was denied because like, for
14	example, a pipefitting and a
15	vending and cutting manufacturing
16	status, but, yet, also they had
17	supply aspect on the same site,
18	so then they said, well, we are
19	not going to give you the
20	administrative on that. So, I
21	mean, I felt like in both of
22	those cases they really did a
23	good job and I feel like that
24	whatever they are bringing to you
25	is something that they have



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1	scrutinized pretty hard and they
2	are not just giving things away
3	in terms of like, well, you are
4	doing one thing so we'll just
5	give you everything. So overall
6	I have been very happy, and I
7	like the way things have been
8	going as far as that goes, so I
9	just wanted to point that out.
10	Thank you.
11	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
12	Thank you, sir. Are there
13	anymore comments in reference to
14	the Industrial Tax Exemption
15	Applications as presented?
16	Hearing none, please consider the
17	comment period closed.
18	With that, I will ask for a
19	motion to approve the Industrial
20	Tax Exemption Applications with
21	the four revisions as follows:
22	Application No. 20100731 from
23	late to timely. Application No.
24	20100853 and 20100854 to late,
25	which they will be forfeiting



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1	
1	four years of their exemptions,
2	and Application No. 20100641 from
3	late to timely.
4	MS. WEBER:
5	Correct.
6	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
7	With that, I will entertain a
8	motion for approval. I have an
9	offer by Mr. Elmore. Second by
10	Mr. Soprano.
11	MR. FRUGE:
12	Madam Chair, discussion on
13	motion.
14	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
15	Discussion, please.
16	MR. FRUGE:
17	Let the record reflect that I
18	don't know what the term is
19	abstain or withdraw, whatever, my
20	vote, just one, which is FCE
21	Properties.
22	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
23	Okay. We have Mr. Fruge
24	abstaining showing his
25	abstinence from voting on name



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1 the	company, please.
2	MR. FRUGE:
3	FCE Properties, LLC.
4	MS. POTTS ROQUE:
5	That would be Application No.
6 201	00264. Mr. Fruge is
7 abs	taining from the vote on that
8 one	application.
9	With that, all in favor?
10	REMAINING BOARD MEMBERS:
11	Aye.
12	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
13	Any opposes?
14	MS. GRECO:
15	Can you split the motion so
16 tha	t with the abstaining from one
17 so	that the record
18	MS. POTTS ROQUE:
19	I will. What she has asked is
20 tha	t we split the motion and
21 we'	re going to approve the motion
22 as	presented with the amendments
23 as	read with the exception of
24 App	lication 2010 I think it's

13	them all, I don't think I have to
14	do a comment period for that one

20	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
21	Okay. I would like to
22	entertain a motion at this time

3	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
4	For the record, please show
5	that Mr. Andre Fruge abstained
6	from the vote. Any opposes?
7	Hearing none, motion carries.

9	another motion on the floor. I
10	had asked for comments in
11	reference to us asking for a

19	This contract was left off the
20	original request by the company.
21	This is in West Baton Rouge.
22	Island Boats, Inc., 20039019. No
23	communication. We have not been
24	able to get any status on it
25	except from the Assessors Office



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1	which said that they are closed
2	and in bankruptcy. We request
3	cancellation, Iberia Parish.
4	Cerro Flow Products; 2009048,
5	20019086, 20029134, 20039093,
6	050147, 060349, 070190 and
7	20080150. They close their
8	facility in July of '09. We were
9	notified by the Bossier assessor
10	of the closure with the request
11	for cancellation. Contract

10	requested cancellation. This is
11	in Jefferson Davis.
12	Ciba Specialty Chemicals
13	Corporation. 2009358, 20019324,
14	20029204, 20039430, 050481 and
15	060664. They have been shutdown
16	and the assets have been sold to
17	a lease holding company and are
18	being dispensed for scrap, I
19	guess. This is in Iberville.
20	Placid Refining. 20090690.
21	This is a duplication of an
22	original contract that is already
23	under contract. 062321. So we
24	request cancellation of the
25	duplicate contract. Lyondell

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1	Chemical Company. Contract No.

5	consultants has requested

8	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
9	Thank you, ma'am. At this
10	time I would like to open the
11	floor for comments in reference
12	to Cancellation of Contracts

14	Exemption Program. Hearing none,
15	please consider the comment
16	period closed.
17	With that, I will entertain a

13	That concludes what we have
14	on the agenda today, and now move
15	into the comments and remarks by
16	Mr. Moret. He has here Mr.
17	Grissom in his absence. Mr.
18	Grissom.
19	MR. GRISSOM:
20	Thank you very much. Thank
21	you to all of our Board members.
22	I first wanted to provide our
23	Board with an update on some of
24	the rules that the Board
25	addressed sometime ago. We do



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1	have Notices of Intent for the
2	amendments to the Enterprise Zone
3	and the Industrial Tax Exemption
4	Program. Those went to the
5	Louisiana Register in on
6	August 20th, and the public
7	comment period will run through
8	the near the end of September.
9	Depending on the comments that
10	the legislative committee within
11	30 days after receipt of a report
12	characterizing those comments,
13	and if everything moved forward
14	as planned, in other words, made
15	it through the committee review
16	and comment period, the final
17	rule may be published in
18	November, more likely December.
19	The Quality Jobs Program is
20	another program that the Board
21	addressed is roughly in a cycle
22	about 30 days behind the cycle
23	I just described for the
24	Enterprise Zone Program and
25	Industrial Tax Exemption Program,



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1	so we're looking forward to
2	making progress and keep the
3	Board posted as we go through the
4	comment period and the oversight
5	committees.
6	For a second I just wanted to
7	comment on a few news releases
8	that I have left with each of the
9	Board members that at your
10	seat. The first release is really
11	focused on some national
12	rankings, and this has been a
13	strong post of the Department
14	working to insure that we focus
15	on activities that could, over
16	time, improve the State's
17	rankings from objective third
18	parties, and we have made some
19	progress on a number of fronts. I
20	wanted to share a few of those
21	with you.
22	The first was this is
23	Southern Business Development.
24	This is a June sorry, July '06
25	release. Louisiana was named for



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1	the second consecutive year post
2	date of the year within Southern
3	Business and Development, and to
4	remain to remain at the top
5	for this ranking, Louisiana, our
6	state, secured more significant
7	projects per capita in 2009 than
8	16 other southern states that we
9	were ranked against through that
10	assessment. So very excited about
11	the progress there.
12	Subsequently in August, this
13	is the August 4th release,
14	another ranking focused on
15	business climate in general named
16	Louisiana the most improved
17	state, and this was the first
18	ever that we were actually
19	identified the most improved
20	state. Louisiana ranked 20th in
21	the 2010 list, from 27th in 2009,
22	and 40th in 2008, and in the
23	report, the 2010 report, one of
24	the comments was noted Louisiana
25	has shown astounding progress.



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1	Again, this is over to their
2	stretch. But these third party
3	rankings report really provide
4	validation. They establish
5	Louisiana with a lot of
6	credibility, and we, in our
7	business development efforts, try
8	to leverage those as much as
9	possible, so very excited to see
10	that positive message. They
11	noticed a number of the things
12	that we implemented over the last
13	few years including our retention
14	to modernization program,
15	Louisiana FAST Start Program and
16	our marketing efforts among the
17	reasons why we have seen that
18	improvement from 2008 to 2010.
19	On a related note but not one
20	of the releases that I provided
21	to you, but our Louisiana FAST
22	Start Program, one of the
23	programs noted was actually
24	briefly cited this was in the
25	late July timeframe, cited as the



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1	top work training programs in the
2	nation. Louisiana FAST Start is
3	a new program. When we created
4	the program we aspired to create
5	a top five program. We were
6	especially pleased to be
7	recognized by the Business
8	Facility magazine, a leading site
9	publication, and singled out as
10	the top performing program with
11	the Louisiana FAST Start, a
12	program that just started two
13	years ago, so very pleased with
14	that performance. One where we
15	edged up other top ranked
16	industries, including Georgia and
17	New Mexico and North Carolina, so
18	certainly pleased to be in front
19	of those states in that
20	particular ranking.
21	Workforce is a very common
22	concern of businesses who are
23	considering Louisiana who aren't
24	familiar with Louisiana, so they
25	had to have in place a strong



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1	program where we are receiving
2	positive testimonials, where we
3	are receiving third party
4	validation on the strength of
5	that program is a very very
6	effective tool for us, and one
7	that we continue to see for the
8	state over time.
9	To wrap things up, I wanted
10	to comment on a couple of our
11	major announcements that we have
12	seen recently. I left with you a
13	few releases on this topic, but
14	we continue to be pleased with a
15	project pipeline. The
16	announcements that we're seeing,
17	new jobs, new investment coming
18	to the state. For instance,
19	recently Global Star, a leading
20	satellite communications company
21	announced they were relocating
22	from California to Covington.
23	This is one where we expect
24	Louisiana employment to increase
25	by more than five hundred by the



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1	end of 2019, so it's very
2	hypotension for the state. That's
3	on the northshore. Also we
4	recently announced a new company
5	establishing a presence at
6	Michoud Assembly facility in New
7	Orleans. This is a venture that
8	is funded by Dow Venture Capital
9	and American Super Conductor to
10	publicly traded companies. The
11	Blade Dynamics is focused on a
12	new turbine technology, wind
13	turbine, and it's one that offers
14	a lot of promise. We have a
15	commitment to create six hundred
16	new jobs over time, and this is a
17	very, very exciting announcement
18	because it's new technology and a
19	focus that aligns with our
20	strategy, and one that leverages
21	the assets that are currently
22	existing at Michoud, so very
23	excited about that. I left with
24	you a couple of other
25	announcements. One with SNF just



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1	across the river, and another
2	with new customer service that
3	announced an expansion in
4	Central, Louisiana.
5	But I just want to share with
6	the Board members that we
7	absolutely appreciate your
8	support and your involvement with
9	this Board, and wants you as
10	Board members to know we remain
11	very focused on job creation in
12	Louisiana. We are excited about
13	the progress that we made so far.
14	We continue to see some exciting
15	prospects despite this very
16	challenging time, and want you to
17	know that we continue to work
18	very hard and very diligently to
19	deliver positive outcomes for
20	Louisiana. So thank you.
21	MS. POTTS-ROQUE:
22	Thank you. With that I would
23	like to ask our chairman if he
24	has anything he would like to say
25	at this time before we conclude.



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
