NEW BUSINESS

Adoption of Reinstatement Policy:

Tina Peltier, Assistant Director is currently working on a reinstatement policy for licensees. This policy will help the commission members be consistent in issuing reinstatements and also help the staff members be more selective on who can petition the commission for instatement. According to the Horticulture regulation, if the period of non-renewal is more than 5 years, the licensee must either retake the exam or petition the commission for re-issuance. The licensee must provide evidence that they have been active in the appropriate profession during the period of non-renewal.

Report on Arborist Insurance Requirements:

Tina Peltier, Assistant Director, surveyed the insurance certificates of 50 licensed arborists, approximately 10%. 70% had a 1M dollar policy, 10% had a \$100,000 policy and 6% had a 2M dollar policy. The rest was made up of \$300,000; \$500,000 and \$5 million and \$35 million dollar policies, which were utility companies. It was hard to get a cost from the insurance companies because too many different factors were involved for them to give us a quote. For instance, type of work, number of employees, years of experience, etc. were all determining factors. (It was difficult to find any information on the amount required by other states as many do not require the state arborist license.) **Motion:** Mr. Von Kurnatowski made a motion to increase the current insurance requirement from \$25,000 bodily injury/\$50,000 property damage. This motion was seconded by Mr. Parker. **Motion:** Mr. Von Kurnatowski made a motion to amend his first motion to increase the current insurance requirement from \$25,000 bodily injury/\$50,000 property damage. This motion was seconded by Mr. Sims and passed unanimously.

Update on Insurance Requirements:

LAC 1177:XXIX.117 were finalized on October 20, 2016 to clarify than an arborist, utility arborist, and landscape irrigation contractor shall maintain insurance coverage while operating in their professions.

Director's Report:

Mr. Rankins gave the following updates:

Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) was confirmed in Lincoln Parish on July 11th, making it the fifth parish in Louisiana to have EAB. Nurseries/NSDs in quarantined parishes cannot ship ash trees out of the quarantined areas. LDAF, in partnership with USDA-PPQ, USFS, and NRCS, monitored ~470 EAB traps statewide through the summer months. The trapping season ended in August, in addition, the LSU AgCenter conducted 15 total parasitoid releases of over 37,000 tiny

parasitoid wasps at the infested sites as biocontrol agents in an attempt to reduce EAB populations and help slow the natural spread of the beetle.

Citrus Canker was confirmed in St. James and St. John the Baptist Parish, bringing the total number of parishes with CC+ trees to eight. Survey activity ongoing in coordination with USDA-PPQ. Emergency Rule published on October 25th, to include all of Plaquemines Parish.

Citrus Commodity Survey- LDAF annual survey funded with federal Farm Bill money, LDAF conducted 57 inspections, surpassing the projected 30 inspections from the Spring/Summer, and visually inspected approximately 4165 citrus plants. Inspectors submitted 51 tissue samples taken from 23 different properties to the LSU Plant Diagnostics Lab for identification of disease problems. 22 samples were diagnosed with citrus canker and 4 samples were diagnosed with citrus greening. Most of the samples were taken from locations already under quarantine for the respective pests. To date, LDAF has removed and disposed of 18 citrus tress diagnosed with citrus greening on 9 different properties in Orleans Parish. Inspectors will complete 30 additional inspections during the fall survey.

We will begin our second year offering online payments opportunities for license and permit renewals. To be eligible for payments, the applicants will have to pay their entire invoice, including late fees if applicable. Multiple license holders choosing to renew one license will have to mail in their payments. Permit holders with multiple locations will have to mail their payments as well.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments but Mr. Bass took a moment to thank the commission members and inspectors for the good job that they do.
