SUMMARY

A. Louisiana Behavior Analyst Board

i. LAC 46:VIII.501-517. Supervision

Changes clarify requirements for electronic supervision of State Certified Assistant Behavior Analysts assisting a Licensed Behavior Analyst. Changes clarify what is allowed and what is required for electronic surveillance supervision to be a qualifying supervision activity. (See highlighted areas for specific rule changes)

B. Louisiana Board of Examiners for Speech Language Pathology and Audiology

i. LAC 46: LXXV.103. Definitions

Repeals “on-site in-view observation” because the terminology for supervision was changed to “direct supervision”.

ii. LAC 46: LXXV.107. Qualifications for Licensure

H.2. Removes the specified number of clinical practicum hours for Audiologists and instead requires the accredited educational institution to verify that the individual has met the breadth and depth of clinical experiences.

iii. LAC 46: LXXV. 109. Licensure Application Procedure

E. Grammatical changed to add “shall be”

H. adds an additional waiver for Audiology licensure, as requested by the state audiology association.

iv. LAC 46: LXXV. 121. Duties

A.1.a. removes language allowing Speech-Language Pathology Assistants to conduct assessments and administer tests.

A.1.h. Adds clarification that Assistant licensees must have “permission and guidance of the supervising speech-language pathologist” and that the supervising speech-language pathologist be “present” for Provisional speech-language pathology assistant licensees to participate in these activities.

A.2.a.xiii. clarifies that “Provisional speech-language pathology assistants may not participate” in specific activities.

C. State Board of Certified Public Accountants of Louisiana

D. Louisiana State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors

i. LAC 46:XXXVII.701. Renewal and Reinstatement

This law will require complete and comprehensive changes due to the Legislative change to LA R.S. 37:844 so that the rule will remain in concert with the law which is attached for review.

ii. LAC 46:XXXVII.905. Application; Fee

This rule pertains to the internship application and the fee regarding same to be promulgated to include the language as “non-refundable” to align with the temporary license application fee as outlined in Chapter 7. 707 A, which is attached.

iii. LAC 46:XXXVII.1701. Reports on Prepaid Funeral Services or Merchandise

This change is being requested to correct a typographical error from 2004, in which the referenced LA R.S. 37:861 is incorrect. The correct reference is LA R.S. 37:865 D.

iv. LAC 46:XXXVII.1901. Survivors Clause

To be repealed.

v. LAC 46:XXXVII.1902. Heirship Clause

To be added as Heirship Clause; this rule will completely update the previous 1901 regarding Survivor's Clause which stipulated an application for a "special work permit". Since there is no definition for a "special work permit" and any requirements for same, the rule is requesting a change to address an ownership change for heirs of a decedent owner of a funeral establishment.

vi. LAC 46:XXXVII.2001. Procedure to Follow

Fees; changes are the request to repeal A. 13 and 14 as these fees are not noted in the statute and the Board is not able to collect these fees.

E. Louisiana State Board of Dentistry

i. LAC 46:XXXIII.1503. Personal Permits for Sedation/Anesthesia

Rule 1503 pertains to education requirements necessary for licensees of the Louisiana State Board of Dentistry to perform sedation and/or use nitrous oxide on patients. The current rule provides that in order to perform nitrous oxide analgesia, a dentist is required to have had 16 hours of didactic instruction on the use of nitrous oxide and non-specified clinically oriented experiences. The rule change is to bring Louisiana in line with the guidelines of the American Dental Association for nitrous oxide education, as our neighboring states have done and revises the requirement to 14 hours of didactic instruction and 6 clinically oriented experiences.

ii. LAC 46:XXXIII.1607. Exemptions (continuing education)

Rule 1607 provides exemptions to the rules requiring continuing education for licensees. Currently licensees renew every two years, with licensees whose last names starting with the letters A-L renewing in odd years and M-Z renewing in even years. When someone whose name begins with a letter in the A-L range graduates or first received his or her license in an odd year, at the end of that year he or she must renew his or her license, even if he or she has held a license even for a few months. Licensees in this situation would be exempt from continuing education requirements for their first

renewal. If a licensee with whose name begins with a letter in the M-Z range first received his or her license in an odd year, then he or she would not need to renew the license until the end of the next even year, meaning that it would be one year and several months before renewing his or her license. Licensees in this situation currently required to complete one half of the continuing education requirements.

This makes for a very complicated scheme that is difficult to track and neighboring states handle this by simply requiring no continuing education for the first license renewal cycle. This proposed rule change does away with any continuing education requirement for all licensee's first renewal cycle, regardless of when the license was first obtained, but requires the licensees to maintain their CPR training.

iii. LAC 46:XXXIII.1615. Continuing Education Requirements

Rule 1615 pertains to continuing education requirements for licensees of the Louisiana State Board of Dentistry. The current rule provides that courses sponsored or approved by several organizations are accepted for licensee continuing education credit in Louisiana. Those organizations currently include organizations such as: The American Dental Association; The American Dental Hygienists Association; and The American Academy of General Dentistry, among others. The proposed change to the rule adds the American Academy of Dental Hygiene (AADH) to the list of those organizations. The American Academy of Dental Hygiene has provided the Dental Board with its extensive policies regarding the requirements which must be met for the AADH to sponsor or approve the course.

Neighboring states, including Texas, Mississippi, Arkansas, Alabama and Tennessee currently already accept courses approved or sponsored by the AADH.

F. State Board of Architectural Examiners

i. LAC 46:I.1101. Registration Information

The proposed amendment to Rule 1101 increases the initial license registration fee for an in-state architectural candidate by \$15 (from \$75 to \$90) effective November 1, 2019, and clarifies that other rules are applicable to the registration and the obtaining of certificated of authority of professional architectural corporations, architectural-engineering corporations, and architectural firms.

ii. LAC 46:I.1105. Licenses

The proposed amendment to Rule 1105 clarifies that the LSBAE issues licenses, not certificates, to individual architects, and established a fee of \$30 for the issuance of a replacement license.

iii. LAC 46:I.1301. Renewal Practices

The proposed amendment to Rule § 1301 increases the license renewal fees for an in-state architect by \$15 (from 75 to \$90) and for an out-of-state architect by \$25 (from \$150 to \$175); increases the delinquent fee of an in-state architect by \$5 (from \$105 to \$110) and for an out-of-state architect by \$20 (from \$180 to \$200), and clarifies that other rules are applicable to the renewals of certificates of authority and any delinquent renewals of professional architectural corporations, architectural-engineering corporations, and architectural firms. The proposed fee increases will be effective November 1, 2019.

G. Louisiana State Board of Social Work Examiners

i. LAC 46:XXV.503. LMSWs Seeking the LCSW Credential

These are the rules that apply to LMCWs that are supervised for the purpose of becoming licensed. The changes being proposed will clarify who is responsible for turning in which forms. It allows the opportunity for approval of more than 48 hours of group supervision and the opportunity for approval or supervision to occur through face-to-face electronic means.

H. Louisiana Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners

i. LAC 46:LX.3105. Definitions for Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists and Provisional Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists

Proposed change reflects a clarification to the definition of *Active Supervision*. Previously, *Active Supervision* was defined as the process by which a supervisee receives one hour of face-to-face supervision with his/her board-approved supervisor for every 20 hours of direct client contact or at least once every three-month period. The change being proposed is to define *Active Supervision* as the process by which a supervisee receives one hour of face-to-face supervision with his/her board-approved supervisor for every 20 hours of direct client contact. The supervisor and supervisee must meet at least one hour within a three-month period. Active Supervision is based on

direct client contact hours. Supervision hours shall be adjusted if the PLPC has less than 20 hours of direct contact, or more than 20 hours of direct client contact.

ii. LAC 46:LX.3309. Academic Requirements for MFT Licensure or Provisional Licensure

This changes the academic requirements for MFT Licensure/Provisional Licensure from *or* to *and*. This would increase the requirements for acquiring a license of this nature.

iii. LAC 46:LX.3315. Application, Practice, and Renewal Requirements for Provisional Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists

Change reflects a simple wording clarification for the application, practice, and renewal requirements for provisional licensed marriage and family therapists.

iv. LAC 46:LX.3317. Qualifications of the LMFT-Approved Supervisor, LMFT-Registered Supervisor Candidate, Board-Approved Supervisor, and Registered Supervisor Candidate.

Reflects a slight change in the qualifications required of the LMFT-approved supervisor, LMFT-registered supervisor candidate, board-approved supervisor, and registered supervisor candidate.

v. LAC 46:LX.3319. Responsibilities of the Provisional Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist

Reflects an addition to the responsibilities of the provisional licensed marriage and family therapist.

I. Louisiana Liquefied Petroleum Gas Commission

i. LAC 55:IX.105. Applications

Technical language change to make the rule more readable. As opposed to listing the classes of permits that are excluded from the application requirements, the classes of permits that the requirements are applicable to are cited therein.

ii. LAC 55:IX.107. Requirements

The filing fee for permits is amended from \$150.00 to \$100.00. This change is to correct a previous rule adoption that changed the fee from \$100.00 to \$150.00. The previous rule change was inadvertently promulgated and the \$150.00 fee was never enacted by the Commission, as it would be more burdensome than the national average. In addition, the requirement for registrations to pay the fee is eliminated due to the fact that

registrations are now obsolete. IN addition to the amendment regarding the filing fees, Section 107 also amends the continuing education requirements. This was requested by industry for the purpose of holding the industry to a higher standard.

iii. LAC 55:IX.109. Compliance with Rules

This amendment repeals Section 109 (D.) which is a specified fee schedule for proposed civil penalties per violations of the rules. Section 109 (B.) already mirrors the language in statute, which sets a pay scale consisting of a monetary “floor” (Not less than \$100.00) and a monetary “ceiling” (not more than \$1,000.00), for the amount that can be assessed for a proposed penalty.

iv. LAC 55:IX.113. Classes of Permits and Registrations

This is a technical language amendment that corrects the previous promulgation which failed to include the word “and”.

v. LAC 55:IX.133. Shall Purchase Containers Manufactured by Manufacturers Acceptable to the Authority Having Jurisdiction

vi. LAC 55:IX.177. Appliance Installation and Connections

vii. LAC 55:IX.181. National Fire Protection Association Pamphlet Numbers 54 and 58

viii. LAC 55:IX.205. Installation of Liquefied Petroleum Gas Systems Used as Engine Fuel System for School Bus/Mass Transit Vehicles

Sections 133, 177, 181, and 205 adopt the latest version of national standards found in the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 58-2017 edition. Previously the 2008 edition of the NFPA was adopted and utilized by the Commission.

ix. LAC 55:IX.1513. Classes of Permits

This is an amendment to add language which was inadvertently omitted from the rule. The omitted language defines Class A2 anhydrous ammonia permits. This mirrors section 1513(A.)(1.) which defines Class A1 anhydrous ammonia permits.

J. Louisiana State Board of Optometry Examiners

i. LAC 46:LI.301. Continuing Education

Revised Rule 301 makes it clear that “a minimum of 9 of 12 hours must be obtained in a classroom setting in the calendar year in which an optometrist holding a controlled dangerous substance license satisfies the one-time continuing education requirement for controlled dangerous substances set forth in §303.”

Revised Rule 301 also makes it clear that “a minimum of 13 of 16 hours must be obtained in a classroom setting in the calendar year in which an optometrist holding a controlled dangerous substance license satisfies the one-time continuing education requirement for controlled dangerous substances set forth in §303.”

ii. LAC 46:LI.303. Continuing Education Requirement for Controlled Dangerous Substances

New Rule 303 makes it mandatory for any optometrist whose scope of practice is to dispense or administer controlled dangerous substances, as a condition prerequisite to licensure renewal, to successfully complete three credit hours of continuing education approved the board on controlled dangerous substances prescribing practices. The rule further provides that these credits may be obtained by an online course approved by the board. This rule is being promulgated in response to Act. No. 76, Senate Bill No. 55 of the Louisiana Legislature requiring “licensing boards that regulates practitioners with prescriptive authority in Louisiana” to “establish continuing education requirements [for controlled dangerous substances] as a prerequisite to license renewal.”

iii. LAC 46:LI.501. Professional Conduct

Revised Rule 501(A) makes it a violation for optometrists for failing to report adverse actions to the board within thirty days of the action.

iv. LAC 46:LI.503. License to Practice Optometry

Revised Rule 503(I) clarifies procedures for retiring a license and adds new procedures for reinstating a retired license.

v. LAC 46:LI.505. Prescriptions for Eyeglasses or Contact Lenses

New Rule 505 adds certain requirements for valid spectacle and contact lens prescriptions. In order to be valid, a spectacle prescription must (1) contain in a legible form the name, address, telephone number and license number of the provider; (2) the name of the patient, the prescription date, refractive power and may contain information specifying the physical design; and (3) the expiration date and signature of the provider issuing the prescription. In order for a contact lens prescription to be valid it must (1) contain the name, address, telephone number and license number of the provider; and (2) the name of the patient, prescription date, brand or material, curvature and lens diameter, refractive power, and the number of lenses/boxes to be dispensed.

This rule further provides that contact lenses may not be sold or dispensed without a signed, unexpired prescription and goes on to list similar requirements for contact lens prescriptions as it does for spectacle prescriptions. This rule also provides that prescriptions for spectacles may not exceed 18 months and the prescriptions for contact lenses may not exceed 12 months (unless provider documents valid medical reason in chart for doing so) and no entity or person may fill a contact lens or spectacle prescription after the expiration date of the prescription.

This rule also provides that neither spectacle nor contact lens prescriptions may be substituted for one another and an optometrist, when filling the prescription, must keep the original prescription, copy or electronic facsimile of the original prescription and must release the prescription to the patient, if requested by the patient, unless the prescription has expired.

vi. **LAC 46:LI.611. Mandatory Access and Review of Prescription Monitoring Program Data; Exceptions**

New Rule 611 provides for mandatory access and review of the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP). Prior to initially prescribing any opioid to a patient, a prescriber shall access and review the patient's record in the PMP and if opioids are prescribed to the patient for more than 90 days the prescriber shall access and review the record in the PMP at least every 90 days. There are several exceptions to this requirement, consisting of the following: (1) the drug is prescribed to a hospice patient or any other patient who has been diagnosed as terminally ill; (2) the drug is prescribed for the treatment of cancer related chronic or intractable pain; (3) the drug is ordered or administered to a patient being treated in a hospital; (4) the PMP is not accessible or not functioning properly due to an electronic issue; or (5) no more than a single 7-day supply of the drug is prescribed or administered to a patient. Any optometrist who fails to follow this rule shall be deemed to constitute just cause for the suspension, revocation, refusal to issue or the imposition of probationary or other restrictions on any license or permit to practice optometry in Louisiana. This rule is being promulgated in response to Act. No. 76, Senate Bill No. 55 of the Louisiana Legislature.
