No requests were received from the public to address the board.

Mr. Clouatre gave a statement to commemorate Mr. Dupuy's last meeting as a member of the board and expressed appreciation for Mr. Dupuy's twenty years of service. Mr. Dupuy gave a statement of gratitude and farewell.

New Board member Adam Guinn was sworn in.

D. ENFORCEMENT HEARINGS:

 D.R. HORTON, INC. – GULF COAST, Baton Rouge, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2158(A)(7) LSLBC Case 2023-0961-01

Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations and read the settlement offer presented by D.R. HORTON, INC. – GULF COAST. Kristen McKey, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Ms. McKey reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motion made,

seconded, and unanimously passed, the board accepted the settlement offer as presented, which included a no contest plea.

2. 3M PAINTING AND RENOVATIONS, LLC, Metairie, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2158(A)(1) LSLBC Case 2024-0131-01

No one was present on behalf of 3M PAINTING AND RENOVATIONS, LLC. Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations. Jude Mathews, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. Mathews reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motions made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board found 3M PAINTING AND RENOVATIONS, LLC to be in violation and assessed an administrative penalty of the maximum fine plus \$1,000 in administrative costs.

No one was present on behalf of S & S AC AND ELECRICAL LLC. Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations. Laurie LaRose, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Ms. LaRose reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motions made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board found S & S AC AND ELECTRICAL LLC to be in violation and assessed an administrative penalty of the maximum fine plus \$1,000 in administrative costs.

4. 2 DEGREES OF AIR LLC, Lake Charles, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2160(A)(1) LSLBC Case 2024-0051-02

No one was present on behalf of 2 DEGREES OF AIR LLC. Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations. Robert Mehrtens, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. Mehrtens reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motions made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board found 2 DEGREES OF AIR LLC to be in violation and assessed an administrative penalty of the maximum fine plus \$1,000 in administrative costs.

Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations and read the settlement offer presented by AMERICAN GUTTER COMPANY, LLC. Frank Vaughan, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. Vaughan reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board accepted the settlement offer as presented, which included a no contest plea.

b) JOEL ROMERO CONSTRUCTION, L.L.C., Jennings, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2158(A)(1) LSLBC Case 2024-0318-02

No one was present on behalf of JOEL ROMERO CONSTRUCTION, L.L.C. Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations. Frank Vaughan, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. Vaughan reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motions made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board found JOEL ROMERO CONSTRUCTION, L.L.C. to be in violation and assessed an administrative penalty of the maximum fine plus \$1,000 in administrative costs.

Ms. LaRose reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board accepted the settlement offer as presented, which included a no contest plea.

CRAIG VERDUN was present and was sworn in. Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations. Mr. Verdun entered a plea of no contest. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the plea was accepted. Laurie LaRose, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Ms. LaRose reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. Mr. Verdun made a statement to the board. The board questioned Mr. Verdun. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board ordered no penalty be assessed.

Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations and read the settlement offer presented by VAPOR INDUSTRIES, LLC. John LeBlanc, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. LeBlanc reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board accepted the settlement offer as presented, which included a no contest plea.

8. SABINE POOLS, LLC, Lake Charles, Louisiana — La. R.S. 37:2158(A)(7) LSLBC Case 2022-1242-01

Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations and read the settlement offer presented by SABINE POOLS, LLC. Frank Vaughan, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. Vaughan reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board accepted the settlement offer as presented, which included a no contest plea.

O & A CONCRETE LLC, Scott, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2158(A)(1) LSLBC Case 2023-1477-01

Oscar Olivera Ortiz was present on behalf of O & A CONCRETE LLC and was sworn in. Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations. Mr. Ortiz entered a plea of no contest. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the plea was accepted. Andy Futrell, Investigator, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. Futrell reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. Mr. Ortiz made a statement to the board. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board ordered a penalty of a \$1,000 fine plus \$1,000 in administrative costs to be reduced to \$1,000 in administrative costs only provided the proper license is obtained by December 27, 2024.

Joseph Anderson, Investigative Supervisor, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. Anderson reviewed the exhibit packet for this case as well as for cases 2022-0223-03, 2023-0012-05, 2022-0023-02, and 2022-1573-01 and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packets into evidence, and they were admitted. On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the board accepted the settlement offer as presented, which included a no contest plea; surrender of their commercial license and the qualifying party status of Mr. Carr; and the stipulation that no license be issued to Mr. Carr nor any affiliated company for a period of one year.

The meeting resumed according to the agenda.
