Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packets into evidence, and they were admitted. Ms. Sconzert made a statement to the board. Ms. Sconzert made an offer to the board of a \$3,000 fine plus \$2,000 in administrative costs. On motion made, seconded and unanimously passed, the offer was rejected.
