Mr. Rene Chopin, BKI, gave an update on the pump station analysis.

Bayou Des Allemands Pump Station Data Gap Analysis

- Final comments addressed and reviewed by CSRS on the modeling package.
- Finalized hydrograph figures are being generated based on the models and will be updated in the report.
- The finalized report and modeling data will be provided to LBCLDD and CSRS for distribution to CPRA.
- Modeling of the exterior of the pump station has been completed and a brief flyover and the latest renderings are included on the following slide

UBRR Segment 3 Barge Gate MEP

- 65% comments from the ITR review have been incorporated into the drawings and specifications
- BKI and Infinity attended a construction conflict review meeting with GIS and finalized the location of the ballast pump system.
- 95% Drawings are being finalized on the barge gate and will go through a review process in the coming weeks. Specifications are currently in review

Mr. Rodney Greenup, Greenup Industries, gave an update.

Segment 3 and Segment 4 Coastal Use Permit (CUP)

- Section 404 Federal permit status
 - USACE internal meetings are happening
 - Impacted by Gov't shutdown
 - Corps PM and Engineering will not make a recommendation until the Corps interior hydraulic modeling is completed in December
 - Looking for 404 Permit in early 2026
- State permit status
 - Coastal Use Permit: Still need to coordinate with the Mitigation department, but the State is reviewing Geotech report in response to their latest comments
 - Water Quality Certificate: Received on November 3, 2025
 - Scenic Rivers Permit: Received on October 20, 2025
- Next Steps
 - USACE St. Paul District Supplemental EA
 - On public notice this month for review
 - The access road is on top of the existing Midway Canal berm and not further west as shown in LBCLDD's plans
 - The Corps design of the bridge over Godchaux Canal is at elevation +8.4 feet, which could restrict some navigation along the channel.
 - Greenup will Finalize a Mitigation Plan with agencies in early 2026
 - Work is on-going with State agencies
 - Indirect impact analysis underway by the Corps
 - Segment 4 Section 408 Permit

- Currently not required by the USACE
- If the Corps receives Construction funding for Segment 4 prior to issuance of the CUP and Scenic Rivers permit, then this may become a requirement for Segment 4 since the Corps has advanced PED on this reach.

Mr. Joseph Christopher, CSRS, Inc., gave the highlights on the Upper Barataria Project.

 - BKI Segment 3 MEP design progress
 - 65% review comments resolved in Plans and Specs
 - 95% design and construction documents has begun

 - Modeling questions coordination with pending focus meeting to be scheduled
