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\* \* \* \* \* 1 MR. PERRY: 2 This our August 31st, Louisiana 3 Trust Fund Advisory Board meeting. I 4 5 thank everyone for making time to attend. The first thing we'll do is, we will 6 7 -- thank you, Durwood. We will do roll call of our board members, and then, 8 we'll go around the room and do 9 introductions. 10 So I will call for you if you're 11 12 here. Let's see, Joe McCartney is on the phone, I believe. 13 14 MR. MCCARTNEY: I'm listening. 15 MR. PERRY: 16 Thank you, Joe. And then Mr. Grady 17 18 Gaubert. 19 MR. MCCARTNEY: 20 Todd, can you hear me? MR. PERRY: 21 Got you, Joe. 2.2 MR. GAUBERT: 23 24 Grady Gaubert --25 MR. PERRY:

1 Grady is here. MR. GAUBERT: 2 -- representing Louisiana Oil 3 Marketers and Convenience Store 4 Association. 5 MR. PERRY: 6 7 Thank you, Grady. And then Mr. Michael Guillory. 8 MR. GUILLORY: 9 Michael Guillory, Louisiana Oil 10 11 Marketers. 12 MR. PERRY: And I'm Todd Perry with PPM 13 14 Consultants. And Mr. Frank Marcello. MR. MARCELLO: 15 I'm Frank Marcello with Louisiana 16 Oil Marketers. 17 18 MR. PERRY: 19 And then Mr. Jesse Hoppes. MR. HOPPES: 20 Jesse Hoppes, Leaaf Environmental. 21 MR. PERRY: 22 23 All right. So that gives us five 24 board members present, one on the phone, 25 and then, Mr. Gary Fulton, we'll get to

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1 him in a second, is here. Oh, I'm sorry. Golly. Here's our best board member, our 2 newest board member, Mr. Damien Watt. 3 MR. WATT: 4 5 Damien Watt with LMOGA, Louisiana Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Association. 6 7 MR. PERRY: So that is six and seven board 8 members here. I'd say that's a record. 9 MS. VIZINAT: 10 Yes, it is. 11 12 MR. PERRY: Good for us. We're doing good. 13 14 So with that done, we'll go around the room and I'll start -- oh, Gary. 15 MR. FULTON: 16 17 Sorry, I apologize. MR. PERRY: 18 That's all right. Got you. Gary, 19 if you would, just quick introduction. 20 MR. FULTON: 21 2.2 Gary Fulton, Assistant Secretary of 23 the Office of Environmental Assessment. 24 MR. PERRY: 25 Thank you, sir. So those are our

1 board members, and so you're good on a quorum. And we'll start with you, Cy, 2 for introductions. 3 MR. MORIN: 4 5 Cy Morin, LDEQ Audit. MS. DELAFOSSE: 6 7 Theresa Delafosse, DEO Financial Services. 8 MS. VIZINAT: 9 Melissa Vizinat, DEO Trust Fund. 10 MR. PERRY: 11 12 All right. Now, we'll go into the 13 room. 14 MR. DICHARRY: Carey Dicharry, DEO UST. 15 MS. FOLSE: 16 Erin Folse, DEQ UST. 17 18 MR. LOUPE: 19 Tad Loupe, UST. MR. PERRY: 20 21 Thank you. MR. MEANS: 22 Chris Means, UST Division. 23 24 MR. PERRY: All right, Chris. I'll go to the 25

1 back row, Shawn. MR. KING: 2 Shawn King, Jones Environmental. 3 MR. PERRY: 4 5 Thank you. MR. BROUSSARD: 6 7 Samuel Broussard, DEO UST Division. MS. FALKE: 8 Fran Falke, DEQ OMF. 9 MR. PERRY: 10 11 Thank you. 12 MR. KEMP: Trey Kemp, DEQ Trust Fund. 13 14 MR. PERRY: Thank you, Trey. 15 MS. ISAACKS: 16 Natalie Isaacks, Louisiana Oil 17 Marketers and Convenience Store 18 19 Association. 20 MR. PERRY: 21 Thank you. MS. CLARK: 22 Jill Clark, General Counsel DEQ. 23 24 MR. PERRY: 25 Thank you.

1 MR. BAKER: Jeff Baker, DEQ Trust Fund Manager. 2 MR. PERRY: 3 4 Yes, sir. Okay. That gets us all 5 introduced. All right. So the first order of 6 7 business is the adoption of our May 18th board minutes, which are in your packet 8 and also were emailed to us prior to the 9 meeting. If you review -- does anyone 10 11 have any comments, or the floor is open 12 for a motion to accept. MR. GAUBERT: 13 I make a motion to accept. 14 MR. PERRY: 15 16 All right. Grady's got a motion. Grady Gaubert made a motion. Second? 17 MR. GUILLORY: 18 19 I'll second. 20 MR. PERRY: Mr. Mike Guillory seconds. So all 21 2.2 in favor please say aye. (All indicated aye.) 23 MR. PERRY: 24 25 Any opposed say nay.

1 (No response.) MR. PERRY: 2 All right. So the minutes are 3 4 adopted from our May 18th meeting. All right. So that brings us to 5 point three of our agenda. Ms. Theresa, 6 7 if you'd give us a financial services 8 report. MS. DELAFOSSE: 9 I can do that. In front of ya'll, 10 in your packet on the financial services 11 12 page or tab, is the Fiscal Year 2023 year ending financial report on the right hand 13 14 column, and then, it's compared with the left hand column, which is year ending 15 Fiscal Year 2022. 16 17 Our collections were on -- you can 18 see on the first row, bulk distribution 19 fee collections were on par with the previous year and they've typically been 20 in the 22, 23 million dollar range. 21 2.2 What you will notice is, our 23 interest earnings have increased, which 24 is due to the changes in the federal 25 interest rates and the different treasury

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-- the rates that the Treasury earns on 1 all the funds. So we earned a little 2 over double what we did last year, which 3 is great. We are still working on the 4 5 Treasury agreement and we've had a good working relationship with them on that. 6 7 So I look to have that signed in the next -- before the next board meeting. So, 8 you know, hopefully, we can begin to earn 9 even more, which will help out with the 10 inactive and abandoned and then the new 11 12 program as well. The second section is the 13 14 disbursements. You will see, as we discussed at our previous meeting as 15 well, the claims for reimbursement did 16 decrease over last year. Jeff will have, 17 I believe, some more statistics on that 18 19 with our final numbers. So, you know, 20 maybe hold your -- any specific questions with regard to our reimbursements for 21 22 Jeff, but I know our application count was significantly decreased, so we look 23 24 to see that rebound here soon, hopefully, 25 this year.

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Our total expenditures on the 1 inactive and abandoned was just under a 2 million, which I'm really happy to see. 3 We're doing a lot of work with that and, 4 5 you know, got a lot of sites on the list that were pulling tanks and -- and doing 6 7 the remediation work necessary. So you see that the difference for 8 this fiscal year between inflows and 9 outflows or between receipts and 10 disbursements was 7.5 million, and then 11 12 we had -- so that's an increase, a net increase. And then the other financing 13 14 uses are the transfer to ETF and the calculated total for Fiscal 2023 was at 15 5.24 -- no, that's the actual total, 16 17 sorry, that was transferred on a cash 18 basis during the year. We did the five 19 million and then the 246. I think it was 20 two separate transfers. So you'll see the net -- the total net inflow is 2.3 21 million. Our cash -- so our cash basis 2.2 fund balance did increase over the year 23 from 119.5 million to 121.8 million. 24 So 25 that does not include the interest

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1 balance. Again, those funds are earmarked for the inactive and abandoned 2 3 work and then the grant program as well. So we don't include those in that cash 4 5 balance on this presentation. And the net equity balance, that leaves it at 6 7 negative 43.8 million, based on the most recent actuary report that we have, which 8 has a current site liability of about 166 9 million. 10

11 The second page of the report is the 12 calculations for the transfer that we present as well. You'll see in the top 13 14 section, the revenue available for the program has been steady in the low two 15 million range. We don't -- I don't think 16 17 we have any major changes forecast to 18 that at this point in time, so hopefully, 19 it remains steady.

20 Then the second section is our 21 Department Expenditures. So you have the 22 UST expenses and then the grant 23 expenditures and then our indirect costs, 24 which is a percent of the personnel costs 25 that we use half of the approved rate

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1 that we discussed previously as well. So you see the bottom row is the 2 amount shown on the financial statement 3 and the five million is typically what 4 5 we've done at the early transfer and then we calculate once the -- all the numbers 6 are final and all the bills are paid in 7 the accrual period, et cetera, which runs 8 July, a little bit of August, we 9 transferred the difference, which was the 10 11 426,000 that you see in that bottom, 12 right spot. So that is it for my presentation, 13 14 but I'm glad to answer any questions. MR. PERRY: 15 So, Theresa, I've got a couple 16 questions and board members ya'll might 17 too. 18 19 MS. DELAFOSSE: 20 Okay. MR. PERRY: 21 2.2 We'll open it up in a second. So 23 just to make sure I understand, in 24 thinking about fiscal year '22 and then 25 fiscal year '23, which is closed as of

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June 30th, kind of in the middle where 1 you see your difference on your 2 disbursements, we were \$8.5 million last 3 year and we're \$7.5 million this year, so 4 5 we actually decreased by about a million dollars. 6 MS. DELAFOSSE: 7 Yeah. And that's main -- that's 8 attributable to the claim for 9 10 reimbursement being down. MR. PERRY: 11 12 Okay. MS. DELAFOSSE: 13 14 So the 16.1 million last year -- or two years ago in fiscal '22 and then it 15 was 14.7 in fiscal '23. 16 MR. PERRY: 17 18 And you follow that down and that 19 would allow us to grow the fund by \$2 million --20 MS. DELAFOSSE: 21 2.2 Yes. 23 MR. PERRY: 24 -- as far as --25 MS. DELAFOSSE:

Yes. 1 MR. PERRY: 2 -- cash on hand. 3 MS. DELAFOSSE: 4 5 Right. So you can see how, you know, if our reimbursements had been a 6 7 million and a half higher, if they had been where they were last year, then we 8 would have had, you know, that two 9 million number would have been reduced --10 MR. PERRY: 11 12 It would've --MS. DELAFOSSE: 13 14 -- yes. MR. BAKER: 15 We have a graph. Durwood, can you 16 17 bring up the recommended amount graph. It's kind of hard to read the number, but 18 19 you can see that our average cost per application is continuing to go up, but 20 if you look at our count, we had -- we 21 2.2 processed 894 applications in '22. We had 855 in '23. So even though the count 23 24 went down and the overall cost went down, 25 but our average cost is still continuing

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1 to go up. MR. PERRY: 2 So the takeaway, Jeff, we can see on 3 4 the table that the average cost per 5 application for fiscal year '23 was about \$5,000 more than 2014. 6 7 MR. BAKER: Well, not -- is it \$5,000? 8 MR. FULTON: 9 Yeah, from 2014. 10 MR. BAKER: 11 Oh, from '14. From '14, yes. 12 MS. DELAFOSSE: 13 14 Yeah, from '14. Yeah. MR. BAKER: 15 From '14. I thought you were 16 17 talking about '22. 18 MS. DELAFOSSE: 19 Yeah. And the graph really shows it. You see how we have the --20 MR. BAKER: 21 2.2 You're right. 23 MS. DELAFOSSE: 24 -- the line -- the straight line in 25 there to kind of illustrate the changes.

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1 MR. PERRY: Okay. 2 MS. DELAFOSSE: 3 4 It's been a pretty steady increase, 5 yeah. You see the, I guess, the X axis. MR. PERRY: 6 And especially --7 MS. DELAFOSSE: 8 The left -- the vertical axis shows 9 where it started and then where we are 10 11 now, you know. MR. PERRY: 12 Well, take a look -- especially, if 13 14 you look at the graph, if you look at 15 2020, take that data point and then watch the '21 and then '22 just a really big 16 17 increase --MS. DELAFOSSE: 18 19 (Indicated a positive response.) MR. PERRY: 20 -- you know, and that's that --21 2.2 those are the inflationary pressures we 23 saw. 24 MS. DELAFOSSE: 25 Yeah. And we had that big increase

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too on all the unit rates. 1 MR. BAKER: 2 We had a 12 percent increase last 3 year, so that added to it. And yes, 4 5 you're right, the inflationary aspects came in. 6 7 Last year, we had a -- mostly during the year, we didn't have a lot of larger 8 corrective action plans being 9 implemented. We had some, but not as 10 11 many as we had in previous years and that 12 affected the average cost, because when you put in a couple \$300,000 dollar app, 13 14 along with a bunch of five and six and \$10,000 apps, it drove that average way 15 16 up. MR. PERRY: 17 18 Sure. 19 MR. BAKER: 20 And we were way down on those. We had a little bit of a pickup in the last 21 month of the year, but overall during the 2.2 year, we didn't. And those ones that 23 24 came in the last month have to get 25 processed.

1 MS. DELAFOSSE: Yeah. Not a lot of large invoices 2 3 \_ \_ MR. BAKER: 4 5 Right. MS. DELAFOSSE: 6 7 -- for the system installs and stuff during fiscal 2023 --8 MR. BAKER: 9 10 Right. MR. PERRY: 11 12 Got you. MS. DELAFOSSE: 13 14 -- is what we noticed. MR. PERRY: 15 And then the other question I had, 16 17 Theresa, on page two, I'm just kind of 18 thinking through that the -- basically, 19 what the department needs out of the fund 20 to, you know, to cover the operations of the department, we actually saw that 21 decrease by about a million dollars from 2.2 fiscal year '22 to '23. I'm just talking 23 24 rough numbers. 25 MS. DELAFOSSE:

1	Yeah. There was a decrease there.
2	And I would have to do a bit of a deep
3	dive to see if I could kind of isolate
4	what that was, and I don't I know
5	Lacey is on the phone, so I don't know if
6	she had looked at it and has anything to
7	add as far as the trends in the
8	department's costs for administration and
9	what we foresee with that, but you can,
10	you know, take another we can present
11	some information at the next board
12	meeting or maybe send some stuff about,
13	you know, what we're expecting.
14	MR. PERRY:
15	Well, I would comment that, if it's
16	decreasing, you're not going to hear a
17	lot out of us. It's when it's increasing
18	
19	MS. DELAFOSSE:
20	Well, that's true.
21	MR. PERRY:
22	then you're going to hear some
23	whining.
24	MS. DELAFOSSE:
25	That's true.

MR. PERRY: 1 Yeah. But we always do want to 2 know, you know, what's happening with the 3 4 department, what kind of pressures you 5 quys are feeling --MS. DELAFOSSE: 6 7 Right. MR. PERRY: 8 -- you know, because that's helps us 9 with that. Okay. 10 MR. FULTON: 11 12 Our grants have gone up a tad bit 13 too. 14 MS. DELAFOSSE: 15 The grants are up. MR. FULTON: 16 I think it was a combination of 17 18 things going on. Yeah. 19 MR. PERRY: 20 That -- and that's certainly, you 21 know, a good thing. So to our board, do you guys have 2.2 23 any questions for Theresa's report? 24 MR. HOPPES: 25 This is Jesse Hoppes. What's going

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1	on with the interest rate sorry,
2	increasing it, what's the hold up at this
3	point? Is it back to the Treasury or
4	MS. DELAFOSSE:
5	Just working on the draft agreement.
б	The example that they had for us was, I
7	think, 30 years old. So they don't
8	typically do these agreements because the
9	statutes that the other funds have that
10	they work with govern the agreement. So
11	they don't have anything you know,
12	they don't have to write anything, so
13	and I know legal had some staffing
14	challenges, which I think they're in a
15	better place with that now, so I kind of
16	took the lead on it since I have an
17	attorney hat that I can wear sometimes.
18	So it just you know, I worked on it
19	here and there, but it was they kind
20	of wanted some significant revisions from
21	the initial draft when we met with them
22	over the summer, so I did I did send
23	it to Jill this week to have her take a
24	look at that. They kind of wanted an
25	addendum that explained how the fund

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works and when we'd need to withdraw 1 funds and, you know, kind of what the 2 funded position of the program was. So I 3 think we'll -- you know, we'll look to 4 5 have a final agreement pretty soon. MR. HOPPES: 6 7 Okay. And then how much is in the fund right now from the interest 8 accounts? 9 MS. DELAFOSSE: 10 11 Lacey, do you have that? 12 MR. HOPPES: Because I know it's going down, I 13 14 guess, if ya'll are spending about a million, so I was curious how much time 15 it's got left in it? 16 MS. DELAFOSSE: 17 18 Okay. Lacey, can you look up the 19 current interest balance and let us know and then maybe tell us what it was at 20 this time last year? 21 MR. PERRY: 2.2 It seems like -- I may have misread 23 24 it, but I thought I saw it was kind of 25 flat just north of \$2 million is what I

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1 thought I saw. MS. DELAFOSSE: 2 Oh, no. It's more --3 MR. PERRY: 4 5 More than that? MS. DELAFOSSE: 6 It's north of ten million still. 7 Yeah. 8 MR. PERRY: 9 10 Okav. MR. BAKER: 11 12 Theresa? MS. DELAFOSSE: 13 14 Yes. MR. BAKER: 15 Look at the page before this. 16 MS. VITTERI: 17 18 Are you talking about the total 19 amount we had in the --MS. DELAFOSSE: 20 Yes, the total. Yeah, it's the 21 difference between two amounts on here. 22 MS. VITTERI: 23 It's the 12.6. 24 25 MS. DELAFOSSE:

1 Oh, yeah. There it is. Okay, sorry, Lacey. 2 MR. PERRY: 3 4 Is that page one? 5 MS. DELAFOSSE: Yes. 6 7 MS. VITTERI: Yes. That's the total and --8 MS. DELAFOSSE: 9 Oh, yeah. On the right side, 10 bottom, right number, yes. Unreserved 11 12 undesignated where you see the right hand column, 12.6. 13 14 MR. HOPPES: 15 Okay. MS. DELAFOSSE: 16 17 So last year was 13.3. This year is 18 12.6. So it declined by 700,000. 19 MR. HOPPES: 20 Okay. Thank you. MS. DELAFOSSE: 21 So -- which is pretty much the 2.2 23 difference between the 950 spent and the 24 260 earned. So it is trending downward, 25 but hopefully, that's a thing of the

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1 past, once we start to earn some money --2 more money. MR. PERRY: 3 4 And so the agreement is pretty close 5 you think --MS. DELAFOSSE: 6 Yes. 7 MR. PERRY: 8 -- from Treasury? So --9 MS. DELAFOSSE: 10 I do. 11 12 MR. PERRY: Our next meeting is November, which 13 14 I guess, kind of hits almost the mid part 15 of the year, but a good chance? MS. DELAFOSSE: 16 Yes. And, you know, we're having 17 the administration change in January, so 18 19 you know, Karyn is familiar with the program and familiar with the agreement, 20 so I really want to get it signed by her 21 before, you know, possibly having a new 22 23 undersecretary and definitely, having a new secretary and having to explain, you 24 25 know, what we're trying to do, et cetera

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1 and -- and kind of start from square one. So it -- it will be signed by Karyn. 2 MR. PERRY: 3 Got you. Thanks, Ms. Theresa. 4 5 MS. DELAFOSSE: Hopefully, sooner rather than later. 6 7 MR. PERRY: Got you. Any other questions for 8 Ms. Theresa. 9 10 (No response.) MR. PERRY: 11 12 Okay. Thank you, Theresa. All right. So now, the loudest one 13 14 in the room, I understand, let's go to 15 four, the auditor's status report. MR. MORIN: 16 Yes. Cy Morin, DEQ Audit. Good 17 18 afternoon. 19 Page 41 of the packet here is the first page of my report. You'll see 19 20 open motor fuel delivery fee audits that 21 2.2 are not in our legal department, detailed here. As of August 25th, we have 16 23 24 cases that have a status of still in 25 progress with results, you know, waiting

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to be determined and/or finalized. 1 Two cases are awaiting review. 2 3 Those two cases represent one potential small credit of about -- less than \$100 4 5 and one of them is potentially a clean audit, pending final review. 6 7 You'll see one on here that says, awaiting credit deduction. It's just 8 over 23,000. This was a company who 9 inadvertently reported and calculated 10 fees based on the dollar amount of the 11 fuel sold as opposed to the actual 12 gallons sold and so they overpaid. 13 They 14 -- the company has been notified of the credit and once it's used, we'll go ahead 15 and close it and remove the case from the 16 list. 17 18 And then since the last meetings, 19 we've added the three new cases at the bottom here. One of them is the case I 20 just mentioned that's awaiting the 21 deduction. And four cases were closed 2.2 and removed from the list, two were small 23 24 credits with a total of less than like 25 \$450 and two were clean audits.

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1 That's all I have on this page. Any questions? 2 (No response.) 3 MR. MORIN: 4 The second page remains the same. 5 Three legal cases listed, all very old. 6 7 The businesses are no longer active. The cases have been referred to ODR as of 8 August 25th, '23, we've received no 9 payments from ODR. And as you can see, 10 11 the total amount is just under \$100,000, 12 plus about \$11,000 in attorney's fees that remains outstanding. 13 That concludes my report. Any 14 15 questions? MR. PERRY: 16 Cy, thank you, as always, for that 17 18 information. Is the overall trend -- and 19 I ask you this every meeting, but we always like to hear. 20 MR. MORIN: 21 2.2 Yes. 23 MR. PERRY: 24 Is the audits -- are the audits becoming cleaner and cleaner, a little 25

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1 bit easier to do? Less findings? MR. MORIN: 2 Yeah, that -- yes, sir. I mean --3 4 MR. PERRY: 5 That's good. That's a good thing. MR. MORIN: 6 Yeah. We find that businesses are 7 more aware of what they need to do. They 8 have records. You know, we find a 9 periodic case like this one I just 10 mentioned where it's -- you know, it's 11 12 just an inadvertent error. It's few and far between that we find something that's 13 14 really, you know, significant. MR. PERRY: 15 16 And most of the findings, I guess, 17 are probably just calculation errors? 18 MR. MORIN: 19 Yes. Yeah. Most of them are calculation errors. I mean, sometimes 20 we'll find a case where someone was 21 2.2 charged when they shouldn't have been or 23 they weren't charged when the should be. 24 And then we'll just look at that 25 particular customer more closely to see,

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1	you know, the extent and then we'll
2	either assess or give a credit, depending
3	on, you know, the situation. Like I
4	said, that occurs, you know,
5	occasionally, so
6	MR. PERRY:
7	Any other questions for Cy?
8	(No response.)
9	MR. PERRY:
10	Thanks for your work, man.
11	MR. MORIN:
12	All right. Thank you.
13	MR. PERRY:
14	All right. Jeff, it is time for our
15	trust fund status report, the belle of
16	the ball.
17	MR. BAKER:
18	All right. If ya'll will refer to
19	the trust fund report section of the
20	package. If you'll look at page one of
21	nine, this provides the board with a
22	summary of the pertinent information
23	related to the fund as of the end of the
24	fourth quarter of fiscal year 2023.
25	At the top of the page, under the

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1 Active Trust Fund Eligible Sites section, this provides a breakdown of the 2 investigation of the sites in the 3 investigation and the corrective action 4 5 phases. Note the sites currently in the corrective action phase have an average 6 7 age of 15 years, with the average age of the sites in the investigation phase of 8 4.2 years, with an overall average of 9 9.2. These ages are determined as the 10 time difference from when the trust fund 11 12 received the first application for reimbursement and the date of this 13 14 report. Next, you'll note the total number 15 of site closures at 1,539, as of the 16 report date, with a total expenditures of 17 337 million. 18 19 Under the CAP Budget Summary 20 section, note the sites currently in the 21 corrective action phase have CAP budgets totaling 94 million -- 94.5 million with 2.2 a reimbursement of 77.6 million, leaving 23 24 16.97 million approved budget remaining. 25 Under the next section, you'll see

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42 sites have been determined trust fund 1 eligible over the last three years, but 2 3 have yet to request reimbursement. Т will say the majority of those are this 4 5 year, because we had a large number of eligibilities this year. 6 Moving on, at the end of June 2023, 7 the trust fund had 52 pending 8 applications to process, which had 9 requested amounts of just over a million 10 dollars. 11 12 Now, if you'll please draw your attention to the Fiscal Year Summary 13 14 section at the bottom of the report, for the fourth guarter of fiscal year '23, 15 the trust fund received 240 applications, 16 totaling 5.3 million. We returned 17 17 applications for various reasons and 18 19 \$110,000 was disallowed as ineligible for 20 reimbursement. During this period, a total of 211 applications were processed, 21 recommending 4.6 million in 2.2 reimbursements compared to the last 23 24 quarter -- the same quarter last fiscal 25 year, the trust fund received 234

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1 applications, totaling 3.5 million for reimbursement, and we processed 250 and 2 recommended 3.9 million for payment. 3 4 Does anybody have any questions on 5 this page? (No response.) 6 7 MR. BAKER: Turn to the next page, this is the 8 report that breaks down the active sites 9 in the corrective action phase. 10 This 11 report provides site specific information 12 related to application counts, time periods of trust fund reimbursements, 13 14 site location, various reimbursements data. Column totals at the first page 15 reflect the values on the summary. 16 17 If you'll skip over to the Summary Report for the corrective action phase. 18 19 That's page 48. This table gives the members an overview of 111 CAP sites with 20 21 reimbursements by cost and category and CAP budget total. Note the current total 2.2 reimbursements at Column A is \$103.9 23 This includes the values listed 24 million. 25 above, as well as the total CAP

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reimbursements.

1

Also note, the total estimated cost 2 of closure for sites in corrective action 3 phase versus the overall average cost 4 5 closure per site is shown at the bottom of the page. As you'll note that the 6 7 sites in the corrective action phase, including the costs that we've already 8 spent, plus the anticipated costs are 9 about \$1.2 million compared to 323,000 10 11 for the average site. What that means 12 is, not all the sites reach corrective action phase. They -- a lot of them 13 14 recap out and we close them out before 15 they ever get to that point, but once they get to that point, their average 16 17 cost is running around \$1.2 million. Okay. And if you'll flip to the 18 19 next page --MR. PERRY: 20 21 Hey, Jeff, real quick on that --22 MR. BAKER: 23 Yes, sir. 24 MR. PERRY: 25 -- calculation. This is an

1 extremely good page. On your estimated average costs for corrective action 2 sites, we're looking at a five year 3 trend, if that was possible. What do you 4 think the increase, or what do you think 5 the change would be, if there is a 6 7 change? MR. BAKER: 8 I'm not familiar with -- it's kind 9 of stayed the same. It's gone up a 10 little bit. 11 12 MR. PERRY: Okay. 13 14 MR. BAKER: 15 I'm not going to say it's gone up dramatically --16 MR. PERRY: 17 18 Okay. 19 MR. BAKER: 20 -- but it has gone up. MR. PERRY: 21 2.2 Okay. Okay. MR. BAKER: 23 24 I mean, we can run that number, if 25 you'd like us to.

MR. PERRY: 1 I think it might be -- I think it 2 might be an interesting graph to look at. 3 MR. BAKER: 4 5 Okay. MR. PERRY: 6 7 Okay. MR. BAKER: 8 I'll try to have that ready for the 9 next board meeting. 10 MR. PERRY: 11 12 Thank you. MR. BAKER: 13 14 If you'll flip to the next page, these are the active trust fund sites in 15 the investigation/assessment phase. Just 16 like the previous report, this breaks 17 down the individual sites under the 18 19 investigation and provides site specific 20 information for them. 21 Anybody have any questions about this? 2.2 23 (No response.) 24 MR. BAKER: 25 Okay. If you'll flip over to the

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1	summary page for the investigation.
2	That's page nine of nine. This gives you
3	a summary of the sites of the 129
4	sites that are currently under
5	investigation, including the various
6	costing categories, totals and averages.
7	These sites, many of which are still
8	being actively investigated, have an
9	average expenditure at this point of
10	\$102,000.
11	Any questions about this page?
12	MR. MARCELLO:
13	When you use the word
14	"investigation", does that mean they've
15	put in they've applied?
16	MR. BAKER:
17	No. It means they
18	MR. MARCELLO:
19	They
20	MR. BAKER:
21	they've been made eligible and
22	are current under the assessment phase.
23	MR. MARCELLO:
24	Then it's right.
25	MR. BAKER:

1 They're going out there at --MR. MARCELLO: 2 3 Okay. MR. BAKER: 4 5 -- their assessment to determine -they're trying to determine whether 6 7 further remediation is required. They'll do recaps. They're just trying to 8 delineate between at that point and 9 determine whether we need to move 10 forward. 11 12 MR. MARCELLO: 13 Got you. Thank you. 14 MR. PERRY: So same question, Jeff, there your 15 average cost, 102, over the last five 16 years, what does that trend look like? 17 18 MR. BAKER: 19 Okay. I'm not -- I don't have that total, but --20 MR. PERRY: 21 That's fine. 2.2 23 MR. BAKER: 24 -- I'll -- I ought to be able to 25 pull that number out.

1 MR. PERRY: Thank you. 2 MR. BAKER: 3 4 If you'll flip to the next report on page 53, these are the incidents 5 determined to be eligible for the motor 6 7 field trust fund in fiscal year 2023. And you'll notice there was -- they were 8 -- the report shows 52 potential trust 9 10 fund sites that were reviewed and made eligible during the current fiscal year, 11 12 representing 59 separate incidents. And 13 just to give you a level of comparison, this compares to last year's eligibility, 14 of 35 sites and 39 incidents. So this 15 year we had 52 sites. Last year we had 16 17 35. This year we had 59 active incidents and last year we had 39. 18 19 Anybody have any questions about 20 that? 21 (No response.) MR. BAKER: 22 Okay. If you'll flip to the next 23 This is titled, Trust Fund Sites 24 page. that had a Release Granted No Further 25

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1	Action Status. Note that there were 24
2	trust fund sites that received a no
3	further action status for fiscal year
4	2023. That compares to 36 sites from
5	last year's total.
6	You may note that some of these
7	sites are still listed on our active
8	list. We often continue to receive
9	reimbursement applications for sites that
10	NFA'd a couple quarters after the
11	official closure of the release as the
12	RAC'S recoup their expenditures.
13	Any questions on that report?
14	MR. HOPPES:
15	Can I ask for one more five year
16	report. It would be kind of fun to see
17	new sites versus closed sites over a five
18	year trend, just to kind of see how
19	that's building.
20	MR. BAKER:
21	Okay. I'm going to have to start
22	taking notes.
23	MR. PERRY:
24	Just keeping you on your toes, Jeff.
25	MR. BAKER:

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1 If ya'll will turn to the next page. At the end of the fiscal year, I try to 2 give you a couple extra reports and this 3 one is the -- a pivot table of the 4 current active trust fund sites grouped 5 6 by region. So you can see -- on each DEQ region of the state, you can see the 7 number of sites in the corrective action 8 phase and you can see the number of sites 9 10 in investigation and the total, as well as their costs and their average age. 11 Anybody have any questions about 12 13 that? 14 (No response.) MR. BAKER: 15 And, Durwood, if you'll flip to the 16 17 last page. These are the -- a pivot table of the current active trust fund 18 19 sites grouped by age grouping. This 20 report breaks down the corrective action 21 investigation sites in each age category by site count, current cost and average 22 23 It gives the reader an idea of the aqe. time frames to move sites from the 24 investigation phase to the correction 25

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1 action phase. MR. GAUBERT: 2 Ya'll need to write that -- the age 3 of these -- these tanks that are in this 4 stage of investigation and/or 5 6 remediation, or whatever it is, they look 7 to be relatively newer tanks than older tanks. 8 MR. BAKER: 9 10 Well, it's incidents, not tanks, but 11 yes --MR. GAUBERT: 12 Okay. It's incidents --13 MR. BAKER: 14 15 -- it would be -- and that's the way it should be. 16 MR. GAUBERT: 17 The age that you refer to here is 18 19 the age of the incident? 20 MR. BAKER: 21 Yeah. MR. GAUBERT: 22 So this is -- the nine years that --23 that would be -- what I'm looking at in 24 Acadiana, for instance, it says, 9.8 is 25

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1 the average site age. 2 MR. BAKER: Yeah. Durwood, could you flip back 3 to the previous page? So yes, sir. So 4 you've got 20 sites in Acadiana that are 5 6 in the corrective action phase and their average age is 16.2 years. You've got 23 7 sites that are in the investigation phase 8 9 and they're average age is 4.2 years. 10 And that's the way it should be. I mean, you know, once they get in the corrective 11 action phase, it can take quite a while 12 13 \_ \_ MR. GAUBERT: 14 15 Right. MR. BAKER: 16 17 -- but during the investigation phase, that should be a relatively short 18 19 period of time. 20 MR. GAUBERT: 21 I was thinking it was the age of the tanks. 22 MR. BAKER: 23 I'm sorry. Sorry for the confusion. 24 25 MR. FULTON:

1 We might be able to get that 2 information to you. MR. GAUBERT: 3 4 It'd be interesting to --MS. DELAFOSSE: 5 Yeah. 6 MR. GAUBERT: 7 -- to know the age of the --8 MS. DELAFOSSE: 9 10 Age of the tanks with releases and stuff, yeah. 11 MR. FULTON: 12 13 Yeah. We got it, so we can do that. MR. GAUBERT: 14 15 That'd be very interesting. MR. FULTON: 16 Yeah. 17 18 MR. MARCELLO: Can I assume that the -- the 19 locations that are listed in the incident 20 21 report are also part of the investigative report, or am I --22 MR. BAKER: 23 24 You talking about the region and the 25 parish?

1 MR. MARCELLO: No. I'm talking about this -- this 2 incidents determined as eligible for 3 motor fuel trust fund. You following my 4 question? 5 MR. BAKER: б 7 Oh, yeah. MS. DELAFOSSE: 8 9 If they requested an application --10 MR. MARCELLO: Right. 11 12 MS. DELAFOSSE: 13 -- if they submitted an application. MR. MARCELLO: 14 If -- if the sites on this list 15 submitted an application, they're listed 16 on -- as -- in here as --17 MR. BAKER: 18 19 Some are. 20 MR. MARCELLO: 21 Some are. MR. BAKER: 22 Some are. Remember --23 24 MR. MARCELLO: But these are listed in here --25

1 MR. BAKER: Yes. 2 MR. MARCELLO: 3 4 What I'm getting at is --MR. BAKER: 5 The ones that are on -б 7 MR. MARCELLO: -- I'm wondering if these are not 8 9 listed and they are going to hit the 10 system --MS. DELAFOSSE: 11 12 Yeah. Some of them have, because 13 there's 42 sites, I think that --MR. BAKER: 14 There were --15 MS. DELAFOSSE: 16 -- have eligibility, but haven't 17 submitted an app. 18 MR. MARCELLO: 19 20 Right. 21 MR. BAKER: Exactly. Remember when I --22 MS. DELAFOSSE: 23 Yeah. So a lot of those are the new 24 25 ones.

1 MR. MARCELLO: 2 That's the line of my question. MR. BAKER: 3 Remember when I mentioned that we 4 had 42 sites that were pending, that we 5 hadn't received a request for б 7 reimbursement yet --MR. MARCELLO: 8 9 Right. 10 MR. BAKER: -- those are ones that we made 11 eligible and many of them are from this 12 13 year because we had such a high year. MR. MARCELLO: 14 Right. Okay. 15 MR. BAKER: 16 17 And they haven't requested 18 reimbursements yet. MR. FULTON: 19 20 Yet, yeah. 21 MR. MARCELLO: 22 Okay. MR. BAKER: 23 24 But they are pending. MS. DELAFOSSE: 25

1 And coming. 2 MR. BAKER: They're coming. 3 All right. Just some points of 4 interest. Based upon the initial 5 stakeholder feedback, we've drafted some 6 7 protocol for the creation of new unit rates for the HRSC logging investigation 8 9 activities and reporting. We hope to 10 pull together a stakeholder group in the next week or so and seek out comments and 11 feedback on the draft language and rates. 12 13 This is the high resolution site characterization logging that we're doing 14 on some of the sites now. We're finding 15 that by getting a qualitative picture of 16 17 the site, by being able to put a lot holes in the ground in a very short 18 period of time, and gleam a lot of 19 20 information from that data, that we can 21 do a better job of finding plumes and, hopefully, hitting the remediation much 22 harder and faster and be able to get the 23 sites cleaned up faster. So we're trying 24 25 to develop some unit rates for that.

Last year, we created several 1 additional surcharges for unit rates 2 related to elevated costs of PDC, 3 landfill disposal, steel and others, due 4 to supply chain and inflation issues. 5 Based upon RAC feedback and our own 6 research, it appears the cost continue to 7 be elevated, thus, we will continue these 8 9 surcharges for another year and reassess 10 them again next year. We have -- we should have a revised guidance document 11 finished by the end of September, this 12 13 month -- or next month. Another thing, we had an audit 14 15 meeting this morning right before this, where the auditors are starting their 16 17 annual audit and they requested that ya'll note that each of ya'll got an 18 19 email with your related party 20 information. They strongly requested 21 that ya'll get it to them as soon as you 22 possibly can. MS. DELAFOSSE: 23 24 Every -- yeah. Every year, there's 25 a few stragglers, so just look for that

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1	email and if you if you need them to
2	send it again, you can just let me or
3	Jeff know and we'll have them send it
4	again so we can get those get those
5	over and finished.
6	MR. BAKER:
7	And the only other thing I was going
8	to bring up is that, as you noted, last
9	year, we did have a reduction in the
10	application count. And we talked about
11	that a little. Based upon the
12	information that I was able to glean, a
13	lot of that was the fact that staffing
14	issues with the RAC's. They were having
15	a problem getting staff and being able to
16	get out and get some of the work done
17	that they needed to get done. Also,
18	supply chain issues caused some problems.
19	All that delayed a lot of the corrective
20	actions, which remember, I said that we
21	didn't get a lot of high dollar
22	application. That's usually indicative
23	of that they weren't able to get out and
24	get CAP's completed, corrective action
25	plans worked on. So we suspect this year

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1	will be a different story as things kind
2	of level out. Based upon the numbers
3	we've seen already, we're already
4	we're close right now to the applications
5	we received in the first two months as
б	what we received last year in the first
7	three months. So our application count
8	has ticked up. Now, a number of them
9	were appeals of some older stuff. One of
10	the RAC's caught up on a bunch of
11	appeals, so that did it increase it by 20
12	or so, but we're still seeing a higher
13	application count.
14	That finishes my report.
15	MR. PERRY:
16	Jeff yes, sir.
17	MR. FULTON:
18	Yeah. I would add that, you know,
19	we haven't seen a lot of corrective
20	action plans either and we're afraid
21	we're going to get a lot of them in the
22	upcoming year, due to supply chain
23	issues. But I think what is going to
24	happen is, we're going to get caught up,
25	the RAC's will get caught up and we're

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1 qoing to see a lot of increase in -- we 2 haven't had a req meeting for --MR. BAKER: 3 A month. 4 MR. FULTON: 5 -- in a month. So we're not seeing 6 7 those issues. I have a feeling what you're going to see is, we're going to 8 9 have a big slug coming through and we're 10 going to have a lot of work to do. MR. BAKER: 11 12 And a lot of cost go out. 13 MR. FULTON: Yeah. 14 MR. PERRY: 15 All right, Jeff. Thank you, as 16 17 always, for that report. You always bring a little more insight to the fund 18 19 and where the dollars are going. We much 20 appreciate you. 21 Do any of our board members have questions for Jeff, related to his 22 23 report? (No response.) 24 MR. PERRY: 25

1 Okay. Jeff, thanks. Great job as 2 always. Well, we're now to the one that 3 4 scares me, number six. Third party claims status, Ms. Jill. 5 MS. CLARK: 6 7 We did not have any third party claims, so --8 MR. PERRY: 9 10 That's the answer we love. MS. CLARK: 11 12 We're good. 13 MR. PERRY: So no new -- no third -- no 14 15 outstanding third party claims and no new claims --16 MS. CLARK: 17 Correct. 18 19 MR. PERRY: 20 -- since our last meeting? Okay. 21 Anything else you want to tell them? MS. CLARK: 22 That's it. 23 MR. PERRY: 24 Any question for Ms. Jill from our 25

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1 board? 2 (No response.) MR. PERRY: 3 Theresa, you look like you have 4 5 questions. MS. DELAFOSSE: 6 7 I just wanted to mention the rule making for the Act 277. I know Durwood 8 is on the phone, but -- and I ran into 9 10 our reg development folks last week and just kind of asked for a rough timeline. 11 I don't know if everybody's up-to-date on 12 that or wanted to ask about that or have 13 us mention it. 14 MR. PERRY: 15 That would be awesome. 16 MS. DELAFOSSE: 17 And I hope I do this justice and 18 19 don't misspeak on any of the dates, but I 20 believe it's going to be published in The 21 Register on September 20th. We did submit all the documentation and, you 22 know, went through all the reviews at the 23 Legislature and such, so yeah, it'll be 24 published then. And then there's a public 25

1	comment period and we'll respond to any
2	comments that we receive. And her
3	estimate was that the rule would be
4	published in December. So unless there's
5	any roadblocks, then that's when we
6	expect that will be finalized.
7	MR. PERRY:
8	Excellent. And
9	MR. FRANKLIN:
10	Theresa, can I step in right here?
11	MS. DELAFOSSE:
12	Yes.
13	MR. PERRY:
14	Thanks, Durwood.
15	MR. FRANKLIN:
16	If you'll look at this page, it'll
17	show the different phases of rule making
18	and we're actually at number two in the
19	first phase of the rule making. As she
20	said as Theresa said, it's been over
21	to the Legislature Fiscal Office and
22	they've done their review of that and it
23	should be submitted to publication by the
24	20th of September, which will be the
25	first end of the first phase of rule

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1	making. That opens up a 45 day comment
2	period, and then, it has to go to a
3	public hearing. And, you know, that
4	other phrase of rule making. The only
5	hiccup in this is that if there are
6	comments that have to be addressed, then
7	this process starts all over. So but
8	if it all goes smoothly without any
9	comments that need to be addressed,
10	everything is on track to be in place by
11	the first of the year.
12	MS. DELAFOSSE:
13	Thanks, Durwood.
14	MR. FRANKLIN:
15	Okay.
16	MR. PERRY:
17	So on that and, Theresa, I
18	appreciate that. Jill, thank you for
19	your report.
20	MS. CLARK:
21	Sure.
22	MR. PERRY:
23	That moves us into other business,
24	which that that was I'm going to
25	to what she shared with you. Very good.

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1 MS. DELAFOSSE: 2 Yeah. MR. PERRY: 3 So, Durwood, I'm going to direct 4 this towards you. And I know there is 5 some uncertainty. Everybody has their 6 7 fingers crossed. I don't -- hopefully, there won't be any comments and we can 8 kind of stick to the timeline. At what 9 10 point would the department be comfortable sharing what potential forms would look 11 like with the UST owners in the state? 12 13 MR. FRANKLIN: Well, right -- right now, the forms 14 are pretty much finalized. I don't think we 15 would have any issues sharing that with 16 17 anyone. I'll let Gary --MR. FULTON: 18 Yeah. 19 20 MR. FRANKLIN: 21 -- have the final say on that, but I don't think our department would have any 22 issues with that. The -- the regulations 23 have been reviewed and finalized. 24 MS. CLARK: 25

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1 I would say --2 MR. FRANKLIN: As far the forms go, I don't think 3 there will be any changes to the forms, 4 so I don't think there would be any 5 6 problems sharing that. But Gary might -might better answer that. 7 MR. PERRY: 8 And I think Jill has a comment. 9 10 MR. FULTON: Yeah. 11 MS. CLARK: 12 13 Well, I would think we'd want to wait until at least after the public 14 comment period to see if there are any 15 substantive comments that we need to 16 address, which would affect the rule and 17 then, you know, that could affect what's 18 19 on the form. So I would just say, let's 20 wait until after the -- we get the public 21 comment period. MR. PERRY: 22 And so as a straw horse, that looks 23 like maybe the second or third week in 24 25 November.

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1 MS. CLARK: I think so. 2 MR. PERRY: 3 4 You know, as a rough time. So we'll put that on our ticker to ask the 5 6 department. 7 And then part two of that would be, do you think the department would be 8 9 willing to do some type of virtual 10 town hall, maybe, assuming everything goes well and there's no comments, in 11 December to educate UST owners? 12 13 MR. FULTON: Yeah. We'll be glad to do that. 14 MR. PERRY: 15 Because I think what we understand -16 17 - Gary, correct me, you or Durwood -- the grant program, if everything goes well, 18 19 would open up January 1st and then close March 31st --20 21 MR. FULTON: 22 Right. MR. PERRY: 23 24 -- and then reviewed in the second quarter, and then, July 1st, the grants 25

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1 would begin --MR. FULTON: 2 Right. 3 MR. PERRY: 4 -- of 2024? 5 MR. FULTON: 6 7 Right. And that's --MR. PERRY: 8 9 If everything goes --10 MR. FULTON: -- to coincided with -- that's to 11 12 coincide with the fiscal year. MR. PERRY: 13 Fiscal year. That all makes sense. 14 15 So that's --MR. FULTON: 16 Yeah. Budgeting purposes. 17 18 MR. PERRY: 19 So that's -- and we appreciate all 20 the work the department has done. 21 MR. FULTON: Yeah. 22 MR. PERRY: 23 24 So with that said, board do ya'll have any questions or comments? 25

1 MR. GUILLORY: I agree that I would let the 2 comments come in first before you --3 MR. FULTON: 4 Yeah. 5 MR. GUILLORY: б 7 Like you said, show something, God forbid, we have to change something. I 8 do agree with that. 9 10 MR. GAUBERT: Do we have a copy of as it's 11 12 proposed right now? 13 MS. DELAFOSSE: The rule? 14 MR. GAUBERT: 15 The rule, yeah. 16 MS. DELAFOSSE: 17 Yeah. We can send that. Yeah. 18 19 MR. GAUBERT: 20 Do we have a copy of yet or has that 21 \_ \_ MR. PERRY: 22 We've got -- I've got a draft, but 23 24 I'd like to see --MS. CLARK: 25

1 Durwood, do you know if it's already been posted? 2 MR. FULTON: 3 Well, the work group had it. 4 MR. BROUSSARD: 5 6 Yeah. Everybody in the work group has a copy. Like, you would have a copy. 7 MR. FULTON: 8 Yeah. Yeah. Yeah. 9 10 MR. FRANKLIN: The only thing that changed is a 11 section in there on the ranking and it 12 13 was advised by legal to take that out because it's subject to change, so -- but 14 15 everything else remained the same. But I can send you the most recent version, 16 Theresa, that's been submitted to 17 rulemaking. 18 MS. DELAFOSSE: 19 20 Okay. 21 MR. BAKER: The ranking was taken out of the 22 rule, but it wasn't taken out of the 23 process, right, Durwood? 24 MR. FRANKLIN: 25

1 That's correct. It was just the language was not -- was taken out of the 2 regulation -- it was recommended not to 3 put it in the regulation because it is 4 subject to change. 5 MR. FULTON: 6 7 Right. MR. PERRY: 8 9 Okay. All right. Thanks Durwood, 10 Gary, Jill and Ms. Theresa. Any other questions about the 11 12 pending UST grant program from our board? 13 (No response.) MR. PERRY: 14 Good. Okay. And they gave us, you 15 know, a straw -- timeline to kind of work 16 17 with and keep our fingers crossed. 18	the CAP per site from \$1 million to \$1.5
19	million. And we've looked at some
20	different states in the south and a
21	number of them other states, like Alabama
22	and Oklahoma, are at \$2 million per site.
23	So we would like to explore, and make a
24	recommendation to the department, that we
25	were to pursue that in this next

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1	legislative session, as a partner,
2	working together to do that, because I
3	think we would need to testify why that's
4	important.

7	MR. PERRY:
8	UST owners and consultants, et
9	cetera. So any thoughts?
