VI. Review of Occupational Forecast:

- Dr. Julian Hwang gives forecast process overview he takes employment data to do
 industry forecast, then to make the occupational forecast, which then informs star
 ratings.
 - o Louisiana is expected to gain 110,000 jobs over 10 years. Houma and Lafayette are expected to see the most growth.
 - Major industry expected to gain the most is accommodation and food services.
 - o Top 5 growing industries include accommodation and food services, construction, mining, health care and social assistance, and retail trade.
 - Bottom 5 industries are agriculture, fishing, forestry, and hunting, manufacturing, utilities, other services except public administration, transportation and warehousing.
 - Dr. Hwang outlines the major industries in New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Houma, Lafayette, Lake Charles, Alexandria, Shreveport and Monroe. He also outlined the major occupations in Louisiana. The biggest growth can be seen in construction laborers.
