Legislative Updated

2018 Session

Mr. Fontenot discussed Act 146 (SB 110), which amended the state PMP law relative to the definition of the term "drug of concern". Additionally, Mr. Fontenot informed the council that the Board intends to propose a rule that will identify naxalone as a drug of concern for PMP reporting purposes.

Mr. Fontenot discussed Act 232 (SB 109), which amended the state PMP law to authorize the Board to enter into an agreement with the Dept. of Health to allow their epidemiologist access to PMP data.

Mr. Fontenot discussed Act 405 (SB 75) regarding compliance monitoring of prescriber access to the program.

2019 Session

Mr. Fontenot informed the council that e-prescribing of controlled substances will be a topic of the 2019 Session.

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Performance Audit of Louisiana PMP by Legislative Auditor

Mr. Fontenot discussed the data deficiencies identified by the Louisiana Legislative Auditor (LLA) as well as the recommendations offered to improve the completeness of the PMP database and the Board's use of the database. Mr. Fontenot informed the council that the program has implemented a new feature available from the program vendor known as Rx Management as recommended by LLA and plans to implement additional program features as they become available next year. Mr. Fontenot stated that the Board of Pharmacy recently approved hiring two additional full-time employees for the PMP to assist in implementing the recommendations of the LLA.
