### Prescription Monitoring Program Advisory Council State of Louisiana April 13, 2022

<u>Advisory Council Representatives/Designees present</u>: Lauren Bailey (Vice Chair of PMP-AC, LSMS) convened the meeting. Also present were Jonathan Bowman (OAL), Dr. Vincent Culotta (LSBME), Dr. Joseph Comaty (LAMP), Crystal Carter (LPA), Lisa Bayhi (LANP), Marty McKay (LBP), Rachel Smith (LDAA), Randal Johnson (LIPA), Shelly Esnard (LAPA), Annette Droddy (LDA).

<u>Others present</u>: Malcolm Broussard, Joe Fontenot, Carlos Finalet, Nerissa Montgomery, Reshmi Ravindranath, Carley Leach (all LABP), and Mary Peyton (LSBME).

#### Amendments to Council Roster

Ms. Bailey reviewed the amendments to the Council Roster due to the change in leadership at the Board of Dentistry since the last Council meeting. Replacement member appointment forms are needed for the Board of Dentistry and the Sheriffs' Association.

#### Call for Additional Agenda Items & Adoption of Agenda

No additional agenda items introduced; agenda adopted.

Consideration of Draft Minutes from October 13, 2021 and January 12, 2022 Meetings

Both the October 13, 2021 and January 12, 2022 meeting minutes were approved by consensus with no corrections.

#### **Opportunity for Public Comment**

No public comments.

#### Election of Council Officers: Chair and Vice Chair

The only nomination for the office of Chair was Mr. Marty McKay (LABP). Mr. McKay was elected by acclamation and assumed the office immediately.

The only nomination for the office of Vice Chair was Ms. Lauren Bailey. Ms. Bailey was elected by acclamation and assumed the office immediately.

#### **Review of Program Operation**

Joe Fontenot, Executive Director Designate, presented statistical information regarding the program to the council. (Attachment 1).

Mr. Fontenot explained that the PMP program experienced its first increase in the annual number of eligible prescription transactions reported to the PMP and this occurred in calendar year 2021. The increase is a direct result of the additional reporting requirement of two drugs of concern (promethazine in oral liquid formulations and gabapentin containing products) as of January 20, 2021. There is a continued downward trend in the number of opioid and controlled dangerous substance prescriptions being dispensed and reported to the program.

Mr. Fontenot explained that the therapeutic marijuana recommendations significantly increased since January 2022 possibly due to the inclusion of raw marijuana products by legislature. Mr. Malcolm expounded the increase is most likely due to the increase in knowledge of the program. Mr. Fontenot reported that both the AWARxE© and Gateway© searches have increased significantly since 2016. The searches performed through the Gateway© far exceeds the AWARxE© website searches. Additional grant funding was obtained from the LDH - Office of Public Health - Bureau of Community Preparedness which will cover the licensing fees associated with Gateway© integration from April 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022. Thus far, the LDH has paid for four full years of integration costs totaling approximately 3 million dollars. Prompted by a question from Dr. Culotta, Mr. Fontenot explained that with the interoperability of the EHR vendor, Athena Health, the PMP integration availability in rural areas has significantly expanded over the past two years. Mr. Fontenot reported that the amount of law enforcement, prosecutorial officials, and specialty court PMP requests have staggered throughout the years and continues to decline.

#### **Review of Legislative and Regulatory Activity**

Mr. Broussard reviewed legislative and regulatory proposals which can be located under the Public Library, Rulemaking Activity portion of the Board of Pharmacy website.

#### New Agenda Items Added During Meeting

No new agenda items added.

#### **Calendar Notes**

The Chair, Mr. Marty McKay, stated in accordance with the council's current preference for meeting dates, the meeting dates for the calendar year of 2022 will be July 13, and October 12.

#### **Adjournment**

With no business remaining, the council meeting was adjourned at 1:50 p.m.








## Louisiana Therapeutic Marijuana (TM) Dispensing Statistics






Heat Map Based on TM Patient Count by Patient Postal Code

As of April 1, 2022, the Louisiana PMP is interoperable with 381 licensees (EHRs and pharmacy management systems) across the state. The 381 licensees represent more than 2,300 facilities in Louisiana and are responsible for 2,343,374 PMP requests in the month of March 2022. There are an additional 291 licensee applicants pending.


