1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the Red River Waterway Commission was called to order by Chair Designee, Troy Roussell, in the Board Room of the Red River Waterway Commission Office located at 5941 Highway 1 By-Pass in Natchitoches, Louisiana.

5. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Deville, the revised agenda was unanimously approved. The revised agenda to include a third item under Contracts Committee to read as follows: Consideration of Authorization of Expense of Construction Funds/1North Adventure Trails/Phase 1C/Lake Improvements. Comments from the public were called for, however, none were offered.

6. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

By motion of Commissioner Deville, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the minutes of the July 17, 2024 meeting were unanimously approved.

7. TREASURER'S REPORT

By motion of Commissioner Lattier, seconded by Commissioner Clark , the Expenditures, Financial Statements, Investment Reports, & Fund Balance Report for the month of July 2024 were unanimously approved.

8. COMMITTEE REPORTS

a) Contracts

<u>Consideration of Authority to Advertise for Construction Bids/Brouillette Playground and Comfort Station/Project No. 24-01/Contract No. RRW-827:</u> By motion of Commissioner Clark, seconded by Commissioner Lattier, the Commission unanimously approved authorizing staff to advertise for construction bids.

<u>Consideration of Authority to Advertise for Construction Bids/Ft. Buhlow Additional Amenities/Project No. 23-01/Contract No. RRW-819:</u> By motion of Commissioner Clark, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the Commission unanimously approved authorizing staff to advertise for construction bids.

<u>Consideration of Authorization of Expense of Construction Funds/INorth Adventure Trails/Phase IC/Lake Improvements:</u> By motion of Commissioner Clark, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the Commission unanimously approved the authorization of expense, not to exceed \$100,000.00, for the excavation of bleeder ditches to help facilitate the dewatering of the lake bottom.

b) Land Management, Legal Affairs & Affirmative Action

Consideration of Cancellation of Leaseback/Pool 3 Tract 11/20.9 Acres: By motion of Commissioner Deville, seconded by Commissioner Goudeau, the Commission unanimously approved authorizing staff to cancel the 5-year leaseback agreement with McQuillin Properties, LLC on the aforementioned tract of land.

<u>Consideration of Award of Leaseback/Pool 3 Tract 11/20.9 Acres:</u> By motion of Commissioner Deville, seconded by Commissioner Jones, the Commission unanimously approved awarding the 5-year leaseback on the aforementioned tract of land to John M. Wardlow for \$1,567.50 for the 5-year term.

c) Recreation

<u>Consideration of Approval of Logo/INorth Adventure Trails:</u> Discussion only took place in committee. No action was taken.

Recreation Area Status Report – Mr. Marcus Long highlighted the prepared report provided in the meeting packet, noting that there had been 140,000 visitors to the District recreation areas during the month of July 2024. Updated maintenance items include, but not limited to:

- Dredge currently working the Socot area and will move to Clarence
- Testament is dredging south of Lock 5 and then will move to the Caddo-Bossier Port
- Spraying for vegetation in Pool 4 by boat and by helicopter in Pool 3 next week
- Suggestion made regarding considering a future plan for tree planting at Grand Ecore RV Park due to loss from storms and age of trees

Consideration of Approval of Audit Servies Proposal and 2024 Audit Engagement Letters: By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Deville, the Commission unanimously approved the three-year audit services proposal from Payne, Moore & Herrington, LLP and approval of the 2024 Audit and 2024 SAUP Audit engagement letters.

Adoption of 2024 Tax Millage by Resolution: By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Deville, and reflecting a complete vote count, the Commission adopted its 2024 Tax Millage Rates of 1.45 mills for capital outlay and 0.78 mills for operations and maintenance for a total of 2.23 mills. Following is the 2024 Tax Millage Resolution read aloud by Commissioner Crutchfield:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proper administrative officials of the Parishes of Avoyelles, Bossier, Caddo, Grant, Natchitoches, Rapides, and Red River, State of Louisiana, be and they are hereby empowered, authorized, and directed to spread said taxes, as hereinabove set forth, upon the assessment roll of said Parish for the year 2024, and to make the collection of the taxes imposed for and on behalf of the taxing authority, according to law, and that the taxes herein levied shall become a permanent lien and privilege on all property subject to taxation as herein set forth, and collection thereof shall be enforceable in the manner provided by law.
