Consideration of Award of public Bid Land Lease/Lock & Dam 4/Tract 1 and 4 Segment A/66 Acres: By motion of Commissioner Deville, seconded by Commissioner Greer, the Commission unanimously approved award of lease to William Walker for \$8,349.00 for the 5-year term.

Consideration of Request for Land Lease Extension/Pool 4/Tract 7/Segment A/1 Acre: By motion of Commissioner Deville, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the Commission unanimously approved award of the 5-year land lease extension to Mr. Tracy Lucky, Mr. Ernie Florane, and Mr. Carey Conway for \$6,000.00 for the 5-year term.

Consideration of Request to Advertise for Public Bid Mineral Lease/Pool 5/Multiple Tracts/526 Acres: By motion of Commissioner Deville, seconded by Commissioner Jones, the Commission unanimously approved directing staff to work with legal counsel to draft a request for an opinion from the Attorney General regarding dredging Waterway Commission inundated property.

<u>Consideration of Cancellation/Rescission of Licensing Agreement to Cooterville Sand and Gravel of 925 Acres:</u> By motion of Commissioner Deville, seconded by Commissioner Jones, the Commission unanimously approved rescinding the offer of a licensing agreement to Cooterville Sand and Gravel previously approved at the August 2022 Commission meeting.
