#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the Red River Waterway Commission was called to order by Chair Designee, Troy Roussell, in the Board Room of the Red River Waterway Commission Office located at 5941 Highway 1 By-Pass in Natchitoches, Louisiana.

#### 2. ROLL CALL

Roll was called and a quorum was present. Others in attendance were asked to identify themselves and offer any comments they may have regarding the agenda. However, no comments were offered.

### 4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

By motion of Commissioner Greer, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the agenda was unanimously approved. Comments from the public were called for, however, none were offered.

#### 5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

By motion of Commissioner Simpson, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the minutes of the November 15, 2023 meeting were unanimously approved.

#### 6. TREASURER'S REPORT

By motion of Commissioner Clark, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the Expenditures, Financial Statements, Investment Reports, & Fund Balance Report for the month of November 2023 were unanimously approved.

#### 7. COMMITTEE REPORTS

# a) Contracts

Consideration of Approval of Change Order No. 6 (Final)/RRWC Project No. 21-11/Contract No. RRW-809/Pland Floating Dock and Comfort Station: By motion of Commissioner Clark, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the Commission unanimously approved the change order which provides a decrease in contract cost of \$34,360.88, bringing the construction cost to \$1,428,864.12 due to not using erosion control matting to establish grass on the slopes and provides for an increase in time of 25 additional days.

Consideration of Approval of Change Order No. 4/RRWC Project No. 21-08/Contract No. RRW-799/Grand Ecore Additional Amenities: By motion of Commissioner Clark, seconded by Commissioner Richardson, the Commission unanimously approved the change order which provides for a decrease in contract cost of \$40,685.50 due to redesigning the pool and splash pad and a decrease in cost with changing the splash pad from a recirculation system to a flow-through system. And included an increase in construction time of 21 days.

Consideration of Approval of Meeting Policy Revisions/Open Meetings Law: By motion of Commissioner Clark, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the Commission unanimously approved revisions to the Red River Waterway Commission's meeting policy and the revised meeting notice language in order to be in compliance with the recently enacted Act 393 by the Louisiana Legislative Auditor.

# b) Land Management, Legal Affairs & Affirmative Action

<u>Consideration of Award of Public Bid Land Lease/St. Maurice Realignment-Hampton Island/108</u>
<u>Acres:</u> By motion of Commissioner Greer, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the Commission unanimously approved award of lease to the high bidder, Angler's Paradise, LLC, for \$9,450.00 for the 5-year term.

Consideration of Request for Land Lease Extension/Hadden Ft. DeRussy Realignment/Tracts 45, 46 & 47/235 Acres: By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the Commission unanimously approved the request for the 5-year lease extension to Aubrey McNeal for a total of \$25,850.00 for the 5-year lease term.

Consideration of Request for Land Lease Extension/Lock & Dam 4/Tracts 2, 3 & Part of 4/65 Acres: By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the Commission unanimously approved the request from Chris Turner for the 5-year extension for a total of \$7,162.38 for the 5-year lease term.

Consideration of Request for Right of Use Dredging Agreement/Pool 4 Tracts 18, 19 & 20 Segment A: By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Clark and with one abstention from Commissioner Simpson, the Commission approved the request from Chesapeake Energy for a Right of Use Agreement to dredge/mine sand from approximately 443 acres of Commission owned water bottoms in Pool 4 adjacent to the Red River Parish Port for use in fracking gas wells.

#### c) Recreation

<u>Consideration of Approval of Cooperative Endeavor Agreement/Shreveport-Bossier Sports Commission:</u>
By motion of Commissioner Greer, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the Commission unanimously approved the funding request for a \$55,000.00 cooperative endeavor agreement for 2024 events to be held on the Red River.

**Recreation Area Status Report** - Mr. Marcus Long highlighted the prepared report provided in the meeting packet, noting that there had been 75,000 visitors to the District recreation areas during the month of November 2023. Updated maintenance items include, but not limited to:

- Grand Ecore RV Park Continued cleanup of undeveloped property areas
- Continued routine maintenance duties at all parks and at headquarters
- Noted increased usage and income of the RV parks in November

#### d) Ports

<u>Consideration of Approval of Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to Cooperative Endeavor Agreement/Central Louisiana Regional Port:</u> By motion of Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Crutchfield, the Commission unanimously approved development of a supplemental agreement granting authority for the Central Louisiana Regional Port to re-allocate the remaining funds from the original CEA approved in August 2023 to further additional Port expansion in the following manner: 1) Build up the lower dock and clear area for additional hardstand to be constructed adjacent to the newly constructed fabric warehouse 2) Allocate \$45,000.00 of the remaining funds towards the installation of a dual-gender restroom container and 3) Invest the remaining funds towards the acquisition of a 14-acre tract of land adjacent to the Port, currently owned by the City of Alexandria.

#### e) Public Awareness & Marketing

<u>Marketing Update</u> - A prepared report was provided in the meeting packet. In addition, Marketing Director, Dustin Hayes discussed:

- Bassmaster College/High School Tournaments verbal commitment received and will follow up
- LSUS Fishing coach, Charles Thompson, interest in event/tournament on Red River will follow up
- Todd Wolf, LA Teen Trail, interest in event/tournament on Red River will follow up
- Interview with Steve Graf, Hook'n Up and Trackin Down, to discuss the Red River and upcoming events

# g) Revenue, Banking & Budget

<u>Consideration of Authority to Unreserve/Undesignate Remaining Project Funds:</u> By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Greer, the Commission unanimously approved unreserving/undesignating remaining funds from completed projects and projects not constructed in the amount of \$286,359.41 to be used towards future projects.

<u>Consideration of Approval of Audit Engagement Letters:</u> By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Clark, the Commission unanimously approved the 2023 Audit Engagement Letter with the revised fee of \$23,500 and the 2023 SAUP Engagement Letter with Payne, Moore & Herrington.

<u>Consideration of Approval of 2024 Budget:</u> By motion of Commissioner Crutchfield, seconded by Commissioner Greer, the Commission unanimously approved/adopted the 2024 Budget as presented and the Resolution was read aloud:

# RESOLUTION FOR ADOPTION OF THE 2024 BUDGET FOR THE RED RIVER WATERWAY COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the Red River Waterway Commission has appointed Executive Director, Colin Brown, to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body; and

WHEREAS, Executive Director, Colin Brown, has submitted a proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2024, beginning January 1, 2024 and ending December 31, 2024, to this governing body on December 20, 2023 for its consideration, and;

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published and posted in accordance with the law, said proposed budget was open for inspection by the public at a designated place, a public hearing was held on December 20, 2023, and interested taxpayers were given the opportunity to inspect and comment as to said proposed budget, and;

WHEREAS, the budget remains in balance, as required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Red River Waterway Commission of the State of Louisiana:

Section 1. That the budget as submitted, amended, and summarized by fund, hereby is approved and adopted as the budget of the Red River Waterway Commission for the year stated above.

Section 2. That the budget hereby approved and adopted shall be signed by the Secretary/Treasurer and Executive Director.

ADOPTED, this 20th day of December, 2023 after vote of the Red River Waterway Commission.
