GOHSEP Updates/ Reports

Brig. Gen. Jason Mahfouz

- GOHSEP/LMD merger updates:
 - Phase 2 of transition complete; effective February 1, 2026.
 - Phase 3 will be subsequent to the FEMA Reform.
- Division of Administration:
 - Meeting planned with new Deputy Commissioner, Brian Clinton, to discuss:
 - State Emergency Response Fund
 - Appeal submitted to DHS for restoration of CARES Act FY25 expenses
 - Other pending FEMA reform efforts
- FEMA updates:
 - FEMA announced another round of layoffs on December 29.
 - Expect 50% reduction in logistics staff following major disasters, increasing pressure on parishes to be self-sufficient
 - FEMA Review Council meeting scheduled for December 11th was canceled; expected to be rescheduled for later this month.
- National Emergency Management Association (NEMA) workshop tentatively scheduled for March 10–14, pending release of the Review Council's report
 - Opportunity to engage the congressional delegation on proposed FEMA changes and their impacts
 - Storyboard Development & Local Buy-In: Regional coordinators may request parish leadership support to illustrate how delays and reductions in federal support affect constituents, aiming to secure local leadership buy-in for communications in DC

Preparedness Division Updates

Matthew McKey, Preparedness Division Director

- **Preparedness Grants**
 - Pending updates for 2025
- **Plans, Training, and Exercises**
 - Statewide Exercise- April 13th thru April 17th
 - Working to publish 2026 GOHSEP training guide soon
 - Finalizing Spring Academy semester training schedule at ULL
 - Working with SDMI to review Parish EOPs & finalizing draft of State EOP
- **School Safety**
 - School Safety Grants
 - \$325,000 remaining from FY 24 will be carried forward to FY26.
 - \$913,609 remains available for FY25

- Schools have until the **end of January** to submit receipts for FY25 grant reimbursement.
- 40 site assessments completed
- **Cyber Security**
 - Grant application period for FY23, FY24, and FY25 is January 1- February 28; refer to email from Nick Cutrera for details.
 - State and Local Cybersecurity Grant (SLCGP) PowerPoint presented. For any questions, please reach out to Catesha Smith.
 - Cost-share match increases annually
 - Individual applications capped at \$200,000 per grant.
 - Applicants should focus on Mitigation & Training per the approved SLCGP plan.

Response Division Updates

Mark Ward, Response Division Director

- **Logistics**
 - Now falls under GOHSEP Response Division
 - LSA contract executed last year; currently being retooled and expanded.
 - Updated contract will be released soon as an RFP and will be larger in scope.
 - LSA and PODs will be combined into a single emergency response package..
 - FEMA Region 6 has requested assistance identifying a federal staging area location and options for just-in-time contracting to avoid annual fixed costs
- **Operations**
 - Mardi Gras
 - Crisis Action Team will be stood up for Sear 1 event in New Orleans, beginning Friday before Mardi Gras through the day of Mardi Gras.
 - Staff will be on standby the weekend prior to Mardi Gras.
 - Primary operational focus will be counter-UAS support for Sear 1 event; personnel will be embedded with LSP and federal partners.
 - LNO will be assigned to New Orleans EOC; additional parishes requesting LNO support should submit request through WebEOC.
 - Mardi Gras Parade Tracker being developed for situational awareness across 259+ events.
 - POD sites
 - If a parish identifies a concern or needs a site reassessed, request should be submitted through WebEOC under Daily Operations.

- **Intelligence Coordination Center (ICC)**
 - Focuses on filling intelligence gaps for emergency management and disaster response, not replacing the Fusion Center
 - ICC- emergency management & homeland security intelligence
 - Fusion Center- criminal intelligence
 - Weekly coordination meetings ongoing with the Fusion Center

- **Homeland Security & Interoperability**
 - Ongoing ICE-related activity has resulted in a heavy law enforcement presence across Louisiana; New Orleans is beginning to scale down, but activity continues.
 - Nationwide, groups observed in cities such as Minneapolis and Portland are organizing under unified structures, sharing information and collecting intelligence on law enforcement locations and personnel.
 - Violence and aggressive behavior have escalated, with observed TTPs including boxing-in officers
 - These groups often do not distinguish between federal, state, or local officers; all law enforcement may be viewed as potential targets for harassment or assault.
 - Law enforcement agencies are advised to remain **vigilant** and maintain heightened situational awareness.

- **Regional Support**
 - No changes

Recovery Division Updates

Sandra Gaspard, Deputy Recovery Division Director

- **Individual Assistance**
 - Crisis Track
 - GOHSEP requesting that each region select one parish to participate in pilot program.
 - Non-Congregate sheltering- Two units remain deployed across the State.
 - Direct Housing- five units remain deployed across the State
 - Cemetery Taskforce- coordination underway with AG's office regarding reinternment of remains disturbed following Hurricane Ida

- **Public Assistance**
 - FEMA updated Grants Portal/Grant Manager system. In order to login into their site, all users must have a login.gov account with the same email address associated with their Grants Portal/Grants Manager account.

- Katrina Deadlines: FEMA denied extensions for Katrina PA projects passed December 31, 2025- with exception of three City of New Orleans projects (extended to July 1, 2026). GOHSEP formally appealing denial.
- **Hazard Mitigation**
 - Hurricane Francine (DR 4817)- application deadline was December 16th
 - GOHSEP submitted application for \$265M plus alternates
 - Submitted OCD CDBG Global Match project for \$8.8M to provide the 25% non-federal cost share
 - Hurricane Gustav (DR 1786) & DR 4080 (Isaac)- expires June 9, 2026; FEMA is not granting further extensions.
 - Hurricane Katrina (DR 1603)- expires December 31, 2026; extensions not likely
 - 14 POP Extension requests still in review at FEMA R6 & HQ

Financial Operations and Administration Updates

Neal Fudge, GOHSEP Deputy Director

- FY27 budget submitted; Office of Planning & Budget (OPB) reviewed and prepared preliminary budget. GOHSEP will be appealing, as not all projects received funding
