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MR. LAGRANGE:

Good morning. I'd like to call to order the meeting of the Board of Certification and Training for Solid Waste Management Operators. We'll start off, Ms. Suzanne would you call role, please?

MS. BORDELON:

Sure. Denny Mize?

MR. MIZE:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Delaney Lewis?

MR. LEWIS:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Terrance Stewart?

MR. STEWART:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

William Mollere?

MR. MOLLERE:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

1 David Guillory? James Berthelot?

2 MR. BERTHELOT:

3 Here.

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Scott Lyons?

6 MR. LYONS:

7 Fred Williams?

8 MR. WILLIAMS:

9 Here.

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 Bo Legrange?

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 Present.

14 MS. BORDELON:

15 Sam Phillips?

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Thank you. Next, we have review of

18 the minutes of the March 25, 2011

19 meeting. Have any questions or

20 comments? If hearing none, I'll

21 entertain a motion to approve the

22 minutes.

23 MR. WILLIAMS:

24 So moved.

25 MR. MOLLERE:

1 So moved.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 Moved by Mr. Mollere, seconded by
4 Mr. Williams. Any other discussion?
5 Any opposition? Motion carries. Okay.
6 Next we to consideration of operator
7 certifications. And you have the list
8 in front of you and Suzanne had
9 previously sent you copies of the
10 applications. I'll read each name and
11 the license being considered. And if
12 you have any questions speak up and
13 we'll go down the list. First is Henry
14 A. Beauchamp, for an incinerator, level
15 B. James E. Chaney, C & D, level A.
16 Christopher A. Humphrey, landfill, level
17 A.

18 MR. LYONS:

19 By the way, on him, his experience
20 for level A, I wasn't 100 percent sure
21 if he had enough time.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Looks like he's got just under two
24 years at the Webster Parish Landfill.
25 He's got about four years with the

1 drilling operation and then... So, on
2 his experience requirements, does any
3 one have any other comments on that?
4 Three years of solid waste management,
5 two years experience solid waste
6 management. All right. So, we have
7 a -- any other comments on Mr. Humphrey?
8 He doesn't have the three years of solid
9 waste management experience.

10 MR. MIZE:

11 Do you know if they have an A
12 operator up there now, do you know?

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 Webster Parish?

15 MR. MIZE:

16 Webster.

17 MS. BORDELON:

18 I'm not a hundred percent sure, but
19 I think that they do.

20 MR. WILLIAMS:

21 I'm trying to think. David --

22 MR. MIZE:

23 I don't -- I don't think they do at
24 the moment. Not for -- that's an --

25 MR. WILLIAMS:

1 Is David Greene at that facility?

2 MS. BORDELON:

3 Who is that?

4 MR. WILLIAMS:

5 David Greene.

6 MS. BORDELON:

7 Say the last name again.

8 MR. WILLIAMS:

9 Greene.

10 MR. LYONS:

11 David Greene.

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 Greene? That's not a -- he's not
14 an operator.

15 MR. LYONS:

16 I don't think he is.

17 MR. WILLIAMS:

18 I thought he was -- Webster --
19 we're talking about Webster Parish,
20 right?

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Yeah. Webster Parish. He didn't
23 say he was replacing anyone --

24 MS. BORDELON:

25 No.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 -- did he?

3 MS. BORDELON:

4 No, but -- he did say if he was not
5 qualified for an A, he would like to
6 request a B.

7 MR. MIZE:

8 He's got plenty of time for a B.

9 MR. WILLIAMS:

10 Yeah.

11 MS. BORDELON:

12 He did take the A level test today,
13 but he did not pass. So, if he's -- we
14 can tell him, maybe, that he's approved
15 for a B and then in October he can
16 either come back and -- by October --
17 he's going to come back and retest in
18 October is what he told me. So, in
19 October he'll have the three -- no, he
20 won't have three years.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 No, he won't have -- actually --

23 MS. BORDELON:

24 Well.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1 -- he doesn't have two years at
2 Webster Parish according to his
3 experience. But you need two for a B,
4 as well.

5 MR. WILLIAMS:

6 Uh-huh (yes).

7 MR. MIZE:

8 Yeah. Or a year --

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 Well, by October he'll have two
11 years, so, if he's approved for a B then
12 maybe --

13 MR. LYONS:

14 At that time.

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 -- then maybe he can take the B
17 test in October.

18 MR. WILLIAMS:

19 Did anyone else test today for
20 Webster?

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 Yes. Yes.

23 MR. WILLIAMS:

24 For an A or B?

25 MS. BORDELON:

1 For an A.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 From Webster?

4 MR. WILLIAMS:

5 Did they pass?

6 MS. BORDELON:

7 Yes. Isn't -- well, actually
8 she's -- she's requesting a conditional.
9 Amy Stewart.

10 MR. WILLIAMS:

11 Oh. She's replacing --

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 Yeah.

14 MR. WILLIAMS:

15 -- what's her face. Yeah. Okay.

16 MR. MIZE:

17 I don't think she's got enough time
18 either.

19 MR. WILLIAMS:

20 No. She wouldn't.

21 MR. MIZE:

22 She doesn't have enough time?

23 MR. WILLIAMS:

24 No. She wouldn't have.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1 Okay.

2 MR. MIZE:

3 That's what I'm saying, they might
4 not have an A up there on account of
5 that, because I know that the manager --
6 of course, we're going to discuss that
7 here in a little bit, too -- is from
8 Georgia.

9 MR. WILLIAMS:

10 Uh-huh (yes).

11 MR. MIZE:

12 And he's asking for -- you know, to
13 count his Georgia licenses in Louisiana
14 for certification.

15 MR. WILLIAMS:

16 He wants a reciprocal.

17 MR. MIZE:

18 Yeah.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Reciprocity.

21 MR. WILLIAMS:

22 Reciprocity.

23 MR. MIZE:

24 Yeah.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1 All right. On Humphrey, at this
2 time I'll entertain a motion.

3 MR. LYONS:

4 I'll make a motion.

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 To?

7 MR. LYONS:

8 Say he's okay for a level B.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Well --

11 MR. STEWART:

12 He still doesn't have the two
13 years. You've got to have at least --

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 -- he doesn't have two years.

16 MR. LYONS:

17 Yes, but he has a year plus he has
18 a level B -- all you have to have is a
19 year.

20 MS. BORDELON:

21 Well, see, for the B you can
22 substitute --

23 MR. STEWART:

24 You have to have at least two years
25 to get a level B.

1 MS. BORDELON:

2 -- construction.

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 Okay.

5 MS. BORDELON:

6 For the A you can't.

7 MR. LYONS:

8 Or you can have one year minimum
9 experience in solid waste and a minimum
10 of two years experience in a related
11 field -- in a construction field.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 In a construction related -- okay.

14 So we have a motion and a second.

15 Motion by Mr. Lyons --

16 MR. WILLIAMS:

17 Second.

18 MR. STEWART:

19 (GESTURING)

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 -- and by Mr. Stewart, for a -- to
22 approve his application for a landfill,
23 level B. Any other discussion? Any
24 opposition? Motion carries. Okay.

25 Next, we have Terry Levasseur --

1 MR. MOLLERE:

2 Mr. Chairman --

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 -- incinerator, level B.

5 MR. MOLLERE:

6 -- did we give him A in September
7 of 2010?

8 MS. BORDELON:

9 He had a conditional.

10 MR. MOLLERE:

11 Okay. There's some big skips in
12 his work, too. I mean, I notice a lot
13 of these applications, there are just
14 big skips and I know they don't have to
15 tell us what they did when they were a
16 kid, but, you know, there are just some
17 holes in a lot of these applications.
18 I'm sure some of them were in the
19 service or something like that, but this
20 one has some big skips.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Well, this -- I mean, he's applying
23 for a level B.

24 MR. MOLLERE:

25 B, yeah.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 He's got two years experience with
3 the facility.

4 MR. MOLLERE:

5 Oh, yeah. He's got that.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 So he should be okay.

8 MR. WILLIAMS:

9 Yeah.

10 MR. MOLLERE:

11 He's got the time it's just -- I
12 couldn't figure out why he had an A
13 earlier and I didn't -- I couldn't tell
14 it was a conditional.

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 Okay. Next is Krystal A. Perkins,
17 landfill, level A. Billy D. Roane,
18 C & D, level B.

19 MR. MOLLERE:

20 Now, this is one that will test in
21 October?

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 Yes.

24 MR. MOLLERE:

25 Okay.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 John M. Roofner. C & D, level B.

3 MR. MOLLERE:

4 I had a question. This guy is 65
5 years old and working 20 hours a week
6 and we don't have, you know, again,
7 there's big skips in his previous work
8 record.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 Bill, can you speak up because I'm
11 having a hard time hearing you --

12 MR. MOLLERE:

13 Okay.

14 MS. BORDELON:

15 -- I know she probably is, too.

16 MR. MOLLERE:

17 I said he's 65 years old and he's
18 working 20 hours a week. I was just
19 wondering, that was a strange work
20 experience. How's that?

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 Better, thank you.

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 Okay. At this time, I'd entertain
25 a motion to approve applications for

1 regular certification of Henry A.
2 Beauchamp, incinerator, level B; James
3 E. Chaney, C & D, level A; Terry
4 Levasseur, incinerator, level B; Krystal
5 A. Perkins, landfill, level A; and,
6 Billy D. Roane, C & D, level B; and John
7 M. Roofner, C & D, level B.

8 MR. MIZE:

9 (GESTURING)

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Moved by Mr. Mize.

12 MR. WILLIAMS:

13 Second.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Second by Mr. Williams. Any
16 discussion? Any opposition? Motion
17 carries. Thank you. Next, we move to
18 requests for conditional certification.
19 We have first Amanda A. Atwood, C & D,
20 level B, Harrelson Materials Management
21 Facility. She is replacing a regular
22 certified operator, Carmen Varnell. And
23 we have Amy Lynn Stewart for landfill
24 level A, Webster Parish Landfill,
25 replacing a regular certified operator

1 of Esta Monzingo.

2 MR. MOLLERE:

3 Ms. Atwood doesn't talk about any
4 of her education.

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 Ms. Atwood hasn't put anything
7 about her education in the application
8 other than the date she attended high
9 school.

10 MR. LYONS:

11 And are there any other people at
12 this facility that are level B
13 certified?

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 At Harrelson.

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 Harrelson -- I'm not sure if
18 they're level B. I know they have a
19 couple of level A's.

20 MR. LYONS:

21 They do have.

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 Michael and his daughter Marcia are
24 both level A's.

25 MR. WILLIAMS:

1 Yeah.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 She's been at the site, according
4 to this, since March of 2010. So, a
5 little over a year. So, she does have
6 some experience. And as a conditional,
7 we feel, you know, that that warrants
8 enough --

9 MR. WILLIAMS:

10 Yeah.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 -- and she's replacing a regular
13 certified.

14 MR. WILLIAMS:

15 Yeah.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 I think we would be in order to
18 award -- to grant that. And then Amy
19 Lynn Stewart, any comments on Amy Lynn
20 Stewart? Hearing none, I'll entertain a
21 motion to approve the two requests for
22 conditional certification for Amanda A.
23 Atwood, C & D, level B, Harrelson
24 Materials Management; and Amy Lynn
25 Stewart, Landfill, level A, Webster

1 Parish Landfill.

2 MR. WILLIAMS:

3 So moved.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Moved by Mr. Williams..

6 MR. LEWIS:

7 Second.

8 MR. LAGRANGE:

9 Second by Mr. Lewis. Any other
10 discussion? Any opposition? Motion
11 carried. Thank you. Next, we have a
12 group of -- requesting extensions and to
13 their conditional certifications. We
14 have Robert C. Becker, incinerator,
15 level A. Ty Boudoin, C & D, level B.
16 That's at Greenpoint, Inc. Daria R.
17 Jones, C & D, level B, Gator
18 Environmental.

19 MR. MOLLERE:

20 Ms. Ransomme didn't have any
21 back-up sheets.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Which one? Ms. Jones?

24 MR. MOLLERE:

25 Ransomme..

1 MR. LYONS:

2 Ransomme.

3 MS. BORDELON:

4 Yeah, Jones.

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 Okay.

7 MR. MOLLERE:

8 Yeah, that's Jones, I'm sorry.

9 Yeah.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Well, she's met the requirements to
12 extend her conditional.

13 MR. MOLLERE:

14 Right. But, I mean, it was just
15 the --

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 Well, what happened, she filled out
18 the recertification application.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Instead of the regular.

21 MR. MOLLERE:

22 Okay.

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 Okay. Tara Milby, transfer
25 station, level B, City of Winnfield

1 Transfer Station; Suzanne M. Musgrove,
2 C & D, level B, Lincoln Parish Landfill;
3 Clay J. Naquin, landfill, level A,
4 Ashland Landfill; Odis M. Ratcliff,
5 incinerator, level A, Louisiana State
6 Penitentiary; Billy Stevens, C & D,
7 level B, Greenpoint, Inc. Any other
8 comments on the requests for extensions
9 to conditional certifications? Hearing
10 none, I'll entertain a motion to
11 approve.

12 MR. STEWART:

13 (GESTURING)

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Motion by Mr. Stewart.

16 MR. BERTHELOT:

17 (GESTURING)

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Second by Mr. Berthelot. Any other
20 discussion? Any opposition? Motion
21 carries. Okay. Next on the agenda
22 would be review of applications for
23 recertification. I'll read the names
24 and levels and facilities. Suzanne, all
25 of these have met all of the

1 requirements?

2 MS. BORDELON:

3 Yes, they have.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Second by Mr. Mize. Any other
24 discussion? Any comments? Any
25 opposition? Motion carries. Okay.

1 Next we will entertain a motion to issue
2 operator certificates. I'll ask Ms.
3 Bordelon to read those who are qualified
4 to be -- have applications approved and
5 have passed the test and have applied
6 for an operator certificate.

7 MS. BORDELON:

8 Yes. Henry A. Beauchamp,
9 incinerator, level B; James E. Chaney,
10 C~&~D, level A; Terry S. Levasseur,
11 incinerator, level B; John M. Roofner,
12 C & D, level B; and Patrick L. Smythe,
13 transfer station, level A. Patrick was
14 approved at one of the previous
15 meetings, but he just took the test
16 today.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Okay. I'll entertain a motion to
19 issue --

20 MR. MIZE:

21 So moved.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Moved by Mr. Mize.

24 MR. LYONS:

25 (GESTURING)

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Second by Mr. Lyons. Any other
3 discussion? Any opposition? Motion
4 carries. Okay. Next we move on to
5 committee reports. First committee is
6 the awards committee. Mr. Mize, do you
7 have anything to report today?

8 MR. MIZE:

9 Nothing to report, sir.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Okay. Testing committee, Mr.
12 Mollere?

13 MR. MOLLERE:

14 Nothing to report.

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 Thank you.

17 MS. BORDELON:

18 We did have six test today and
19 one -- all passed but one.

20 MR. WILLIAMS:

21 Mr. Mollere --

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Continue --

24 MR. WILLIAMS:

25 That's okay. I'm sorry.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Continuing education committee,

3 Mr. Berthelot?

4 MR. BERTHELOT:

5 Our next conference is in

6 Shreveport, October the 22nd at the

7 Hilton.

8 MR. LAGRANGE:

9 Okay. Also, under continuing

10 education at this time I'd like to take

11 up the request -- we had a request from

12 Ms. Ann Wilson relative to reviewing the

13 conference agenda for the Environmental

14 Regulatory Compliance Conference to be

15 held January 25th and 26th, 2012. And

16 her request was for review and approval

17 of continuing education hours for solid

18 waste operators. Ms. Wilson, would you

19 like to make any comments?

20 MS. WILSON:

21 Okay. Thank you. I'd like to

22 thank the board on considering our

23 request for 10 CEUs for the

24 Environmental Regulatory Compliance

25 Conference. We have our general

1 session, which starts on January the
2 25th. And, reviewing the conference
3 agenda, we have regulatory updates being
4 done by Dr. Armendariz, Region Six
5 Administrator. Peggy Hatch, Secretary
6 of the Department of Environmental
7 Quality. The attendees will also
8 receive hours for ethics, which will be
9 conducted by the Louisiana Board of
10 Ethics, Mike Dupree as well as the
11 current developments and changes to the
12 Louisiana bid law by the Assistant
13 Attorney General Mike Vallan. I noted
14 with the previous approval of
15 certifications that incinerators do play
16 a part in your solid waste regs and Mike
17 Vince will do regulatory update of not
18 only more stringent ozone requirements,
19 but an overview of any changes in the
20 air quality regulations from the LDEQ.
21 The New Orleans office of the Corps of
22 Engineers will give us regulatory
23 updates on changes on wetlands and
24 permitting as it pertains to corps
25 regulations. Celena Cage will also --

1 from DEQ -- will also give us an update
2 on enforcement action from LDEQ, not
3 only in water quality, but as well as
4 solid waste. Then we'll end our first
5 day's program with funding opportunities
6 for government and for agencies. LDEQ
7 will talk about their funding and
8 Dr. Sutherlin from University of
9 Louisiana at Monroe will give us other
10 opportunities for grants and funding
11 that public entities as well as private
12 entities can qualify for. So, I
13 calculated five-and-a-half on the first
14 day. Then, if we move to the solid
15 waste session, the first session 8:30 to
16 9:00 I didn't feel pertained or granted
17 any hours towards the 10 hours we're
18 requesting, but the next session talks
19 about field activities, taking,
20 sampling, monitoring. We know that
21 landfills have storm water permits and
22 are required to do field sampling as
23 well as wastewater permits. We have
24 someone from Providence talking about
25 use of liners and solid waste closure

1 applications. I'm still waiting on his
2 abstract. And we have also a new system
3 for landfill closures closure turf
4 presentation being given by Michael
5 Ayers. As well as landfill expansion
6 and obstacles with C-K and Associates.
7 We do have one 30 minute slot left and I
8 can move the program around if, you
9 know, we wanted more up in the, you
10 know, not the last session. And I would
11 like to offer to the solid waste
12 association to make a presentation about
13 your association, maybe the testing or
14 requirements to become certified and
15 also give us an update on the upcoming
16 conference that you host each year in
17 Lafayette. I noted -- and I've attended
18 your conference -- and I see that y'all
19 have expanded into wastewater, nonpoint
20 source and storm water. And I think
21 that it's a great opportunity for people
22 that attend the conference not only to
23 give water -- wastewater information,
24 but solid waste at our conference as,
25 myself being a certified wastewater

1 operator, to come to your conference and
2 see that you've expanded your agenda as
3 well to get wastewater certification
4 hours. We were happy to extend a
5 reduced rate for a booth for the
6 association last year. And this year
7 we'd like to just offer the association
8 a free complementary booth for their
9 participation in the conference. And we
10 look forward to continuing our
11 relationship with both conferences.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 Thank you, Ms. Wilson for that
14 overview. Anyone have any questions for
15 Ms. Wilson or comments concerning those
16 topics?

17 MR. MOLLERE:

18 Well, Mr. Chairman, one thing. I
19 think Ms. Wilson has maybe melded
20 together the certification board and the
21 LSWA which, really, are two separate
22 groups. And I know she's extending an
23 invitation to LSWA to make some
24 presentations, but that would have
25 nothing to do with our certification

1 board here, of course. And the booth
2 and all of that, so I just want to make
3 sure --

4 MS. WILSON:

5 Right. Okay.

6 MR. MOLLERE:

7 -- we --

8 MS. WILSON:

9 Thank you for making that
10 clarifications.

11 MR. MOLLERE:

12 -- bifurcate those two, so.

13 MS. WILSON:

14 Yeah. Okay. Thank you for that.

15 MR. MOLLERE:

16 Okay.

17 MR. WILLIAMS:

18 Mr. Chairman, I've gone through the
19 program agenda and I'm not sure exactly
20 how many hours Ms. Wilson is asking for
21 as far solid waste certification is
22 concerned or continuing education. But,
23 after going through the program and the
24 agenda I see -- I see about four half,
25 five hours of solid waste participation.

1 For instance -- I'll point out the ones
2 that I've seen and y'all can go along
3 with me. I gave them an hour for the
4 preliminary session. I gave them an
5 hour for the ethics presentation. I
6 gave a half an hour for the regulatory
7 update on ozone and air quality,
8 which -- and I have questions about
9 that, but I went ahead and did that. A
10 half an hour for DEQ enforcement action.
11 A half an hour for site investigation
12 and remediation. A half an hour for the
13 EPDM liner. A half an hour for new
14 system landfill closures. And a half an
15 hour for landfill expansion. Totaling
16 those hours up, I get a total of five
17 hours. And that's all I see as it
18 pertains directly to solid waste. And
19 if there are no other comments...

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 Anyone have any other comments or
22 questions concerning that?

23 MR. LEWIS:

24 I noticed, you know, when you were
25 going through it kind of giving a

1 description of what the topics are going
2 to be talked about, you know --

3 MS. WILSON:

4 Uh-huh (yes).

5 MR. LEWIS:

6 -- and what this board, you know,
7 what Mr. Fred's talking about is
8 addressing solid waste industry and
9 training.

10 MR. WILLIAMS:

11 Yes.

12 MR. LEWIS:

13 That's what they're looking for.

14 MS. WILSON:

15 Okay.

16 MR. LEWIS:

17 And what he's seeing is about five
18 hours total --

19 MR. WILLIAMS:

20 Yeah.

21 MR. LEWIS:

22 -- that you see and I don't guess
23 anyone else sees any more than that.

24 But these figures that you have, I mean,
25 you know, what they're set up to speak

1 on. You know, some of these are really
2 close to being solid waste or not, you
3 know.

4 MR. WILLIAMS:

5 Uh-huh (yes).

6 MR. LEWIS:

7 And the way it's got -- some of the
8 descriptions in here don't sound very --
9 it's not like they're leaning towards
10 the solid waste industry. And I don't
11 know what capacity they have to alter to
12 a degree that might make it more
13 eligible and acceptable to this board
14 that would fit into what we require.
15 And if that's possibility, you know,
16 to -- maybe the same speakers --

17 MS. WILSON:

18 Okay.

19 MR. LEWIS:

20 -- but the presentations changed
21 enough to where it's geared towards, you
22 know, what this board needs and is
23 looking forward for our operators to be
24 trained and certified and get that
25 information they need. So, you know,

1 you might have the right combination of
2 speakers here and, you know, the
3 tweaking of the agenda and what they're
4 speaking on may need to happen, I don't
5 know. Fred --

6 MR. WILLIAMS:

7 Yeah.

8 MR. LEWIS:

9 -- what do you think?

10 MR. WILLIAMS:

11 Well, you know, like I said, I went
12 through it. We had -- and I appreciate
13 the opportunity that we had, given the
14 advance notice and the copies of the
15 agenda and program, and I've gone
16 through it. And the best -- you know,
17 actually I came up with four and a half,
18 but I added in the regulatory updates
19 even though I didn't really think that
20 that was solid waste, but I added it in
21 and, which, you know, I came up with
22 five hours.

23 MR. LEWIS:

24 Right.

25 MR. WILLIAMS:

1 Yeah.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 Okay. So, what's your pleasure?

4 MR. WILLIAMS:

5 I'd like to make a motion that we
6 grant five hours.

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 We have a motion to grant five
9 hours continuing education for the
10 Environmental Regulatory Compliance
11 Conference.

12 MR. STEWART:

13 (GESTURING)

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Second by Mr. Stewart. Any other
16 discussion? Any opposition? Motion
17 carried. Thank you. Thank you, Ms.
18 Wilson.

19 MS. WILSON:

20 Okay. Thank you.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Okay. Next we move on to committee
23 report, the nominating committee. Mr.
24 Lewis?

25 MR. LEWIS:

1 I'd like to welcome Mr. Fred
2 Williams back to the board.

3 MR. WILLIAMS:

4 Thank you, sir.

5 MR. LEWIS:

6 And he's from the Municipal
7 Association and he has replaced
8 Mr. McMullan and finish out his term and
9 then serve for the next three-year term
10 after that, if I'm correct.

11 MR. WILLIAMS:

12 That's how I understand it, yes.

13 MR. MOLLERE:

14 I think it should be noted that
15 this is true recycling.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Mr. Lewis, is anyone else's
18 terms...

19 MR. LEWIS:

20 Yeah. We have Mr. Denny Mize has
21 been reappointed to this board to serve
22 another term from the solid waste
23 industry.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Congratulations to both of you.

1 And welcome --

2 MR. MIZE:

3 Thank you.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 -- welcome back Mr. Williams.

6 MR. WILLIAMS:

7 Thank you, sir. And I truly do
8 feel recycled.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Anything else, Mr. Lewis?

11 MR. LEWIS:

12 That's it for this.

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Thank you for your report. Okay.
15 Other business, we have discussion of a
16 certification for Mr. Earl Townsend.
17 According to this explanation he's
18 applied for a C & D, level A,
19 Natchitoches Parish Police Jury. He
20 took the C & D, level A exam in March of
21 07. Was -- his application for
22 certification was denied due to lack of
23 experience. In '08 he did receive a
24 regular C~&~D, level B. He now has four
25 and a half years experience. He's

1 requesting a level A certification
2 without having to retest. He took and
3 passed the test in '07. I think he was
4 able to provide copies of the minutes of
5 the March '07 meeting of this board,
6 which said upon completion of his
7 experience he would be issued a regular
8 certificate for a level A. So I would
9 entertain a motion to issue a regular
10 C~&~D, level A certificate to
11 Mr. Townsend.

12 MR. MIZE:

13 I have a question first.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Yes, sir.

16 MR. MIZE:

17 Has he kept all of his hours up to
18 date when he was a level B?

19 MS. BORDELON:

20 Yes, he has.

21 MR. MIZE:

22 He has?

23 MS. BORDELON:

24 Yeah.

25 MR. MOLLERE:

1 Mr. Chairman, I --

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 So he currently -- he currently
4 still holds a level B --

5 MS. BORDELON:

6 Well, he --

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 -- he's in good standing?

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 Right.

11 MR. MOLLERE:

12 Mr. Chairman, I just -- again,
13 it's -- I notice that he's now the
14 Director of Public Works for the City of
15 Natchitoches and this is other one of
16 those things that sort of concerns me
17 where people fill these applications out
18 and don't read what we're asking for.
19 For instance, Mr. Townsend according to
20 his application took 12 years to get out
21 of Marthaville High School. And then it
22 took him another six years at
23 Northwestern. He was working part-time
24 as a state policeman. So, sometimes I
25 don't think these people read what we're

1 asking them, and that may be our fault
2 for not making the applications clearer.
3 But I thought it was interesting.
4 Marthaville High must have a real
5 unusual program.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Very unusual. However, when --
8 probably when he attended Marthaville
9 High School, it was probably grade first
10 through 12th --

11 MR. MOLLERE:

12 Well, that's what I said --

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 -- so that's why.

15 MR. MOLLERE:

16 -- it was Marthaville High.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Yeah. Any other questions or
19 comments?

20 MR. MOLLERE:

21 They have a dynamite basketball
22 team.

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 Motion by Mr. Mollere? Is that a
25 motion by Mr. Mollere?

1 MR. MOLLERE:

2 Motion.

3 MR. LEWIS:

4 Second.

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 And second by Mr. Lewis. Any other
7 discussion? Any opposition? Motion to
8 issue a regular C & D, level A
9 certificate to Mr. Townsend is approved.
10 Okay. Any public comments? Suzanne any
11 announcements, anything?

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 No.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Mr. Berthelot?

16 MR. BERTHELOT:

17 Move to adjourn.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 A motion to adjourn.

20 MR. WILLIAMS:

21 Second.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Second by Mr. Mollere. Any
24 opposition? This meeting is adjourned.
25 Thank you.

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
