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1 PROCEEDINGS

2 MR. LAGRANGE: I'd like to call to order the  
3 meeting of the board of certification and training for  
4 solid waste management operators, and ask for the roll  
5 call, please.

6 MS. BORDELON: Delaney Lewis.

7 MR. LEWIS: Here.

8 MS. BORDELON: Denny Mize.

9 MR. MIZE: Present.

10 MS. BORDELON: William Mollere.

11 MR. MOLLERE: Here.

12 MS. BORDELON: Bijan Sharafkhani.

13 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Here.

14 MS. BORDELON: <sup>Terrance</sup>~~Clarence~~ Stewart.

15 MR. STEWART: Here.

16 MS. BORDELON: James Berthelot.

17 MR. BERTHELOT: Here.

18 MS. BORDELON: Scott Lyons.

19 MR. LYONS: Here.

20 MS. BORDELON: Robert McMullen.

21 MR. MCMULLEN: Here.

22 MS. BORDELON: Henry Lagrange.

23 MR. LAGRANGE: Present.

24 MS. BORDELON: And Doug --

25 MR. LAGRANGE: David.

1 MS. BORDELON: David Guillory.

2 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. Next on the agenda is  
3 the review of the July 27, 2010 minutes. Do we have any  
4 questions, comments or a motion to approve?

5 MR. MOLLERE: Move to approve.

6 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion by Mr. Mollere. Seconded  
7 by Mr. Stewart. Any other discussion?

8 Everyone in favor signify by saying aye.

9 (Positive Response)

10 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay.

11 (No Response)

12 MR. LAGRANGE: So carried. Thank you.

13 Next, I'd like to officially deviate a little bit  
14 from the agenda and that is to welcome our newest board  
15 member, Mr. Scott Lyons. I want to welcome you here.  
16 Scott comes to us as the assistant supervisor from Choctaw  
17 Landfill in Franklinton as the representative of the  
18 Louisiana Municipal Association.

19 So, Scott, we definitely want to welcome you to  
20 the board. Look forward to working with you in the coming  
21 years.

22 Also, I'd ask for your consideration to expand  
23 the agenda to issue Level A Certifications to Scott Lyons  
24 in all areas of landfill, incinerator/waste handling,  
25 construction/demolition, wood waste, surface impoundment,

1 land farms, refuse-derived fuel facility, composting  
2 facility, transfer station and separation facility.

3 Do I have a motion to expand?

4 MR. MOLLERE: Move that Mr. Lyons be granted --

5 MR. LAGRANGE: Need a motion to expand, sir,  
6 first. Motion to expand the agenda, to take the --

7 MR. MOLLERE: Expand the agenda.

8 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. Motion.

9 MR. MIZE: (Indicating).

10 MR. LAGRANGE: And seconded by Mr. Mize.

11 Any opposition to expand the agenda?

12 (No response)

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Hearing none, motion carried.

14 Now, Mr. Mollere makes a motion to issue  
15 certifications.

16 MR. MIZE: Second.

17 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Mize. Everyone  
18 signify by saying aye.

19 (Positive Response)

20 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

21 (No Response)

22 MR. LAGRANGE: So carried.

23 All right. So now you're official, Scott.

24 All right. Next item of business is  
25 consideration of operator certifications. First item,

1 review of applications for certification. I'll read the  
2 names and the certification, and if anyone has any  
3 comments, we'll discuss them at that time.

4 First one is David W. <sup>Arthur</sup> ~~Author~~, Landfill, Level B.;  
5 next is Lewis Bonton, III, Landfill, Level B; Christopher  
6 C. Breaux, Incinerator, Level A; Randall Clark, Jr.,  
7 Landfill, Level B; Karen R. Holcomb, Landfill, Level A --

8 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Mr. Chairman --

9 MR. LAGRANGE: Yes, sir.

10 MR. SHARAFKHANI: -- can we ask questions?

11 MR. LAGRANGE: Definitely.

12 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Ms. Holcomb, she's seeking  
13 Landfill Level A, right?

14 MS. BORDERLON: Yes.

15 MR. LAGRANGE: That's correct.

16 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Okay. Looking at her  
17 experience, I really haven't seen any experience relevant  
18 to landfill administration. And that's the question I  
19 have, whether or not she has the experience to be granted  
20 Level A operator certificate.

21 MR. LAGRANGE: Does anyone else have any comments  
22 on that or anything to add?

23 Suzanne, do you have anything on that?

24 MS. BORDELON: What specifically are you -- do  
25 you think that she's missing? You said administrative --

1 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Well, we do requirements for  
2 Level A. I mean, I think -- discuss the -- all aspects of  
3 the landfill operation administration. In reviewing her  
4 experience, I don't see relevant experience. Maybe she  
5 missed it. I don't know.

6 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. The Level A reads  
7 that, Shall encompass all of the technical, regulatory,  
8 administrative and management knowledge needed to perform  
9 all of the duties necessary for the proper operation of an  
10 entire solid waste management facility. It shall  
11 encompass both procedural and operational aspects of a  
12 process in a disposal facility, according to the type of  
13 facility for which the applicant seeks certification.

14 MR. SHARAFKHANI: And that's my question, whether  
15 or not her experience is sufficient to qualify as a Level  
16 A operator.

17 MR. LAGRANGE: According to this she's been --  
18 she's been employed there as operations clerk for over  
19 three years. She has a Level B License she's had for a  
20 year. I think the regs do allow -- do provide that once  
21 you have a minimum of two years' certification as a Level  
22 B, you would be qualified to seek a Level A at that time  
23 as well.

24 MR. SHARAFKHANI: All right. Thank you,  
25 Mr. Chairman.

1 MR. LAGRANGE: So is there -- is there an  
2 objection to approval of this application for Level A?  
3 Mr. Sharafkhani, is there a --

4 MR. SHARAFKHANI? That's fine. Thanks for the  
5 explanation, Chairman.

6 MR. LAGRANGE: You were questioning the  
7 qualifications. Is there --

8 MR. SHARAFKHANI: That was the question. I have  
9 questions on several of them, you know.

10 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay.

11 MR. SHARAFKHANI: I think maybe my question  
12 really is to make sure that the applicant, whatever  
13 experience they put down is relevant, that's really  
14 parallel to what we require in the rules. That's --  
15 that's my question.

16 MR. LAGRANGE: It's a good point.

17 Anyone have anything to add to that? Anyone else  
18 share Mr. Bijan's comments relative to the experience?

19 (No response).

20 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. We'll move on to Richard  
21 Isgitt, Landfill, Level A; Timothy L. Merriman, C&D, Level  
22 B.

23 The only thing I noted on his application was he  
24 would have his two years' experience on the 27th of this  
25 month, which two years' experience is required for -- for

1 a C&D, Level B.

2 Tony Nervis, Landfill, Level B; Carol G. Oates,  
3 C&D, Level A.; Darlene B. Perry, Landfill, Level A;  
4 Clayton E. Smith, Landfill, Level A; and the application  
5 that we just received from Fred Jones, Landfill, Level B.

6 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Mr. Chairman, I've got a  
7 question on Randall Clark. That's, I guess, a  
8 re-consideration, right?

9 MS. BORDELON: Correct. Randall Clark at the  
10 last workshop took the Level -- Landfill, Level A exam and  
11 passed it. The board did not approve his application  
12 based on his experience requirements. <sup>✓</sup> Dick Culpepper, his  
13 supervisor, sent a letter in asking that his application  
14 be reconsidered for a Level B, Landfill, Level B.

15 MR. LAGRANGE: Any other comments or discussions  
16 on the applications for certification?

17 (No Response)

18 MR. LAGRANGE: Hearing none, I'll entertain a  
19 motion to approve the applications.

20 MR. MOLLERE: So moved.

21 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Mollere.

22 MR. STEWART: (Indicating).

23 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Stewart.

24 Any other discussion?

25 (No response)

1 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying  
2 aye.

3 (Positive Response)

4 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

5 (No Response)

6 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried.

7 MS. BORDE~~Y~~LON: Can I just make one comment  
8 regarding the applications with the experience that these  
9 applicants are putting on there. When I get these  
10 applications in, I do just a preliminary review, and a lot  
11 of times there's little or no information on the  
12 experience. I go back. I call them. Tell them they need  
13 to put more experience on there. They need to go into  
14 more detail. I go as far as sending them an e-mail and  
15 just cutting and pasting that section from the regs that  
16 states what the board is looking for. I send them that.  
17 In most cases they e-mail me back more information.  
18 Beyond that, I don't know what else to do, I mean, other  
19 than writing it for them.

20 MR. MOLLERE: It's not your responsibility.

21 MS. BORDE~~Y~~LON: It's not my responsibility,  
22 right, for them to -- for them to complete their  
23 applications.

24 MR. LAGRANGE: That's correct. And it's our  
25 responsibility to determine if it's complete and

1 sufficient to -- to approve them or not or ask them -- or  
2 reject it.

3 MR. MOLLERE: Mr. Chairman, we had asked  
4 Ms. Bordelon originally to view and make those preliminary  
5 decisions, and I think beyond that she can't do more, but  
6 at least that's a screening process.

7 MR. LAGRANGE: Right.

8 MS. BORDELON: And then, also, the reason -- I  
9 know this last time it was only like two weeks before the  
10 meeting that I got the applications to you. That was  
11 another reason for us scanning the applications and  
12 e-mailing them out so that if any of the board members see  
13 a problem, a real issue with any of them, I'd like some  
14 feedback. I don't mind contacting the applicant at that  
15 point if you know -- if you foresee a problem with the  
16 application, that way we can get -- we can get more  
17 information from them prior to the meeting. Otherwise,  
18 they have to wait until the next board meeting.

19 MR. MIZE: I have a question. What is -- what is  
20 actually considered an incomplete application like  
21 Mr. Jones did? He didn't fill out nothing on this right-  
22 hand side or hours of operation or anything. So, I mean,  
23 what's considered to be a completed application when they  
24 didn't fill everything out?

25 MS. BORDELON: You're right. He didn't fill that

1 out, but it is complete on the -- his -- on the front  
2 page.

3 MR. MOLLERE: I guess he should have just carried  
4 that over to it --

5 MS. BORDELON: He should have, you're right.

6 MR. MOLLERE: When I looked at it, I looked back  
7 to see --

8 MR. MIZE: That's what I saw too, but I figured  
9 if it's on there, it's supposed to be filled out.

10 MS. BORDELON: No, it should. You're right.

11 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. So based on that,  
12 that's, you know, in the future when Suzanne does e-mail  
13 you the application, let's try to take a moment to review  
14 them and maybe if you see something that may seem to be a  
15 little deficient, you know, shoot her an e-mail back and  
16 ask her if she could get, you know, some more information,  
17 something on that as well.

18 MS. BORDELON: And I will try to get them to you  
19 just as -- The deadline for submitting applications in the  
20 regs is 30 days, and that's part of the reason we ask for  
21 the 30 days so I can get them out to the board members,  
22 and we have that little bit of time in between, you know,  
23 to ask for more information if needed.

24 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Mr. Chairman, would that be  
25 appropriate to -- to articulate what we require in the

1 application form so that language in the caveat there that  
2 if they don't -- an incomplete application will be  
3 returned and will not be considered? And on the  
4 experience, you know, if you could reference the  
5 applicable part of the regulations, you know. Maybe  
6 that's kind of, you know -- give them a guide -- give the  
7 applicant a guideline to follow.

8 MS. BORDERLON: Right. I'm actually in the  
9 process of updating the application now because we're  
10 trying to, in the future get applicants to fill out  
11 applications on line. Right now it's just an issue with  
12 -- with receiving payment online at the department. Once  
13 we get that squared away, we're going to try to go that  
14 route. But I am trying to update the application now, and  
15 I've considered that -- maybe just putting the regulation  
16 section on the application so they can refer back to it.

17 MR. MCMULLEN: One question on this we're  
18 revising, it says on here to send in 12 copies and the  
19 original. Are they doing that?

20 MS. BORDERLON: With me scanning them now, I  
21 mean, it's not really going to be necessary.

22 MR. MCMULLEN: We need to take that off and not  
23 burden them with it --

24 MS. BORDERLON: Right.

25 MR. MCMULLEN: -- if they don't need to.

1 MS. BORDELON: Right. And like I was telling a  
2 lot of the board members earlier, I've noticed that when  
3 I've been scanning applications and e-mailing them out,  
4 the board members are printing them out and making notes  
5 on their own copies and bringing those copies in. So me  
6 making another packet with another copy for everybody is  
7 just a waste.

8 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Suzanne, if you need help with  
9 this application, the formatting, I'll be glad to help  
10 you.

11 MS. BORDERLON: Okay.

12 MR. LAGRANGE: Thank you.

13 Next we will move on to review of applications  
14 for conditional certification. First applicant requesting  
15 conditional is Mr. Roosevelt Bass requesting that the  
16 conditional certification for construction demolition or  
17 wood waste facility, Level B; Diamond Disposal, LLC; site  
18 name, Catahoula C&D Landfill.

19 MR. MIZE: On his application, we have him as  
20 being a truck driver instead of an operator.

21 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Is he here today?

22 MS. BORDERLON: I'm sorry, who?

23 MR. LAGRANGE: Mr. Bass, Roosevelt Bass.

24 MS. BORDERLON: No.

25 MR. LAGRANGE: No, he's not here. He --

1 According to his application, he's been employed there for  
2 four years, position driver.

3 MR. LYONS: Yeah. But from '88 to '99 he was an  
4 operator at a different facility.

5 MR. LAGRANGE: He does have operator experience.

6 MS. BORDERLON: And he is also replacing another  
7 certified operator.

8 MR. LAGRANGE: Oh, he is?

9 MS. BORDERLON: Uh-huh.

10 MR. LAGRANGE: I didn't notice that.

11 MS. BORDERLON: Oh, maybe I didn't write --  
12 well --

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Yeah, you did. He's replacing --  
14 replacing Charles Atkins.

15 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Do we have anybody from the  
16 facility that may want to come --

17 MR. WYNN: It was a changeover from the Catahoula  
18 Parish that went out to private industry. And the  
19 operator that was at the parish landfill decided to stay  
20 with the police jury instead of going with the other  
21 company and so this is the replacement for that operator.

22 MR. LAGRANGE: Entertain a motion to award  
23 conditional to Mr. Bass.

24 MR. LEWIS: Make a motion.

25 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion by Mr. Lewis.

1 MR. BERTHELOT: (Indicating).

2 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Berthelot to issue  
3 a conditional certification for construction, demolition,  
4 wood waste facility, Level B, Mr. Roosevelt Bass. All in  
5 favor signify by saying aye.

6 (Positive Response)

7 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

8 (No response)

9 MR. LAGRANGE: So carried. Thank you.

10 All right. Next request is Susan Musgrove  
11 requesting conditional for construction demolition, a wood  
12 waste facility, Level B, Lincoln Parish police jury; type  
13 three C&D, wood waste facility.

14 MS. BORDERLON: Ms. Musgrove is also replacing  
15 another certified operator, Glenda Sue Holloway.

16 MR. LAGRANGE: Entertain a motion to issue  
17 conditional certificate to Susan M. Musgrove.

18 MR. STEWART: (Indicating).

19 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Stewart. Seconded by  
20 Mr. Berthelot. Any other discussion?

21 (No response)

22 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying.

23 (Positive response)

24 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

25 (No response)

1 MR. LAGRANGE: So carried.

2 Okay. Next we have Mr. Billy Stevens for a  
3 construction demolition, a wood waste facility, Level B;  
4 employer, Greenpoint Incorporated; facility, Greenpoint  
5 Landfill.

6 He's not replacing anyone.

7 MS. BORDERLON: No.

8 MR. LAGRANGE: Entertain a motion to issue a  
9 conditional certification to Mr. Stevens.

10 MR. MIZE: So move.

11 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Mize.

12 MR. LEWIS: Second.

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Lewis.

14 Any other discussion?

15 (No response)

16 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying  
17 aye.

18 (Positive response)

19 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

20 (No response)

21 MR. LAGRANGE: So carried.

22 Yeah. Since we're on issuance of conditionals,  
23 it's not on the agenda, but we'd ask that you -- we have a  
24 gentleman here to address the board. We'd ask that you  
25 expand the agenda to allow Mr. Troy Barrilleaux to address

1 the board and take up the matter of issuing a conditional  
2 certification to him relative to Better Materials  
3 Recycling for a conditional Level A. He is replacing a  
4 conditional Level A at that facility.

5 We have a motion to expand?

6 MR. BERTHELOT: (Indicating).

7 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion by Mr. Berthelot.

8 MR. STEWART: (Indicating).

9 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Stewart.

10 Any other discussion?

11 (No response)

12 MR. LAGRANGE: Any opposition?

13 (No response)

14 MR. LAGRANGE: So carried.

15 We have Mr. Troy Barrilleaux here and come  
16 forward and address the board, sir.

17 MR. BARRILLEAUX: Good morning. Where would you  
18 like for me to set up?

19 MR. LAGRANGE: Yes. Right on the corner there.

20 MS. BORDERLON: He brought applications with him,  
21 if y'all would like for him to pass those out, if you want  
22 a chance to look at his application.

23 MR. BARRILLEAUX: I've got the original,  
24 Ms. Suzanne.

25 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Any relation to Paul

1 Barrilleaux?

2 MR. BARRILLEAUX Not that I'm aware of.

3 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Okay.

4 MR. BARRILLEAUX: Could be all related.

5 Well, good morning, gentlemen. Like Mr. Bo said,  
6 I'm Troy Barrilleaux. I'm with Better Material Recycling  
7 in Thibodaux, Louisiana. I'm just recently hired with BMR  
8 approximately about a week -- a week ago. What happened  
9 was, a gentlemen by the name of Mr. Dwayne Breaux resigned  
10 about two and a half weeks ago. So the company would like  
11 to be in compliance with the state and also with the solid  
12 waste association. So it just so happened that the board  
13 was meeting today, and we was hoping that we could expand  
14 the agenda to accept me as a conditional Level A so we can  
15 be in compliance.

16 My certifications, I come from SWeeDee, which is  
17 a residential and commercial disposal company, which also  
18 operates as a -- with the transfer station in Larose,  
19 Louisiana. I had a lot of knowledge in that facility of  
20 putting it together and also have eight years of  
21 employment with SWeeDee where we did residential  
22 commercial. I also hold a manager of landfill operations  
23 with SWANA and been holding that, I think, since '04. I'm  
24 also a safety -- certified safety manager as well as a  
25 safety claims specialist and certified auditor in the

1 safety field.

2 So we're just here this morning hoping that we  
3 can get the conditional Level A so we can keep our company  
4 in compliance with y'all's regulations as well as the  
5 state and federal regulations.

6 MR. LAGRANGE: Also, another point,  
7 Mr. Barrilleaux took the test and did pass the exam this  
8 morning as well.

9 MS. BORDELON: Just to go back a couple of  
10 meetings ago, they had asked for three conditional  
11 certificates for this facility. Mr. Breaux was given the  
12 Level A, the Conditional Level A, and two of his  
13 colleagues were given conditional B's. Mr. Breaux is the  
14 one that resigned with the A. So they only -- they  
15 currently have two conditional Level B's that are actually  
16 on the agenda today asking for extensions to those.

17 MR. LAGRANGE: Any questions, Mr. Barrilleaux?

18 (No response)

19 MR. LAGRANGE: Any discussion on the  
20 application?

21 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Mr. Chairman, would this be  
22 conditional or be seeking a Level A?

23 MR. LAGRANGE: Conditional. This is a  
24 conditional.

25 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Why shouldn't it be a Level A

1 certificate if he meets the qualification?

2 MS. BORDERLON: Well, if the board feels like he  
3 does meet the qualifications, then, I mean, it would be  
4 better for him to go for a regular one.

5 MR. LEWIS: I think he meets the qualifications  
6 of a Level A without the conditional.

7 MR. SHARAFKHANI: You're not a geologist, are  
8 you?

9 MR. BARRILLEAUX: No, sir.

10 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Okay. Fine.

11 MR. MIZE: Is SWANA still up to date?

12 MR. BARRILLEAUX: SWANA, yes, it is. We are  
13 currently -- I have to do 30 CEU units, but we paid the  
14 \$200 fee to get it back into --

15 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Well, looking at his  
16 experience, Mr. Chairman, from 2001 to 2009, it appears  
17 that he meets the --

18 MR. LAGRANGE: Well, at this time then I'll --  
19 I'll entertain a motion to approve his application for a  
20 regular certificate separation facility Level A.

21 MR. MIZE: So moved.

22 MR. LEWIS: (Indicating).

23 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Mize, seconded by  
24 Mr. Lewis.

25 Any other discussion?

1 (No response)

2 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying  
3 aye.

4 (Positive response)

5 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

6 (No response)

7 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried.

8 Thank you, Mr. Barrilleaux.

9 MR. Barilleaux: Thank y'all so much.

10 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. Next we'll move on to  
11 request for extensions, extensions of conditional  
12 certifications. First one being Rodney Daigle, Gator  
13 Environmental Waste Solutions, Level B construction  
14 demolition, wood waste facility. This would be to extend  
15 his conditional another six months which was issued -- his  
16 first conditional was issued March 26th of this year.

17 Any discussion, questions, comments?

18 (No response)

19 MR. LAGRANGE: Do I have a motion?

20 MR. BERTHELOT: (Indicating).

21 MR. LYONS: (Indicating).

22 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Berthelot; seconded  
23 by Mr. Lyons.

24 Any other discussion?

25 (No response)

1 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor to issue conditional  
2 certification to Mr. Rodney Daigle signify by saying aye.

3 (Positive response)

4 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

5 (No response)

6 MR. LAGRANGE: So carried.

7 Next we have Gaylen Bullion, same company, Gator  
8 Environmental, construction demolition, wood waste, Level  
9 B. Her first conditional was also issued in March of this  
10 year.

11 Are there any comments, discussion or motion?

12 MR. MIZE: These people don't have the  
13 experience?

14 MS. BORDERLON: Yes.

15 MR. LAGRANGE: Right.

16 MR. LEWIS: It did have one thing in there it  
17 said they were not able to attend a required ten-hour  
18 workshop, that one was not available in the duration; is  
19 that correct? I guess since they got the conditional  
20 there hasn't been another class.

21 MS. BORDERLON: Well, there was a class in July.  
22 If I'm not mistaken, they may be registered for this  
23 class.

24 Connie, can you check Gaylen Bullion and Rodney  
25 Daigle? Rodney's here. I saw him this morning.

1 MS. HENRY: Gaylen is registered and so is  
2 Rodney.

3 MR. LAGRANGE: Thank you.

4 MR. MCMULLEN: I so move.

5 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. McMullen.

6 MR. LYONS: (Indicating).

7 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Lyons.

8 Any other discussion?

9 (No response)

10 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying  
11 aye.

12 (Positive response)

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

14 (No response)

15 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried to issue a  
16 conditional to Gaylen Bullion for construction demolition  
17 wood waste Level B.

18 Okay. Next is Doug Benoit for a separation  
19 facility Level B which is with Better Material Recycling.  
20 Again, this would be -- His conditional was issued in  
21 March. This is an extended conditional another six  
22 months, and we'll take Mr. Benoit and Mr. Reinhardt up at  
23 the same time. They're both requesting extensions for  
24 Level B's at separation facility, both at Better Material  
25 Recycling.

1 MS. BORDERLON: This would be Better Material  
2 Recycling, the regular Level A that you just approved for  
3 Mr. Barrilleaux and two conditional B's.

4 MR. LEWIS: Make a motion.

5 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Lewis.

6 MR. MOLLERE: (Indicating).

7 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Mollere.

8 Any other discussion?

9 (No response)

10 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying  
11 aye.

12 (Positive response)

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

14 (No response)

15 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried. Thank you very  
16 much.

17 All right. Next we have two requests for  
18 certification by reciprocity for Mr. John Alderete and  
19 Mr. John Helms. Both are certified operators in the state  
20 of Texas. You should have a copy of their certification  
21 attached to the application. I have a question. It looks  
22 like their applications expire next year or the year  
23 after. When we issue a certificate, do we put the same  
24 expiration or do we give them a four year --

25 MS. BORDERLON: No. We give them the four

1 years. As long as they're -- they're --

2 MR. LAGRANGE: Currently certified?

3 MS. BORDERLON: -- currently certified.

4 MR. LAGRANGE: I'll entertain a motion.

5 MR. MOLLERE: (Indicating).

6 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion by Mr. Mollere.

7 MR. MIZE: (Indicating).

8 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Mize, to issue  
9 certificates by reciprocity to Mr. John Alderete and  
10 Mr. John Helms, both Landfill Level A's. All in favor  
11 signify by saying aye.

12 (Positive response)

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

14 (No response)

15 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried.

16 MR. SHARAFKHANI: General question for  
17 reciprocity. We are looking at a -- when you're  
18 evaluating the application from another jurisdiction, we  
19 are looking at the qualifications at the time that was in  
20 effect in our state, right? They have to meet minimum  
21 qualification requirement of our state at the time they  
22 became certified in another jurisdiction, right?

23 MR. LAGRANGE: Yeah. Provided the standards are  
24 not lower than our standards, it says.

25 MS. BORDERLON: Right.

1 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Next --

2 MS. BORDERLON: And this just excuses them from  
3 taking the test.

4 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Yeah, I understand. The reason  
5 I say that because I want to make sure when they provide  
6 us with the job description from another jurisdiction,  
7 that job description meets our requirements. That's --  
8 that's all I'm asking.

9 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. Next item on the  
10 agenda is review of applications for recertification.  
11 I'll read all the names: Maccon Brown, Landfill, Level B,  
12 St. Landry Southwest Disposal District; Norris J.  
13 Crappell, Landfill, Level A, C&D, Level A, St. Mary Parish  
14 Government, Harold J. "Babe" Landry, Landfill; Jerry D.  
15 Frost, Landfill, Level B, St. Mary Parish Government,  
16 Harold J. "Babe" Landry Landfill; Shane T. Landry,  
17 Landfill Level B, St. James Parish Government, St. James  
18 Parish Landfill; Yolunda Righteous, C&D Level A,  
19 Providence Engineering; Justin R. Seals, Landfill, Level  
20 B, Waste Management - Woodside Landfill; Daniel R. Thomas,  
21 Landfill Level A, Picket Industries, International Paper,  
22 Mansfield Mill; and we have Hajji Brown, Landfill Level B,  
23 St. Landry Southwest Disposal District, provided he  
24 attends the workshop here in Shreveport to obtain his  
25 final ten hours needed for recertification.

1 MR. SHARAFKHANI: He is registered?

2 MR. LAGRANGE: He is registered.

3 I'll entertain a motion for recertification.

4 MR. MIZE: (Indicating).

5 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Mize.

6 MR. MOLLERE: (Indicating).

7 MR. LAGRANGE: Second by Mr. Mollere.

8 Any discussion?

9 (No response)

10 MR. LAGRANGE: Hearing none, all in favor signify  
11 by saying aye.

12 (Positive Response)

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

14 (No response)

15 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried.

16 Yes, sir.

17 MR. STEWART: I have one on one of the owner-  
18 operators from Tangipahoa Parish. His check was sent in  
19 on the 13th of October, so he may have not gotten his  
20 application and all sent in. He expires on the 8th of  
21 December. Will he be okay or --

22 MR. LAGRANGE: This is for re-certification?

23 MR. STEWART: Right.

24 MR. LAGRANGE: What's the --

25 MR. STEWART: Jeff -- Jeffrey <sup>Gilliland</sup> Burio (phonetic).

1 MS. BORDERLON: Yeah. If he -- If the  
2 application's been submitted prior to his expiration date,  
3 he'll be fine.

4 MR. STEWART: Okay.

5 MS. BORDERLON: The board -- When we discuss it  
6 at the next board meeting -- which I think we're probably  
7 trying to look at the 10th -- I mean he just won't have --  
8 there will be just maybe a week's time where he won't have  
9 a certificate, but he's still in compliance, and he's  
10 still -- as far as turning his application in, his  
11 re-certification application in on time, he'll be fine.

12 MR. STEWART: And he'll be here today, but we  
13 just wanted to make sure that, you know, he doesn't  
14 expire.

15 MR. LAGRANGE: Yeah. So we'll -- we'll take his  
16 up at the next meeting.

17 MS. BORDERLON: We'll take his up at the next  
18 meeting.

19 MR. STEWART: Okay. All right. Thanks.

20 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Next we'll go to the  
21 issuance of operator certificates, and I'd ask  
22 Ms. Bordelon to read the names and the certification,  
23 please.

24 MS. BORDERLON: Again, these are applicants that  
25 -- whose applications were approved either today or the

1 previous meeting and have passed the text: David Arthur,  
2 Landfill, Level B; Christopher Breaux, Incinerator Level  
3 A; Randall Clarke, Landfill, Level B; Karen Holcomb,  
4 Landfill, Level A; Richard Isgitt, Landfill, Level A;  
5 Timothy Merriman, C&D, Level B; Tony Nervis, Landfill,  
6 Level B; Carol Oates, Landfill, Level A; James Repke  
7 (phonetic), C&D, Level B; and Fred Jones, Landfill, Level  
8 B and Troy Barrilleaux, Separation Level A.

9 MR. LAGRANGE: Entertain a motion.

10 MR. MOLLERE: (Indicating).

11 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion by Mr. Mollere.

12 MR. MIZE: (Indicating).

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Mize.

14 Any other discussion?

15 (No response)

16 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying  
17 aye.

18 (Positive Response)

19 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

20 (No response)

21 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried. Thank you.

22 All right. Next we go to our committee reports.

23 Awards committee, Mr. Mize. Do you have any  
24 report for us today?

25 MR. MIZE: No, sir. Nothing to report.

1 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Usually in December is when  
2 we begin the process for sending out the awards nomination  
3 forms?

4 MS. BORDERLON: Yes.

5 MR. LAGRANGE: So you'll be in touch with  
6 Mr. Mize to discuss that.

7 Testing, Mr. Mollere.

8 MR. MOLLERE: No news.

9 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. Continuing education,  
10 Mr. Berthelot.

11 MR. BERTHELOT: Suzanne, how many did we have  
12 test today?

13 MS. BORDERLON: Today we had 12.

14 MR. LAGRANGE: That's your report?

15 MR. BERTHELOT: That's my report.

16 MR. LAGRANGE: All right.

17 MS. BORDERLON: For the record, out of those  
18 twelve three did not pass.

19 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. And the nominating  
20 committee, Mr. Troy Barber has manned that committee for  
21 us, and I've asked Mr. Delaney Lewis to take over for him,  
22 so I know he doesn't have a report today, but I'm sure  
23 he'll have some great reports in the coming meetings.

24 MS. BORDERLON: I can -- I can actually make that  
25 report for him today.

1 MR. LAGRANGE: Sure.

2 MS. BORDERLON: Scott Lyons, of course, replaced  
3 Troy Barber, representing the Louisiana Municipal  
4 Association until October 2013. What else. . . Oh, Bo  
5 was nominated for another term, or reappointed for another  
6 term until October of 2013. Mr. Mollere's nomination --  
7 re-appointment letter has been submitted. It has not yet  
8 been signed, but I'm sure it will be. I've already gotten  
9 the okay from -- from the secretary. Just waiting on the  
10 official letter to be signed for his re-appointment.

11 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Thank you for that report,  
12 Suzanne.

13 Okay. Other business we have on the agenda is  
14 revisit the request for continuing education units from  
15 the City of Alexandria. We have Ms. Ann Wilson here, if  
16 you'd like to address the board.

17 MS. WILSON: I am just requesting that the board  
18 reconsider the City of Alexandria's request for the  
19 environmental compliance conference to be held in  
20 January. We were originally approved for five CEU's. We  
21 have since rearranged the agenda. We had for the second  
22 day concurrent sessions were occurring at the same time,  
23 so we submitted in greater detail through a letter those  
24 sessions that would be applicable to solid waste  
25 operators. And by having the morning session on the

1 second day, three in the solid and hazardous waste session  
2 and three in the afternoon on the waste water sessions,  
3 the electronic VMR, waste water treatment compliance  
4 issues, as well as defining more in detail the first day  
5 of the session.

6 And I'm probably being a little conservative on  
7 what courses could apply for solid waste operators. The  
8 pesticide certification is a new regulation that's going  
9 to require certification in order to apply pesticides, and  
10 that's going to be administered by DEQ that I didn't mark,  
11 that we're eight or plus hours with classroom-style  
12 seating and sessions. And also we have 52 exhibitors that  
13 we have planned which sold half of the exhibitor space.  
14 And so we have 30-minute sessions for the attendees to  
15 visit our exhibitors and gather more information.

16 So I'm here to answer any questions that the  
17 board may have and would respectfully request  
18 reconsideration for ten CEU's.

19 Thank you.

20 MR. LAGRANGE: Thank you, Ms. Wilson.

21 Does anyone have any questions for Ms. Wilson?

22 MR. MCMULLEN: On this sheet that we have from  
23 them, who wrote the hours down? That's something we went  
24 over last time when I wasn't here or --

25 MR. LAGRANGE: No. I think Ms. Wilson just

1 provided that just to point out the items that were  
2 pertinent to solid waste operators, solid waste  
3 education.

4 MR. MCMULLEN: I'll go a step farther on this,  
5 what she doesn't have marked. I'm very familiar with the  
6 Brownsfield program, and I think that's something that  
7 they would get something out of if they sit in on those of  
8 -- with the waste streams coming from of some of these  
9 programs that's not marked on here.

10 MR. LEWIS: I agree. You know, some of the  
11 programs that you wrote down you're conservative because  
12 there are some more programs in here that will absolutely  
13 be beneficial. You know, even the wetland challenges,  
14 waste cleanup, that's another one that -- that I can pick  
15 out.

16 MR. LAGRANGE: So do I have a motion to grant ten  
17 hours continuing education?

18 MR. MCMULLEN: (Indicating).

19 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. McMullen.

20 MR. LEWIS: Second.

21 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded, by Mr. Lewis.

22 Any another discussion?

23 (No response)

24 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying  
25 aye.

1 (Positive response)

2 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

3 (No response)

4 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried.

5 Thank you Ms. Wilson.

6 All right. Next request is for CEU's, continuing  
7 education units, from the Mississippi SWANA, and we have  
8 the agenda before you.

9 Suzanne, do you have any comments? Does anyone  
10 have any information on this? Any communication? Who has  
11 communication with SWANA?

12 Do you know, Mr. Mize?

13 MR. MIZE: I did. I went down there. I went to  
14 the SWANA training they had.

15 MS. BORDERLON: That's today.

16 MR. LAGRANGE: Well, this is --

17 MR. MIZE: Huh?

18 MR. LAGRANGE: That's today.

19 MS. BORDERLON: That's today. Yesterday, today  
20 and tomorrow.

21 MR. MIZE: I am supposed to be asking for the one  
22 earlier this year.

23 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Have you audited his travel?

24 MR. LAGRANGE: This is the fall -- fall  
25 conference, starts today.

1 MR. MIZE: Supposed to be the one for the other  
2 one. The one I went to in the spring.

3 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Well, the request --

4 MR. MIZE: There's a -- there's a lot of people  
5 went to that conference from Louisiana.

6 MR. LAGRANGE: Well, let's back up. Who sent the  
7 request?

8 MS. BORDERLON: I don't remember his name.

9 MR. LAGRANGE: Someone sent you a request from  
10 Mississippi SWANA, and this is what they sent you?

11 MS. BORDERLON: Yes.

12 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. So let's take this up  
13 and -- and review it and --

14 MS. BORDERLON: Actually, there probably was some  
15 e-mail correspondence, and I guess I didn't print it out  
16 and attach it to the. . . .

17 MR. LAGRANGE: Any comments?

18 Mr. Mollere, are you familiar with this?

19 MR. MOLLERE: Well, I know Mr. Breaux is with our  
20 SWANA organization here in the state as our -- our board  
21 member. And he had -- he would have been here today  
22 except for a health problem. But he had called me early  
23 yesterday morning to tell me that the SWANA chapter in  
24 Mississippi was requesting this, and that the Alabama  
25 chapter of SWANA would also be requesting that we

1 recognize their workshop. And I told him that they had to  
2 submit the agenda for this board, for us to review it  
3 before we can act on ten hours.

4 Looking over the Mississippi plan that's been  
5 reviewed, I don't see a total of ten hours, but that's not  
6 my decision so. . . .

7 MR. LAGRANGE: How many hours do you see?

8 MR. MOLLERE: At most eight, and that's  
9 stretching a little.

10 MR. SHARAFKHANI: I kind of concur, Mr. Chairman,  
11 with Mr. Mollere.

12 MR. MCMULLEN: Is that the one Denny took today?

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Well, the fish fry is tonight.  
14 You can make it there.

15 MR. MIZE: That's a long drive. That's a long  
16 drive to Natchez.

17 MR. MOLLERE: You can get in eight hours.

18 MR. MIZE: I'm hoping to get the ten hours for  
19 the one in the spring.

20 MR. LAGRANGE: Well, I mean, you can still submit  
21 that for the next meeting.

22 MS. BORDERLON: Yeah. He's got a different  
23 agenda.

24 MR. MIZE: I'll call --

25 MR. LAGRANGE: Get that one submitted.

1           But on this one, anyone else have any comments on  
2 it, on the hours?

3           MR. LEWIS: Only thing that I would say on it is  
4 on the hours that you have guys that are going to that --  
5 that class expecting to get ten hours, working that into  
6 their four-year program. And they get there and they get  
7 come up with eight instead of ten, then maybe they don't  
8 have enough hours to meet their renewal, you know. Not  
9 that this board has that authority to do that, but I think  
10 that whoever represents SWANA from over there needs to be  
11 informed that if they don't get ten hours, then it doesn't  
12 need to be available. We're putting people in jeopardy,  
13 is what I'm trying to say.

14           MR. MOLLERE: Mr. Chairman, I think what  
15 Mr. Breaux's comment was that a lot of people go to these  
16 conferences and then come back and assume that we will  
17 grant the ten hours, and that's not what should be done.  
18 The agenda should be submitted in advance and have this  
19 board approve that prior to people going. Because it's  
20 just like you say, if they come back and they're --  
21 they're thinking they're going to have ten hours and we --  
22 we don't grant that, they could be shorting themselves on  
23 their hours needed.

24           MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Good point.

25           Anyone else have any other comments? I mean for

1 the sake of -- I can't see that we would grant ten hours  
2 for the sake of granting ten hours though either.  
3 That's -- You know, that's the other side of that coin so.  
4 . . . .

5 MR. MOLLERE: I know Ms. Swackert (phonetic), I  
6 think, e-mailed everyone a copy of the Texas Environmental  
7 Conference that was held in Austin, and, again, it was  
8 quite a few topics. But once you start looking at what's  
9 real solid waste areas, then you may leave one empty.

10 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. So do I have any  
11 motion --

12 MR. MCMULLEN: Well, have we been through just  
13 why we don't think it's ten hours? I mean, I see one  
14 thing, lots of time taken for networking, the opportunity  
15 on Wednesday today, sporting clays, golf, guided tour of  
16 Natchitoches. Now is that guided tour going to landfills,  
17 or is it going to the Mississippi River? I mean, I don't  
18 think it's quite as much there so. . . .

19 MR. LAGRANGE: Well, you know, there were two  
20 things concerning the Mississippi DEQ which doesn't apply  
21 to Louisiana, Solid Waste Operators. And not counting  
22 that, I'd roughed out nine hours in my review of it.

23 MR. BERTHELOT: What about if we just allow ten  
24 this time and get in touch with them and say next time we  
25 need the agenda more in advance of the meeting so we can,

1 you know, tell you, not the day of the meeting, if we're  
2 going to allow eight or ten, whatever.

3 MR. LAGRANGE: Well, I don't think they  
4 requested -- they just requested -- They didn't  
5 specifically say we want you to give ten hours, requested  
6 ten hours, did they?

7 MS. BORDERLON: I want to say that they may have  
8 -- he may have in the e-mail correspondence, which I  
9 failed to bring a copy of. But like somebody had  
10 mentioned earlier, I mean, we can still bring it up at the  
11 December meeting and get more information from him. There  
12 will still be time though since the conference is not till  
13 the spring. So this is not even the agenda for the spring  
14 conference.

15 MR. BERTHELOT: This is for this conference now.

16 MR. LAGRANGE: Yeah. But they wanted -- they  
17 wanted -- they want it in reference to this conference  
18 too, which we could still table it --

19 MS. BORDERLON: Well, if they're there, they're  
20 there, so it doesn't really -- they're already there.

21 MR. BERTHELOT: Like Mr. Lewis said, if they're  
22 expecting ten and they come out with eight. . . .

23 MR. LEWIS: Yeah. If they expire, you know, this  
24 year, then they've got 38 hours instead of 40.

25 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Do you know --

1 MR. LAGRANGE: But the burden's on them to -- I  
2 mean, the burden's on them. It's not our position to do  
3 that, to babysit.

4 MR. LEWIS: I agree with that. I think that  
5 what -- somewhere there's a step missing between the  
6 responsibility of Mississippi SWANA to meet and inform  
7 those people that they're only eligible when they send it  
8 out.

9 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Mr. Chairman, do we know any of  
10 the Louisiana licensees attending this -- this  
11 conference? I mean, I don't --

12 MR. LEWIS: The one in Mississippi?

13 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Yeah, yeah. That's --

14 MR. MIZE: I don't know about this one. I knew  
15 some -- the one I was talking about was last spring, in  
16 March or April.

17 MR. LYONS: Yeah. I have people that work for me  
18 that go.

19 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Attend this?

20 MR. LYONS: Yeah.

21 MR. MIZE: Not necessarily this one, but the one  
22 in the spring, there were waste management people there,  
23 IESI had people there and public -- I mean, it was a lot  
24 of people at that conference.

25 MR. LAGRANGE: What I'd like to do is ask

1 Mr. Lewis and Mr. Mize to work together, you know, and  
2 communicate with these folks and really get, you know, as  
3 much information as you can on these topics that we  
4 discussed, and let's revisit it at the next meeting.  
5 Okay.

6 All right. Next is the election of chairman and  
7 vice chairman.

8 MR. MOLLERE: Move to re-elect our officers and  
9 allow them to have another chance to do the right thing.

10 MR. LAGRANGE: Thanks for that vote of  
11 confidence.

12 MR. LYONS: Second.

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Mollere. This would  
14 be for chairman because vice chairman is no longer on the  
15 board.

16 MS. BORDERLON: Our vice chairman is Troy.

17 MR. MOLLERE: Well, we won't give him another  
18 chance.

19 MR. LAGRANGE: So your motion is chairman.

20 MR. MOLLERE: Chair.

21 MR. LAGRANGE: Second by Mr. Lyons. Any  
22 discussions? Any other nominations? Move to close  
23 nominations.

24 MR. BERTHELOT: (Indicating).

25 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Berthelot.

1 MR. LEWIS: Second.

2 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. Lewis. All  
3 right. Well, thank you.

4 Now we'll open the floor up for nominations for  
5 vice chairman.

6 MR. LEWIS: I'd like to nominate Mr. Mollere.

7 MR. MIZE: Second.

8 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion by Mr. Lewis; seconded by  
9 Mr. Mize to nominate Mr. Mollere.

10 MR. LEWIS: Motion to close.

11 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion to close.

12 MR. MCMULLEN: Second.

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Seconded by Mr. McMullen.  
14 Congratulations, Mr. Mollere.

15 MR. MOLLERE: All right.

16 MR. LAGRANGE: And we'll see if you do the right  
17 thing.

18 MR. MOLLERE: It will never happen.

19 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. Next meeting date,  
20 Suzanne and I looked at the calendar, and I suggest that  
21 it will be on December 10th.

22 Mr. Mollere?

23 MR. MOLLERE: I just wanted to ask if we could  
24 have one more item of business on that life certification  
25 that came up at the last meeting that was confused, and we

1 were going to defer until this meeting.

2 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Let's set the date for the  
3 December meeting, and then we'll take that up, if that's  
4 all right.

5 December 10th? Mark your calendars December 10th  
6 meeting.

7 MS. BORDERLON: It's a Friday.

8 MR. LAGRANGE: It's a Friday.

9 MS. BORDERLON: Second Friday in December.

10 MR. LAGRANGE: And the meeting will be  
11 determined. What time will be --

12 MS. BORDERLON: The time will most likely be  
13 10 a.m.

14 MR. LAGRANGE: Ten o'clock. Site to be  
15 determined. We'll let you know.

16 Any comments, questions on that?

17 (No response)

18 MR. LAGRANGE: Next, public comments, and we'll  
19 let Mr. Mollere bring up --

20 MR. MOLLERE: Mr. Chairman, at the last meeting  
21 we talked about life certification for several of our  
22 members and the precedence that had been set previously.  
23 And there was a request that a formal motion be brought  
24 and so I would move this: Any member of the board of  
25 certification who has served at least two terms of the

1 three years each and who retires from the board may  
2 request a life certification in all categories and classes  
3 of certification and an exemption from all fees provided  
4 that the individual maintains the minimum required hours  
5 of certification, training and an association with and in  
6 the solid waste management profession. So moved.

7 MR. LAGRANGE: We have a motion. Do I have a  
8 second?

9 MR. STEWART: (Indicating).

10 MR. LAGRANGE: Second by Mr. Stewart.

11 All right. Let's have some discussion.

12 MR. SHARAFKHANI: As far as solid waste  
13 profession, I assume somebody's been consulting with --  
14 would it be considered as solid waste?

15 MR. MOLLERE: As long as they're not geologists.

16 MR. SHARAFKHANI: That was my question, solid  
17 waste association, I'm assuming waste business and. . . .

18 MR. MOLLERE: Yes.

19 MS. BORDERLON: I would like to add that these  
20 members, board members, still submit the re-certification  
21 application and proof of their continuing education hours  
22 so that I'm not having to keep up with their expiration  
23 dates.

24 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. And you mentioned  
25 retire from the board?

1 MR. MOLLERE: Yes, sir.

2 MR. LAGRANGE: What does that mean, retire from  
3 the board?

4 MR. MOLLERE: Goes --

5 MR. LAGRANGE: No longer -- no longer serves.

6 MS. BORDERLON: But they serve two consecutive  
7 three-year terms.

8 MR. LEWIS: Two consecutive terms or just two  
9 terms?

10 MR. LAGRANGE: What's the motion? Is it two  
11 terms or two --

12 MR. MOLLERE: It says at least two terms.

13 MR. LAGRANGE: At least two terms.

14 MS. BORDERLON: Okay.

15 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. Any other discussion  
16 on the motion?

17 Yes, sir.

18 MR. BONVILLAIN: Okay. When the term "retire"  
19 does that mean this individual won't serve on the board in  
20 the future, certification board, in the future?

21 MR. LAGRANGE: That's why I brought it up. That  
22 was kind of my question.

23 MR. SHARAFKHANI: How about saying who serves two  
24 consecutive terms.

25 MR. LAGRANGE: Yeah. You don't have to say

1 retire.

2 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Serve two consecutive terms.

3 MR. LAGRANGE: Two terms.

4 MR. SHARAFKHANI: Two terms, yeah.

5 MR. MOLLERE: But someone just like

6 Mr. Bonvillain who keeps coming back and coming back and

7 just like --

8 MR. WILLIAMS: But he already has his lifetime

9 certification.

10 MR. MOLLERE: In -- in my situation when I went

11 off the board after 14 or 15 years I was given life

12 certification. But then I came back on the board, so

13 that's why I don't know if that life certification ended,

14 and it would have to be reissued.

15 MR. LEWIS: Wouldn't be a life certification if

16 you --

17 MR. LAGRANGE: I think once it's issued it's

18 issued. And even in you come back on the board later on,

19 you know, you do -- but you already have it so let's --

20 would you amend your motion to take out "retired from"?

21 MR. MOLLERE: I will.

22 MR. LAGRANGE: All right. And would you agree

23 with the second --

24 MR. LEWIS: I second the motion.

25 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. All right.

1 MR. WILLIAMS: Mr. Chairman --

2 MR. LAGRANGE: Yes, sir.

3 MR. WILLIAMS: Does it have to be submitted in  
4 writing, or can we make a verbal request at a board  
5 meeting?

6 MS. BORDERLON: No. It has to be submitted in  
7 writing.

8 MR. LAGRANGE: Yeah. It has to be submitted in  
9 writing.

10 MS. BORDERLON: And I know there are a lot of  
11 these board members here who expire in December, December  
12 8th of this year.

13 MR. SHARAFKHANI: And that's going to be  
14 effective immediately, right? It's not retroactive, or is  
15 it going to be retroactive or effective immediately?

16 MR. LAGRANGE: No. It's retroactive, anyone that  
17 qualifies, is my understanding.

18 Is that the intent of the motion?

19 MR. MOLLERE: I would hope that it would be  
20 retroactive.

21 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Restate the motion one more  
22 time, Mr. Mollere, before we vote.

23 MR. MOLLERE: Any member of the board of  
24 certification who has served at least two terms may  
25 request in writing a life certification in all categories

1 and classes of the certification and an exemption from all  
2 fees provided that the individual maintain the minimum  
3 required hours of certification, training and an  
4 association with and in the solid waste management  
5 profession.

6 MR. LAGRANGE: Okay. Any other discussion?

7 (No response)

8 MR. LAGRANGE: All in favor signify by saying  
9 aye.

10 (Positive response)

11 MR. LAGRANGE: Opposed, nay?

12 (No response)

13 MR. LAGRANGE: Motion carried.

14 Thank you, Mr. Mollere.

15 MR. MOLLERE: Thank you.

16 MR. LAGRANGE: Any other public comments?

17 (No response).

18 MR. LAGRANGE: Hearing none, I'll entertain a  
19 motion to adjourn.

20 MR. LEWIS: (Indicating).

21 MR. MCMULLEN: Second.

22 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Lewis; second by  
23 Mr. McMullen. Meeting is adjourned.

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
