2 proceeded as follows:)

3 MR. DE ABREU:

4 All right. The meeting of the Board  
5 of Certification Training for Solid  
6 Waste Management Operators come to  
7 order, date of December 8th, 2023. It  
8 is 10:11 a.m. Ms. Robins, can we have  
9 the roll call, please?

10 MS. ROBINS:

11 Okay. My name is Shirley Robins.  
12 We have Mr. Ricardo --

13 MR. DE ABREU:

14 De Abreu.

15 MS. ROBINS:

16 -- de Abreu.

17 MR. DE ABREU:

18 Here.

19 MS. ROBINS:

20 Bubba Wynn.

21 MR. WYNN:

22 Here.

23 MS. ROBINS:

24 Richard LeBouef.

25 MR. LEBOUCEF:

1                   Here.

2           MS. ROBINS:

3                   Donnie Colona.

4           MR. COLONA:

5                   Here.

6           MS. ROBINS:

7                   Donovan Driskill.

8           MR. DRISKILL:

9                   Here.

10          MS. ROBINS:

11                   Jason Brancamp.

12          MR. BRANCAMP:

13                   Brancamp.

14          MS. ROBINS:

15                   Brancamp.

16          MR. BRANCAMP:

17                   Here.

18          MS. ROBINS:

19                   And Robert, Mr. Robert Thomas.

20          MR. THOMAS:

21                   Present.

22          MR. DE ABREU:

23                   All right. We have a quorum. Do we  
24                   have anyone who have not received the  
25                   meeting's agenda? Everybody received

1 the meeting's agenda?

2 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

3 I think so.

4 MR. DE ABREU:

5 Awesome. So the first item is the  
6 review of the October 23, 2023, minutes.  
7 Ms. Shirley Robins sent to everybody.  
8 You should have that. We have a motion  
9 to --

10 MR. DRISKILL:

11 I move to approve them.

12 MR. DE ABREU:

13 Okay. Motion by Mr. Driskill. Do I  
14 hear a second?

15 MR. LEBOUF:

16 Second.

17 MR. DE ABREU:

18 Second by Mr. LeBouef. Any  
19 comments? Hearing none, the motion  
20 carries.

21 Then we had the review of the agenda  
22 for approval hours for 2024 LSWA/DEQ  
23 conference. If you please, Ms. Suzanne.

24 MS. BORDELON:

25 Yeah, hi. Good morning, everyone.

1 I'm Suzanne Bordelon. I'm with LSWA,  
2 and I've given you a copy of the  
3 proposed agenda for the LSWA annual  
4 conference that will be held March the  
5 14th and 15th, in Lafayette. And if you  
6 look at the agenda and look at the  
7 different time slots, we have -- I've  
8 added up hours here on the first day,  
9 added four hours on the second day to  
10 five hours, which is nine hours. But if  
11 you're -- we we're taking into  
12 consideration the exhibitor's  
13 spotlights, which is the breaks, because  
14 we will have some of our exhibitors --  
15 we have -- we're gonna have a designated  
16 area where the attendees can go and  
17 listen to a spotlight by the exhibitors.  
18 So we're try -- we're counting those as,  
19 as hours also. And there's five of  
20 those. So let's see, wait, one, two,  
21 three, four of them. So that's an  
22 additional two hours, so we're looking  
23 at a total of 11 hours. And this --  
24 LSWA is asking this Board to consider  
25 this conference for -- we're asking for

1 10 hours of continuing education for the

2 --

3 MR. DE ABREU:

4 Correct. Mr. Bordelon, and these --  
5 for these exhibitors, there'll be a, a  
6 way to, to confirm that the person  
7 attended this?

8 MS. BORDELON:

9 Just -- well, that, that's gonna be  
10 a whole -- we're gonna have a whole  
11 other way of confirming however, how  
12 attendees are attending the, the  
13 courses.

14 MR. DE ABREU:

15 Okay.

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 So yeah, so we're gonna have a  
18 designated spot for the exhibitor to do  
19 their spotlight and for the attendees to  
20 go, everybody gather in one spot to  
21 listen to it. We have -- I have two  
22 names of the exhibitors right now.  
23 Waypoint Analytical and SGS Engineers  
24 are, are two of the four that have  
25 agreed to do the, the spotlight.



1 MR. DE ABREU:

2 Very good, Ms. Bordelon. I'm  
3 looking forward for the conference --

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Okay. Thank you.

6 MR. DE ABREU:

7 -- for sure. Right here, a motion  
8 to approve the agenda for 2024  
9 conference?

10 MR. WYNN:

11 I make a motion.

12 MR. DE ABREU:

13 A motion by Mr. Wynn, Mr. Wynn. Do  
14 I hear a second?

15 MR. DRISKILL:

16 I'll second.

17 MR. DE ABREU:

18 Seconded by Mr. Driskill. Any  
19 comments? Hearing none, the motion  
20 carries.

21 Next is the consideration of  
22 operator certifications. First item is  
23 the review applications for  
24 certification. Let's go down the list.  
25 First one is Mason Pierron. He, he test

1 for Incinerator Level A. He's applying  
2 for Incinerator Level A license. He's  
3 from American Advanced Technologies, and  
4 he passed the test on October 23, 2023.  
5 Just if you look at his application, it  
6 seems that he has about two hours, which  
7 is -- should not be enough --

8 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

9 Two, two years.

10 MR. DE ABREU:

11 -- for a Level A.

12 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

13 Two years.

14 MR. DE ABREU:

15 Only two years of experience, yes.

16 MR. WYNN:

17 My recommendation would be for a --  
18 I would put forward a motion that I  
19 would give him a B Level certification,  
20 and then if they need a A Level  
21 certification, to have him to reapply,  
22 reapply for a conditional, A Level  
23 conditional.

24 MR. DE ABREU:

25 Thank you. That's when, like he

1           substitutes with someone?

2           MR. WYNN:

3                 Right. Right.

4           MR. DE ABREU:

5                 That's a motion? Motion by Mr.

6           Wynn. Hear a second?

7           MR. COLONA:

8                 Second.

9           MR. DE ABREU:

10                 Seconded by Mr. Colona. Any  
11           comments? So just to recap, we are  
12           giving him a Level B certification, and  
13           he is -- will be able to apply for a  
14           Level A if, conditional if he, he  
15           substitutes someone. Yes, Mr. LeBouef?

16           MR. LEBOUEF:

17                 I can wait on the next one. I don't  
18           want to jump ahead, but on the next one  
19           I think we're gonna run into the same  
20           thing on it.

21           MR. WYNN:

22                 Well, the next one is not even a --

23           MR. LEBOUEF:

24                 Yeah, he --

25           MR. WYNN:

1                   He don't even qualify for it,  
2                   basically.

3                   MR. DE ABREU:

4                   So that's a motion by Mr. LeBoeuf to  
5                   give him a Level B, maybe a Level A?

6                   MR. LEBOUCEF:

7                   Correct.

8                   MR. DE ABREU:

9                   Do I hear a second?

10                  UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

11                  On which one now? Which one are you

12                  --

13                  MR. DE ABREU:

14                  The first one, Mason Pierron.

15                  Nobody second yet.

16                  MR. WYNN:

17                  LeBouef did.

18                  MR. LEBOUCEF:

19                  He made the motion, I seconded.

20                  MR. DE ABREU:

21                  Oh, you second. Seconded by Mr.  
22                  LeBouef. Any comments? Hearing none,  
23                  the motion carries.

24                  MS. ROBINS:

25                  I have a question.

1 MR. DE ABREU:

2 Yes.

3 MS. ROBINS:

4 You approved Level B until he passed  
5 the test?

6 MR. DE ABREU:

7 Until he passed the test.

8 MS. ROBINS:

9 Okay.

10 MR. DE ABREU:

11 We are approving, we are approving

12 --

13 MS. ROBINS:

14 Level B.

15 MR. DE ABREU:

16 -- only the certifications, not  
17 approving --

18 MS. ROBINS:

19 Okay.

20 MR. DE ABREU:

21 -- I mean, the, the, the  
22 applications.

23 MS. ROBINS:

24 Okay.

25 MR. DE ABREU:

1                   Only the applications we are  
2                   approving today. He has -- he still has  
3                   to do a Level B test.

4                   MS. ROBINS:

5                   Test.

6                   MR. DE ABREU:

7                   Second, I have Kane Dardar,  
8                   Incinerator Level A, American Advanced  
9                   Technologies. He passed the test on  
10                  October 23, 2023. I assume it that's  
11                  the Level A testing that he passed?

12                  MS. ROBINS:

13                  Uh-huh (affirmative).

14                  MR. DE ABREU:

15                  And he seems -- he also doesn't have  
16                  enough time.

17                  MR. WYNN:

18                  This person only has five months of  
19                  experience. I -- you know, he's not  
20                  really qualified for an A Level  
21                  certification.

22                  MR. DE ABREU:

23                  Right. So --

24                  MR. WYNN:

25                  Here's another question. If they

1 are needing the operators just to fill  
2 these positions, the A and B Level,  
3 maybe you should reapply for a B Level  
4 certification, conditional.

5 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

6 Conditional B?

7 MR. WYNN:

8 Yeah.

9 MR. DE ABREU:

10 But again, the point I think we have  
11 to deny is --

12 MR. WYNN:

13 At this point, we'll deny this  
14 application.

15 MR. DE ABREU:

16 Okay. So I hear a motion to deny  
17 his application for a Level A  
18 Incinerator.

19 MR. LEBOUF:

20 I will second that motion.

21 MR. DE ABREU:

22 A motion by Mr. Wynn, second by Mr.  
23 LeBouef. Any comments? Hearing none,  
24 the motion carries.

25 Then you have Logan Hoffpauir, C&D

1 Level B, on Chaney Trucking,  
2 Incorporated. He passed the test on  
3 November 17, 2023. Do we have any  
4 comments on the application?

5 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

6 Seven and a half years.

7 MR. DRISKILL:

8 I move we approve.

9 MR. DE ABREU:

10 A motion by Mr. Driskill. Do I hear  
11 a second?

12 MR. WYNN:

13 I'll second.

14 MR. DE ABREU:

15 Seconded by Mr. Wynn. Any comments?  
16 Hearing none, the motion carries. Yes?

17 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

18 Ricardo, before we go to the next  
19 one, let's go back to the first one that  
20 we were giving the B Level certification  
21 on.

22 MR. DE ABREU:

23 Okay.

24 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

25 If he passed the A Level



1 certification, he does not have to pass  
2 a B Level certification?

3 MR. DE ABREU:

4 The test.

5 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

6 The test.

7 MR. DE ABREU:

8 He didn't pass the Level B test. He  
9 needs to take the Level B test.

10 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

11 No, if he's already passed --

12 MR. DE ABREU:

13 Passed the level, even if he passed  
14 the Level A test.

15 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

16 He still has to take the B Level?

17 MR. DE ABREU:

18 He has to take the B Level test.

19 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

20 He does?

21 MR. DE ABREU:

22 Yes, he does.

23 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

24 Why?

25 MR. DE ABREU:

1                   Because he's applying for a Level B  
2                   certification, not the Level A.

3                   UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

4                   But if Level B's on the A?

5                   UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

6                   Yeah.

7                   MR. DE ABREU:

8                   Well --

9                   UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

10                  If he passed the A, then the B is --  
11                  you already --

12                  MR. DE ABREU:

13                  Well, it's a different test. It's a  
14                  different test. And the regulations  
15                  specifically says you have to pass a  
16                  Level B test to apply for a Level B  
17                  certificate. It doesn't say you have to  
18                  have a Level B or a Level A test.

19                  MR. WYNN:

20                  He shouldn't have a problem.

21                  MR. DE ABREU:

22                  I'm not making up. It's in the  
23                  regulations.

24                  UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

25                  And it's quoted like scripture.

1 MR. DRISKILL:

2 Okay.

3 MR. DE ABREU:

4 Okay.

5 MR. DRISKILL:

6 We're all straightened out on that.

7 MR. DE ABREU:

8 Next, Kaleb Benoit, Lanfill Level B,  
9 St. Landry Parish. Passed test on May  
10 17th, 2023.

11 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

12 I don't want to be biased, but I'll  
13 make that motion.

14 MR. DE ABREU:

15 Motion to, to approve the, the  
16 application. Do I hear a second?

17 MR. DRISKILL:

18 I'll second it.

19 MR. DE ABREU:

20 Second by Mr. Driskill. Any  
21 comments?

22 MR. WYNN:

23 Why'd they wait so long?

24 MR. DE ABREU:

25 I'm sorry?

1 MR. WYNN:

2 Why do they take the test in May and  
3 just now sending it in (inaudible).

4 MS. ROBINS:

5 He --

6 MR. LEBOUCEF:

7 Well, when he, when he took the test  
8 in May, he didn't have enough time. He  
9 had a conditional.

10 MR. WYNN:

11 Is that what it was?

12 MS. ROBINS:

13 Yes, he had a conditional.

14 MR. WYNN:

15 He had a conditional?

16 MR. LEBOUCEF:

17 Yes, sir.

18 MR. DE ABREU:

19 Yes, he, he has a conditional and  
20 then he now is applying for regular  
21 certificate. That's correct, Mr.

22 LeBouef?

23 MR. LEBOUCEF:

24 That's correct.

25 MS. ROBINS:

1                   Yes.

2           MR. DE ABREU:

3                   Okay.

4           MR. WYNN:

5                   All right.

6           MR. DE ABREU:

7                   All right. Any other comments?

8                   Hearing none, the motion carries.

9                   Next on the list would be the review  
10                   application for recertification. Let's  
11                   go over the complete recertification  
12                   applications. Let's go one by one on  
13                   this ones.

14                   So we have Michael Weekley, C&D  
15                   Level A, for AMID/Metro Partnership. He  
16                   has 40 hours in, LSWA courses. Next, we  
17                   have Percy Hollins, C&D Level B,  
18                   AMID/Metro Partnership. He also has 40  
19                   hours, LSWA course. Joshua Kritzer is a  
20                   little bit different. He is applying  
21                   for extension on Landfill Level B  
22                   Conditional, for St. Landry Parish. And  
23                   he has ten hours that were taken before  
24                   the -- he proactive took before his  
25                   Level B certification. So he, he is in

1           accordance with also what's required by  
2           the regulations.

3                   So do I hear a motion to approve all  
4           these three applications?

5           MR. DRISKILL:

6                   I'll make a motion.

7           MR. DE ABREU:

8                   A motion by Mr. Driskill. Do I hear  
9           a second?

10          MR. COLONA:

11                   I second.

12          MR. DE ABREU:

13                   Second by Mr. Donovan -- sorry, Mr.  
14          Colona. Any comments? Hearing none,  
15          the motion carries.

16                   Next, we have incomplete to  
17          recertification applications. We have  
18          just one by Brent Broussard. He's  
19          applying Incinerator Level A, from  
20          American Advanced Technologies. And he  
21          has only 20 hours. So unless the board  
22          thinks different, I, I think we should  
23          deny this recertification.

24          MR. WYNN:

25                   I make a motion we deny it.

1 MR. DE ABREU:

2 A motion by Mr. Wynn to deny the,  
3 the application. Do I hear a second?

4 MR. LEBOUF:

5 I'll second it.

6 MR. DE ABREU:

7 Second by Mr. LeBoeuf. Any  
8 comments? Hearing none, the motion  
9 carries.

10 So Ms. Shirley, can you please go  
11 through the list of all the applicants  
12 that we're issuing operator certificates  
13 today?

14 MS. ROBINS:

15 We have Mr. Logan Hoff --

16 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

17 Hoffpauier.

18 MS. ROBINS:

19 Hoff, Hoffpauier.

20 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

21 Hoffpauier.

22 MR. DE ABREU:

23 Hoffpauier.

24 MS. ROBINS:

25 Hoffpauier. Mr. Logan Hoffpauier,

1 Kaleb Benoit, Michael Weekley, Percy

2 Hollins, Joshua --

3 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

4 Kritzer.

5 MS. ROBINS:

6 -- Kritzer.

7 MR. DE ABREU:

8 Do I hear a motion to approve all

9 these applications to receive --

10 MR. LEBOUCEF:

11 I motion.

12 MR. DE ABREU:

13 -- their operator's certificate? A

14 motion by Mr. LeBouef. Do I hear a

15 second?

16 MR. DRISKILL:

17 I second.

18 MR. DE ABREU:

19 Second by Mr. Driskill. Any

20 comments? Hearing none, the motion

21 carries.

22 So let's go now over the committee

23 reports. First, Awards Committee, Mr.

24 LeBouef.

25 MR. LEBOUCEF:



1 I have nothing at this time.

2 MR. DE ABREU:

3 Did we, did we receive any  
4 applications for any of the --

5 MR. WYNN:

6 We've got one coming in, but it's  
7 (inaudible) getting here.

8 MR. DE ABREU:

9 Okay. So we should extend till the  
10 end of the year probably to have a  
11 meeting to approve in January. I appear  
12 -- it can be a virtual meeting in  
13 January.

14 MR. WYNN:

15 Right. Right.

13 I'll have to find me a (inaudible)  
14 test.

16 Okay. Nobody taking testing.

17 MS. ROBINS:

18 No.

19 MR. DE ABREU:

20 So we have one spot now open, vacant  
21 for continuing education. I think  
22 that's your time now, Mr., Mr. Driskill?

3                   I was going to say congratulations.

9 any, any other ones?

10                  UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

11                  If you need a second or third on  
12 that, I'm in.

13                  UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

14                  I second.

15                  MR. DE ABREU:

16                  Do you accept the nomination, Mr.  
17 Driskill?

18                  MR. DRISKILL:

19                  I'll accept it.

20                  MR. DE ABREU:

21                  Okay. Do I hear a motion to approve  
22 his nomination? A motion by Mr.  
23 LeBouef. Do I hear a second?

24                  MR. THOMAS:

25                  Second.

1 MR. DE ABREU:

2 Seconded by Mr. Thomas.

3 UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

4 You're an (inaudible) saying it,  
5 too.

6 MR. DE ABREU:

7 Any comments? Hearing none, the  
8 motion carries. Congratulations, Mr.  
9 Driskill.

10 MR. DRISKILL:

11 Oh, thank you.

12 MR. DE ABREU:

13 Next, Nominating, Donnie Colona. Do  
14 you have anything for us today?

15 MR. COLONA:

16 No.

17 MR. DE ABREU:

18 Okay. Just to remind everyone that

10          trying to contact the president of LMR  
11          -- LMA, and maybe we all have to make an  
12          effort to make this happen, all of us.

13          UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

14                     There might be a way that we can  
15          maybe send a joint email or something,  
16          you know?

17          MR. DE ABREU:

18                     Yes, maybe so. Maybe so. Maybe so.  
19          I'm gonna give him one last try, and  
20          we'll see. All right. We have other,  
21          other business that you guys want to  
22          bring?

23          UNKNOWN SPEAKER:

24                     Nothing.


