20	doesn't look like what I would consider
21	having experience in incinerator or any
22	type of solid waste. He looks like
23	wastewater.
24	MR. HYLTON:
25	I agree.

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1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Well, under Veolia Water from 3/15/11
3	to the present, at the beginning of the
4	shift inspect the incinerator for leaks,
5	hotspots, make sure that all pumps and
6	blowers are functional, check the pilot
7	oil level, make adjustments to the belt
8	presses needed, assist with repairs,
9	record and log all related information.
10	I'm not sure what he had on the
11	original one, but this one he's
12	specifically referring to incinerator.
13	MR. HYLTON:
14	But it's incinerating water?
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	I'm not sure what he's incinerated.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	No, he's incinerating sewer sludge.
19	MR. HYLTON:
20	Yeah, stuff like that. Liquids.
21	MS. TURTLE:
22	He did the incinerator work from '92
23	to 2001.
24	MR. BARBER:
25	Well

2	So, I mean, from this, he's had
3	experience with incinerators, and that was
4	our question before, is that, you know, he
5	had he worked with water and wastewater
6	but it wasn't showing where he had
7	experience with incinerators, but this
8	he's breaking it down, and to me he's
9	showing that he's got incinerator
10	experience.

13	says US Filters?

17	with solid waste?
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	Mr. Chairman, it's kind of confusing,
20	because her position is Assistant Street
21	Supervisor, she says she employs the Level
22	A operator, Cheryl Mclayland. If you look
23	at that
24	MR. CREEL:
25	She supervises a Level A operator.

1	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	And another thing, on type and class
3	facility, someone put type III Transfer,
4	it's a type II A facility. If you look
5	right here at the type of facility. So,
6	there's a lot of inconsistencies, it seems
7	like, with this application.
8	MR. BARBER:
9	And it appears that she had attended
10	two LSWA training in '16, the March and
11	the July, and then LB is that LB OE or
12	DE? that's on page two at the very top.
13	MS. TURTLE:
14	It looks like
15	MR. WILLIAMS:
16	Looks like LBOE.
17	MS. TURTLE:
18	Yeah.
19	MR. BARBER:
20	LBOE. I don't know what that is.
21	That was this year, in March. So, I mean,
22	apparently has attended some training, but
23	then I'm not seeing the experience that
24	satisfies me that she's qualified for this
25	position.

1	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	Suzanne, was there any discussion
3	with her about her experience or nothing
4	about conditional or anything.
5	MS. BORDELON:
6	No. No. The only thing I know about
7	her is she's come to every she's come
8	to the last several classes, and thought
9	she was registered to take the test and we
10	had never received an application for
11	until now.
12	MR. BARBER:
13	So, did she test today?

9	Yes. It will be Jeddie Bankston,
10	Keith Daigle, and Charles Mancuso.
11	MS. BORDELON:
12	No, Kenneth Newman.
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	Kenneth Newman.
15	MR. BARBER:
16	And I can I okay.
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	Go ahead, Mr. Barber.
19	MR. BARBER:
20	Thank you, sir.
21	I have a serious problem with this,
22	and I think everybody sitting at this
23	table knows how I feel. We represent the
24	Board the DEQ, which represents all of
25	the residents and citizens of this state,

and I just don't feel comfortable putting any facility, even if it is a simple C & D facility into the hands of people that have no clue about what they are doing. And these three people -- this guy Daigle apparently is buying this facility or in the process of purchasing it, and he wants us to come in and ask us a Board to sign off on him and two of his employees that he's bringing from another business -- now they probably have all been in dirt work business, but I've been to some of these facilities that had unqualified people. And I just don't feel comfortable as a Board member representing the people of this state to say let's put this facility in this guy's hands without having someone that has the experience to assist them until they get their experience. I have no problem with them getting their experience, but I don't want it to be at the expense of the environment or our residents.

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And I guess I could continue and also say that they apparently thought they

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1	could slip by with asking for a
2	conditional replacing one guy with three
3	people, because they put the same guy's
4	name on all three applications.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Yeah, now
7	MR. BARBER:
8	And one can replace one, but
9	MS. TURTLE:
10	Do you have the applications?
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	Ms. Bordelon had
13	MR. BARBER:
14	Huh?
15	MS. TURTLE:
16	Do you have the applications?
17	MR. BARBER:
18	Uh-huh (yes).
19	MS. TURTLE:
20	Oh, I didn't.
21	MR. BARBER:
22	It's Bankston, Daigle, and Newman.
23	MR. WILLIAMS:
24	Newman.
25	MS. TURTLE:

1	Oh, I don't think I got them.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	You should have got those in e-mail.
4	MS. TURTLE:
5	Oh, okay.
6	MR. HYLTON:
7	Does anybody on site have a current
8	certification of any kind?
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	Yeah, Mr. Abshire does.
11	MR. LAGRANGE:
12	He has a Level A?
13	MS. BORDELON:
14	Uh-huh (yes).
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	He's the one that's retiring. Okay.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	He is being replaced, so.
19	MS. BORDELON:
20	He is being replaced.
21	MR. LAGRANGE:
22	And there is an application for a
23	Level A to replace him
24	MS. BORDELON:
25	Correct.

1	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	for a conditional?
3	Let's take that one up first.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	Okay. I have a question about this,
6	too. And, Mia, you may be able to help us
7	on this. On this purchase of this
8	company, is it a different company that's
9	purchasing it? In other words, is the
10	ownership going to change the corporate
11	ownership going to change?
12	MS. BORDELON:
13	I think so.
14	MR. LAGRANGE:
15	What does the cover letter say?
16	MR. HYLTON:
17	It says purchasing. You purchase
18	something, it changes ownership.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Well, it's a little confusing,
21	because they talking about 108 Disposal,
22	LLC, and then David A. Abshire, LLC - 108
23	Disposal.
24	MS. TOWNSEL:
25	It looks as though they're taking

1	over the entire facility. It may not
2	necessary it looks like a clean
3	ownership change, that's what it looks
4	like. Now, I don't work in the section
5	where we receive the information
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	Right.
8	MS. TOWNSEL:
9	that's in the Public Participation
10	Group, so they would receive a certain
11	form that would say whether it's ownership
12	change, name change, things like that, but
13	based on this it looks like it is strictly
14	an ownership change.

17	When this happens, on the permit side of
18	the issue do they have to show that they
19	have certified operators?

BONVILLAIN: 14 Because under the regulation --15 MR. HYLTON: 16 Are they applying for a permit under 17 their name or are they just assuming the 18 old permit? 19 MS. 16	Mr. Daigle indicated to me that as
17	soon as they received the he received
18	the conditional, that Mr. Abshire could
19	leave.
20	MS. TOWNSEL:
21	They have an August 1st date on here,
22	right?
23	MR. BARBER:
24	Right.
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

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1	Mr. Lagrange?
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	Mr. Chairman, looking at the
4	Secretary of State's website, shows that
5	108 Disposal, LLC, was registered with the
6	Secretary of State on June 15th of this
7	year.
8	MR. CREEL:
9	That's correct.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Who does it show as officers?
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	It shows as the members of the LLC
14	as: Adam Daigle, manager; Keith Daigle,
15	member; and James Daigle, member.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	Okay.
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	And what I would in line with what
20	Ms. Mia was saying, I think that David
21	Abshire, LLC, was the company that owned
22	the facility and they're selling it to
23	108. It's the same facility, but they're
24	selling it to 108 Disposal, LLC.
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

1	Yeah, but they're selling it to a	
2	different corporation. See, we had	
3	with Gordon's Landfill, Gordon sold out,	
4	but those people bought the stock of	
5	Gordon's Landfill. It wasn't a separate	
6	company. This is a separate company	
7	that's buying it.	
8	MR. HYLTON:	
9	What happens to the permit if it's i	n
10	one company's name and someone else buys	
11	it, whose name is the permit in?	
12	MS. TURTLE:	
13	The legal entity's name.	
14	MS. TOWNSEL:	
15	Yeah, it's going to go into their	
16	name, the 108 Disposal.	
17	MR. HYLTON:	
18	So, anybody can just go buy a	
19	landfill and obtain a permit?	
20	MS. TOWNSEL:	
21	You would have to do a lot more.	
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:	
23	There's a process to go through. Bu	it
24	I'm wondering if they get that process	
25	that quick.	

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1 MS. TOWNSEL: 2 It takes months, ordinarily. It 3 takes months. 4 MR. BONVILLAIN: 5 See, and they were just incorporated 6 June 15th, he said, so they --7 MS. BORDELON: I think they're wanting to have their 8 9 operators in line, because if you read the 10 last paragraph it says, following the 11 issuance of the operator certification 12 then 108 Disposal will begin the facility 13 ownership changes. 14 MS. HENRY: 15 So, they can't change over until a 16 certified -- a conditional is granted. We 17 can't grant one because they're doing a 18 one for one, right. 19 MR. BONVILLAIN: 20 Right. 21 MR. WILLIAMS: 22 Yeah. 23 MS. HENRY: 24 So, the other two would have to wait? 25 Is that what you're saying?

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1	MR. BARBER:
2	And I'll just go ahead and tell y'all
3	before somebody makes a motion, I cannot
4	vote for a man to get a conditional Level
5	A and be in charge with zero experience.
6	I can't do it. I'm not going to do
7	it.
8	MS. BORDELON:
9	It's in the regulations.
10	MR. LAGRANGE:
11	Well, I think Mr. Daigle has
12	construction experience, and there's solid
13	waste experience, as you said, but he does
14	have construction experience.
15	MR. BARBER:
16	I agree.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	And you for and he would our
19	consideration would be is the
20	application one of the applications for
21	the Level A is to replace a Level A at
22	that facility. Notwithstanding who owns
23	what, but he's replacing that
24	MR. BARBER:
25	But he's going to be the guy in
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1	charge, though.
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	So, I would think I know, but I
4	think we would in according with the
5	regs, we, in our it's within our
6	purview to grant that conditional.
7	MR. BONVILLAIN:
8	That's correct.
9	MR. LAGRANGE:
10	Number one. The second part, on the
11	two Level B applications, again, the regs
12	allow us to grant conditionals if we feel
13	that they I forget exactly how it
14	reads, but if we feel that those
15	applicants have enough qualifications to
16	warrant getting a conditional at that
17	level at that specific facility.
18	So, that's in the regs, regardless
19	I know how you personally feel, and all,
20	but I just want to make it clear that it
21	is within the regs, whether it's a right
22	or a wrong for the State of Louisiana or
23	the people of Louisiana, evidently the
24	folks at DEQ and the folks in the
25	legislature and the administration of the

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1	state who promulgated those rules and regs
2	thought this was something that needed to
3	be available to the public for these types
4	of facilities.
5	So, having said that, Mr. Chairman,
6	I'd like to move on the conditional Level
7	A applicant. I'm not sure which one that
8	is. Is that
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	That's Daigle.
11	MR. WILLIAMS:
12	Keith Daigle.
13	MR. LAGRANGE:
14	Keith Daigle.
15	MR. WILLIAMS:
16	Yeah.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	Keith Daigle, to grant him a
19	conditional Level A, replacing
20	Mr. Abshire
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	Okay.
23	MR. LAGRANGE:
24	at that facility.
25	MR. BARBER:
5 13	

1	Well
2	MR. HYLTON:
3	I have a question, then.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	Yes.
6	MR. HYLTON:
7	Definition of conditional says it's
8	only good for six months.
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Correct.
11	MR. HYLTON:
12	What happens to this guy in six
13	months?
14	MR. LAGRANGE:
15	He has to reapply.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	We extend the conditional. We can
18	extend the that's what just did
19	earlier
20	MR. HYLTON:
21	Okay.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	for Gordon's Landfill people.
24	MR. HYLTON:
25	Okay. But how long can you extend

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1	it? When
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Basically what happens is, we extend
4	it until they have the necessary
5	experience to get the regular certificate.
6	MR. LAGRANGE:
7	But there are some stipulations. In
8	order to get an extension, they have to
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Right. Right. They have to attend
11	class, they have to pass the exam.
12	MR. HYLTON:
13	Okay.
14	MR. BARBER:
15	Well, again, I don't have to tell you
16	I'm opposed
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	Mr. Chairman, I've got a motion on
19	the table.
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	Yeah, is there a second to the
22	motion?
23	MR. BARBER:
24	Well, I think it's
25	MR. WILLIAMS:

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1	Second.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Okay.
4	Wait. Wait. Wait.
5	Okay. We have a motion on the floor
6	by Mr. Lagrange to grant the conditional
7	Level A to Keith Daigle, seconded by
8	Mr. Williams.
9	Is there any discussion?
10	MR. BARBER:
11	Yes, there is.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Mr. Barber.
14	MR. BARBER:
15	And I don't know how I can stress
16	this enough. This is no different than
17	what we done with Stericycle the last
18	couple of years. You're putting a
19	facility in the hands of people that have
20	zero experience. And I am opposed to it.
21	I am highly opposed to it. And I can't
22	believe that anybody sitting at this table
23	is for it. It disappoints me in everybody
24	that is for it.
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.	There	is	
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MR. BARBER:

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Because I have been to some of these facilities, and I can take y'all if y'all take time to get in your vehicle and go with me, I can show you some of these facilities that have been in the hands of people that don't know what they're doing. MS. HENRY: Then that would be up to the regulators to come down on --MR. BARBER: No, that's up to this Board when it comes to --MR. BONVILLAIN: Okay. Now wait a minute, wait a minute. MR. BARBER: -- certifying the operators. MR. BONVILLAIN: Wait a minute. There's a difference between this instance here and Stericycle. Stericycle was starting a new facility with no

operators. This is an existing facility

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1	and under the current regulations, a
2	any individual can come in and get a
3	conditional to replace a regularly
4	certified operator, and that's
5	Mr. Lagrange's motion.
6	Okay.
7	MR. BARBER:
8	But there's nobody there
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Now, the other two the other two,
11	that's a different discussion. Okay.
12	Right now we're just talking about
13	Mr. Daigle.
14	MR. BARBER:
15	There's nobody there this Abshire
16	guy's going to be gone, because he's the
17	one that's being replaced. There's nobody
18	here with the experience
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	I understand
21	MR. BARBER:
22	to guide this facility.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	I understand exactly what you're
25	saying, but I'm telling you what the

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1 regulations say. 2 MR. BARBER: 3 I understand what the regulations 4 say. 5 MR. BONVILLAIN: 6 Okay. The regulations require no 7 experience to get a conditional to replace 8 a regularly certified operator. 9 MR. BARBER: 10 But I think back to what Bo was 11 saying with the legislatures and the 12 people that made these laws. I think 13 that's why we have -- they had a Board 14 sitting here with people that are 15 qualified and knowledgeable that 16 understands this stuff, because these 17 people making these laws don't understand, and they depend on us. 18 19 MR. BONVILLAIN: 20 All right. But, again, the 21 discretionary part of this comes in the next two that want a Level B. They're not 22 23 replacing anybody that's regularly certified. But the regulation 24 25 specifically says if he is replacing a

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regularly certified operator, there is no 1 2 experience requirement. All he has to do 3 is be replacing him. Whether we like it 4 or don't like it, that's the way the 5 regulation is right now. 6 MR. HYLTON: 7 Do you even have grounds to not grant 8 it under those guidelines? 9 MR. BONVILLAIN: 10 No. Okay. 11 Any further discussion? 12 Okay. I'll take a roll call vote. I 13 know I'm going to get some objections. 14 MR. WILLIAMS: 15 I was going to request it. 16 MS. BORDELON: Hold on, let me write the names down. 17 18 MR. CREEL: 19 I don't agree with it either, but based on the rules, there's nothing you 20 21 can do about it. 22 MR. WILLIAMS: 23 Mr. Chairman, why don't you clarify 24 what the vote is? 25 MR. BARBER:

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1	I can vote against it.

3	Right.
4	MR. LAGRANGE:
5	The motion.
6	MR. WILLIAMS:

9	The motion on the floor is to approve

13	MS. BORDELON:
14	Okay. Say yay or nay?
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	Yes.
17	MS. BORDELON:
18	Jason Creel?
19	MR. CREEL:
20	Yay.
21	MS. BORDELON:
22	Troy Barber?
23	MR. BARBER:
24	Nay.
25	MS. BORDELON:

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1	Danny Hylton?
2	MR. HYLTON:
3	Do you allow abstentions?
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	You can abstain if you wish.
6	MR. LAGRANGE:
7	Yes.
8	MR. HYLTON:
9	I abstain.
10	MS. BORDELON:
11	Bo Lagrange?
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	Yay.
14	MS. BORDELON:
15	Fred Williams?
16	MR. WILLIAMS:
17	Yay.
18	MS. BORDELON:
19	Connie Henry?
20	MS. HENRY:
21	Yay.
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	Lindsey Turtle?
24	MS. TURTLE:
25	Yay.

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MS. BORDELON:

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We have five yays and one nay and one abstention.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Five yays, one nay, and one abstention, the motion passes.

Okay. Now, moving on to Mr. Jeddie Bankston and Kenneth Newman requesting Level Bs for the same facility, not replacing a regularly certified operator. MR. LAGRANGE:

12All right. Mr. Chairman, just,13again, going back to the regs, and this14one says, or in part of the regs say, the15Board must determine that the applicant is16qualified to perform duties at a17particular facility for the conditional.18MR. BONVILLAIN:

Correct.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, that's where it comes to this Board to review these applications and make that determination.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right. It's in the Board's

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discretion. 1 2 MR. LAGRANGE: That's correct. 3 MR. BONVILLAIN: 4 5 Does anybody have any comments on the experience of either of these two 6 7 individuals that they'd like to bring forth? 8 9 MR. BARBER: 10 Y'all know what I think. 11 MR. LAGRANGE: 12 Well, the experience -- and they 13 don't elaborate other than to say they're 14 equipment operators, operate excavators, 15 bulldozers and compactors, it says, for 16 construction companies it looks like, and 17 they pretty much put the same thing for 18 both applicants from an experience 19 standpoint. So, you know, the question for the Board is, is that enough 20 information for us to make that 21 22 determination on their qualifications. 23 MR. CREEL: 24 But they can't get a conditional 25 under the other conditional, can they?

3		MR. WILLIAMS:
4	P. M. March	No.
5		MR. CREEL:
6		So, it doesn't matter.
7		MR. BONVILLAIN:
8		Wait, wait. What do you mean, a
9		conditional under the other conditional?
10		MR. CREEL:
11	the states	They're applying for a conditional
12	1	license under the conditional license that
13	1.2017	we just voted on for Mr. Daigle.
14		MR. BONVILLAIN:
15		No, they can.
16		MR. CREEL:
17		So, three applicants can apply for
18		one
19		MR. LAGRANGE:
20		No, they cannot.
21		MS. BORDELON:
22		No, they can't.
23		MR. BONVILLAIN:
24		Not under the same provision.
25	P. 19. 1.	MR. CREEL:

1	Well, that's what they're doing.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	No well, initially, yes.
4	MS. BORDELON:
5	Well, that's what they requested. I
6	informed them that they could that
7	could not happen. It could only be one
8	them.
9	MR. CREEL:
10	Okay. So, what do they
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	See, only one can get the condition
13	to be replacing the other one.
14	MR. CREEL:
15	All right.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	The other two would be completely at
18	the discretion of the Board as to whether
19	you think they deserve to get a
20	conditional certificate.
21	MR. CREEL:
22	All right.
23	MR. BARBER:
24	Well, Title 46 clearly defines what
25	kind of experience they should have, and

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1	they don't meet it.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Okay. I'm open for a motion in
4	either direction.
5	MS. TURTLE:
6	Do they have two years of
7	construction? I don't have the
8	applications.
9	MR. BARBER:
10	One year of solid waste and one of
11	construction as a supervisor.
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	That's what the requirements are.
14	And currently their experience is just
15	working for construction companies.
16	MS. TURTLE:
17	For how many years.
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	You have one year from 2009.
20	MS. BORDELON:
21	Fifteen years.
22	MR. LAGRANGE:
23	And then 2017.
24	MS. BORDELON:
25	Eighteen years.

1	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	Yeah. The other guy is
3	MR. HYLTON:
4	It teaches you nothing about
5	recognizing hazardous waste and all of
6	this kind of stuff.
7	MS. TURTLE:
8	But under the requirements, I mean, a
9	year in construction.
10	MS. BORDELON:
11	They still need one year of solid
12	waste.
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	For a regular certificate.
15	MS. TURTLE:
16	And oh, one year and two years.
17	Okay.
18	MR. WILLIAMS:
19	Those requirements are for a regular
20	certificate, right?
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	Correct.
23	MS. BORDELON:
24	Right.
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Correct.

MR. WILLIAMS:

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Not a conditional.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And as I said, on a conditional, you know, the experience they put under construction, I mean, the experience, it shows construction experience, and they really don't elaborate other than they were equipment operators that operate excavators, bulldozers and compactors. So, the determination, you know, is that enough information for us to make a determination of their qualifications for a conditional, and if it is enough information, is it enough to grant one or not grant one?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

And here's something else you may consider, too, when we grant conditional certificates, we can put conditions on that conditional.

MR. HYLTON:

Such as?

25 MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Such as taking classes in monitoring incoming waste. I mean, the equipment part of it, they obviously know how to operate the equipment.

MR. HYLTON:

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Sure.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

You know, that, I don't think, is the issue. You know, what do they know about actually receiving income waste, what's acceptable, what's not acceptable, you know, how do you have to maintain your interim cover, all of that stuff.

MR. BARBER:

Ms. Bordelon, did these three people test today?

MS. BORDELON:

Yes, they did. They all passed. And they're all attending the workshop as well.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

And the test is based on the regulations. Strictly on the regulations. <u>MR. BARBER:</u>

Yeah, but, you know, we have seen

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1	some of those girls walk in here that
2	worked in the office that knew nothing
3	about solid waste, but studied the regs
4	for three or four days and passed the
5	test. You know, that don't signify
6	knowing how to run a facility.
7	MR. HYLTON:
8	But it meets the regs if you pass the
9	test.
10	MR. BARBER:
11	It meets the regs. That still don't
12	make me feel better about it.
13	MR. LAGRANGE:
14	Well, these gentlemen aren't people
15	who worked in the office, though.
16	Obviously, they work in construction.
17	They didn't work in the office.
18	MR. WILLIAMS:
19	Are they girls?
20	MR. LAGRANGE:
21	I wasn't going gender I was
22	talking about gender. I was just talking
23	about where they worked, Fred.
24	MR. WILLIAMS:
25	I know.

MR. BARBER:

I understand that.

MS. TOWNSEL:

Gary, if we put conditions on the conditionals, like you said, as far as taking certain classes, do we specify when and where they take the class and do we have them to send a certification after they take? How do we --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Anyway you want to set it up.

MS. TOWNSEL:

Okay.

MR. HYLTON:

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But where do you get a class that teaches you specific things other than -and, you know, the conferences don't always cover everything you need to know. <u>MR. LAGRANGE:</u>

I say they go spend a day with Rhondain Lafayette.

MS. HENRY:

Oh, Lord.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I tell you what, I mean, they got a

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1	good lesson this morning.
2	MS. HENRY:
3	Yes, they did.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	We had one of the DEQ regional
6	managers give a talk this morning. She
7	went a little over an hour. Top to
8	bottom. As an operator, what you've got
9	to do, what you've got to look for.
10	MR. LAGRANGE:
11	And what she's looking for when they
12	come, and what they expect of a facility.
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	Yeah. You know, from that particular
15	perspective, just sitting in on that
16	lesson this morning, I'd feel a lot I
17	feel a lot more comfortable that they know
18	a little bit about what they can do and
19	what they can't do. Okay. That's my
20	personal opinion.
21	But we need to take some kind of
22	action, so what's the pleasure of the
23	Board? I can't make a motion.
24	MR. LAGRANGE:
25	Mr. Chairman, I'm going to take a

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1	crack at it. I'm going to make a motion
2	to issue a conditional certification with
3	conditions that they attend each attend
4	a minimum of four hour class, course,
5	instruction, from a qualified source
6	relative to waste handling, waste
7	identification, waste acceptance for a C &
8	D type III C & D landfill. Within
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Waste handling, waste acceptance, and
11	what?
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	Waste identification.
14	Within 90 days.
15	MS. BORDELON:
16	But is that type is that
17	available?
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	Approved by I mean, it can be
20	instruction by someone at DEQ, you know.
21	MR. WILLIAMS:
22	Or it could be attending a workshop
23	out-of-state.
24	MR. LAGRANGE:
25	By instruction
100 200 100	

1	MR. WILLIAMS:
2	If we do reciprocity.
3	MR. LAGRANGE:
4	By instruction from a qualified
5	source through DEQ or by attending a
6	any other workshops that meet those
7	qualifications.
8	MS. TURTLE:
9	Does that training need to be
10	preapproved by the Board or?
11	MR. LAGRANGE:
12	Yeah, preapproved by the Chairman of
13	our Board.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Thank you, Bo.
16	MR. WILLIAMS:
17	Is that your motion?
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	That's my motion.
20	MR. WILLIAMS:
21	I second.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Okay. Have a motion by Mr. Lagrange
24	that we approve conditional applications
25	for Kenneth Newman and

1	MS. TURTLE:
2	Jeddie Bankston.
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Jeddie Bankston.
5	Kenneth Newman and Jeddie Bankston
6	with the following stipulations: That
7	within 90 days they must attend a minimum
8	of four hours of instructions pertaining
9	to waste handling, waste acceptance, and
10	waste identification for C & D type
11	facilities with such training to be
12	preapproved by the Chairman of the Board.
13	Any further discussion?
14	MR. BARBER:
15	I've got a question.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	Yes, Mr. Barber?
18	MR. BARBER:
19	If they haven't done that in 90 days,
20	what happens?
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	The conditional is no longer valid.
23	MR. WILLIAMS:
24	It's rescinded.
25	MR. BARBER:

1	But it's valid from now until then.

3	It will be valid from now until then.
4	And, as a matter of fact, if you want to
5	change your motion a little bit, issue it

18	be willing to as the Chairman I
19	would be willing to give them an hour
20	credit for that session this morning. And
21	there may be sessions tomorrow, I don't
22	remember what's on the agenda for
23	tomorrow, but we'll take a look at that to
24	see if there's anything there can be
25	applied. Okay.
