We're going to go right into our 18 first agenda item, the update on the LA1 19 2.0 project. Joe Donahue? MR. DONAHUE: 21 Good evening, Board members. Joe Donahue 22 23 with DOTD. You may recall that in March of our last quarterly meeting, we had a rather 2.4 detailed update regarding the status of LA1. 25

I'm happy to report to you that not much has changed since then, so this update will be very brief.

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Primarily, the biggest occurrence was -you may recall also that it was discussed, there was a pending option for the contractor in the Belle Chasse P3 Project to take over the operations of LA1. And the Department was in negotiations with that developer. negotiations have concluded successfully, and we have reached an agreement with them. The takeover by Plenary Infrastructure Belle Chasse will take about two years to perform the work. It will require some slight modifications to the infrastructure, the toll pay entry, and the replacement of the existing technology.

So that will, as I said, I believe the estimated contract time is actually 720 days, so 10 days short of two years. And that is currently the status. The technology partner for the developer has begun working on the software, and so things are moving along.

CHAIRMAN WARD:

Secretary Wilson for a question.

SECRETARY WILSON:

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No question but just wanted to comment that much of the recapitalization of the equipment needed to be done anyway. And the fact that we are moving forward with the remaining segment for construction, it had to be built in a way that accommodates that growth. So it really is good timing in terms of what we're doing because it has to get done and we're going to do it based on what the final buildout will be for the new entrance to LA1.

And then the other piece that's worth mentioning, we are going to begin a process of trying to restructure the toll configuration. Right now, the system we have is based on axles. It's very complicated. That speaks to some of the challenges over the next two years to redo that system to comply with what we But we've done the research and want to be. are able to begin a public conversation on narrowing and refining those tolls that will be revenue-neutral essentially. We can't make that exact promise because it's going to be consolidating, I think, 13 different

configurations down to three basic 1 configurations, which is much cheaper to build 2 and maintain in terms of its system. 3 So that's a public conversation that 4 we're going to start with the community that 5 could readjust -- if you remember, the tolls 6 adjust upward every five years to account for 7 inflation, so it could also be more modest 8 adjustments as opposed to significant 9 adjustments every five years. All of that can 1.0 be factored into what we're doing and use more 11 current numbers in terms of those who are 12 13 using the bridge. 14 CHATRMAN WARD: Sounds good. Any other information or 15 update? 16 17 MR. DONAHUE: Not regarding LA1. 1.8 CHAIRMAN WARD: 19 All right. Do we need to take action on 20 that or just an update? 21 MR. DONAHUE: 22 23 Just an update. 24 CHAIRMAN WARD: All right. Any new business to be 25

1 | discussed? It looks like we're good there.

Old business? Jimmie Davis Bridge update as

3 | well.

MR. DONAHUE:

Yes. So you also may recall that last year in the June meeting of LTA, we had -DOTD had presented an unsolicited proposal from United Bridge Partners regarding the Jimmie Davis Bridge in Bossier Parish offering to replace it and toll it in a P3 project. At the June meeting, that request was tabled. The request was for the authority to give DOTD the go-ahead to vet that proposal and evaluate it. And the proposer actually was given additional time to go out and do some community outreach regarding the tolling.

As of this morning, the Jimmie Davis
Bridge Project was approved by the Joint
Transportation Committee to go forward as a
design build project. So the funding has been
identified for that project and is no longer
eligible for a P3. So under the LTA statutes
and the bylaws, one of the things that the
proposer had to submit when they provided
their proposal was a \$50,000 fee, basically,

to defray the costs of review of the proposal 1 2 by DOTD. And the bylaws do authorize refunding that fee in the event that the 3 project is unable to go forward for legal 4 reasons which, here, would be the fact that 5 DOTD has not approved it to go forward as a 6 7 P3, and that qualifies in order to be able to 8 refund that fee. So it would be DOTD's recommendation that 9 10 the \$50,000 fee provided by UBP in connection with their unsolicited proposal be refunded to 11 12 them. 13 CHAIRMAN WARD: Secretary Wilson? 14 Okay. SECRETARY WILSON: 15 Three seventy-five-- no, that's an 16 incentive to Senator Peacock. No, thank you. 17 Thank you, Joe. The one thing I wanted to do 1.8 because we oftentimes, as we evolved and 19 looked at all of these other developing P3s, 20 we still have current and active P3 21 22 procurements underway or at least one procurement underway for one of the five 23 projects, which is the Calcasieu Project that 24 25 is moving forward.

I do want to, you know, while no one expected \$100 million to fall from the sky or be a part of the package, we are appreciative, and we've always maintained, Mr. President would remember, when we passed Legislation, we always said, if we had cash to do it, we would take that option. We don't always have cash I think it's important for this to do it. Body to recognize the P3 Community for stepping up, particularly, United Bridge Partners, because this is only the second unsolicited partner, a proposal that we've received, and not to be discouraged when these projects here and across the country come up because it's a very boutique industry. doesn't happen very often that you find 100 percent of the funding to move projects along.

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And so we are very appreciative for the Administration in Washington for giving us those dollars that made it possible; because we've always said, if we get money, we'll build it that way. And I just want to thank United Bridge Partners for having confidence in Louisiana and seeing the interest in our projects and would encourage them, in that

space, to continue looking for those options. 1. 2 And while we haven't really begun the procurement process, other than being 3 authorized to use design build, it does not 4 5 exclude them from being considered as a design б builder in the traditional sense for that 7 project. And so I just wanted to go on the record 8 to do that to know that we didn't enter into 9 10 this process expecting it to happen that way, but it's just one of the challenges. And it's 11 12 a good challenge in the situation since we can provide this full funding for this project. 13 So I just wanted to make that comment on the 14 15 record. 16 CHAIRMAN WARD: 17 We're thankful to have some dollars to be able to do --18 19 SECRETARY WILSON: 20 Absolutely. 21 CHAIRMAN WARD: 22 -- things right now. Hopefully, we can continue that going forward. 23 Senator Peacock, were you wanting to say 24 anything about the project? 25
