        the bank account at the end of November was
22
        $1,746,147, which is up about $138,000 from
23
        last month due to our renewal season.
24
        accounts receivable hearings and fines
25
        remain the same at $498,078. Fines are down
```

- 1 slightly due to the net effect of the Lauco
- 2 -- the audit. We wrote off the Lauco
- 3 account and we also approved the assessments
- 4 from last month. The -- right underneath
- 5 that, the uncollectible accounts is an
- 6 estimate. We added to that at the time of
- audit \$72,000, but, of course, if any of
- 8 those accounts are collected, we can amend
- 9 the statement to show -- reflect that. The
- 10 current liabilities at the bottom of the
- 11 page were \$48,844.
- Page 2, the 2016 deferred inflows
- were \$309,515. Those will move to revenue
- in January. The 2017 deferred inflows were
- 15 \$97,800. In addition on this page, you will
- note there's some new items. At the bottom
- of long-term liabilities, you have the net
- 18 pension liability. That's a reflection of
- the new GASB 68 changes and the deferred
- inflows related to pensions. And the change
- in our net position from the audit was a
- negative \$236,000. So that made our total
- net position negative \$69,282.
- On Page 3 is the statement of
- 25 revenues, expenses, and changes in net

- 1 position. Your page at the bottom, the
- year-to-date revenues were \$454,480 compared
- 3 to \$636,000 last year at this time. It's
- 4 primarily due to the difference in the line
- of -- hearing costs and fines were not as
- 6 high this year as last year. The regular
- 7 license fees were approximately \$22,000 less
- 8 than the same time last year.
- 9 On the following page, the
- 10 expenses, salaries, and related benefits
- 11 year to date decreased slightly. The
- 12 remainder of the expenses increased about
- 13 \$14,000 year to date.
- And on Page 5, the change in net
- position was a positive change of \$9,388,
- 16 which is down from last year, again
- 17 primarily due to those hearing fines that we
- had at the end of last year.
- On Page 6 is the revised
- 20 month-to-month figures. As you can see in
- 21 the left-hand set of columns, the changes at
- 22 audit drastically changed our net position
- to a negative \$236,000 and that's due to
- 24 that pension liability accrual that we had
- 25 to do for GASB 68. And the -- on the

Page 9

- following page, the chart of the revenues,
- 2 expenses, and net position, you can see how
- 3 GASB 68 affected that. It looks kind of
- 4 crazy. The -- November 2014, there was end
- of year change in the net position prior
- 6 period adjustment done on the audit, which
- 7 brought the fund balance down. And then we
- 8 had that large write off of the \$292,000 in
- 9 June of 2015. So that's why you see those
- 10 negative figures there.
- Okay. And on Page 8 is the fee
- revenue, which is mostly our renewals, UD
- 13 licenses, SM licenses.
- And then on Page 9 is our
- 15 certificate of deposit report. There was a
- 16 slight change in that first Landmark CD.
- 17 The bank rolled our interest into the CD in
- lieu of sending us a check, but they've
- 19 corrected that. They're going to begin
- 20 mailing the checks from here on out, but no
- changes on that to date. We'll have some
- 22 CDs that will come up for renewal in
- 23 January.
- And on the final page, the
- accounts receivable hearings and fines, Page
