21 MR. WATTS:  
22 Thank you. All right. Anybody for  
23 public comments?  
24 MS. BARON:  
25 No, sir.

1 MR. WATTS:

2 All right. I need adoption and  
3 approval for the minutes for the May meeting,  
4 please.

5 MR. DONNELL:

6 So moved.

7 MR. POTEET:

8 Second.

9 MR. WATTS:

10 Items for discussion and action.  
11 Ratification of imposed penalties.

12 MR. PARNELL:

13 Commissioners, I will ask that we  
14 move to amend the agenda because of hearing  
15 items. The documents that is in the hearing  
16 items Damien M. Bolden, Jr. and Sr., they were  
17 scheduled to come in today for a -- I denied  
18 their salesperson license and they just wanted  
19 to go before you-all and see if they can get  
20 that turned over. They are not present. They  
21 won't be present until next month. So we need  
22 to amend the agenda to reflect that they won't  
23 be here.

24 MR. DONNELL:

25 Mr. Chairman, I don't see any place

1           for financials.

2           MR. WATTS:

3                   We had no financials today.

4           MR. PARNELL:

5                   We don't have financials today. So  
6 we will have two sets for next month.

7           MR. WATTS:

8                   Do I have a motion for change of the  
9 agenda like that? Does anybody make a motion  
10 or a second?

11          MR. FLOYD:

12                   I make a motion.

13          MR. DONNELL:

14                   Second.

15          MR. WATTS:

16                   Do we have any objections?

17                   (No response.)

18                   Motion passes.

19                   Ratifications of imposed penalties.

20          MR. PARNELL:

21                   Commissioners, you will find in your  
22 packet a chart that illustrates the licensees  
23 that were in violation of state law. These  
24 cases have been investigated and I have  
25 determined that the public interest can be

1 served without further administrative  
2 proceeding; thus, civil penalties were imposed.  
3 We do not have anyone present from this list  
4 and I will announce the names of the dealers  
5 that have been imposed civil penalties for the  
6 record.

7 First on the list is Alvin Merrell  
8 doing business as Al's Capital Auto Sales from  
9 Marksville, Louisiana, fine amount is \$1,000.  
10 This dealer contacted compliance investigator  
11 Ronnie Wisenor and informed him that he was out  
12 of trust with his floor planner dealer. He  
13 sold 11 vehicles but did not pay the floor  
14 planner. The investigator contacted Kim Baron  
15 at the office. She obtained 10 titles from the  
16 floor planner. And the investigator contacted  
17 the consumers. We did not obtain one of the  
18 titles as of yet, but all other titles had been  
19 registered and dealers have paid taxes, titles,  
20 and license fees, and late penalties and  
21 interest has been paid.

22 The next on the list is HD Pay Here  
23 Auto Sales, LLC, from Denham Springs,  
24 Louisiana, fine amount is \$200. Vehicle was  
25 purchased while at the lot on Plank Road. When

1 the compliance investigator questioned the  
2 dealer, he stated that he had already spoken to  
3 complainant. She agreed to give him an  
4 additional week to obtain the title. Confirmed  
5 this with the complainant. And the title has  
6 been delivered.

7 T&C Mixed Auto Sales, LLC, from Baton  
8 Rouge, Louisiana, fine amount is \$300.

9 Complainant stated that he had not received a  
10 title. Compliance investigator proceeded to  
11 dealership and asked to look at the  
12 complainant's transactions file. The documents  
13 in the file were a copy of the buyer's guide,  
14 60-day temp tag. He contacted his notary. The  
15 dealer visited -- he ascertained that he had no  
16 monthly sales report filed. So his fine amount  
17 was \$300.

18 The total fine amount for -- is  
19 \$1,500. Commissioners, I ask that you ratify  
20 the imposed civil penalties assessed.

21 MR. WATTS:

22 I need a motion.

23 MR. DONNELL:

24 So moved.

25 MR. WATTS:

1                   Second.

2                   MR. POTEET:

3                   Second.

4                   MR. WATTS:

5                   Anybody agree or disagree?

6                   MR. DONNELL:

7                   I do see Mr. Dees' name again.

8                   MR. PARNELL:

9                   This was at the last commission  
10                  meeting, if you recall. He came in before us  
11                  and spoke. He mentioned that there was one  
12                  fine that was still out there. That was this  
13                  one. That he did pay that day. He came to the  
14                  office later on that day. He did pay that  
15                  fine. This was at the other dealership so.

16                  MR. WATTS:

17                  He is cleared up, right?

18                  MR. PARNELL:

19                  He cleared up everything. I will say  
20                  this. He came into our office. He met with  
21                  myself, Kim Baron, the compliance investigator,  
22                  and our counsel. And he kind of talked about  
23                  everything where he was with the entire  
24                  process. He has cleared up most of everything.  
25                  I can let Kim kind of speak to it a little bit.

1 She has a little bit more detail, if you will.

2 MS. BARON:

3 When he came in, Robert had asked him  
4 about one when he was here last month, Keith  
5 Johnson. And that was one that had been just  
6 sitting out there and sitting out there and we  
7 hadn't been able to do anything with it. And  
8 so he went ahead and made payment to the  
9 floorplan company. We had talked to the floor  
10 planning company. They said if we would send  
11 them a certain amount for that particular  
12 vehicle that he would go ahead and give him the  
13 title so that this man could be -- have his  
14 vehicle registered. And so Mr. Dees went out  
15 and he got -- he sent him a check. He got the  
16 title and he got the vehicle registered. He  
17 sent me documentation on all of that.

18 So that, like Mr. Parnell said, that  
19 was the last payment that he owed the office  
20 and that has been cleared up.

21 MR. PARNELL:

22 Was it over 100 titles that he had?  
23 Was it 79?

24 MS. BARON:

25 It went to 72 or 72 or something like

1           that. And all of those either agreed or doing  
2           claims with surety or he cleared them up.

3           MR. WATTS:

4                        So what I understand, he just has HD  
5           Pay Here Auto. That's him by himself. It's  
6           just him.

7           MS. BARON:

8                        That's correct.

9           MR. WATTS:

10                       No affiliation with nobody else?

11           MR. PARNELL:

12                        Correct.

13           MR. WATTS:

14                        All right. The ratifications of  
15           revocations.

16           MR. PARNELL:

17                        You will also find in your packet a  
18           chart that illustrates the licensees that their  
19           licenses have been revoked. Please note that  
20           each of the licensees on the list have been  
21           through the revocation process. Once again, we  
22           do not have anyone present from the list. And  
23           so I will go through and announce the names of  
24           the licensee and we will revoke revocation for  
25           the record.

1                   Butler Brothers, LLC, from Harahan,  
2 Louisiana. Suspension letter went out on  
3 February 25 of '21. Notice of revocation went  
4 out on 5/10 of '21. The reason was no licensed  
5 salespersons. Everyone on this list is because  
6 of an unlicensed salesperson. And we did reach  
7 out to them via letter, suspension letter, just  
8 advising them, hey, you have got to get a  
9 license from the dealers for a salesperson. If  
10 not, then we will go through the revocation  
11 process with them. So each person on this  
12 list, that is the process that has taken place  
13 with them.

14                   The second one on the list is ASAP  
15 Auto Sales, LLC, from Harvey, Louisiana.  
16 Reason, of course, no licensed salesperson.  
17 Suspension letter went out on 2/24/21. Notice  
18 of revocation on 5/10 of '21.

19                   Central Station Auto Sales,  
20 Incorporated, from Gretna, Louisiana.  
21 Suspension letter went out on 2/25/2021.  
22 Notice of revocation on 5/10 of 2021.

23                   Father and Son's Automotive, LLC,  
24 from Port Allen, Louisiana. Reasons for the  
25 revocation is no licensed salesperson.

1 Suspension letter was sent down on February 1  
2 of '21. Notice of revocation was on 5/10 of  
3 '21.

4 GT Wholesale Auto, LLC, from  
5 Greensburg, Louisiana, no licensed salesperson.  
6 Suspension letter went on 3/1 of '21. Notice  
7 of revocation was 5/10 of '21.

8 Hercos Auto Repair, LLC, from  
9 Metairie, Louisiana, no licensed salesperson,  
10 notification was sent out -- suspension letter  
11 was sent on 3/1 of '21. Notice of revocation  
12 was 5/10 of '21.

13 Just Right Auto Sales, LLC, from  
14 Kenner, Louisiana, no licensed salesperson.  
15 Suspension letter was sent out on 3/2 of '21.  
16 Notice of revocation was 5/10 of '21.

17 Vinson Enterprises, LLC, of Florida,  
18 doing business as Vinson Enterprises of Kenner,  
19 Louisiana, no licensed salesperson. Suspension  
20 letter was sent out on 3/4 of '21. Notice of  
21 revocation on 5/10 of '21.

22 Raymond Lacombe doing business as  
23 West Baton Rouge Auto, Port Allen, Louisiana,  
24 no licensed salesperson. Suspension letter was  
25 sent out on 3/2 of '21. Notice of revocation

1 was on 5/10 of '21.

2 Commissioners, I ask that you ratify  
3 the revocation of the dealers I just announced.

4 MR. WATTS:

5 Do I have a motion?

6 MR. POTEET:

7 I move we ratify those revocations.

8 MR. DONNELL:

9 Second.

10 MR. WATTS:

11 Any objections?

12 (No response.)

13 Hearing no objections, they are  
14 approved.

15 Next up with your compliance  
16 investigation report from Montie.

17 MR. WISENOR:

18 Good morning. I have the total for  
19 the activity for the field for May of 2021.  
20 The number of audits that were conducted for  
21 the month of May was 10. There were 3 notices  
22 issued for revocation. Work orders or site  
23 visits conducted were 39. Hand delivery of  
24 cease and desist orders, zero were delivered in  
25 the month of May. Assisted titles with

1 registration for consumers either title  
2 delivered or title registration were 16.  
3 Violations delivered during that month was 5.  
4 Refunds, assisting consumers received was  
5 10,000 total. Cases closed that were assigned  
6 were 21. Cases closed unassigned were 19. And  
7 physical examinations were 27. And those are  
8 the totals.

9 MR. WATTS:

10 Does anyone have questions for  
11 Montie?

12 (No response.)

13 If there are no questions, we will  
14 move on. We don't have no hearings.

15 MR. PARNELL:

16 Not until July. And it is a pretty  
17 large one in July that we are going to have.  
18 Also, we are going to have the two persons that  
19 were denied licenses to come back in July. So  
20 I want to make sure we all have a quorum for  
21 July because we have a pretty big one.

22 MS. BARON:

23 Mr. Chairman, is it okay if Ms.  
24 Morris reiterated what she said before  
25 everybody was here about Zoom versus them being

1 in person, because we need to make sure  
2 everybody understands that process, because  
3 they are not going to be able to vote or  
4 whatever. So if she go ahead and reiterate  
5 that to the right people.

6 MR. WATTS:

7 Go ahead and make your statement and  
8 then I will ask questions.

9 MS. MORRIS:

10 There was some legislation that  
11 allows meetings to take place during -- by Zoom  
12 or video platforms during a declared  
13 emergency -- state of emergency only. So it  
14 can only be used when there is a current state  
15 of emergency declared by the governor. And if  
16 you were meeting remotely because of the  
17 emergency, then it has to be noted on the  
18 agenda that it will be remote meeting. If you  
19 plan an in-person meeting but you don't have a  
20 quorum in-person but people are participating  
21 remotely and it was not noticed as a remote  
22 meeting, you cannot conduct it as a remote  
23 meeting.

24 If we have a quorum present and  
25 people are watching by Zoom, they are not

1 participating. They cannot vote, but they can  
2 keep up with what's going on for the board. So  
3 it's a good way if it is broadcasted by Zoom  
4 for the other commissioners that can be here to  
5 at least know what is going on because  
6 sometimes things continue from more than one  
7 meeting.

8 MR. WATTS:

9 That's it. Now, let me ask you how  
10 long is this going to persist with Zoom?

11 MR. PARNELL:

12 Really, it depends on -- like Sheri  
13 said -- the governor did a declaration of  
14 emergency. If he pulls that away and then we  
15 won't be able to do Zoom in this context is  
16 what I understood.

17 MS. MORRIS:

18 Well, it's been ongoing because of  
19 the pandemic. But the state of emergency could  
20 be because of weather, if there is a hurricane  
21 or something like that. But it is limited to  
22 business that can't be delayed. So it's not  
23 designed for regular meetings, but a lot of  
24 things that you do are time-sensitive. And so,  
25 say, there was a hurricane but you knew that

1           you needed to do something going forward to  
2           meet a deadline, you could still meet remotely.  
3           But it is not really not for regular business  
4           meetings. It is more to handle things that  
5           need to be handled in a timely manner and can't  
6           be delayed until your next meeting.

7           MR. DONNELL:

8                     You are saying they can still tune  
9           in, but they can't vote.

10          MS. MORRIS:

11                     Absolutely.

12          MR. BROWN:

13                     Even after the state of emergency,  
14           they can still tune in?

15          MS. MORRIS:

16                     If we continue to use the Zoom, yes.

17          MS. BARON:

18                     They could still, but they couldn't  
19           participate.

20          MS. MORRIS:

21                     A lot of the agencies are using  
22           streaming video because they have small meeting  
23           places as you-all do. And during the pandemic  
24           they couldn't allow the public in because they  
25           couldn't meet their distancing requirements.

1           And because of that, a lot of people are  
2           watching those meetings so they are going to  
3           continue to stream them so that people can  
4           across the state see what's going on at the  
5           board meetings without traveling.

6           MR. PARNELL:

7                     I will look into that.

8           MR. WATTS:

9                     Derek, the executive report.

10          MR. PARNELL:

11                    I just want to give a little bit of  
12           background because some of this I am covering  
13           again. Commissioner Russell was not present  
14           and we had a few other commissioners there who  
15           were not at our last meeting. Give you a  
16           little background for our new commissioner.  
17           There was a discussion with Office of Motor  
18           Vehicle to allow the LUMVC to become additional  
19           location to issue dealer plates to our used  
20           dealers. This was done -- we are doing it for  
21           the convenience of the dealers just so they  
22           have another outlet to where they can go to and  
23           get their dealer plates.

24                    My assumption is since we are the  
25           ones that issued the license, they can get it

1 all in one place. They are not going to have  
2 to go to the Office of Motor Vehicles if they  
3 come and pick up a license. They can go ahead  
4 and pick up their dealer plate at that time.

5 Last month I advised that Officer of  
6 Risk Management approved issuing a bond for our  
7 agency for the Office of Motor Vehicles.

8 Initially, Office of Risk Management said that  
9 they would not do this because we were going  
10 from state agency to state agency. But they  
11 did approve the bond and advised that the bond  
12 would be written at no charge for our agency.

13 Our Office of Risk Management sent a  
14 draft for -- to our office and we sent it to  
15 Office of Motor Vehicles for approval. Reached  
16 out a couple of times to Office of Motor  
17 Vehicles. It took them a little bit to get to  
18 it because they are kind of bogged down. We  
19 submitted the draft and we submitted it back  
20 and they just kind of let us know that they  
21 would be approved and received that back a week  
22 and a half ago. Office of Motor Vehicle has a  
23 two-stage process as it related to getting  
24 final approval. My goal is to be at least at  
25 the first stage fully completed by the middle

1 of next week with all of the documents in their  
2 hand, and I will just be waiting at that time  
3 for them to approve so we can move on to the  
4 second stage.

5 We know that House Concurrent  
6 Resolution 71 was passed in the 2020  
7 legislative session. That the state agencies  
8 and licensing boards that adopted emergency  
9 rules suspending fees that are imposed on  
10 businesses and final adjourning -- until final  
11 adjournment of the 2021 regular session. So on  
12 June 1 of 2021, we will start taking fees for  
13 licensees affected by the HCR-71. We have sent  
14 out notices to those dealers that are affected  
15 advising them that the fees will begin July 1.  
16 We will do renewals for those persons. It  
17 should be -- there should be a smaller -- in  
18 essence, we are going to do two renewal periods  
19 towards the end of this year. We are going to  
20 try to go July through August for those dealers  
21 that was affected with House Concurrent  
22 Resolution 71 and then get into our regular  
23 renewals which start in September and goes to  
24 the end of that year. Those persons, their  
25 license is going to expire on December 31;

1           whereas, the other persons that were affected  
2           with House Resolution 71, their licenses are  
3           going to expire at the end of this month.

4                        So we had to -- we were down quite a  
5           few staff members, like 4, just from turnover.  
6           So this past month we worked really hard at  
7           hiring new staff. We hired four new full-time  
8           employees to help in the licensing department  
9           and the accounting department. We do have one  
10          other staff person that's on maternal leave  
11          that she should be returning very soon. If I  
12          am not mistaken, I think toward end of this --

13                       MS. BARON:

14                                July.

15                       MR. PARNELL:

16                                In the beginning July. Well, at that  
17          point. So we really have been kind of bogged  
18          down with, you know, getting through the  
19          contracts because a lot of our contracts expire  
20          specifically from our IT company that we have  
21          been going with, Transformyx. They do our  
22          phone system and they do our IT. And we had a  
23          lot of back and forth with them on getting the  
24          contract exactly how it was last year versus,  
25          you know, how we can have a contract as a dual

1 state agency. I think sometimes they always  
2 forget -- they said we have state agencies, we  
3 have state agencies. With their new management  
4 that came in, they are trying to send things in  
5 a different direction to where we couldn't  
6 follow that. We had to follow the state law  
7 demands of us of what a contract should look  
8 like. So we're getting to the end of that;  
9 hopefully, we will have something at the end of  
10 this week solidified and we can go on -- well,  
11 June 30 is upon us. So we have to have  
12 something in place. And so they also do our  
13 website as well.

14 So, with that said, we really have  
15 been working really hard at trying to get  
16 contracts out of the way to make sure that we  
17 are rolling July 1 without a break in service  
18 from anything or anyone. And so with that  
19 said, that's my report. This kind of just  
20 letting you know what was going on. If you  
21 have any comments or questions or concerns,  
22 please do at this time.

23 MR. DONNELL:

24 I apologize because I let it slip my  
25 mind. Jill -- I talked with Jill the week

1 before last, Jill Jarreau. And she said she is  
2 emailing you all of the documents you that  
3 needed to be DocuSigned. Did she do that?

4 MR. PARNELL:

5 Yes, I did. I signed it.

6 MR. DONNELL:

7 She was going out of town last week  
8 and I forgot to call you.

9 MR. PARNELL:

10 That's fine. But that was actually  
11 for this Memorandum of Understanding that we  
12 have in place already with them. So our  
13 process is going to be a little bit better  
14 because currently we do have access to their  
15 portal where we can go in our office. We have  
16 two persons that have gone through the  
17 background check process and they can go in and  
18 pull up a lot of information off of their  
19 website. So what she was talking about with  
20 that was Memorandum of Understanding that we  
21 have between our two agencies as it relates to  
22 us having access to their portal, I guess that  
23 you will say. Their system -- their computer  
24 system.

25 So it's going to help us -- some of

1           our process moving into with the dealer plates  
2           is going to be easier because we do already  
3           have two persons in our office, and I want to  
4           limit the amount of persons that would have  
5           contact with dealer plates. I want to make  
6           sure that the person that I have are, you know,  
7           responsible. But it is going to be a process  
8           because we have been through all of the set up  
9           as it relates to what we have in our computer  
10          system, our servers, the capacity. So we  
11          already have that in place. So I just -- we  
12          just got to get through the process for the  
13          public tag agent situation moving forward.

14                   One other thing I am going to ask  
15          them about is allowing us -- right now for a  
16          dealer in order to get issued a second temp  
17          tag, they have to go through their management  
18          account system -- their managers. They contact  
19          Office of Motor Vehicles, the specific manager  
20          that they have now, four, maybe five for the  
21          entire state. And so I get a lot of complaint  
22          a lot of times from dealers saying they reach  
23          out to them but they never hear anything back  
24          and if they do, it is about a month later. So  
25          they have said, yes, okay. We'll allow you-all

1 to do that. But I just want to get something  
2 more formal from them written stating, you  
3 know, that we will be able to offer -- we will  
4 be able to approve the dealers. Really  
5 compliance investigators that's in those areas,  
6 approve them to give a second dealer plates.

7 So that's some things. We will have  
8 the capacity to be a full public tag agent, but  
9 that's way outside of our scope. We are really  
10 going to just concentrate on just issuing  
11 dealer plates, number one. And, number two, if  
12 they allow us to do -- well, that's necessarily  
13 a public tag responsibility, but on the  
14 management side to allow dealers to have a  
15 second temp tag. That's about.

16 But she did send that information. I  
17 did DocuSign it and send it back to her.

18 MR. DONNELL:

19 Only one other thing that I have.  
20 The commissioners that travel, they are  
21 beginning to ask us -- I have been asked the  
22 last two times at these hotels to show some  
23 identification. Could you get us  
24 identification card or commission cards?

25 MR. PARNELL:

1                   Like some IDs?

2           MR. DONNELL:

3                   Yes, like IDs.

4           MR. PARNELL:

5                   Well, I will get to that for sure.  
6           There was something that we tried to do for  
7           staff as well.

8           MR. DONNELL:

9                   I have been asked the last two times  
10          I have been there.

11          MR. PARNELL:

12                   They require an ID card? Or would  
13          they require any kind of identification?

14          MR. DONNELL:

15                   They are looking for an ID card. I  
16          paid for a badge last time. I happened to have  
17          that in my truck and that's worked. We need  
18          some identification cards.

19          MR. PARNELL:

20                   What kind of badge are you referring  
21          to?

22          MR. DONNELL:

23                   I ordered the badge, like a  
24          commissioner badge. I will show it to you. I  
25          got it in the truck. We need something with

1           our picture on it.

2           MR. PARNELL:

3                    It might be something that we -- we  
4           kind of talked about it with other agencies so  
5           see what agency they use. It is kind of like  
6           on your own to do it.

7           MR. DONNELL:

8                    George has one.

9           MS. MORRIS:

10                   That's from the Secretary of State.

11           MR. PARNELL:

12                    We will look into that and try to get  
13           something for you-all moving into the future.

14           MS. MORRIS:

15                    That's a commission card is what the  
16           Secretary calls that. It is from the Office of  
17           Commissions.

18           MR. PARNELL:

19                    I will definitely look into that.

20           MR. WATTS:

21                    I talked to Derek earlier in the week  
22           and I will just bring you up to date on it. I  
23           would like to get a -- Darty Smith passed away  
24           with COVID. And Darty Smith's dad -- y'all  
25           knew him better than I did -- was on the

1 Commission. So we are going to get a plaque  
2 made. Might Zoom his wife in over in Alex when  
3 we get it all set up.

4 MR. DONNELL:

5 He was a good guy.

6 MR. PARNELL:

7 We have a company that we deal with  
8 that they do that as well. So we will reach  
9 out to them and we can just get some language.

10 MR. WATTS:

11 It ain't no big hurry. Just the  
12 right language and stuff.

13 MR. PARNELL:

14 We had a discussion about for the  
15 rest of this year holding the commission  
16 meetings here. It's no cost to us to get the  
17 building and so we had discussions about it and  
18 we will go ahead -- Kim said that she will go  
19 ahead and let them know that. She will put in  
20 the request to have it here, and if anything  
21 changes from there, we already have dates  
22 looked in.

23 MR. DONNELL:

24 Who is opposing us coming back to the  
25 office?

1 MR. PARNELL:

2 The space isn't in there. I guess  
3 social distance is not as huge.

4 MR. WATTS:

5 I would rather get back to the  
6 office, if I could, for y'all's sake.

7 MS. MORRIS:

8 I guess that you have a hearing, it  
9 might be crowded.

10 MR. PARNELL:

11 Next month for sure we are going to  
12 do it here. But if we don't have any hearing  
13 or any people coming in.

14 MR. WATTS:

15 Another thing I said for the meetings  
16 for the rest of the year, I think that the  
17 December meeting, I am not going to have the  
18 December meeting, because it is always on the  
19 21st. If you got business that you want to  
20 tend to, you need to get it done in the  
21 November meeting. Unless we have got something  
22 pertinent or into something, which I don't  
23 think it is going to be this year, who knows.

24 We are ready to adjourn.
