MR. GRISSOM:
Thank you, Mr. Chairman, Board members. Thank you very much for your participation today.

I'm happy to provide a brief update. First, I know many of you have seen this in the news, but Louisiana is at the center of an industrial renaissance, and nowhere is that more evident than in Southwest Louisiana. I wanted to highlight a few recent developments that $I$ believe that are of interest to this Board, of interest to the State.

First of all, Sasol, yesterday, reached a final investment decision on an \$8.1-million ethane cracker complex in Westlake, Louisiana. They also envision another 8-million on infrastructure improvements, land acquisition and utility improvements for a total capital investment of almost \$9-billion. This is a portion of their overall integrated ethane cracker and gas-to-liquids complex, a significant
component of that project, so very excited about that company reaching that final investment decision. The project is expected to be able to produce 1.5-million tons of ethane annually, and the ethane will be further converted into additional chemical products that are used in such items as detergents, lotions, cleaners, packaging, adhesives, a wide variety of products used throughout the US.

We expect 500 direct jobs with an average annual salary of 88,000, over 2000 new indirect jobs and approximately 5,000 construction jobs over the next several years associated with this project. So that's one major decision reached earlier this week.

Just last week, two additional projects in South Louisiana. Sempra Cameron LNG project in Hackberry, Louisiana. Ground was broken on this project. That is a $\$ 6$-billion capital investment, and a new natural gas liquefaction processing complex and liquified natural gas export terminal. The project is estimated to create 140 new direct jobs with average annual salaries of 80,000 , over 600 new indirect jobs and over 3,000 construction jobs.

Major customers of the project for the LNG that will be exported include Mitsubishi and Mitsui of Japan and GDF Suez based in France. So a very nice
export-oriented project, very large capital investment and a nice set of construction and direct jobs associated with that project.

Additionally, on the same day, Westlake Chemical announced a $\$ 330$-million expansion in Sulphur, Louisiana, Southwest Louisiana, 25 new jobs with \$2-million in new direct payroll, 164 new indirect jobs and approximately 1,000 construction jobs during that construction activity.

So just a tremendous amount of activity occurring in the chemical and energy sectors, much of this activity is occurring in Southwest Louisiana, really at the epicenter of this industrial renaissance, but similar projects occurring across the State, so very, very exciting time in Louisiana and certainly exciting to see this industrial renaissance in Louisiana participating in a major, major way in that industrial renaissance we're seeing in the United States. Moving to another topic I wanted to cover with you. This is related to our National Business Climate ranking and some recognition to the department. Earlier this month, Louisiana received its fifth top 10 business climate ranking. A national location marketing firm, DCI, Development Counsellors International, ranked Louisiana tied for Number 10 in
the US. Louisiana is up 20 spots since 2011, so a great leap over the last three years. DCI also ranked LED tied for Number 2 in the US for Best Performing State Economic Development Agencies, so that's looking across all 50 states at the state level of economic development efforts. These rankings were based on a national survey of over 350 corporate executives and site selection consultants. Those are individuals obviously from a department that cares about and has been working to cultivate over the years. The survey is released every three years and was released in conjunction with the International Economic Development Counsellors meeting.

To put this in perspective, prior to 2008, Louisiana had never ranked in the top 10 states in any business climate ranking, in any national ranking state business climates, so great progress has really been made. We're now in the top 10 in five different business climate rankings, so we're seeing multiple entities recognizing the progress the State's made, provides additional validation for your efforts and I think a great testimony to the economic activity that's occurring in the State, and also with that Number 2 ranking of the department, just great recognition for the work that this Board does and the work of the LED team and the work that the State's doing to cultivate
economic development. So $I$ wanted to share that recognition with you. Great to see the State being recognized for its overall business climate. Also great to see that the department is being recognized for its individual efforts and those efforts associated with the department.

With that, that concludes my remarks.
Once again, thank you very much for your participation. I know the traffic was a bit difficult today. I definitely appreciate you making the effort to participate. Important work, a great set of projects that we have had here in front of you today, and thank you for your continued dedication to the economic development in Louisiana. Thank you.
