Page 3 MR. FRUGE: 1 Let's go ahead and call the meeting to 2 order, but we won't call roll or anything like that. 3 We'll have Steven Grissom make his comments, just move 4 him up on the agenda. So we'll get started after his 5 comments. 6 MR. GRISSOM: 7 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 8 9 Well, I wanted to provide the Board a 10 couple updates on, you know, a large number of topics that I've covered at prior meetings, but at a high 11 level, the Department continues to see a lot of 12 13 enthusiasm about investment and economics in the State of Louisiana. I'm going to share a few examples of 14 those corporate decisions that have occurred recently, 15 and, also, the State continues to receive positive 16 17 recognition about it's overall economic health and our economic development efforts, so I wanted to share a few 18 examples there. 19 First, on the project announcements, the 20 company decisions, looking in Louisiana, we had two 21 exciting announcements yesterday I wanted to cover. 22 CGI, which is the fourth -- I believe this is right. 23 Ι believe they're the fourth largest global IT outsourcing 24 25 firm in the world. The company employs more than 68,000

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1	professionals in 40 nations and has a recorded revenue
2	of approximately \$10-billion. CGI announced that
3	they're going to establish a 400-job technology center
4	in Lafayette, and this is a company that LED has been
5	working with for quite some time. They will deliver
6	technology solutions as the anchor tenant of the
7	University of Louisiana Lafayette Research Park, and one
8	of the, I think, very interesting things about this
9	project is the higher-education partnership that's going
10	to be established associated with the protect, so a key
11	part of the project includes a state-funded, 10-year,
12	\$4.5-million higher education initiative. It's going to
13	be led by ULM Lafayette, and the result is going to be a
14	tripling of the number of undergraduate degrees awarded
15	annually by the university's School of Computing and
16	Informatics. Now, these will be graduates that are of
17	interest to CGI right there in Lafayette, but also
18	graduates that are going to be of interest to a wide
19	number of companies throughout the State, and I think
20	you have a lot of students in a very exciting field that
21	will be interesting for them as career opportunities
22	evolve. With that growth, that would place the
23	university's Computer and Science program among the top
24	25 programs in the nation for the number of bachelor
25	degrees awarded annually. So very exciting project,

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1	excited about a very significant company investing in
2	Louisiana, the number of new jobs associated with the
3	project. Four-hundred jobs when you look at indirect,
4	over 800 jobs, and a very innovative, higher-education
5	partnership associated with that.
6	I see we have our quorum, so I'll ask,
7	Mr. Chairman, would you like me to continue?
8	MR. FRUGE:
9	Go right ahead.
10	MR. GRISSOM:
11	Yesterday as well, TCI Plastics
12	announces a \$36.5-million investment in the Port of New
13	Orleans, and along with this project, 160 new direct
14	jobs, and when indirect are included, a total of 340 new
15	jobs for the New Orleans region. This project is really
16	tied to expansions in Louisiana's chemical industry.
17	This is a with the expansion, TCI will have more than
18	900,000 square foot of warehouse space dedicated to
19	plastics and the capacity to package nearly 2-billion
20	pounds annually, so this is an investment that's really
21	tied to more traditional industries here in Louisiana,
22	points to the strength and the outlook in the chemical
23	and plastics sectors in Louisiana, and, again, a very
24	exciting announcement building along that heritage of
25	global trade and commerce and an investment in the Port

of New Orleans.

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Just last week, a couple of additional 2 announcements, and I'll wrap up with an announcement 3 that happened today. 4th Source, Incorporated announced 4 a software development IT corporate headquarters 5 location that's going to be in New Orleans. That's 6 anticipated 320 new direct jobs. Again, building out of 7 that software information technology space in the state. 8 And last week as well, Marathon Petroleum announced 9 10 progress towards an over \$2-billion project at the 11 Garyille Refinery, and they're moving forward with plans to file permits and also detailed due diligence and the 12 13 project involves a wide variety of infrastructure investments as well as the expectation of creating 65 14 new jobs at the Garyville facility. 15 So, again, we see investments in some of 16 17 Louisiana's traditional sectors as well as some newer sectors in software, too. 18 Just the other day, Agrico Sales 19 announced a 25-new job expansion, manufacturing 20 expansion in New Orleans, so another exciting 21 announcement. In the project pipeline, the set of 22 companies that the department is interacting with both 23 domestically and internationally is very robust. 24 I 25 anticipate to see a number of continuing announcements

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along these lines in the coming months, so we're excited 1 about the progress we've made. We're excited about the 2 possibilities ahead of us. 3 I wanted to wrap up my remarks with a 4 few points of recognition that Louisiana received. 5 These occurred in March, so a little bit dated, but, you 6 know, these are updates since your last Board meeting. 7 A couple of our projects that were announced last year 8 9 received recognition for what -- Trade and Industry 10 Development is a magazine that covers economic 11 development. They essentially review projects across the U.S.. They look at the top 30 is what they end up 12 13 coming down to, and two of the 30 project winners for the 2014 awards looking back at projects in 2013, two 14 Louisiana projects were selected. One was the 15 \$55-million IBM project in downtown Baton Rouge, and the 16 17 other, the \$130-million Gulf Coast Spinning project in Bunkie, Louisiana. So we're excited to receive that 18 recognition. And then earlier in March, Site Selection 19 Magazine, another magazine that covers economic 20 development across the U.S., they recognized Louisiana 21 as Number 3 in their expanded and new corporate 22 facilities on a per capita basis. So, essentially, they 23 look at all states, the number of new projects or 24 25 expansion projects that meet a certain threshold,

3	Number 3 when you look at it on a per capita basis. So
4	very excited to receive that recognition. I think it
5	also points to the health of Louisiana's economy and the
6	strength of many things we're accomplishing together
7	with C&I as well as the Department.
8	So I will stop at that, but in summary,
9	a lot of great things happening in the State at the
10	Department, and appreciate all of your support and help
11	as we try to make these investments come to fruition.

16	first came on this Board about 1,200 years ago, I asked
17	the question, and I'm not sure that I made my question
18	clear back then because I don't think I understood my
19	question as well as I do now. But as I've served on the
20	board, one thing I am absolutely convinced of is the
21	programs that the LED staff administers are very
22	valuable to the State and very valuable to the companies
23	and businesses, not only those that are coming into the
24	State, but more importantly, in my mind at least, to
25	those that are here. One thing I've learned in talking

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1	to people who take advantage of these programs is, for
2	many projects, the expansion that they may want to do is
3	marginal. There's a very slim margin, and sometimes
4	it's these programs that make those margins wide enough
5	that in fact make them good projects to take on, and so
6	what we do here every other month, while it may seem to
7	people sitting in the audience very pro forma, and the
8	reason it is pro forma is because the staff is doing a
9	good job. As I said many times, our job up here is to
10	break the ties when it's ugly, and people don't like
11	when we break ties lots of times because it can go
12	either way. But I'm absolutely convinced of the value
13	of these programs, but one thing I would love to be able
14	to do, but I just haven't wrapped my heart and mind
15	around the right way to do it, is how to quantify the
16	actual dollars in the bank that these programs bring to
17	the State of Louisiana, and I'm going to, once again,
18	ask the staff and Steven, maybe, if y'all can just kind
19	of think a little bit about that. When I read the
20	quarterly that y'all do, which, by the way, is an
21	amazing report. I think y'all ought to win some awards
22	just for the quarterly report that y'all do. It's
23	chock-full of great information, but I still and if
24	it's there, I must have missed it, but I still would
25	like to be able to see some way to quantify because I

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1	know so many of these, they have goals. They have
2	contract amounts that may or may not come to fruition,
3	but I would still like to see, if it's possible to
4	quantify actual dollars in the bank, jobs on the ground
5	that are actually created by these programs. I'm not
6	asking anybody to do anything today except think about
7	how to do it, and if there's a way to do it, get back
8	with me and let me know because I think that would be
9	important to the public to know about these programs.
10	MR. FRUGE:
11	Very good. Well, maybe then let's at a
12	minimum add that to the next meeting's agenda where
13	someone with LED will get back to us on how we might go
14	about gleaning that information, or you may be able to
15	do it between now and the next meeting, but maybe we
16	could add that
17	MR. JONES:
18	If it's an impossible thing to do,
19	that's an acceptable answer as long as there's some
20	explanation that goes with it, but I really want this
21	information because I think it's important for the
22	Department.
