The **motion** was made by Michael Hensgens and seconded by Justin Alford to set the penalty rate at \$350.00 per violation, for a total of \$1400.00 to be paid in penalties. All members were in favor. **Motion carried**.

Kimberly Turner, HS&E Compliance Officer - attended the hearing as representation on behalf of Central Oil. No legal representation for the defending party was in attendance for the hearing. At the request of LDAF Counsel, Emily Andrews, Chairman Larry Terrell motioned to proceed with the hearing in their absence. Motion granted. Inspector Troy Coates was called as a witness and his previously conducted Price Verification inspections were entered in as evidence. Kimberly Turner was then allowed to make a statement on behalf of Central Oil — advising of a vendor change starting May 01, 2018. It was noted that there were two followup inspections conducted after this date that both received failing scores as well.

Motion made by Dave George and seconded by Michael Hensgens to find Harde Mart / Central Station #215 guilty as charged. All members were in favor. **Motion carried.**

The motion was set before the commission to assess a penalty of a maximum \$500.00 for each violation, for a total of up to \$3500.00 in penalties to be paid. The **motion** was made by Michael Hensgens and seconded by Nolan Percy to set the penalty rate at \$250.00 per violation, for a total of \$1750.00 to be paid in penalties. All members were in favor. **Motion carried.**
