**I. CALL TO ORDER**

A quarterly meeting of the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice was held on Thursday, March 21, 2024, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. Sheriff Sid J. Gautreaux, III, Commission Chairman, called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m.

### **III. ADOPTION OF AGENDA**

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to adopt the agenda. A motion was made by Sheriff Tubbs, seconded by Sheriff Martin, and the motion passed without opposition.

### **IV. OLD BUSINESS**

#### **A. Consideration of Minutes**

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to approve the minutes from the meeting held on December 7, 2023. A motion was made by Sheriff Martin, seconded by Sheriff Ard, and the motion passed without opposition.

#### **B. Report of the Priorities Committee**

Chief Craft reported that, on March 5, 2024, the Priorities Committee received all allocations, applications, proposed increases, and sole source requests via electronic mail-out. On March 6, 2024, the Priorities Committee received an additional sole source request via email. The Priorities Committee reviewed all proposed agenda items and recommended approval on March 12, 2024. All items will be considered for final approval at the March 21, 2024 Commission meeting.

This concludes the report of the Priorities Committee.

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to accept the report. A motion was made by Mr. Walters, seconded by Chief Dunn, and the motion passed.

### **C. Report of the Victim Services Advisory Board**

On behalf of Board Chair Gary “Stitch” Guillory, Mr. Julio Galan reported that the Victim Services Advisory Committee met at 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, March 20, 2024, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. A membership quorum was present.

The Board recommended approval of the following:

- 12 FY 2023 SASP allocations totaling \$895,725
- 2 FY 2022 VOCA allocations totaling \$94,400
- 19 FY 2023 VOCA allocations totaling \$1,447,589
- 43 FY 2023 STOP allocations totaling \$1,201,270
- 12 FY 2021 VOCA increases totaling \$304,027
- 1 FY 2022 VOCA increase totaling \$14,273
- 12 FY 2023 SASP applications with pre-award costs beginning 1/01/24 totaling \$895,725
- 19 FY 2022 VOCA applications totaling \$1,723,205
- 43 FY 2023 SASP applications with pre-award costs beginning 1/01/24 totaling \$2,201,270
- 1 Waiver of Commission Policy #2 under *Fiscal Limitations*, which states “fringe benefits shall be limited to no more than 30% of salary costs”. The Jena Band of Choctaw Indians is requesting up to 45% for fringe benefits in all future subgrants awarded by the Commission.
- 1 Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate (JDC) FY 2023 – 66.10% \*
- 1 Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate (JDC) FY 2024 – 59.91% \*

\* The JDC rates assigned to the Jena Band of Choctaw Indians JDC for use on grants, contracts, and other agreements with the Federal Government were negotiated by the Department of Interior to be applied to all programs administered by the Tribe for direct salaries and wages only.

This concludes the report of the Victim Services Advisory Board.

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to accept the report. A motion was made by Sheriff Martin, seconded by Mr. Landry, and the motion carried without opposition.

### **D. Report of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (JJDP) Advisory Board**

Mr. Leonard Espree, Board Chair, reported that the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Advisory Board met at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, March 20, 2024, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. A membership quorum was present.

The Board recommended approval of the following:

- 1 application for FY 2021 totaling \$45,158
- 1 increase for FY 2020 totaling \$1,710

This concludes the report of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Advisory Board.

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to accept the report. A motion was made by Sheriff Stassi, seconded by Sheriff Tubbs, and the motion unanimously passed.

**E. Report of the Drug Control and Violent Crime Policy Board**

Col. Carlos Stout, Board Chair, reported that the Drug Control and Violent Crime Policy Board met at 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 20, 2024, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. A membership quorum was present.

The Board recommended approval of the following:

- 6 allocations for FY 2022 totaling \$218,909
- 16 applications for FY 2022 totaling \$342,050
- 3 increases for FY 2021 totaling \$63,006
- Waiver Request/Sole Source Request – Grant staff requests approval of all waiver and sole source requests reviewed by LCLE staff

All of this activity is listed in the eGrants system

This concludes the Drug Control and Violent Crime Policy Board Report.
