I. CALL TO ORDER

A quarterly meeting of the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice was held on Thursday, September 25, 2025, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. In the absence of Sheriff Sid J. Gautreaux, III, Commission Chair, Ms. Kristine Russell, Commission Vice Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m.

Vice Chair Russell called for a motion to approve the minutes from the meeting held on June 5, 2025. A motion was made by Sheriff Richardson, seconded by Sheriff Tubbs, and the motion passed without opposition.

V. COMMITTEE AND BOARD REPORTS

A. Report of the Priorities Committee

Chief Craft reported that, on September 8, 2025, the Priorities Committee received all proposed allocations, applications, sole source for program requests, and grant increase requests via electronic mail.

On September 16, 2025, the Priorities Committee approved all items as presented and the following items will be considered for final approval at today’s meeting:

- 28 allocations totaling \$2,034,851
- 114 applications totaling \$11,677,088

- 14 grant increase requests totaling \$215,531
- 2 sole source for program requests totaling \$91,468

These items equal a grand total of \$14,018,938 (including allocations) to be awarded to deserving agencies at today's meeting.

This concludes the report of the Priorities Committee.

Vice Chair Russell called for a motion to accept the report. A motion was made by Mr. Welborn, seconded by Sheriff Breaux, and the motion passed without opposition.

B. Report of the Victim Services Advisory Board

In the absence of Sheriff Gary "Stitch" Guillory, Board Chair, Mr. Julio Galan reported that the Victim Services Advisory Committee met at 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, September 24, 2025, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. A membership quorum was present.

The Board recommended approval of the following:

- 9 FY 2024 VOCA allocations totaling \$722,539
- 9 FY 2024 VOCA applications totaling \$722,539
- 9 FY 2024 VOCA increases totaling \$53,739
- 1 FY 2023 STOP allocation totaling \$14,580
- 1 FY 2023 STOP application totaling \$14,580
- 1 FY 2023 STOP increase totaling \$4,128
- 11 FY 2024 STOP allocations totaling \$321,677
- 11 FY 2024 STOP applications totaling \$321,677

The Board recommended approval of the following:

- 2 JJDP allocations totaling \$66,056
- 2 JJDP applications totaling \$66,056
- 1 JJDP increase totaling \$13,126

D. Report of the Drug Control and Violent Crime Policy Board

The Board recommended approval of the following:

- 4 FY 2024 allocations totaling \$699,999
- 1 FY 2023 application totaling \$225,000
- 3 FY 2024 applications totaling \$274,999
- Grant staff requests the approval of all waiver requests and sole source requests (reviewed by LCLE staff)

All of this activity is listed in the eGrants system.

This concludes the Drug Control and Violent Crime Policy Board Report.

E. Report of the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) Advisory Board

Sheriff Julian Whittington, Board Chair, reported that the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) Advisory Board met on September 24, 2025, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. A membership quorum was present.

The Board recommended approval of 55 DARE state-funded grant applications to the following entities with the understanding that cuts will be made to the grants based on the available DARE budget:

- 2 Marshalls' Offices
- 1 Constable's Office
