1 what they did. They started back in 1970, 2 and in '84, they were purchased by Timberland Group, and Timberland Group is 3 4 their parent corporation. They're fully owned by them. Timberland Group is located 5 6 in Canada, and they serve a worldwide base 7 TSE International basically of customers. 8 services, up until recently, just the United States and Canada. 9 They've expanded their 10 marketing and their sales to include South America and Mexico. To do that, they need 11 12 to expand their existing facility. The EDAP 13 was offered to assist with this expansion. 14 It will be 200,000 of a 1.1 project. The expansion will include additional warehouse 15 16 and assembly space but will also increase their machine shop, which will double their 17 18 welding capacity. TSE currently has 63 19 employees with a payroll of 3.5 million, and 20 they have agreed to maintain those employees during the life of the contract as well as 21 increase their jobs by 30 with a payroll of 22 23 TSE is -- as I said, they're in 1.4. Their bank HSBC Bank Canada has a 24 Canada. 25 lien against all of their property. It has

1	it first on all of their property, and so in
2	place of collateral and apparent guarantee,
3	they're going to do a pari-passu agreement,
4	and what that will do is it will share any
5	liquidation on the first \$500,000 of any
6	type of liquidation, LEDC will share with
7	HSBC Bank, and it will be a 1 to 1. This is
8	a \$200,000 grant, so that will cover this
9	\$200,000, and then after that, it will all
10	be the bank's.
11	TSE, as I said, was located in
12	Caddo Parish. Caddo Parish currently has an
13	unemployment rate of 6.9 percent against the
14	state's, which is 6.1. The incentives that
15	have been offered to TSE are quality jobs as
16	well as the EDAP. LEDC's staff is
17	recommending approval of the \$200,000
18	performance grant to TSE with the regular
19	contingencies except for the pari-passu
20	agreement.

First, thanks for letting us
come here today and have this opportunity.
As we mentioned, TSE has been in
our current location since 1972. We have
several employees that are well past 30
years, so keeping our location is important
for us in terms of keeping the skilled labor
that we already have established. As most
of you probably realize now, our
construction division is very limited.
There's only three manufacturers in North
America that build this type of equipment,
and there's only probably seven in the
entire world that build this type of
equipment, so it's very limited in terms of
our competition, but we're very proud to
stay and we want to stay in our current
location, but we have maximized our current
workspace completely.
Since 2011, we've actually been
on a steady growth period ever since. We've
doubled our shipments this year compared to
2011, and we've already increased our
workforce to 60 percent, but we are totally
maxed out. This extra expansion area is

1	going to create a dedicated, clean,
2	climate-controlled machine shop area of
3	almost 10,000 square feet, which doubles my
4	machine shop space and then opens up all
5	that existing space for my welling
6	department. So we're looking at adding
7	welders, low skilled people in terms of
8	material handlers, as well as high skilled
9	machinists, as well as assembly people. So
10	it's a variety of people that we'll be
11	looking for adding in that 20- to 30-people
12	range in the coming years.
13	Are there any questions?
14	MR. AVANT:
15	Where are you located in
16	Shreveport?
17	MR. BARLOW:
18	We're on the
19	Blanchard-Shreveport Highway between
20	Shreveport and Blanchard, so just off
21	Highway 220 right where
22	MR. AVANT:
23	Is that close to K.C. John [ph]?
24	MR. BARLOW:
25	It's close to that, yes. We're

3	actually just one exit down from that. So
4	that's really close to us.
5	MR. AVANT:
6	So the reason for Shreveport is
7	all of your skilled people are already
8	there?
9	MR. BARLOW:
10	Yes. Yes.
11	MR. AVANT:
12	Do you have offices in the
13	United States?
14	MR. BARLOW:
15	Well, what we do is we have
16	salesman located within the different
17	divisions of the United States, so we have
18	five salesman that live within their
19	territories. We also have another salesman
20	that lives out of Miami. He handles Mexico,
21	Central and South America, and we had a
22	salesman that recently left us. He was out
23	of Houston and he handled the Middle and Far
24	East and Australia. So we've expanded
25	outside North America now, and that's really

1	what's putting pressure on our manufacturing
2	capabilities to keep up with they are.
3	We're currently running about
4	four and a half to five months backlog, so
5	right now I'm building I'm taking orders;
6	my delivery times are in May. And it's been
7	like that for the last three years. We just
8	cannot keep up with the demand for our
9	equipment, which is fantastic news for us,
10	but we need to expand in order to actually
11	facilitate better service to our customers
12	and then allow us to then grow into our
13	international market.
14	MR. ANDRE:
15	You mentioned you have a limited
16	number of people that are your competitors,
17	right?
18	MR. BARLOW:
19	Yes.
20	MR. ANDRE:
21	What is your market share?
22	MR. BARLOW:
23	In the United States, we're
24	probably above 50 percent of the market.
25	Our main competitor is up in Oakland,

1	Oklahoma, and he's probably running right
2	now 30 to 35 percent. We're probably around
3	50 to 55, and then there's a couple minor
4	players, but some build some small
5	quantities. So in North America, we're
6	quite strong. Internationally, we sell very
7	little national. Our main competitors
8	the number one manufacturer in the world is
9	out of Italy, and they, unfortunately, get
10	substantial subsidies from their Italian
11	government, which makes it incredibly
12	difficult to compete with them. But that's
13	one of the reasons that we moved all of our
14	manufacturing for tension screening
15	equipment to Shreveport. We feel that we
16	can compete with the skilled labor we have,
17	and the people that we have now are
18	currently payroll areas, and the cost of
19	steel and the cost of materials that we get
20	from the north Louisiana section, we can
21	compete with the Italians, we think, head to
22	head.
23	MR. ANDRE:
24	Describe for me specifically

25 what the EDAP will money be used for.

2	It will be used for the actual
3	building part of the
4	MR. ANDRE:
5	The expansion of the building?
6	MR. BARLOW:
7	The expansion of the building,
8	yes. So currently we have just under 30,000
9	square feet of manufacturing space. What we
10	would like to do is a we're adding 10,000
11	square foot expansion building on the back
12	of it and increasing our concrete area out
13	the back so we have more space around the
14	new building, and that new building will be
15	completely air-conditioned and a clean room
16	just for our machine shop so that our CNC
17	equipment hopefully will stop breaking down
18	as much, being in a cleaner environment.
19	MR. ANDRE:
20	What if they built the building
21	in a new area without the skilled craftsman?
22	It's pretty tight in this area as well.
23	MR. BARLOW:
24	It's especially very tight. The
25	oil and gas industry has picked up again,

and as soon as they pick up, we start to 1 2 have a lot of difficulty trying to attract machine shop people. But in our little 3 4 area, most of the machine shops are not climate controlled, not clean environment. 5 They're just out in normal merchandising 6 7 space. 8 MR. ANDRE: 9 So you want to attract people 10 with your work environment? 11 MR. BARLOW: 12 We certainly believe that we 13 will be able to now attract a higher quality 14 of people and get more of a line-up at our 15 door trying to get into these positions 16 because of the improved working conditions that we'll be able to offer. 17 18 MR. ANDRE: 19 It should be able to help you 20 find people as well. 21 MR. BARLOW: 22 Yes. And, yes, we're certainly 23 having to increase our pay raise for machine 24 shops at this point, but, again, it's very hard to compete dollar-for-dollar head up 25

2	located in Donaldsonville, which is
3	Ascension Parish. CF Industries has been in
4	Louisiana since 1946. The existing facility
5	is going to be expanding. They're going to
6	the EDAP is going to be used for a dock
7	area.
8	This will be your fifth dock?
9	MR. JOHNSON:
10	Yes.
11	MS. BIGNER:
12	They have five docks on the
13	Mississippi River currently. They also can
14	distribute by interstate as well as by rail.
15	CF Industries Holdings is the parent
16	company. Up until recently, they had a
17	nitrogen segment and a phosphate segment.
18	They sold off the phosphate and now they're
19	concentrating strictly on the nitrogen. The
20	Donaldsonville facility is one of two
21	facilities that does distribution for CF
22	Holdings. In 2013, as I said, they sold off
23	their other segment. They're going to be
24	using those funds to increase this both
25	of the distribution facilities, but we're

2	Donaldsonville. It's a \$2.2 billion
3	project. The EDAP is going to be for \$2
4	million, and, as I said, it's going to be
5	for an additional dock area. CF Industries
6	currently has 361 employees with a payroll
7	of \$48 dollars, and they've agreed to create
8	93 jobs next year with a payroll of 5.8.
9	The contract will be for five years. There
10	will be a lien against a urea ammonia
11	nitrate tank with a value of more than \$10
12	million as collateral as well as a parent
13	guaranty. They're going to be making use of
14	the Quality Jobs as well as the EDAP
15	program. Staff recommends approval of the
16	project for a \$2 million EDAP with the
17	existing. CF Industries has agreed to
18	maintain the 361 employees and increase the
19	93 employees within a five-year period of
20	the contract, and we have the normal
21	contingencies that we have on most of the
22	EDAPs.

3	Morris Johnson. I'm the operations manager
4	at CF Industries Nitrogen in Donaldsonville.
5	On behalf of CF Industries Nitrogen, I'd
6	like to thank LEDC for the initiative put
7	forth for this project. It will certain
8	contribute to Donaldsonville site being
9	selected for this very important expansion.
10	As mentioned, CF Industries
11	Nitrogen is a wholly-owned subsidiary of CF
12	Industries Holdings, which is publicly
13	traded company also known as CF. CF
14	operates 7 nitrogen manufacturing facilities
15	in North America, two in Canada, two in
16	Oklahoma, one in Iowa, and one in
17	Mississippi. We also have numerous
18	distribution facilities located throughout
19	the Midwest.
20	The Donaldsonville complex has
21	been an integral of the Donaldsonville and
22	Ascension Parish community now for over 45
23	years. We're the largest nitrogen
24	manufacturing site in North America. This
25	project, valued at \$2.2 billion, I

understand includes 3,500 metric tons a day 1 2 urea at the granulation plant, 1,500 tons a day at the nitric acid plant, and 4,500 3 metrics tons a day at the urea ammonium 4 nitrate or UAN facility. Once completed, it 5 6 will increase shippable project out of our site by about 50 percent. 7 It will make the 8 site the largest manufacturing site in the 9 world by a large margin. It's extremely 10 strategic for our company. Donaldsonville offers a number of strategic advantages, 11 12 including access to the river, as we 13 mentioned. The incentive would be used to 14 build a barge loading facility in addition to a warehouse and other infrastructure at 15 16 our site.

The project's on schedule to be 17 18 completed in the first guarter of 2016. We 19 currently have approximately 2,000 20 construction personnel on our site. That 21 will peak probably in March, around 3,200. 22 Once completed, we'll have created 93 23 permanent CF positions in addition to the 24 roughly 350 that we have today. 25 So, you know, overall it's an

3	brings is obviously access to low cost North
4	American gas and give us the opportunity to
5	export projects outbound throughout the
6	Mississippi River to South America and
7	Europe in lieu of just the North American
8	midwest market.

But right now we 17 have no supply for this pouch, so to speak, 18 that doesn't breathe, but we will have it in 19 a couple of months. So that will be another 20 way to market. The loan will be only for the first year and 9 10 then, like I said, turned out. The straight is will be 6.25.
