#### **MEETING MINUTES**

A public meeting of the Interim Emergency Board was held in Senate Committee Room E on January 22, 2018.

#### ITEM NO. 1

Sen. John Alario, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 8:19am and asked the Secretary to call the roll.

#### Present:

- Rep. Rep. Cameron Henry, Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee
- Commissioner of Administration Jay Dardenne
- Mr. Robert Barham, designee of Lt. Governor Billy Nungesser
- Mr. Ron Henson, designee of State Treasurer Ron Henson

#### ITEM NO. 2

Sen. Alario requested a motion for approval of the minutes of the October 19, 2017, meeting as presented to the board. Rep. Barras moved to approve the minutes as submitted. The motion passed without objection.

#### ITEM NO. 3

At Sen. Alario's request, Mr. Henson explained that the State Treasurer's Office had reviewed the application of Wymar Federal Credit Union, Geismar, a financial institution that applied for designation as a state depository/fiscal agent for the remainder of the four-year period ending June 30, 2019. Finding their application and accompanying financial information satisfactory and in order, the State Treasurer's Office had made its recommendation for approval.

Mr. Henson motioned for approval; second by Rep. Barras. The motion passed with no objection.

#### ITEM NO. 4

Sen. Alario called on Mr. Mark Moses, Director of Facility Planning and Control, Division of Administration, to introduce the scope change request submitted by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries.

Mr. Moses stated that the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (WLF) had submitted a scope clarification request to add the ability to purchase buildings to its "Wildlife Land Acquisition" project, which is part of its statewide land acquisition program. It was his understanding that if they found an appropriate property with an existing building, they wanted to be able to purchase the land along with the existing building.

Rep. Henry asked if the project funds were from the state general fund, and Mr. Moses said it was his understanding the funds were from the Conservation Fund, which is from self-generated revenue, but he would defer to Mr. Bryan McClinton of WLF to confirm.

Rep. Henry asked if the approval to purchase the building would be for one building only or for long term. Mr. Moses stated that WLF currently has one building in mind for purchase in Lafayette, but with the way the request was worded, there could possibly be others in the future in those wildlife areas.

Rep. Henry asked who will oversee the process of purchasing in order to ensure that WLF follows requirements. Mr. Moses responded that the oversight going forward would be by Facility Planning & Control (FPC). He explained that any time state agencies move to purchase buildings, they are required to submit appraisals, which are reviewed and approved by FPC, and those documents would be signed by the Commissioner of Administration.

Rep. Henry asked if the project would come back to the legislature for approval, since the legislature is who would be on the hook in the event of defaults. Mr. Moses stated that the only reason the project would come back to the legislature would be for a change in funding for this particular appropriation. It is a new appropriation every year, thus it is in the capital outlay act every year, so that's when the legislature would need to weigh in and either approve it or not.

Mr. McClinton responded to Rep. Henry's questions, confirming that the funds for the project come from the Conservation Fund, which is statutorily dedicated, and they would still be required to go through FPC for monitoring and approval to be able to procure any buildings. Rep. Henry asked if operation and maintenance of buildings would be paid through the fund, to which Mr. McClinton responded yes, that WLF does not get any state general funds. He added that by purchasing this building, WLF would be able to consolidate two offices into one.

Mr. Henson asked, if approved, would it still be within the parameters of the existing statute that authorized the purchase. Mr. Moses responded that the appropriation this year is for land acquisition only, so the appropriation would now include buildings until June 30. There will be another bill this coming session that would reauthorize the approval for this type of land acquisition and it would then include "and buildings" in the bill. In regard to another thing Mr. McClinton had mentioned, Mr. Moses said there are buildings that are in capital outlay that WLF has requested, to the tune of \$10 million that, for example, could go to construct a new building north of Lafayette. This change would eliminate the need for those capital expenditures if they could consolidate some of those activities.

Sen. Alario asked if checks and balances and monitoring were in place to ensure that the funds were spent as provided in the capital outlay bill, and Mr. McClinton and Mr. Moses both said there were.

Mr. Barham stated he was familiar with what WLF was trying to do and so moved for approval. The motion passed without objection.

With no further business to discuss, Sen. LaFleur moved for adjournment. The meeting was adjourned at 8:27 a.m. without objection.

As provided in R.S. 39:461.9, I request that the Interim Emergency Board (IEB) consider a scope clarification for Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, "Wildlife Land Acquisition" (Statewide, FPC Project Number 16-513-03-04) project.

Act 16 of the 2016 Second Extraordinary Session appropriated \$15,500,000 for the referenced project payable from the Conservation Fund. The capital outlay request indicated that the requested funds would be used for the acquisition of properties with favorable habitat in accordance with LRS 56 and Vision 2020. The agency wishes to clarify these funds may also be used to acquire buildings to support Department staff to accomplish the mission of the Department.

I request the Interim Emergency Board clarify the scope of the project as described above and change the project title to "Wildlife Land and Building Acquisition." Please advise if you need further information.
