MEETING MINUTES

A public meeting of the Interim Emergency Board was held at the State Capitol in House Committee Room 2 on November 22, 2022, at 9:30 a.m.

ITEM NO. 1

Sen. Page Cortez, board chair, called the meeting to order at 9:42 a.m., and asked that the secretary call the roll.

ITEM NO. 2

Rep. Schexnayder motioned for approval of the minutes of the July 21, 2022, meeting as presented to the board. The motion passed without objection.

ITEM NO. 3

President Cortez asked Mr. Jason Sooter of the Division of Administration, Office of Facility Planning and Control, to present the information regarding item no. 3, which is a proposed project alteration in Act 117 of 2022. Mr. Sooter explained that the application being presented is a request by Southern University – Southern Shreveport that the scope of its project, "Louis Collier Hall Science Building Renovation, Planning and Construction" payable from General Obligation Bonds in the amount of \$4,004,961, be changed to allow for construction of a new 6,000 square foot science laboratory annex building, and that the project title be changed to "Louis Collier Hall Science Building Annex, Planning and Construction."

Mr. Ken Dawson with Southern University Facilities Planning explained to the board that Louis Collier Hall is not presently being used because of its poor condition, which includes leaks, mold, HVAC issues, and other deterioration, and the university urgently

needs lab space in order to teach existing classes as well as provide for student growth that the Shreveport campus is experiencing. Thus, Southern University is proposing to change the scope of the \$4 million capital outlay allocation from the project intended to stabilize the exterior only of Collier Hall to constructing a new annex building directly across the street. The university has determined that the original \$4 million allocation would not be nearly enough to fund the renovation of the old building but would be enough to build the new annex building, which would more immediately meet the urgent need for new science labs. They are currently investigating whether it would be best to renovate the original Collier Hall or that it be demolished and rebuilt.

There was much discussion regarding the concerns of the board that this scope change request is actually an entirely new project that should be vetted and reviewed through the legislative process. Representative Zeringue motioned to defer the item so the university can determine the best means of moving forward and work with the Board of Regents to submit the request in the upcoming 2023 capital outlay bill. The motion passed without objection.

ITEM NO. 4

Mr. Sooter explained that item no. 4 was a request by the Garyville Timbermill Museum Association that the name of the entity on its project, "Garyville Timbermill Museum Storm Damage Repairs and Renovation, Planning and Construction," payable from State General Fund (Direct) Non-Recurring Revenues in the amount of \$3,000,000, be changed to "Louisiana Steam Train Association/Garyville Timbermill Museum Joint Venture, A Non-Profit Corporation." There have been some federal dollars allocated in conjunction with the steam train being relocated to that site. Thus, these two entities have formed a joint venture which will allow them to accept the additional federal dollars.

With no further discussion, Speaker Schexnayder motioned for approval. The motion passed without objection.

With no further business to discuss, Speaker Schexnayder moved to adjourn. The motion passed without objection and the meeting was adjourned at 10:16 a.m.

The Southern University System is requesting that a scope change request for the referenced project be considered by Interim Emergency Board. Although the capital outlay request for this project included a comprehensive renovation of all building systems, the cost estimate grossly underestimated the cost of such a renovation at \$4,000,000. Although this request was fully funded, the funded amount is insufficient for the scope of work. Therefore, in keeping with the intent of the original request to provide instructional space for science courses, after consultation with the leadership of the Southern University at Shreveport campus, our System Office of Facilities Planning is recommending that the scope of the project be changed to the construction of a 6,000 square foot science laboratory annex building.

The attached Interim Emergency Board Scope Change Request Form has been signed by both the senator and representative for the location of this project. Further, this request was approved by the Southern University System Board of Supervisors on July 22, 2022, and by the Louisiana Board of Regents on August 24, 2022.
