# LEEMI BOARD MEETING

# **MINUTES**

A quarterly meeting of the Law Enforcement Executive Management Institute (LEEMI) Board was held at 2:00 a.m. on July 7, 2015, at the Shreveport Hilton and Convention Center. The meeting was called to order by Chief Gary Presswood, Chairman.

During the conference, she and Mr. Smith will make a full presentation to the police chiefs at a meeting scheduled for July 8, 2015.
