The meeting of the Louisiana State Racing Commission was called to order by the Chairman on Monday, November 15, 2010 at 9:05 AM in the Lafitte A & B Rooms of the Chateau Bourbon, 800 Iberville Street, New Orleans, Louisiana. Roll call was taken; a quorum was present.

Mr. Meaux asks the commissioners for approval of the meeting minutes from the previous meeting; Mr. Covington motions to approve; Mr. Babb seconds; motion carries.

I. ASSOCIATION REQUESTS

A. BOYD RACING, LLC d/b/a DELTA DOWNS RACETRACK, CASINO & HOTEL

1. PROGRESS REPORT, by Mr. Chris Warren. Mr. Warren informs the 88-day thoroughbred meet began on October 27th. He informs the schedule started with four day weeks (will close Christmas week) and will end with five day weeks for the last five weeks of the meet. Mr. Warren informs the live handle is up 10%, simulcast bet-in is up 15% and the betting on other signals is up 34%. Mr. Warren states the reviews of the new track surface have been positive. He states the track surface will be watered more often if there isn't enough rainfall. Mr. Warren informs more drainage ditches were added to four or five barns on the backside. He informs the biggest day in Louisiana racing (purse money totaling \$2.4 million, 8-stakes races and million-dollar jackpot race) will be held on November 20th. Mr. Warren informs of upgrades in the grandstands as well as the bar area in the OTB. Mr. Warren states that Delta Downs purchased a 12-horse starting gate 2 years ago and he discusses the possibilities of implementing a plan to put it in full use in the future. Mr. Tromba asks Mr. Warren

about the current field size and purse distribution. Mr. Warren states the field size average is 9.1 and average purse size is \$175,000. Mr. Beech, Regional Manager of the Jockeys' Guild states his concern with safety and would like to have future discussions on running 12 horses at Delta Downs.

B. EVANGELINE DOWNS RACETRACK & CASINO

1. PROGRESS REPORT, by Mr. Steve Darbonne. Mr. Darbonne reports Evangeline Downs has no outstanding projects and has received no complaints from the barn area. He informs the thoroughbred meet ended in early September. He states Evangeline Downs was down 4% overall. Mr. Darbonne informs the third quarter horse meet has started and they are running days instead of nights to cut expenses. He informs the handle is down 35% from the last year. He informs a good part of it is due to losses on Sundays. He states the handle is down a larger percent than actual revenue because only half of the revenue is from other signal fees, but it's not affecting Evangeline Downs as much as it looks on the handle. Mr. Darbonne informs Dr. Mick Peterson is scheduled to examine the track at the end of December. Mr. Covington asks Mr. Darbonne for a copy of the price quote given by Dr. Peterson. Mr. Darbonne supplies the commission with a copy of the quote.

1. PROGRESS REPORT, by Mr. Eric Halstrom. Mr. Halstrom informs the Fair Grounds 10 day quarter horse meet in September was very good. He informs the purse average was \$200,000 per day. He informs the handle was down 10%. Mr. Halstrom informs the backside opened for thoroughbreds on October 1, three weeks earlier than normal. He informs the track is currently in great condition and is pleased with the new track superintendent, Pedro Duval. A new sprinkler was replaced in the summer. Mr. Halstrom informs that the American Quarter Horse Challenge will be held on this upcoming Friday night (11-19-10). He informs Los Alamitos will take all 13 races on Friday night. He mentions the clubhouse is very close to selling out and the simulcast should provide great exposure. Mr. Halstrom informs the thoroughbred meet will open on Thanksgiving Day and there is a 250 person waiting list for tables. He states purses should average \$320,000 per day. Mr. Tromba asks how much of the purse money is contributed from OTB's. Mr. Halstrom responds the OTB business is struggling and is off between 10%-15% and video poker is flat. Mr. Tromba compliments Mr. Halstrom on the Fair Grounds advertising campaign. Mr. Halstrom states Fair Grounds is using Trumpet as their new advertising agency.

Mr. Romero asks Mr. Halstrom if there is another location to replace this OTB. Mr. Halstrom states there were neighborhood issues. He informs Fair Grounds will seek other options in the area. Ms. Wagner asks Mr. Halstrom about the current OTB locations on the West Bank. Mr. Halstrom replies there is one in Gretna.

D. HARRAH'S BOSSIER CITY INVESTMENT COMPANY, LLC d/b/a HARRAH'S LOUISIANA DOWNS

1. PROGRESS REPORT, by Mr. Trent McIntosh. Mr. McIntosh informs the thoroughbred meet ended on September 26th. He informs the handle on their simulcast signal was down 20%. He states Monmouth Park created a racing schedule (reduced number of racing days and doubled their handle) which cut into the market share for simulcasting. Mr. McIntosh states Louisiana Downs added one race per day, adjusted post times and focused more on promotional items in September. He mentions Monmouth competed against Louisiana Downs twice per week in September. The result was the handle being down 6% compared to over 20% from May through August. Mr. McIntosh informs the quarter horse meet begins on January 8th with stall applications going out today (11-15-10). He reports the on-track handle during the offseason (through the beginning of November) was up about 6%. The horses will move on the track on December 18th. He informs the awnings and gutters on the south side of all the barns have been installed. He informs the next step is to replace all of the lumber on all of the barns that are twenty-five years and older. He states, the project began in October and is scheduled for completion December 10th. Mr. Tromba states in the last 4 or 5 years the decline in racing handles are dramatic. He states he is concerned with the direction racing is taking in that area. Mr. Tromba states that Louisiana Downs termination of one of the most respected simulcast directors in the nation had a profound impact on the handle. Mr. McIntosh discusses the quality of racing at Louisiana Downs and states running 84 days is definitely a challenge. Ms. Wagner asks Mr. McIntosh about the average field size. He responds 9.1. Mr. McIntosh and Mr. Tromba have a discussion regarding barn closings and purse sizes. Mr. Roberts asks Mr. McIntosh about the negative cash flow when the barns were closed. Mr. McIntosh responds somewhere between \$20,000 and \$40,000. Several commissioners discuss competition, start times as well as marketing issues adversely effecting Louisiana Downs. Mr. Laverne Perry, LQHBA addresses the commission and states he would like all of the tracks to get together and create a successful marketing initiative.

Mr. Arthur Morrell, horse owner and Clerk of Criminal Courts in New Orleans, addresses the commission. As a horse owner, he urges the commission not to cut the amount of live racing days. Mr. Meaux states for the record that there hasn't been any discussion in that regard.

Mr. Covington informs the Medication Committee met on Sunday, November 14, 2010. He states the Medication Committee, with Chairman Meaux's approval, decided not to get involved at this time with RCI's recommendation to reduce the Bute test threshold from five to two. Mr. Covington states the committee recommended all health rules should be applied to all training facilities similar to all of the tracks.

B. RULES COMMITTEE, by Committee Chairman Keith W. Babb

Mr. Babb motions to approve for formal adoption rules LAC 46: XLI. Chapter 11 – Owners and LAC 46: XLI. Chapter 21 – Stables; Ms. Wagner seconds; motion carries.

C. LEGAL COMMITTEE, by Committee Chairman Bob F. Wright

Mr. Wright states that he has no report. Mr. Wright motions to have an executive session in order to discuss litigation issues; Ms. Wagner seconds; motion carries.

The Commission goes into executive session after 1:00 PM.

D. RACETRACK/HBPA LIAISON COMMITTEE, by Committee Chairman Ray A. Tromba

Mr. Tromba states the committee discussed safety issues at Evangeline Downs and Mr. Darbonne will follow-up with the Commission after Dr. Peterson examines the track surface at the end of December.

E. SECURITY COMMITTEE, by Committee Chairman Kenneth "Kenu" Romero

Mr. Romero states that he has no report.

F. COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE, by Committee Chairman Anthony Bourgeois

Mr. Bourgeois states the Compliance Committee inspected the Training Center at Copper Crowne and recommends their license approval.

III. OTHER

A. For Discussion/Approval:

1. Approval of the Training Center at Copper Crowne located at 5180 Highway 182 S., Opelousas, Louisiana.

Mr. Harold Forman, owner and developer of Copper Crowne shares his goals and concepts regarding the facility. He informs 11 million dollars has been spent on improvements. Mr. Romero motions to approve the facility as a training center in Louisiana; Ms. Wagner seconds. Ms. Kim Chatelain, Assistant Attorney General, Mr. Beech, Mr. Sean Alfortish, President-HBPA and commissioners discuss insurance issues. Mr. Covington motions to approve the training center and have the same health rules for horses that the tracks are using; Mr. Romero seconds; motion carries.

2. Approval of alternate state stewards.

Mr. Gardiner asks the commission to give blanket approval to the current state stewards and Judy Dugas to work as alternate state stewards as needed. He provides past examples of stewards having to substitute for one another. Mr. Wright motions to approve alternate state stewards; Mr. Covington seconds; motion carries.

3. HBPA discussion of toe grabs at Delta Downs.

Mr. Alfortish asks the commission to reconsider a previous rule where the toe grabs on the horseshoes were reduced from 4 millimeters to 2 millimeters. He provides a petition signed by approximately 35 trainers to consider this matter. He presents surface issues and the effects it has on horses. Dr. Tom David, Equine Medical Director informs that lower toe grabs result in less injury. Mr. Wright motions to refer this matter to the Medication Committee for evaluation; Mr. Covington seconds; motion carries.

4. Discussion of the Communication Alliance to Network Thoroughbred Ex-Racehorses. CANTER

Ms. Nancy Koch, National Executive Director of CANTER provides the commission with a presentation of the organization. She states CANTER provides careers to sports horses after racing. She also states CANTER's website gets 40,000 hits a day and sells or helps to sell up to 300 horses per track with the prices averaging from \$1,500-\$3,500. Mr. Covington motions to allow CANTER access to the backside to all Louisiana tracks; Mr. Tromba seconds. Mr. Gardiner states a vendor's license will be needed to gain access to the backside. Mr. Tromba motions to grant CANTER a vendor's license that includes following all rules and regulations; Mr. Covington and Ms. Wagner seconds; motion carries.

Mr. Gardiner recognizes and welcomes Ms. Bobbie Rockmore, Vice President of the Sports and Entertainment Law Society at Loyola Law School.
