PROCEEDINGS/MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Girouard called the regular monthly Soil & Water Conservation Commission Meeting to order at 1:15 P.M. Mr. Reggie Skains gave the invocation and Mr. Larry Sayes lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comments

Chairman Girouard asked if there were any comments from the public or from Commission members and there were none.

<u>Approval of the Agenda</u> Chairman Girouard called for a motion to approve the July 21, 2021 SSWCC agenda.

Motion by: Mr. Reggie Skains **Seconded by**: Mr. Steve Horvath Motion passed unanimously. <u>Approval of the minutes</u> Chairman Girouard called for a motion to approve the June 22, 2021 SSWCC minutes.

Motion by: Mr. Ed Yerger Seconded by: Mr. Steve Horvath Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Spicer said Mr. Breaux had to attend a Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority (CPRA) meeting in Lake Charles and requested that he give the reports until he arrives.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

<u>NRCS/OSWC Farm Bill Cooperative Agreement- Mr. Brad Spicer, LDAF Alternate Member</u> The Farm Bill program reporting system closed July 10th. June's Farm Bill total is \$61,873. The districts have \$105,465 to earn over the next 3 months. Mr. Kacir said NRCS and LDAF OSWC recently signed an amended agreement that added \$1,000,000 to the current Farm Bill agreement making it a 4 year, 4 million dollar agreement.

District Funding- Mr. Brad Spicer, LDAF Alternate Member

Mr. Spicer said LDAF has not given OSWC their budget amount for allocation to districts. We hope to be able to report the figures at the next Commission meeting.

NACD Summer Meeting- Mr. Alan Williams, LACD President

Mr. Williams said this NACD meeting will be a shorter meeting than normal. Right before the meeting today, we found out there is a travel advisory. The Chicago Department of Health added Louisiana to its travel advisory list which means unvaccinated individuals traveling from Arkansas, Missouri, Florida, Louisiana, Nevada, and U.S. Virgin Islands are "advised" not "required" to obtain a negative COVID-19 test result no more than 72 hours prior to arrival in Chicago or quarantine for a 10-day period upon arrival. Vaccinated individuals are exempt from the advisory.

New Business

NRCS State Conservationist Report- Mr. Chad Kacir, State Conservationist (13:45)

Mr. Kacir said currently NRCS has approximately 24-25 million dollars of EQIP funds this year and 50% of the funds have been obligated. NRCS hopes to spend the month of August working through their 600 CSP applications. The process of automatically renewing CSP contracts has now become competitive for anyone applying. In March 2021, NRCS funded approximately 100 CSP renewals with a value of 10 million dollars. This fiscal year, NRCS will have to use 11 million dollars for renewals and new applications.

Mr. Kacir said NRCS plans to bring back the Assistant State Conservationist for Partnership position. Mr. Scott Edwards held this position previously. He said he believes this will be vital to assist in working on the current agreements and as well as future agreements. NRCS is also creating two new positions that will be strictly working to identify wetland IDs. One wetland position will be in Monroe, LA and one wetland position will be in Lafayette, LA.

Mr. Kacir said Congressman Graves had a meeting at the request of many parish presidents and police juries of the state to discuss drainage funds in our state. Mr. Horvath said that he was able to attend a few meetings in Livingston Parish to hear ideas and possible solutions drainage. Dredging seems to be the main option that is discussed but is not always the answer. NRCS has started with Upper Delta SWCD to assist in watershed implementation. Chairman Girouard said Vermillion SWCD submitted a watershed plan to NRCS for review and has received comments back. Mr. Spicer said there had been previous discussions with the Louisiana Watershed Initiative and Mr. Skains said he attended a few meetings since their presentation to the Commission a year ago. Mr. Spicer said when he worked with the Governor's office, Baton Rouge implemented a plan where you could not develop any home site without having a drainage plan. You weren't couldn't increase the runoff.

Mr. Kacir said Louisiana is:

- 2nd lowest vaccinated state (40%-one shot, 36%- fully vaccinated)
- 4th on increased cases (3 cases per 10,000 people)
- Reaching 1,500 cases per day

NRCS has restricted all travel to "mission essential time critical" status. They have also said that unvaccinated employees must quarantine for 7 days after personal or official travel. Many field offices have been seeing a drastic increase in COVID-19 cases that can compare to last March and April. NRCS is hoping that headquarters does not limit staffing back to 25% or limit staffing to "essential personnel".
