1	CALL TO ORDER
2	MR. LEDUFF:
3	Meeting called to order.
4	OLD BUSINESS
5	<u>City of West Monroe - Randall Duke</u>
6	MR. LEDUFF:
7	We have Mr. Randall Duke from the City of West Monroe
8	here who is going to give us some clarification on his
9	position.
10	Tell us a little bit about your position, because we have
11	some questions.
12	MR. DUKE:
13	Yes, sir. Originally, I started with the City of West
14	Monroe. It was in 2005, with the Community Development
15	Department, and under that Department, the City started to do
16	what we call code enforcement, but it is not really what
17	typical governments call code enforcement. It is not building
18	inspections or anything along those lines. It was really the
19	citations of nuisance-type violations.
20	After doing that for a few years, it was they came to
21	the conclusion that it really needed to be under a law
22	enforcement-type position, so I was then transferred to the
23	Marshal's Office and where I currently am now. I believe
24	that was in 2008. After working with it some more, it was
25	decided it would be best to P.O.S.T certified, because, you

know, I run into all kind of -- just any kind of criminal 1 2 element, you know. 3 MR. LEDUFF: When were you P.O.S.T certified? 4 5 MR. DUKE: November of last year. 6 MS. LEBOEUF: 7 8 2009. MR. LEDUFF: 9 10 Okay. 11 MR. DUKE: And, basically, my duties now, I do everything that the, 12 you know, the regular Marshals do, you know, the courtroom, 13 the -- serving subpoenas. I do inmate, not necessarily 14 transfer, but supervision, doing some litter abatements, and 15 what not, and I still do, you know, municipal type-citations 16 and some of them are State. 17 And I wanted to also say that it was completely my fault 18 on the first application, because -- you know, I'm not putting 19 the blame off on anybody else, but we had a new secretary at 20 the Marshal's Office that had never turned in a state 21 supplemental package, and I said, I'll take of it, and, 22 basically, it was told to me, now you are P.O.S.T. certified, 23 you work for the Marshal's Office, you send something in. Ιt 24 doesn't matter if you plant petunias. 25 It is --

You know, in hindsight -- in hindsight, here we are now, 1 and after reviewing it with the City attorney, he said, yes, 2 you know, that would definitely would throw up a flag. 3 MR. LEDUFF: 4 Paul, what do you see? 5 6 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: It sounds much better now that he has explained it. 7 MR. LEDUFF: 8 Yes, it does. 9 MR. DUKE: 10 And that is why I want to apologize. Because in -- like 11 I say, in hindsight, I could see where it was very confusing 12 and misleading, and it was completely my ignorance of the 13 14 situation. MS. ROBERTS: 15 So you work for the Marshal's Office? 16 MR. DUKE: 17 Yes, ma'am. 18 19 MS. HUTCHINSON: But you always have, right? 20 MR. DUKE: 21 22 No, no. 23 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 24 No. 25 MR. LEDUFF:

1 No. 2 MR. DUKE: I have always worked with the City. I started with the 3 4 City, and then I transferred to the Marshal's Office in 2008. MR. LEDUFF: 5 And you are enforcing State laws? 6 7 MR. DUKE: State laws, municipal, yes. 8 MS. LEBOUEF: 9 And he was P.O.S.T. certified in '09. 10 MS. HUTCHINSON: 11 12 You said "always," but when you were -- when you submitted in February. 13 MS. LEBOEUF: 1415 It was in December. 16 MS. HUTCHINSON: December? 17 MS. LEBOEUF: 18 Yes, December 7th, the application date. 19 20 MS. HUTCHINSON: Okay. But you were in -- you were a code enforcement 21 officer? 22 23 MR. DUKE: Uh-huh. 24 25 MS. HUTCHINSON:

And now?

3 Well, probably, the original job description was an old 4 one. And like I say, I was under the mentality of, hey, you are in the Marshal's Office, you are P.O.S.T certified, just 5 6 send something in. And so, then, after talking with the 7 Marshal, and I didn't want to burden him with it, well, I said, I'll just take care of it. It is no big deal. Here is 8 9 the package, you know, I put everything in, and after he 10 reviewed, he was, like, well, you know, you are not going to get it with that. 11 12 MS. HUTCHINSON: So the first job description you sent as a code 13 14 enforcement was not even --15 MR. DUKE: 16 Well, the first job description was from when I was working with the City in 2005. 17 18 MS. LEBOEUF: 2005. 19 20 MR. DUKE: 21 And I just used it as --22 MS. HUTCHINSON: Because you didn't really have a job description from the 23 24 2008, so you used it from another job to submit to us? 25 MR. DUKE:

1	Yes, uh-huh.
2	MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
3	So are there other City Marshals?
4	MS. ROBERTS:
5	Yes.
6	MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
7	And they get supplemental pay?
8	MS. ROBERTS:
9	Yes.
10	MS. LEBOEUF:
11	And are their duties similar to this job description?
12	MR. DUKE:
13	Yes, ma'am. But I must say that I am out on the street
14	more than any of the other ones.
15	MS. HUTCHINSON:
16	Do you have something with their job duties?
17	MS. ROBERTS:
18	I haven't gotten an app for West Monroe. His is the
19	first one in a while. I do have Marshals, though, that get
20	supplemental pay with West Monroe, but I
21	MS. HUTCHINSON:
22	So you don't have a job description?
23	MS. ROBERTS:
24	Not recent. Because, usually, they don't have to send me
25	a job description. All they normally send me is the

1	MR. LEDUFF:
2	The certification?
3	MS. ROBERTS:
4	their commission card, their oath of office, on a
5	Marshal is all that we require they send us.
6	MR. LEDUFF:
7	Right. Okay.
8	MS. ROBERTS:
9	So I wouldn't necessarily
10	MR. LEDUFF:
11	Really.
12	MR. DUKE:
13	And also, I don't know if I said it before. We had a new
14	secretary that had never sent in an application.
15	MR. LEDUFF:
16	Well, you just left a lot of questions with the original
17	letter.
18	MS. ROBERTS:
19	Yes, most definitely.
20	MR. DUKE:
21	Yes. I'll consider myself an expert in that now, and if
22	we get any in the future, I will definitely be the liaison to
23	write it.
24	MR. LEDUFF:
25	Yes, right, help somebody else.

1	MS.	ROBERTS:
2		And we really don't get that many apps. I mean, people
3	don	't move around that much up there, really.
4	MR.	DUKE :
5		Right.
6	MR.	LEDUFF:
7		I say we move to approve him.
8	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
9		I'll second.
10	MR.	LEDUFF:
11		Are we good?
12	MS.	LEBOEUF:
13		Yes.
14	MR.	LEDUFF:
15		All right. I guess the question is, it goes back to
16	effe	ective date?
17	MS.	ROBERTS:
18		Well, I have him on hire 12/15/08, that is when he took
19	his	oath of office, so one year from that date?
20	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
21		His P.O.S.T?
22	MS.	LEBOEUF:
23		His P.O.S.T. is November of '09.
24	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
25		November 2009. He isn't eligible for it until

2		12/15/09, one year from his hire date?
3	MR.	LEDUFF:
4		Yes.
5	MS.	ROBERTS:
6		Well, his P.O.S.T. is 11/20/09, so one year would be
7	aft	er that date?
8	MR.	LEDUFF:
9		Right.
10	MS.	ROBERTS:
11		Is that what you all have?
12	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
13		Okay. I am sorry.
14	MR.	LEDUFF:
15		One year after this date.
16	MS.	ROBERTS:
17		Yes.
18	MR.	LEDUFF:
19		You understand that there is a one-year waiting period?
20	MR.	DUKE :
21		Yes, sir.
22	MR.	LEDUFF:
23	2	And you are fast approaching it, so we don't have any
24	bac	k pay issues, so but we approve for supplemental pay.
25		And when would he get his first check, in December?

1	MS. ROBERTS:
2	Actually, the first check will be because his
3	effective date is 12/15/09, he will get his first check I
4	can only pay him right now, July 1st to current, so his first
5	check will be November 30th, unless you all see something
6	different.
7	MS. LEBOEUF:
8	Okay. He started in December of '08, but he wasn't
9	P.O.S.T. certified until November of '09.
10	MS. ROBERTS:
11	Right.
12	MR. LEDUFF:
13	Right.
14	MS. ROBERTS:
15	And he has to serve a year anyway, so a year from '08.
16	MS. LEBOEUF:
17	Right. So, yes, okay, that is right. So December '08,
18	and December '09, will be when he was eligible. Okay.
19	MS. ROBERTS:
20	Okay.
21	MR. LEDUFF:
22	Right.
23	MS. LEBOEUF:
24	I sorry I had the dates wrong.
25	MS. ROBERTS:

His first check would be November 30th. 1 2 MR. LEDUFF: Okay. I got you. 3 MS. ROBERTS: 4 And he will need Act 110 money, and I don't have a date 5 6 on that. 7 MR. DUKE: What is that? 8 9 MS. ROBERTS: I don't have a date on your Act 110 money, which is money 10 that is due you for the prior year --11 MS. LEBOEUF: 12 13 Prior to the fiscal year, prior to June 30th. MR. DUKE: 14 15 Okay. 16 MR. LEDUFF: Good, good. Thank you. 17 MR. DUKE: 18 All right. I apologize for the confusion and wasting 19 your time with it, but I appreciate it. 20 MS. LEBOEUF: 21 22 No, that is okay. We figured it out. MR. DUKE: 23 You all have good day. 24 25 MS. LEBOEUF:

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1 You too. Thank you. 2 MS. ROBERTS: 3 Okay. Do we need to go back and approve our minutes, or 4 did you all do that when I wasn't --MR. LEDUFF: 5 6 No, we didn't. 7 MS. ROBERTS: Okay. I didn't know if we needed to go ahead and approve 8 9 our minutes? I guess because he was waiting on us, so ... 10 APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF PREVIOUS BOARD MEETING 11 12 MR. LEDUFF: I make a motion that we approve minutes from the last 13 State Supplemental Board meeting. 14 15 MS. HUTCHINSON: I second. 16 MS. LEBOEUF: 17 It doesn't matter. I'll second it. 18 19 OLD BUSINESS 20 Gretna Police Department - Christopher Tapie MS. ROBERTS: 21 And then we have Gretna Police Department. We are still 22 -- Paul has submitted 23 \_\_\_ Did you submit it? 24 25 MR. SCHEXNAYDER:

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I assuming it is going to take a while, like the 1 Yes. other one did, for them to getting around to doing the 2 3 decision after we submitted it. Hammond Police Department 4 MS. ROBERTS: 5 Okay. And the next is the firearms qualifications from 6 Hammond Police Department. Did we make any decisions on that? 7 MS. LEBOEUF: 8 I think that, as long as the positions are eligible, the 9 decision, based on what I get from P.O.S.T, is that, as long 10 as they were P.O.S.T certified, the decision to carry weapons 11 and the duties are -- would be an administration of the 12 Hammond Police Department or the respective police department. 13 14 Is there anything, Paul, that you see? MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 15 The only thing is, you know, the first provision for 16 getting supplemental pay that deals with officers, in general, 17 says, "bearing arms," but there are so many other 18 19 classifications that don't have that. So I don't think the fact that they are not requiring them to carry a firearm --20 you know, if it were depending strictly on that paragraph, but 21 there are so many other paragraphs that don't require it, so ... 22 23 MS. HUTCHINSON: So then the other paragraph that don't require it, they 24 25 meet --

1	MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
2	Yes, exactly, they meet those qualifications.
3	MS. HUTCHINSON:
4	those qualifications. And do they have other I
5	guess that we deny other communication officers and
6	correctional officer that are I guess that are P.O.S.T.
7	certified; do you know?
8	MS. ROBERTS:
9	I don't think if they were P.O.S.T. certified we have
10	denied them, but we have never had any that came back and
11	asked us this, that they weren't going to meet firearms.
12	MR. LEDUFF:
13	Right.
14	MS. ROBERTS:
15	I've had people call me and question me, because they
16	were doing their 18 months and they knew that they had to go
17	and shoot, and if they didn't pass, they were concerned that
18	it would affect their supplemental pay, but they never called
19	back, so I assume that they passed their firearms.
20	MS. LEBOEUF:
21	Yes. So it was never an issue?
22	MS. ROBERTS:
23	Uh-uh. This is the first time it is an issue.
24	And I've talked to three people in their office, and all
25	three of them told me these people cannot pass their firearms

1 and they are having to move them. It is more than one person, from what I gather. It is not just one person. 2 3 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: We've never had an issue specifically where they say, 4 we're not requiring them to carry a firearm? 5 6 MS. ROBERTS: No, never, ever, uh-uh. This is the first. I just 7 don't -- I can't imagine. I mean, I --8 MS. LEBOEUF: 9 Well, I can't imagine how they can be a -- their job 10 duties, their job titles, be in their job title without fully 11 12 performing their duties and meeting their requirements, and I would think that one of them would be to carry a firearm. 13 MS. HUTCHINSON: 14 Right. 15 MS. ROBERTS: 16 And this is not a small department, like he was Right. 17 saying a five or ten department. This is department is a 18 larger department, and they have a firearm training --19 20 MS. LEBOEUF: I'm not going to --21 Yes. MS. ROBERTS: 22 This guy -- exactly -- this Lieutenant Hawk 23 Yes. 24 (phonetic). 25 MR. LEDUFF:

1 He is the quy. 2 MS. ROBERTS: 3 He is the guy. I'm talking to their training person. 4 MS. HUTCHINSON: 5 Something doesn't sound right. MS. ROBERTS: 6 7 He doesn't -- he wants us to tell them, because, you know, they don't want to be the ones to say, you can't get 8 9 your supplemental pay. They want us to either say they can or can't get it because they are not passing their training. 10 11 MS. LEBOEUF: 12 I don't know how we can -- I don't know. I am not really comfortable with just saying yes or no. 13 MS. HUTCHINSON: 14 15 I am not either. 16 MS. ROBERTS: 17 Can you get an Attorney General on that? 18 MS. LEBOEUF: 19 I don't know the next step, you know. 20 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: We are just talking in general. Do we have any 21 22 specific --23 MS. ROBERTS: 24 Names? 25 MR. SCHEXNAYDER:

-- names?

#### 2 MS. ROBERTS:

1

He has names. He is moving these people. I talked to him yesterday. He didn't give them to me. But he obviously is doing this, because when I talked to him yesterday -- I thought they were coming to the meeting today. Yes. They were planning on coming, but he wants me to call him this afternoon and let him know what the status is of this.

9 MR. SCHEXNAYDER:

Because I'm just curious which paragraph they do fit under, you know? Obviously, No. 1, isn't going to fit that, no.

- 13 MS. LEBOEUF:
- 14 No.
- 15 **MR. SCHEXNAYDER:**

But, say, like a radio dispatcher, it doesn't say anything about them carrying firearms.

18 MR. LEDUFF:

19 It says the position has to be P.O.S.T. certified.

- 20 MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
- 21 Exactly.

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22 MS. LEBOEUF:
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You know, what is confusing is, the first part of the second to last sentence, he says, "we are considering."

25 MR. SCHEXNAYDER:

1 I know. 2 MS. LEBOEUF: 3 And then the second part, he says, "because we're not requiring them to carry a firearm." So it sounds like it 4 5 doesn't matter what we say one way or the other, he is doing 6 it. 7 MS. ROBERTS: Yes, right, that is what I gather exactly what you just 8 9 said. 10 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: And what if we said they can't get supplemental pay 11 12 without it, is he going to switch to -- and make them carry? MR. LEDUFF: 13 14 I don't think they will. 15 MS. ROBERTS: 16 Well, can they if they don't pass it? 17 MR. LEDUFF: 18 If they don't pass, they can't carry it. No. 19 MS. HUTCHINSON: 20 Right. So can't we just put that in the manual that, you know, P.O.S.T. is not going to take your certification away, 21 22 but if you are not eligible to carry a firearm, then --MS. ROBERTS: 23 24 Do you have that authority, like they were saying, Yes. 25 they can make their administrative changes, can we? I don't

1 know. 2 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 3 We don't have the authority. I don't think the Board --4 MS. LEBOEUF: 5 Right, that is right. No. We would have to do that 6 through the legislature. 7 MS. ROBERTS: 8 Let me ask you all this. Can we -- I was going to say 9 can we get an opinion? 10 MS. LEBOEUF: 11 I say we defer it and do more research. 12 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: We would have to get specific. 13 14 MS. ROBERTS: Right. And can I ask you all this? Can we -- when he 15 16 gives me these names, can their pay be suspended until we get clarification, because we're going to be overpaying these 17 18 people? 19 MS. HUTCHINSON: 20 I don't know. MS. LEBOEUF: 21 22 If we say, no, but if it comes back that we say that it 23 is denied or they can be. I don't know that we have the --24 MS. HUTCHINSON: 25 Can you do that, can you take their supplemental?

1 MS. ROBERTS:

I do it.

3 MR. LEDUFF:

2

4 You do it?

#### 5 MR. SCHEXNAYDER:

You do?

7 **MS. ROBERTS:** 

Yes. I suspend pay all the time until I get -- like, if a town calls me and says -- I don't know -- they might give me a reason of, this person, I'm not sure yet, but they are running out of sick leave and they are going to be -- they don't want to overpay. So they are, like, suspend their pay for these many days, and we'll make the difference up if something were to happen after I do check it.

15 **MS. HUTCHINSON:** 

But have we made -- the Supplemental Pay Board said, I'm going to suspend your pay because the Board is not sure if you meet the qualifications? The other times it was because, okay, you are not going to be receiving pay from the town. MS. LEBOEUF:

2		I have suspended the pay of the chiefs.
3	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
4		But that was because they didn't meet
5	MS.	LEBOEUF:
6		That was because they didn't meet the qualifications.
7	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
8	:	the criteria. It was just something that was
9	MR.	SCHEXNAYDER:
10		Yes. We don't
11	MS.	LEBOEUF:
12		That wasn't our determination.
13	MS.	ROBERTS:
14		I bet Kay would know more about it, because, you know,
15	she	was
16	MS.	LEBOEUF:
17		I don't think we have ever done it.
18	MS.	ROBERTS:
19		I don't either. Not that I know of, Ternsia, I don't.
20	But	if we overpay them while we're finding out, then we're not
21	goir	ng to get this money back. This is going to be our fault.
22	Well	l, they are going to say that, you all didn't tell us to
23	take	e them off, we didn't take them off, so, therefore, we are
24	not	going to reimburse you all. That is why I am wondering
25	whi	le we are if we have to get an opinion or if we have to

1	find out I don't see what of course, I suspend people's
2	pay all the time, and I just send them a letter, due to this,
3	your pay is being suspended until we can get clarification.
4	MR. LEDUFF:
5	We are going to need to who this is.
6	MS. ROBERTS:
7	They are going to tell I'm sure when once they do it,
8	they are going to tell me these people did not qualify with
9	firearms.
10	MR. LEDUFF:
11	I guess my question would be, if it was my department, I
12	would write back and say, well, they still have their weapons.
13	They still have the same functions. We have not taken the
14	weapons yet.
15	MS. ROBERTS:
16	Right.
17	MR. LEDUFF:
18	I guess that is an answer we need to know.
19	MS. HUTCHINSON:
20	Uh-huh. I was going to say, can we ask them, well, when
21	are you going to take their firearms?
22	MR. LEDUFF:
23	Right.
24	MS. ROBERTS:
25	Or are you going to move them, take their firearms away,

and they are not going to be required to carry a firearm in 1 2 their new position? MS. HUTCHINSON: 3 And what is that new position, are they going to say? 4 5 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 6 That is the thing. We need to know their position. MS. LEBOEUF: 7 8 Yes. 9 MR. LEDUFF: 10 Right. 11 MS. HUTCHINSON: 12 Because if they become secretaries --MS. LEBOEUF: 13 14 He is just sending a generic letter. MS. ROBERTS: 15 16 Yes, right. 17 MS. LEBOEUF: And he contradicts himself in that one sentence. 18 MS. ROBERTS: 19 20 This is the conversation I'm having with him on the phone. Before he even put it in writing, he is asking me all 21 22 this stuff. I'm, like, first of all, you need to put it in 23 writing, because I will never remember all of this. 24 MS. LEBOEUF: 25 And I wouldn't -- I wouldn't talk to him on the phone.

1 wouldn't give him a decision. I wouldn't tell him anything. MS. ROBERTS: 2 3 Okay. Type up a letter. They are going to call me this afternoon, so should I just tell them -- I mean, I know --4 5 MS. LEBOEUF: Once we decide. 6 7 MR. LEDUFF: 8 I say, we send them a letter asking when this move will 9 take effect, what positions, what will the new positions be. MS. LEBOEUF: 10 11 Yes. MR. LEDUFF: 12 13 If they are going to remain as -- are they remaining as correctional officers and communication officers? I mean, are 14 they being moved to new positions, or are they remaining --15 16 MS. LEBOEUF: 17 Can we get a job description from them? 18 MR. LEDUFF: I mean, we are owed that. 19 Yes. 20 MS. HUTCHINSON: 21 So we can compare and do a side-by-side, yes. MS. ROBERTS: 22 23 I'll type a letter -- old and new? 24 MS. HUTCHINSON: 25 Old and new.

1	MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
2	We might even need somebody from them to come and talk to
3	us.
4	MR. LEDUFF:
5	To come and talk to us.
6	MS. LEBOEUF:
7	Well, they might. Yes.
8	MS. ROBERTS:
9	Well, should we do this then, I'll send them a letter and
10	go, we will need we will need to know well, I'm going to
11	type it up.
12	MS. LEBOEUF:
13	Yes.
14	MS. ROBERTS:
15	But, basically, we need to know when the move will take
16	place, the old job description, the new job description. What
17	were the other things you all told me?
18	MS. HUTCHINSON:
19	You know, what are the new titles, too. I need to know
20	what the new titles are.
21	MR. LEDUFF:
22	The names of the officers.
23	MS. ROBERTS:
24	Officers.
25	MS. HUTCHINSON:

1	Uh-huh.
2	MS. ROBERTS:
3	And we will request your presence at our next schedule
4	Board meeting on February whatever?
5	MR. LEDUFF:
6	Right.
7	MS. HUTCHINSON:
8	Along with someone who can us give a clear description of
9	what are the daily duties or the new duties. I mean, I just
10	don't want somebody to come for show.
11	MS. ROBERTS:
12	I'm sure the chief is coming, that is who I think is.
13	MS. HUTCHINSON:
14	Right. He needs to bring somebody else.
15	MR. LEDUFF:
16	And the young man that will take my place is from right
17	next door. He is from Ponchatoula, so I'm sure he will
18	have
19	MS. LEBOEUF:
20	Some insight.
21	MR. LEDUFF:
22	insight.
23	MS. ROBERTS:
24	When will this move take place, job descriptions, old and
25	new, new title what will their new titles be.

2		Uh-huh.
