19	<u> Harbor Police Department - Robert Hecker</u>
20	MR. LAYRISSON:
21	All right. We'll move to the new business, the Harbor
22	Police Department, Chief Robert Hecker.
23	I believe we notified the Chief in January of this
24	year, that he was going to be losing his supplemental pay.
25	He was on our list provided by LEMI.

We have since found out that, as a Harbor police chief, he was exempt from that statute.

I have also reviewed the statute, and he will remain exempt. The new law states that -- the new law is LA 33, R.S. 23:45, and "shall also apply to every nonmunicipal chief of police elected or appointed to the position of chief of police on or after January 1, 2012." So all of the Harbor police, the Tribal police, all of those, any chief from January of this year, we'll have to abide by that law.

So can we notify Mr. -- Chief Hecker that he is exempt?

### MS. ROBERTS:

Okay.

# Homer Police Department - Johnnie Hough

#### MR. LAYRISSON:

The next item on the agenda is Homer Police Department.

#### MS. ROBERTS:

Okay. I received this application from Johnnie Hough. He had prior service from different locations. The first one was LSU Hospitals, I think, Police Department, was the latest one, but they aren't eligible for supplemental pay. Then he had prior service at Shreveport and Minden. I -- I mean, there is no way for me to verify through my records whether he got it or not. So he was told he needed to go to these two departments for them to complete this form for him in order for me to, you know, see what was going on with

him. 1 2 He says they have no pay records. He filled the form out himself with his own dates, and I told him that wasn't 3 going to be good enough, and we can only go by his 4 5 employment date, one year from that date, because he doesn't have information that is verified -- you know, that hasn't 6 7 been verified, so ... 8 MS. LEBOEUF: 9 Uh-uh. MS. ROBERTS: 10 And I know that Shreveport and Minden both -- I know 11 these people there, and they do very good paperwork. 12 13 is -- I don't know what is going on with him, but he filled 14 his own form out. It was obvious to me. He admitted to me 15 he did it, so ... MS. LEBOEUF: 16 Well, it says he's receiving since back in '78, for 17 18 Minden, and '86, for Shreveport -- or is that his paycheck 19 -- no, it's supplemental. MS. ROBERTS: 20 21 That is exactly -- he called Homer about this, and they 22 told me he said that he could not get them to fill this out. 23 They fill these forms out all the time. I get them from 24 these two cities. I don't know.

ROBERTS: 12 Oh, I didn't -- actually, he is going to have to -- I 13 didn't catch that. He is going to have to go through -- go 14 to P.O.S.T. and get a letter and tell us either he's got --15 he is current. I didn't even catch that part. I was too 16 focused on the other. Yes. He is going to have to go to 17 P.O.S.T. and get a letter, either he is grandfathered and he 18 is -- it is still valid, or he is going to have to take a 19 refresher course, true. 20 MS. LEBOEUF: 21 Because he is past his five years --22 MS. ROBERTS: 23 Uh-huh. 24 MS. LEBOEUF: 25 -- on his P.O.S.T.

# 1 MS. ROBERTS: 2 Should I, though, whenever I -- because he is going to 3 call me. So should I -- I mean, I'm definitely going to tell him about the refresher, but should I tell him also he -- in case he does have some other service that made this --5 actually, you know what too? 6 MR. LAYRISSON: 7 8 As long as he is P.O.S.T. certified and does it within 9 the last five years, then nothing else, I think, applies because he's eligible. 10 11 MS. ROBERTS: 12 What would be his effective date, though? 13 MS. LEBOEUF: 14 Well, unless he can get official documents, it's going 15 to be --MS. ROBERTS: 16 17 That day? MS. 11	Billing?
12	MS. ROBERTS:
13	Okay. I've attached a list of all of the our current
14	billing as of yesterday for the Police supplemental pay. As
15	you can see, the majority of them the majority of the
16	billing is New Orleans. It's 200,000. The remainder of it
17	is everybody else.
18	MS. LEBOEUF:
19	Is it like overpayments?
20	MS. ROBERTS:
21	Overpayments, uh-huh.
22	MS. LEBOEUF:
23	Okay.
24	MS. ROBERTS:
25	I do I will say this. I haven't done one thing.

I'm going to have to go through all the invoices and see if 1 2 any of these people -- what happens is, say, somebody leaves 3 New Orleans and goes to Baton Rouge, if they were overpaid in New Orleans, I will deduct that amount before they go --4 5 they get put on at Baton Rouge, but I might have already sent an invoice to them, so it's a possibility that some of 6 7 this money will be not -- New Orleans is accurate, exactly 8 accurate, I feel like, but maybe -- it could fluctuate, because I know with Fire and Constables, when I did theirs, 9 10 it came down because there were some -- I mean, not a whole lot, but there are some that we will be able to see that 11 12 I've took money back from, and we can delete those invoices, 13 so -- but for the most part, this is our current billing. MS. LEBOEUF: 14 15 Well, if we start withholding it from their 16 supplemental pay, the agencies will pay. 17 MS. ROBERTS: 18 If we could just get New Orleans --MR. LAYRISSON: 19 20 Why do they have two? MS. ROBERTS: 21 22 Why do they have two? Because people -- the way they 23 used to do invoicing, I mean, I think they would bring it down there to the accountant to do it, and they might have 24 25 I do need to combine them. reentered it more than once.

The reason I haven't combined any of them is I was worried 1 2 about the dating of it because, if they are ten years old or whatever, I don't want to mess that up, but I talked to 3 someone at the Probill the other day, and they told me that 4 I can probably go in the invoice and put the date back to 5 6 where it needs to be. Because there are several that have --MS. LEBOEUF: 7 8 Yes, that have two. MS. ROBERTS: 9 A lot of them do, that would be a lot better to 10 have them all combined. I really don't want to combine New 11 Orleans, though. I really would like to leave theirs like 12 13 it is, just because I think it would be easier. 14 MR. LAYRISSON: 15 All right. MS. LEBOEUF: 16 I don't guess we have any recourse. 17 MS. ROBERTS: 18 I don't know. Katie, do you know? I know you've been 19 20 talking to Jill. MS. RYLAND: 21 We've only sent out the first set of invoices. 22 going to go ahead and send out --23 MS. LEBOEUF: 24 25 Oh, cool.

LEBOEUF: 5 6 I'll second it. 7 Sulphur Police Department - Earnest Estess MS. LEBOEUF: 8 What are we doing with him? 9 10 MS. ROBERTS: I just want to -- this is an individual that is -- was 11 the chief of police -- an acting chief of police, from May 12 28th to November 24, 2011, just until they could put someone 13 permanently into the position. We approved his application 14 and gave him an effective date of one year from when he was 15 16 I brought it with me just to make sure I didn't tell anybody anything incorrect.
