I get these letters all the time, and their 10 11 letter either tells me they're grandfathered and that tells me that they are, you know -- they're grandfathered, 12 therefore, they don't have to go through a P.O.S.T. course. 13 14 They're telling him he is no longer grandfathered. lost it. 15 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 16 17 Right. 18 MS. ROBERTS: 19 But that he's exempt from it. They don't care because 20 he's a chief of police, which I understand that, but as far as my rules go, when I put somebody on supplemental pay, 21 the first thing I look for is, they have to be grandfathered 22 or they have to have a valid P.O.S.T. He doesn't have 23 so how is he getting supplemental pay? 24 25 MR. SCHEXNAYDER:

I don't know. 1 2 MS. ROBERTS: I think -- I mean, I don't know. 3 MS. LEBOEUF: 4 5 Probably at the time -- no, it was after. MS. ROBERTS: 6 7 This is just in 2000 --8 MS. LEBOEUF: 9 It was after the letter. The letter from P.O.S.T. was 10 before we received the application. 11 MS. ROBERTS: 12 Right. 13 MS. LEBOEUF: 14 That didn't mean -- well, we obviously had the letter. MS. ROBERTS: 15 16 He was appointed February of 2007. 17 MR. LAYRISSON: 18 He had 30 years lapse in service. MS. ROBERTS: 19 20 Yes. HUTCHINSON: 8 9 I think it's just the way they worded it. 10 above," meaning you have more than the five years so it's 11 no longer valid, that is what you're exempt from. 12 MR. LAYRISSON: 13 Chiefs do not have to go to P.O.S.T., but they do have 14 to go to P.O.S.T. if they want to get supplemental pay. MS. LEBOEUF: 15 16 Yes, exactly. MS. ROBERTS: 17 And that is what I tell people all the time. I have a 18 19 chief in Loranger or somewhere. I can't remember. 20 little bitty town. He's an older man, and he calls me 21 constantly. He's not the chief anymore, but -- it may not 22 be Loranger. I can't recall, but he's no longer the chief, 23 he thinks that he should get supplemental pay because 24 he -- you know, he was the chief. I'm like, you cannot get 25 it because you're a chief. You have to meet these

qualifications, you know, to get supplemental pay, and I 1 2 think that's what they're telling him. Just because you are a -- you are exempt from it, but he's definitely not 3 4 grandfathered. 5 MS. LEBOEUF: Uh-uh. Is he still the chief? I'm just curious. 6 7 MS. ROBERTS: 8 Yes. Yes, he is. MR. LAYRISSON: 9 10 If he was elected in '07, he should have attended the 11 new chiefs --MS.
