3	MR.	LAYRISSON:
4		It's Thursday, June 12th. I would like to call this
5	mee	ting to order.
6		APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF MEETING - FEBRUARY 13, 2014
7	MR.	LAYRISSON:
8		I'd like to entertain a motion for approval of the
9	min	utes from the February 12, 2014, meeting.
10	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
11		I will make that motion.
12	MR.	LAYRISSON:
13		We have a motion and a second.
14	MS.	RYLAND:
15		I can't.
16	MR.	LAYRISSON:
17		I did second it.
18		The motion passes without objection.
19		NEW BUSINESS
20		Sulphur Police Department - Melanie Burleson
21		Sulphur Police Department - Jennifer Young
22	MR.	LAYRISSON:
23		The first item on the agenda under new business,
24	Sul	phur Police Department.
25		Would you like to explain that to us, please?

1 MS. BURLESON: We took a wrong turn, and our Asst. Chief is with us. 2 He had to go park. He just dropped us off. 3 MR. LAYRISSON: 4 All right. Let's push that to the bottom of the new 5 6 business agenda. Let's go ahead and move to the Village of Fisher Police Department 8 9 Village of Fisher Police Department - Lamar Thomas, Jr. 10 MR. LAYRISSON: Could you give us some info on that one, please? 11 12 MS. RYLAND: Yes. This is a new department that we received an 13 application for. Everything is in order, so we just need 14 15 approval. MS. HUTCHINSON: 16 And he's the --17 MS. RYLAND: 18 19 Chief. 20 MS. HUTCHINSON: 21 And the only person that --22 MS. RYLAND: 23 Yes. 24 MS. HUTCHINSON: 25 Okay. I'll make a motion to approve this gentlemen

1	for the Village of Fisher.
2	MR. LAYRISSON:
3	All right. I'll second.
4	The motion passes.
5	Mansfield Police Department - Joseph Pratt
6	MR. LAYRISSON:
7	Let's move on to the next item on the agenda, the
8	Mansfield Police Department, Joseph Pratt.
9	MS. RYLAND:
10	Okay. After reviewing the monthly warrant through
11	our audit, we determined that Joseph Pratt was an
12	administrative assistant, so we asked for more
13	documentation. The Chief then changed Mr. Pratt's job
14	title to the Assistant Chief of Police, so we decided to
15	bring it before the Board and let you all decide how to
16	handle this situation.
17	MR. LAYRISSON:
18	Paul?
19	MS. HUTCHINSON:
20	Is his job duties the same as the administrative
21	assistant?
22	MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
23	It only changed on one.
24	MS. HUTCHINSON:
25	It's not the position title. I thought it was the

1	job duties?
2	MR. LAYRISSON:
3	That's what he says in our letter, if you read the
4	letter that we got from the Chief here.
5	MS. HUTCHINSON:
6	He says it's the exact same job duties, so or same
7	responsibilities as the administrative assistant. For a
8	reason we denied that person before because of job duties?
9	MS. RYLAND:
10	The job title of administrative assistant is an
11	ineligible position.
12	MS. HUTCHINSON:
13	So did they submit the job duties of what that person
14	does?
15	MS. RYLAND:
16	No, he did not submit it.
17	MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
18	Do you want to send him a letter saying
19	MS. HUTCHINSON:
20	I think we need the job duties.
21	MS. BOUDREAUX:
22	The job title, the first page.
23	MS. HUTCHINSON:
24	What are the job duties? Which one are you referring
2.5	102

MS. RYLAND: Didn't put a job description -- she did request it, 2 and that's what she got. 3 MS. HUTCHINSON: 4 Assists in overall day-to-day of the department. 5 Tell him we need job duties for the -- the percentage 6 allocations. MS. RYLAND: 8 9 All right. MS. HUTCHINSON: 10 11 Do we need to make a motion? MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 12 Yes. 13 14 MS. HUTCHINSON: I'll make a motion to defer this Joseph Pratt with 15 Mansfield Police until we receive the job duties of this 16 17 position. 18 MR. LAYRISSON: I'm okay with that, and would just like to add that 19 let's keep him eligible for back pay on this if he is 20 21 approved at the next meeting, you know, once we receive 22 it. 23 MS. RYLAND: 24 Right. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 25

Right. 1 2 Vidalia Police Department - Frank Duson 3 MR. LAYRISSON: All right. The next item on the agenda is the 4 Vidalia Police Department. 5 MS. BOUDREAUX: 6 Frank Duson was receiving at several departments and he's reapplying, but I found out that he is also receiving 8 9 it as a Justice of the Peace at the same time, and he was legally not able to. On the second attachment, I have the 10 11 letter stating that he was ineligible, so we were trying to find out if he took that \$400 payment for each month 12 whenever he was a Justice of the Peace, which is February 13 2011, through March of this year, from his payment of 14 \$5,1607. 15 MS. HUTCHINSON: 16 So he was on both warrants. 17 18 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: Uh-huh. 19 MS. HUTCHINSON: 20 So he is ineligible to receive supplemental pay from 21 both? 22 23 MS. BOUDREAUX: Actually, he was not even supposed to be a Justice of 24 the Peace by law because he was an officer. 25

1	MS.	RYLAND:
2		They submitted that. They told us that.
3	MR.	LAYRISSON:
4		What do you recommend, Mr. Paul?
5	MR.	SCHEXNAYDER:
6		Well, it does seem like the reasonable, logical thing
7	woul	ld be to take the money out of what we're going pay
8	him.	
9	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
10		As opposed to asking for overpayment back?
11	MR.	SCHEXNAYDER:
12		As opposed to asking for it back, right.
13	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
14		I'll make a motion to wait. I'm sorry. I need to
15	ask	another question.
16		We're going to take it out going forward or
17	MS.	RYLAND:
18		Act 110.
19	MR.	LAYRISSON:
20		We owe him
21	MS.	HUTCHINSON:
22		Oh, we owe him \$5,000 in back pay, okay.
23		I'll make a motion to approve back pay less the \$100
24	each	n month that he received as Justice of the Peace.
25	MR.	LAYRISSON:

1	I'll second.
2	The motion carries.
3	Sulphur Police Department - Melanie Burleson
4	Sulphur Police Department - Jennifer Young
5	MR. LAYRISSON:
6	All right. Now we will move back up to the top of
7	the agenda and speak with our visitors from the Sulphur
8	Police Department.
9	Good morning.
10	MR. CRADDOCK:
11	I apologize for messing up your meeting agenda.
12	MR. LAYRISSON:
13	That's no problem.
14	Okay. First up, we have is Melanie Burleson.
15	You can go ahead and speak on your behalf anything
16	you want to
17	MS. BURLESON:
18	Okay. February 28th, I checked my checking account
19	and no supplemental was in there. There was no warning,
20	no nothing. It was just stripped from me. I didn't know
21	why.
22	I want to know where and how this came about?
23	MR. LAYRISSON:
24	Okay.
25	MS. BURLESON:

1		I just want some answers.	
2	MR.	LAYRISSON:	
3		How long have you been in law enforcement?	
4	MS. BURLESON:		
5		Since 2000. I went to the Academy in 2008, so I've	
6	beer	P.O.S.T. certified since March of 2008.	
7	MR.	LAYRISSON:	
8		And in 2000, what was your job title?	
9	MS.	BURLESON:	
10		I went into the records division.	
11	MR.	LAYRISSON:	
12		Okay. And then when you went to that Academy in	
13	2008	, where were you?	
14	MS.	BURLESON:	
15		I was communications.	
16	MR.	LAYRISSON:	
17		Communications, and you've been there ever since?	
18	MS.	BURLESON:	
19		Uh-huh.	
20	MR.	LAYRISSON:	
21		Okay. Do you work any extra duty details?	
22	MS.	BURLESON:	
23		No.	
24	MIR.	LAYRISSON:	
25		Are you currently certified with your firearm?	

MS. BURLESON: 1 2 Yes, sir. I have a copy of it. MR. LAYRISSON: 3 4 Okay. MS. BURLESON: 5 All the way up to 2015. I just went through the week 6 7 of in-service. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 8 9 We're showing you are a police records clerk, is that 10 your job? 11 MS. BURLESON: I mean, I'm in the criminal records division. I 12 13 handle all the jail, the billing, you know, all the -- I do search females on occasion. In fact, this last April, 14 I had to. We had three females, so I still go to the 15 16 jail, participate in stuff with the SMB, also dispatch when they need me to dispatch. I go in there for an hour 17 or so at a time, being that I've done that for so long. 18 19 keep up with everything. MR. LAYRISSON: 20 21 During hurricanes or special events, event, or anything of that nature, would you ever be out in a law 22 enforcement capacity, or would you always strictly be 23 running the communications and things of that --2.4 25 MS. BURLESON:

More confined to the office. 1 2 MR. LAYRISSON: Okay. Do you all want to -- I would say let's hear 3 from Ms. Jennifer Young too, as well. Let's hear hers, 4 and then we'll make a decision. 5 MR. CRADDOCK: 6 Can I ask a question? 7 MR. LAYRISSON: 8 9 Yes, sir. MR. CRADDOCK: 10 11 The reason this all came about, I guess, is we were allowing out people to go to the Academy to get further 12 education so as a bonus. It was win-win for us. We're 13 not a huge department to start with. 14 Like she said, sometimes an emergency -- both of 15 these ladies were former communications officers, so we 16 ask them to fill in in the communications role, plus, they 17 are allowed to go to the Academy to further their skills, 18 and as such, they keep up their weapons qualifications. 19 When this came up, we also -- in pulling up the law, 20 21 you come to D(1), and it lists their position as somebody that is eligible for supplemental pay. 22 23 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 2.4 Wait. D(1)? MR. CRADDOCK: 25

D(1), yes, sir. About halfway through the first paragraph of D(1), first, it's saying the people that -it lists people that are not entitled to it. Then about halfway through, it starts, except those classified under municipal police or fire Civil Service law. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: That seems to be modifying the term "secretaries," not all the other positions. If that "except" applied to all of them, you wouldn't have --MR. CRADDOCK: Sir, that's records clerk. There is not a classification for us for secretary. It's records clerk, and that came from the State Examiner recommended that those job descriptions be listed under records clerk. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: Well, it lists filing clerks, steno clerks. I mean, it seems to be pretty much the same category. MR. CRADDOCK: It gives the exception classified under the fire and police Civil Service. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: That exception applies to the term "secretary," and secretaries, except for those classified under municipal fire and police and classified as secretary.

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They're talking about secretaries.

MR. CRADDOCK: 7 That's what they do, clerical work. 2 3 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: But they're --4 MR. CRADDOCK: 5 As far as the classification of secretary, we have 6 7 none. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 8 They're listed as records clerk, and there are 9 specific references -- in the section above, it says 10 filing clerks, steno clerks. I mean, it seems like we're 11 12 talking about clerk. So they're not entitled. 13 MR. CRADDOCK: So that's not all encompassing. If you look at their 14 job duties, it's -- it includes different secretarial 15 duties. She handles -- Ms. Young handles all the accident 16 reports and enters reports and things. They don't just 17 file, as it says filing clerks, or steno clerks that 1.8 19 transcribe things. They do a multitude of things that is basically secretarial tasks, that's what -- we've always 2.0 considered them as a secretary. It's just the 21 recommendation from the State -- excuse me -- State 2.2 Examiner's Office was to make the classification records 23 24 clerk because of the vast amount of things they do. 25 MR. LAYRISSON:

Would records clerks qualify? 1 2 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: Well, you can read it, and I know you've read it. 3 MS. BURLESON: Those that wouldn't --5 MR. CRADDOCK: 6 I mean, the other question -- I mean, I know you're dealing with that, but in January of 2011, when Ms. Young 8 9 was -- applied, I called and I spoke with Ms. -- a lady named Susan, and she said everything fit and went before 10 11 the Board in 2011, and they approved her, and I was just wondering what had changed between 2011 and now, she's 12 13 disapproved? MR. LAYRISSON: 14 15 Let's do this. Let's look at this a little more. 16 You all may or may not have heard before, we have another issue with the Mansfield Police Department where we need 17 some more info. Their duties that they're doing don't 18 exactly fit their job title. So let's do some research, 19 and I suggest that we put this off until the next meeting, 20 21 and in the meantime, let's have all of their duties listed 22 out in real good detail. 23 MR. CRADDOCK: That has been submitted. 24 25 MR. LAYRISSON:

I know that has been submitted, but you and I will talk, but it seems to me that you have a job title and that's the way the law spells out who qualifies and doesn't for P.O.S.T. Their job title right now, in my opinion, does not match a lot of their duties. So let's put this off until the next meeting. We'll try to get all of their duties and see what other job titles they may need to add or be amended to, and then we'll make the final decision at the next meeting. MR. CRADDOCK: Can I ask a question for clarification, for future? One of the things, I guess it's my fault as well is, when you move into a position, you kind of accept things have been done the right way in the past. The situation brought up us, of course, looking at the law, and it mentions dispatchers. Are dispatchers eligible for supplemental pay, merely from being dispatchers? MR. SCHEXNAYDER: They have to qualify. MR. CRADDOCK: What I read, it didn't mention anything about the Academy. It just says dispatchers, that's why I wanted to ask and clarify before we moved on that.

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MR. SCHEXNAYDER:

I'm pretty sure dispatchers if they're P.O.S.T. 1 2 certified. 3 MS. RYLAND: Yes, communications officers, dispatchers, as long as 4 they are P.O.S.T. certified, do qualify. 5 6 MR. LAYRISSON: They have to qualify on an annual basis -- they have 7 8 to be treated as your officers. 9 MR. CRADDOCK: 10 My questions --MR. LAYRISSON: 11 They have to qualify, and they have to get the 12 continuing education hours every year now to maintain it. 13 14 MS. BURLESON: 15 And we do the same, too, you know, we do the same. I accepted the job as a records clerk in 2012. Now, 16 if I would have known I wouldn't have -- I would not have 17 -- I'm not going to lose \$6,000 a year. 18 19 MR. LAYRISSON: Well, in your case --20 MS. BURLESON: 21 22 You know, I would not have accepted the job. 23 I was --24 MR. LAYRISSON: 25 Your case is -- I think you may be doing a lot of

things other than what your title says, and we need to get 2 that straight. A lot of people just give a title -- and, you know, I'm from a small department, as well, and I have 3 people multi-tasking everywhere, so -- but for legal 4 5 reasons and to make sure we're doing the right thing, we need to clarify this. 6 7 MR. CRADDOCK: So it's more of a job title issue versus a --8 MR. LAYRISSON: 9 10 Yes. 11 MR. CRADDOCK: 12 Okay. We can move for the Civil Service Board --13 MR. LAYRISSON: And if you're approved -- if you are approved at the 14 15 next meeting, we'll have the date, you will receive all of your back pay, if you are approved. If you're not, we'll 16 17 give you reasons as to why. Okay? MS. BURLESON: 18 19 Okay. 20 MR. LAYRISSON: 21 Do we have a date set for our next meeting yet? 22 MS. RYLAND: 23 August 6th. 24 MR. LAYRISSON: 25 August 6th.

MR. CRADDOCK: 1 2 I hate to bother you with more questions, but if, at the next meeting, they are not approved until such as we 3 change the title, is back pay an issue at that point, or 4 5 is that a moot point? MR. LAYRISSON: 6 We'll just have to address that then. I mean, I can't -- we can't promise one way or another. 8 9 MR. CRADDOCK: 10 I mean, I'm not sure --11 MR. LAYRISSON: You know, we're going to do the best we can, but we 12 13 have to stay within the realm of the law. MR. CRADDOCK: 14 15 Okay. I think that's all. MR. LAYRISSON: 16 17 All right. You all are welcome to stay for the rest of the meeting or you all can leave now, whatever you all 18 19 prefer. 20 MR. CRADDOCK: 21 I apologize for being late today. 22 LEGAL MATTERS 23 MR. LAYRISSON: 24 The next item on the agenda is legal matters. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 25
