The monthly meeting of the Board of the Non-Flood Protection Asset Management Authority of the Orleans Levee District was held on Thursday, July 16, 2015 at 5:30 p.m., in the Lake Vista Community Center, 2nd Floor, 6500 Spanish Fort Blvd., New Orleans, Louisiana after due legal notice of the meeting was sent to each Board member, the news media, and a copy of the call was posted.

Chair Ernst called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance. The roll was called which constituted a quorum.

OPENING COMMENTS

Chair Ernst requested to revise the Agenda to first take up matters related to the executive matters. The COO noted that Item Nos. 5 and 14 would be taken out of order.

ADOPT AGENDA

Comm. Heaton moved to revise the Agenda and take item nos. 5 and 14 out of order, seconded by Comm. Fierke and unanimously adopted. Comm. Hugel moved to adopt the Agenda as amended, seconded by Comm. Settoon, motion adopted.

APPROVE MINUTES

Approval of the May 21, 2015 minutes was deferred.

REPORT BY CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER

The COO advised that a formal report will be forwarded.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Airport Committee – Comm. Heaton advised that the Authority hosted a reception at Lakefront Airport for the Louisiana Airport Managers and Associates Convention, which consisted of 70 public and 200 privately owned airports in Louisiana. Charles Lindbergh's grandson gave a presentation on flight at the reception, which was very good marketing for the Airport.

The Authority received a letter from Congressman Richmond supporting the Authority's request for a flood wall. Elise Grenier will begin the mural restoration at Lakefront Airport. The Authority will attempt to provide more community engagement at the Airport as it is a critical building. A fence has been erected around the Four Winds Fountain and may be FEMA reimbursable.

Comm. Heaton advised that U.S. Customs and Border Control is on course for October 1, 2015 occupancy at Lakefront Airport, which will be celebrated by a special event after project completion. The second floor lease with the Flood Authority has been approved, and a Memorandum of Understanding will be provided for the second floor Conference Center. The Flood Authority will pay to build out the Conference Center, which will be leased to generate revenue for the Non-Flood Authority. Ben Morris, Airport Director, has been busy with deferred maintenance issues, taking those issues on one at a time.

Marina Committee – Comm. Settoon advised that the bathymetric survey (first step in silt removal) was approved. Maintenance is underway at both Marinas, utility boxes and meters were replaced at South Shore Harbor and bids are being solicited for rub rails. Light poles, pedestals and spiders were recent issues at South Shore Harbor, and are currently being addressed. The long-term issue with New Basin Canal slips is under review.

Commercial Real Estate Committee – The Commercial Real Estate meeting was deferred, and those matters will be heard during this Board meeting.

Finance Committee – Comm. Heaton advised that the Finance Committee is pleased with the numbers and the progress made. There are strong working committees and every committee, especially Marina and Airport, have had a lot of deferred maintenance. They have held on and tried to address the issues. For the first time in 20 years the Airport is not in the red. That is huge for the amount of money in terms of income and expenses that passes through the Airport. As further revenue producing facilities come online, the Authority will continue to progress. This Board's fiscal discipline is amazing and the Authority is here with what it started with five years ago. The Authority is in good shape and did not have to draw down from the settlement money this year. The Authority is looking at a cash flow crush in July and August and will have to work through that. Comm. Heaton had requested that the insurance broker allow the Authority to split the premium as the insurance was over \$700,000, but that request was denied. The Authority has tight cash flow but the fiscal position is strong. The COO advised that there will be a draw on the Bally's settlement money to pay insurance.

The COO advised that there are three tiers in the Messina's lease as far as percentage rent. Messina's just hit the third tier, which is great for the Authority's rental revenue.

Legal Committee – Chair Ernst advised that the Legal Committee meeting was cancelled.

Chair Ernst announced that no action was taken in Executive Session.

PRESENTATIONS

Chair Ernst noted that the Corps is making progress on the permanent pump station, and most heavy hauling is complete. Cones and barriers were adjusted at Lakeshore Drive and Marconi to provide one full lane for vehicle traffic and approximately half a lane for bike traffic. PCCP will sweep the street in front of restaurants on Lakeshore Dr. to assist with drainage issues by The Blue Crab. Large rocks were removed near the exit of the mobilization yard on Marconi at Robert E. Lee, which has been a constant issue.

OLD BUSINESS

1) Update on The Landing Music Festival (Sept. 25-27, 2015)

The COO informed that the Location Agreement for the September music festival has been signed and staff is coordinating with the Airport and Marina to move forward. There was a slight delay on the long-term lease negotiations as a result of the music festival and other Producer obligations, but those negotiations will move forward.

WHEREAS, Special Counsel, LEGER & SHAW, has negotiated a fair settlement with "BP Entities" (BP p.l.c., BP Corporation North America Inc. ("BPCNA"), BP Exploration and Production, Inc. ("BPXP"), and any parents, subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns, officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives of any of the foregoing) on behalf of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East, and its member districts, as well as the Orleans Levee District, for and on behalf of the Non-Flood Protection Asset Management Authority; and

WHEREAS, Executive Counsel and Special Counsel, LEGER & SHAW, has recommended that the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East, and the Orleans Levee District, for and on behalf of the Non-Flood Protection Asset Management Authority accept the Settlement Offer; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for Lambert J. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mike Gillen- South Shore Harbor Marina Association

Mr. Gillen questioned the outcome of the bathymetric survey. Comm. Settoon advised that primary use of the survey is justification to apply for a silt removal grant; to show the need for silt removal. Comm. Heaton advised that there have been complaints of silt. There is a small window where some grant funding may be available, but GOHSEP requires bathymetric readings. Readings from 1988 and 1999 will suffice for the purpose of measurements pre-storm and post-storm. Present bathymetry will be used to compare to the bathymetry found on file. The dredging dollars provided by GOHSEP are 100% funded.

Mr. Gillen advised that boats continue to run aground at the entrance to South Shore Harbor Marina and requested that recently installed navigation buoys be repositioned so boaters are not guided into mud flats. Additional navigation buoys will provide continual markings and guide boaters who are not familiar with the entrance channel. Comm. Settoon noted that boaters also run aground in other parts of the lake and waters close to the Authority's properties.

Mr. Gillen also addressed distribution of meeting Agendas and the 10% increase allocated to maintenance at South Shore Harbor Marina. Mr. Gillen requested an accounting of expenditures for South Shore Harbor Marina during the past two years. The COO noted that the requested information would be provided via a public records request and directed Mr. Gillen to the NFPAMA website. Comm. Settoon advised that a detailed list of Orleans Marina expenditures was disclosed at previous meetings.
