The Council's Charge

To work with existing state entities focused on maternal death and severe maternal morbidity

The council shall address racial and ethnic disparities in maternal health outcomes and incorporate a community-engaged, equity-focused lens into current programs and campaigns, and shall promote safe and equitable care for every mother and every birth in our state.

The Council's Tasks

- Evaluate functions and activities of existing statewide efforts (PAMR, LaPQC, Medicaid)
- Support and contextualize reporting of maternal outcomes data
- Recommend how to ensure an ongoing community advisory process into existing state committees and collaboratives
- Establish guidelines for specific data components relevant to equity
- Make recommendations on further policy options

Deliverables:

- ➤ Issue a report of findings and recommendations to the Louisiana Commission on Perinatal Care and Prevention of Infant Mortality, the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate, on or before February 1, 2020
- ➤ Issue research findings, reports, and recommendations for legislation at the discretion of the council
